BREEDERS' CUP PRE-ENTRIES ANNOUNCED



A record number of 143 pre-entries. including 15 cross-entries, were announced during a press conference yesterday for Breeders' Cup XVI, to be held at Gulfstream Park Nov. 6. The total is bolstered by a 26-strong European en-

try. The overseas contingent, who will try to break through with Europe's first Breeders' Cup win at Gulfstream after going 0-for-28, is headed by the Godolphin team of the possible Turf favorite, G1 Champion S. winner Daylami (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}) and Dubai World Cup hero Almutawakel (GB) (Machiavellian). Daylami is cross-entered in the Classic as well.

Team Baffert Sends Eight

Trainer Bob Baffert is represented by eight runners, headed by his Classic team of GI Pacific Classic champ General Challenge (General Meeting) and Gl Woodward and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup winner River Keen (Ire) (Keen {GB}), as well as Sprint candidate Forestry (Storm Cat), unraced since his victory in the GI King's Bishop at Saratoga Aug. 28, and undefeated juvenile filly Chilukki (Cherokee Run). General Meeting worked over the Florida strip yesterday morning. "He was having a little trouble getting around the turns, so I decided to change his equipment," Baffert said. "We put a new bit on him and he made the turn really well and went five furlongs in :57 3/5." As for how the colt, who has been off the board in his only two previous starts outside of California, is handling his new surroundings, Baffert said, "He has been very good here. Usually he gets hot, but not here."

If It's The Breeders' Cup, It's Gotta Be Lukas

The leading trainer in Breeders' Cup history with 13 victories, D. Wayne Lukas will send seven runners postward, including two-year-old Surfside (Seattle Slew), the daughter of 1994 Juvenile Fillies winner Flanders. Cat Thief (Storm Cat), third in the GI Florida Derby over the Gulfstream oval, is set to contest the Classic. The chestnut will have the services of Pat Day. "He has an affinity for the Gulfstream track," Lukas said. "There appears to be a full field and a good blend of speed and off-the-pace horses. We're looking for a big day from him."

Frankel Looks To Get Off The Schneid

The Bobby Frankel stable is represented by four entrants, headed by GI Yellow Ribbon winner Spanish Fern (El Gran Senor) who will start in the new Filly and Mare Turf race and Keeper Hill (Deputy Minister), winner in her last outing of Keeneland's GI Spinster, a historically productive prep for the Distaff. When asked about his 0-for-30 record in Cup races, Frankel said, tongue in cheek, "It only frustrates me when you guys (the media) bring it up. I just go about this like it was any other race, that's all you can do."

And then maybe, if that occurs, then you're looking at the chance that the race will set up for a closer. If that's the case, who knows?"

Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford yesterday selected Lend A Hand (GB) as their best hope of victory in the Breeders' Cup. The four-year-old is first reserve, but is expected to get a run. Crisford said, "We will be really disappointed if he doesn't get in. He needed a little time after the Challenge S., but has come out of it in good order and will go out on Monday. He has been very lightly raced, but he deserves to be in the race and he will be suited by the track at Gulfstream. If the course firms up, that will help. He is a handy type of horse and he has got the speed to travel very well in his races. I think he is coming to himself right now and if you look at his three-year-old form he is very much a horse that people shouldn't ignore."...Garbu worked five furlongs in 1:05 at Payson Park Wednesday...Middlesex Drive, getting ready at Gulfstream, zipped a half in :47 1/5 yesterday. "We're going into the Mile awfully optimistic," trainer Phil Hauswald said.

FOXHOUND TO IRELAND Foxhound (Danzig--Lassie Dear, by Buckpasser), one of the top 10 freshmen sires in Europe this season despite spending his first three years at stud in Kentucky, will move from John Sikura's Hill n' Dale Farm in Lexington to Coolmore in Ireland. "We will be sad to see him go because he is such a very well-bred individual," Sikura said. "He comes from the same female line as A.P. Indy and...Summer Squall, so it is hardly surprising that he has made such as encouraging start as a stallion, and we will still be retaining an interest in Foxhound. However, there is no getting away from the fact that moving Foxhound back to Ireland gives him a great chance of capitalizing on his very bright start." The eight-vearold stallion was represented by his Group winner when Kier Park (Ire) took the G3 Cornwallis S. at Ascot Oct. His Irish stud fee was not announced.

KAYF TARA OFFICIALLY OUT OF CUP

Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford said from London yesterday that while Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells)'s career was not necessarily over, he would miss the Melbourne Cup and will require a long spell of recuperation. Crisford said it was a severe blow for the horse's principal owner, Sheikh Mohammad bin Rashid al Maktoum. "It's a bitter pill to swallow, but we'll be back," said Crisford. "The most disappointing aspect is we learned a lot with Faithful Son, who ran for the stable in last year's Melbourne Cup (finishing sixth as the second favorite). We had planned this campaign from the time the season began in England." In additon, Godolphin's Central Park (Ire) (In the Wings {GB}) was more likely to race in Saturday's G1 Mackinnon S. than the Melbourne Cup.


