F/M TURF FOR PLEASANT TEMPER

Trainer Elliott Walden has decided to run Pleasant Temper (Storm Cat) in the Filly and Mare Turf rather than the Mile. The five-year-old mare was pre-entered in both races, but was only third on the

list of not-selected horses in the Mile. She was selected for the inaugural Filly and Mare Turf race. "We went back and forth on what to do," said Walden yesterday. "We know she's competitive with the fillies, although the distance (1 3/8m) isn't quite as good for her." Pleasant Temper won this year's Kentucky Cup Ladies Turf at Kentucky Downs in September before succumbing to the late rush of Happyannoit in Keeneland's 11-furlong Vinery First Lady.

The five-year-old Godolphin runner has won three Group 1 races in Europe this year...**Yagli** (Jade Hunter), runner-up in the Turf last year, worked the same distance over the Gulfstream course in 1:19.

DISTAFF... Tap to Music (Pleasant Tap) worked six furlongs in a bullet 1:12.60 yesterday at Gulfstream Park. The four-year-old filly took the G1 Gazelle H. last year and won this year's GIII Delaware H.

MILE... Winner of the GII Shadwell Keeneland Turf Mile S., **Kirkwall** (GB) (Selkirk) worked five furlongs yesterday at Hollywood Park in 1:03 4/5.

SPRINT... Good and Tough (Carson City), winner of the GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup S. at Keeneland, drilled five furlongs at Gulfstream in 1:00.20.

JAPAN CUP INVITEES ANNOUNCED The overseas invitations for the G1 Japan Cup were announced yesterday. The five invitees from Europe are **Daylami (Ire)** (Doyoun {Ire}) and **Fruits Of Love** (Hansel) from Britain; **Croco Rouge (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest) and **Montjeu (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) from France; and **Tiger Hill (Ire)** (Danehill) from Germany. The U.S. is represented by **Royal Anthem** (Theatrical {Ire}), **Val's Prince** (Eternal Prince) and **Yagli** (Jade Hunter). There are two from Oceania on the list as well--Australia's **Sky Heights (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}) and Hong Kong's **Indigenous (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}). The Japan Cup will be run Nov. 28 at Tokyo Race Course.

Northern Drake (Aus) (Varick), scratched from the G1 Cox Plate due to a hoof injury following his re-sounding Caulfield S. win, will line up in Saturday's G1 MacKinnon S. But Cox Plate winner **Sunline (NZ)** (Desert Sun {GB}) will head to the paddock in New Zealand. Sunline's co-trainer Steve McKee said her owners had decided to target the G1 Hong Kong International Cup at Sha Tin Dec. 12.

Sumati to Tackle Hollywood Derby:

It has been reported that **Sumati (GB)** (Warning {GB}), heroic winner of the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club at Milan Oct. 17, where he beat the multiple Group 1 winner Silver Patriarch (Ire), is to be primed for a bid at the Nov. 28 G1 Early Times Hollywood Derby. The three-year-old is set to move from top Italian trainer Bruno Grizzetti's yard to the Southern California barn of Wally Dollase. Negotiations for the sale of the Scuderia Cocktail-owned colt are at an advanced stage, but the name of the prospective owner has not been disclosed.

Cummings Seeks Sixth Derby Win:

Bart Cummings will send three horses postward Saturday in an attempt to win his sixth Victoria Derby. He will be represented in the Aus\$1 million Flemington race by **Cloth Of Gold (Aus)** (Barathea {Ire}), **Liberty Hall (Aus)** (Zabeel {NZ}) and **Campomanes (NZ)** (Grosvenor {NZ}).

Melbourne Cup Notes:

Central Park (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}) is now a definite for Tuesday's Aus\$3 million Melbourne Cup. Frankie Dettori will be aboard the Godolphin runner. Central Park had been widely expected to race in Saturday's G1 Aus\$500,000 MacKinnon S. at Flemington, but with Godolphin's early Cup favorite **Kayf Tara (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) sidelined with a strained suspensory ligament, Central Park will take his place in the 24-horse field Tuesday. Godolphin's Australian representative Brad Marzato said Central Park, who has had a relatively light preparation, was a natural stayer.

Hong Kong-based Michael Harrison will take suspended jockey Ray Cochrane's place aboard **Travelmate (GB)** (Persian Bold {GB}). The Melbourne stewards ruled they did not have the power to allow Cochrane to ride Nov. 2, in light of his two-day ban incurred last Saturday at Doncaster.