Adonis may be developing a horse-for-the-course reputation. He stamped himself as a Classic contender with a good-looking score in the GII Wood Memorial over this track last April, but came away empty handed from his Triple Crown sojourn. Given time to regroup, he returned with a sharp effort going seven panels, beaten only a head at Belmont Oct. 9. Favored here, Adonis flashed speed from the start, pressing Waddaan through the first six furlongs. He bid for the lead while three wide, hit the front at the eighth pole and remained clear to the wire for a replay of the Wood Memorial exacta. Said trainer Nick Zito, "Whatever we do, we'll have to run him back at Aqueduct. The Cigar Mile (GI, Nov. 27) is a possibility."

EUROS ABOUND IN MIAMI

Undeterred by comments that the money ain't big enough and European horses won't handle the heat and the tight turns, it's entirely possible there could be a horse trained in Europe running in every Breeders' Cup race next weekend at Gulfstream Park. However, there is no overwhelming Euro favorite in what looks like a very open day's racing.

Let's look first at the five dirt races. Aidan O'Brien, the new Wizard of Ballydoyle, has trained the winners of more than 60 two-year-old races this season, including five Group 1s, and he fields the European representatives in the two juvenile races. Warrior Queen takes on Chilukki and company in the Juvenile Fillies. This looks a tough assignment, particularly as Warrior Queen hasn't yet run further than six furlongs, but there's a doubt whether Chilukki is as effective around two turns as she is around one.

O'Brien nominated four for the Juvenile Colts, in which the Norfolk one-two, Dixie Union and Forest Camp, look like the chalk. Two million-dollar Danzig colts Brahms (out of Queena) and Mull of Kintyre (out of Retrospective, who sells in the Wycombe House dispersal at Keeneland on the Sunday, along with a full brother to Mull of Kintyre), made the field, with the other two (Bach and Thady Quill) among the reserves. Brahms, who was third in the Middle Park and second in the Dewhurst, has been steadily improving; Mull of Kintyre hasn't run since winning the Gimcrack in August.

Perennial champion French trainer Andre Fabre is sneaking quietly into town with three Wildenstein horses, including Louve Mysterieuse for the Distaff and the three-year-old Louve (that's a she-wolf, I think) for the Filly and Mare Turf. Arc-winning trainer John Hammond has E.P. Taylor winner Insight as a possibility for the Distaff, but the other race is the first preference for this Niarchos Family filly. Louve Mysterieuse has the dirt race as her first preference, though.

Europe's best sprinter, the brilliant three-year-old Stravinsky, is likely to contest what looks like a very hot race in the Sprint, though the Magnier-Tabor runner, also trained by Aidan O'Brien, is also in the Mile. And four American-trained ex-Euros are likely for the Classic: Godolphin's Dubai World Cup winner Almutakawel; reformed claimer River Keen; and Supreme Sound, who won the GIII Hawthorne Gold Cup for Da Hoss's trainer Michael Dickinson and owner Peter Harris (yes, the trainer of Middle Park winner Primo Valentino). But the real joker in that pack would be Chester House, now with Bobby Frankel for Prince Khaled Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms. If he likes dirt and has a going day, he could shock them all.

The new Filly and Mare Turf race over 11 furlongs attracted only Insight, Louve and Zomaradah from Europe, though at least three other contenders--Coretta, Fiji and Spanish Fern--began their careers in Europe. That pattern is amplified in the Mile: just four of the 14 likely runners are trained in Europe, but another six, including early favorites Hawksley Hill and Silic, are ex-Euros. All four Europeans are in with a fair shot, too--globetrotting Jim and Tonic; G2 Challenge S. one-two Susu and Lend a Hand; and Docksider, who's never stopped improving this year, loves fast ground and may run a big race at big odds if things go his way.

The Turf is likely to have around six Euro-trained runners, plus a couple of ex-Euro longshots, Fahris and Single Empire, and ex-Euro Royal Anthem, now trained by Bill Mott. Godolphin's Daylami has won six Group 1s in his career, from a mile to 1 1/2 miles, including devestating performances in the King George and the Irish Champion S., but has had a long season. For a real dark horse, how about Dark Moondancer, from the team that brought you Northern Spur.

After tipping Gold Away in my last column, which was followed immediately by his injury and retirement (sorry, Criquette), I know you're all dying to hear my next great Brainwave. Be creative, I say: a lot of these horses have better chances than their odds on the day will imply.

STORMIN FEVER TO AIRDRIE STUD GSW Stormin Fever (Storm Cat--Pennant Fever, by Seattle Slew), who will make the final start of his career in the GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 27, will begin his career at stud at Brereton C. Jones' Airdrie Stud near Midway, Kentucky next season. The five-year-old, winner of the GIII Sport Page H. last year, was also the runner-up in the GI Vosburgh going seven furlongs and the GII Philip H. Iselin H. at a mile and an eighth; he came back after a nine-month layoff to score a Saratoga allowance victory this season and was once again second in the GI Vosburgh.