More Trenbolone Fallout:


Brisbane trainer Chris Morson was suspended for four months by Queensland stewards for his role in the trenbolone steroid implant scandal. He was found guilty of failing to exercise care and supervision to prevent horses under his care from being implanted with a prohibited substance. Stewards noted that from 1,400 horses tested statewide, only five that had been at Morson's stable showed evidence of having been implanted with the anabolic steroid that is registered for use only in domestic beef cattle.

NTRA CHAMPIONS ON FOX The National Thoroughbred Racing Association announced changes in the format of its NTRA Champions on FOX series when the event returns for its second running next year. The 2000 edition of the series will feature five network telecasts, beginning with the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream on Feb. 5. FOX will also broadcast the Mar. 4 GI Santa Anita H., the May 13 GI Pimlico Special, July 9 GI Sempra Energy Hollywood Gold Cup and the Aug. 6 GI Whitney H. Any horse who sweeps all five "super series" races would earn a \$5 million bonus. A horse winning three of the five races would receive a \$1 million bonus. In addition, \$100,000 will go to the overall point leader and there will be a points-for-cash bonus to the top three finishers of the Whitney. The NTRA will also offer bonus points to older horses competing in graded stakes over one mile on the dirt that are run between the Donn and the Whitney. In Grade I races, 10 points will be awarded for first place, six for second and four for third. In Grade II races, six points will go to the winner, four for second and two for third. In Grade III events, the winner will receive four points, two points will go for second and one for third. "This series gives us the opportunity to feature Thoroughbred racing's top performers in an easy-to-follow format," explained NTRA Commissioner Tim Smith. "The changes we have made will allow owners and trainers increased opportunities to compete for bonus money."

FLORES WINS 2,000 Jockey David Flores earned the 2,000th win of his career Wednesday at Santa Anita when he guided Timber Baron to victory in the second race. The milestone comes on the heels of a successful Del Mar meeting in which Flores won four of the track's five Grade I events, including the Pacific Classic aboard General Meeting.

Program Snafu at Aqueduct:

All of the starters in the fifth race at Aqueduct ran for purse money only, after it was discovered that the program listed incorrect post positions. All wagers were refunded.

Record Belmont Purses:

The daily average purse at the recently concluded Belmont Fall Meet was \$566,509, up 7.7 percent from \$525,891 in 1998, the highest daily average purse ever at a New York Racing Association racetrack. The average overnight purse of \$38,466 was the highest ever at Belmont Park, up 5.7 percent from \$35,039 last year. "It has always been our belief that the better purses attract the better horses and the better horses attract the fans," said NYRA President and COO Terry Meyocks. "We've made progress in the four years and the proof of that is the 47-percent increase in purses in that time. And the current purse structure will continue through the winter."

Chequer to Empire State:

Graded stakes winner **Chequer** (Mr. Prospector--Number, by Nijinsky II), who entered stud last year at Vinery, will stand the 2000 season at McMahan of Saratoga Thoroughbreds in New York. The seven-year-old, who remains the property of Darley Stud Management LLC and Vinery LLC, will remain at \$5,000 live foal, payable on Oct. 1 of the year bred. Chequer was group placed on grass in France as a two-year-old and won the 1996 GIII William P. Kyne H. over the dirt.

Bursting Forth Retires:

Bursting Forth (Alwasmi--Burst of Sound, by Stop the Music) has been retired to Sporting Life Farm in Middleburg, Virginia. The five-year-old mare set a course record for 1 1/2 miles at Keeneland while winning this year's GIII Bewitch S. in 2:27.54. She also earned victories in the 1998 GIII Vinery Matchmaker and GIII All Along. During her three-year racing career, Bursting Forth won 10 of 28 races and earned \$524,474.

Churchill Downs Posts Record Earnings:

Churchill Downs Inc. Wednesday reported third-quarter revenues of \$63.1 million, a record for the period and an increase of 89 percent from the same quarter in 1998. Net earnings were \$1.2 million, as compared with a net loss of \$655,000 a year ago. "The net earnings for the third quarter, which exceeded analysts' estimates, highlight the value of our acquisition initiative," Churchill President and CEO Thomas Meeker said. "We historically have not been profitable during this period due to the lack of live racing at our flagship Churchill Downs operation. The third quarter marked the first full quarter in which we have benefited from a contribution from Calder Race Course, which we acquired in April 1999. We believe our financial performance in the fourth quarter will also show significant improvement compared with the year-earlier results."

Stud Fee Set for Military:

MGSW Military (Danzig--Wavering Girl, by Wavering Monarch), who enters stud in 2000 at Glencrest Farm in Midway, Kentucky, will stand for a fee of \$7,500 live foal, due Nov. 1. The five-year-old is available for inspection by appointment at Glencrest.

Santa Anita Fined \$150,000:**

The Los Angeles Turf Club, previous owner of Santa Anita Park, has been fined \$150,000 by the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board for illegally discharging at least 15,000 gallons of animal waste, straw, and other material into Arcadia Wash, a concrete channel which leads to two local rivers and to the Pacific Ocean, according to *Harness Tracks of America* newsletter. The fine was the largest the organization could levy and was for an Aug. 31 incident. The agency is also investigating a possible Sept. 2 violation.

Jockey Club Releases Mare Stats:

The Jockey Club reported that, as of Oct. 21, it had received Reports of Mares Bred for 3,756 stallions who had covered 57,633 mares in 1999. The information comes from an estimated 90 percent of RMBs so far submitted to The Jockey Club. The number of stallions declined 5.5 percent from the 3,975 reported at this time last year, but the mares bred increased 1.5 percent from the 56,767 reported at this time in 1998. "The NTRA has been able to put in place a number of strategic building blocks for the future, which collectively will enable us to improve the overall economic conditions of all segments of the Thoroughbred racing industry," said NTRA Commissioner Tim Smith. "Thoroughbred racing is poised to take advantage of the momentum of the last two years and move forward in a much stronger position in the market."

The Oregon Racing Commission approved a license application by National Thoroughbred Racing Association Services to operate a national wagering hub in Oregon for the processing of wagering in conjunction with the TVG Network. The commission approved the measure by a unanimous vote of 5-0 at a special meeting yesterday.

Bell said, "He's the first Environment Friend I have had. But we checked the statistics beforehand and he has only had about 60 foals who have raced and has had 56 percent winners." The first yearlings by General Monash (USA) are doing well, and trainer Alan Bailey paid 25,000 guineas for a filly out of Blue Vista (Ire), who is a half-sister to two winners. The sale resumes today at 9.15 a.m. for a morning session and concludes with an evening session starting at 5.45 p.m.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

"Size doesn't matter," is a piece of advice often handed out in newspaper agony columns, but try telling that to Thoroughbred breeders. In Britain, breeders tend to be wary of anything that stands much more than 16.2, or less than 15.2, hands, but these prejudices can sometimes be costly. There have been many successful stallions in the U.S. who stand around 16.3, and the English-based Inchinor is busily demonstrating that he has plenty to offer breeders, even though he is only 15.1 hands tall.

The explanation is that it takes more than mere physique to make a very good racehorse. Determination, or a will to win, is another essential ingredient, and Inchinor possessed this asset in abundance. His refusal to be beaten earned him a neck win in the G3 Greenham S., a half-length triumph in the G3 Criterion S. and a short-head victory in the G3 Hungerford S. He also came out on top in a three-way photo for second place behind the majestic Zafonic in the G1 Dewhurst S.

Inchinor no doubt inherited his short stature and his indomitable spirit from his dam, Inchmurrin. This mare represented one of the first successful experiments with inbreeding to Northern Dancer, a stallion who single-handedly made a lack of height almost fashionable. Inchmurrin was inbred 2 x 4 to Northern Dancer, through his sons Lomond and Nijinsky II, and it showed. Timeform's racetrack reporters described her as "tiny, almost a miniature" and "one of the smallest horses I've ever seen." Once again, though, Inchmurrin's character more than compensated for her stature. Worries that she would not train on after she had won her last three races at two proved well wide of the mark. She produced smart performances to finish second in the G1 Coronation S. and to win the G2 Child S. by 5 lengths. Inchmurrin's owners took the precaution of selecting a good-sized stallion, Ahonoora, as Inchmurrin's first mate, but the diminutive Inchinor was the result. I feared that breeders would be loath to support Inchinor in case they were then faced with the problem of trying to sell a very small foal or yearling. Happily, they gave him enough opportunities for him to demonstrate his potential and he was recently represented by his third Group winner from his first three crops when his son Umistim put up a determined display to take the G3 Horris Hill S.

Inchinor has yet to sire a Group 1 winner, but he has already gone fairly close to hitting that target. His admirably courageous daughter Golden Silca was beaten only a neck in the Irish 1,000 Guineas earlier this year before finishing second in the Coronation S. (beaten by Balisada, a filly out of a sister to Inchmurrin). Another three-year-old daughter, Nordican Inch, was second to Perfect Sting in the G1 Garden City Breeders' Cup H. on her American debut.

These achievements add up to a fine start for a stallion who stood the 1999 season at a fee of only £4,000 and they leave me wondering whether Inchinor can now step up into the major league in much the same way as Indian Ridge, another son of Ahonoora, has done.
