RAIN CANCELS TURF TRAINING

Gulfstream's water-logged turf course got a break yesterday when only light rain hit south Florida, and not the torrential downpour that was predicted. And with nothing but clear weather in the forecast through Breeders' Cup Day, there doesn't appear to be any doubt that the turf course will be in decent shape for Saturday's races. Still taking every precaution, Gulfstream management banned training on the turf yesterday and today. The course may be open for training on Thursday. "We're doing everything we can to get the water off the course," Breeders' Cup Director of Racing and Nominations Pam Blatz-Murff said. "Certainly it's not going to be firm Saturday, but with a break in the weather it might be listed as good."

World Cup Winner Drills:

Almutawakel (GB) (Machiavellian) worked five furlongs over the sloppy Gulfstream track yesterday in 1:00 3/5. "He went well and handled the track OK," said Tom Albertrani, assistant to trainer Saeed bin Suroor.

• TURF...

Single Empire Out:

Single Empire (Ire) (Kris {GB}), winner of this year's GI San Juan Capistrano Invitational, has been withdrawn from the Breeders' Cup due to an abscessed foot. "We just poulticed it," said trainer Neil Drysdale. "The blacksmith came in and cut it out. He will be able to resume training in four or five days. He should be able to make the GI Hollywood Turf Cup (Dec. 4)." Drysdale was also forced to declare last year's turf champion mare Fiji (GB) from the Breeders' Cup with a respiratory infection which caused her retirement.

Daylami Works:

Daylami (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}) worked five furlongs Tuesday over Gulfstream's sloppy main track in 1:01. "He's doing a lot better this year than he was at this same time last year," said Tom Albertrani, assistant to trainer Saeed bin Suroor. The five-year-old is entered in both the Classic and the Turf, but will likely start in the Turf.

ROGAN GIVES CUMMINGS 11TH CUP

Rogan Josh (Aus) (Old Spice {Aus}) was runner-up in the January's Perth Cup, a race that hardly attracts Australia's top echelon, but racing icon Bart Cummings had seen Rogan Josh race that day. Racegoers were forced to reassess the ribby gelding after his exceptional win in Saturday's G1 Mackinnon S., which indicated that Rogan Josh was transformed under Cummings' tutelage. The seven-year-old settled in fourth spot and jockey John Marshall took the horse wide to avoid several scrimmages including one that saw Able Master (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ})'s jockey Grant Cooksley toppled. Central Park (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}) and Frankie Dettori looked to have Rogan Josh's measure in the straight but inch by inch, the blue-collar gelding overtook the globally recognised blue colours of Godolphin for the win. Lahar (Aus) (Kenmare {Fr}) and the Cummings-trained Zazabelle (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) went wide to avoid torrid buffeting inside and dead-headed for third. Sky Heights (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), sent out the 7-2 favourite, languished 17th after being the victim of interference.

Soaring Softly Works:

Soaring Softly (Kris S.) worked four furlongs in :52 3/5 Tuesday at Payson Park. The four-year-old filly captured this year's GI Flower Bowl Invitational H. "We got very lucky because we weren't able to work yesterday when the track came up muddy, and we got to work on a 'good' track this morning right before the rain came," said trainer Jimmy Toner. "Everything at this point is going perfectly."

● **DISTAFF...**

Banshee Breezes:

Last year's champion three-year-old filly **Banshee Breeze** (Unbridled) drilled five furlongs at Gulfstream yesterday in 1:01 4/5. "She went extremely well this morning," trainer Carl Nafzger said after the work. "If they seal that track and it's raining like it was this morning, then **Beautiful Pleasure** (Maudlin) will have to catch us on Saturday, especially the way my filly took to the track this morning. She just sailed around that track." Beautiful Pleasure is coming off a victory over champion **Silverbulletday** (Silver Deputy) in the GI Beldame over a sloppy Belmont track.

● **JUVENILE...**

Postponed (Summer Squall) worked four furlongs in :47 2/5 at Gulfstream yesterday. His is the first name on the preference list.

● **SPRINT...**

Affirmed Success (Affirmed) went three furlongs, with the dogs up, in :37 yesterday at Gulfstream. "I just wanted him to stretch his legs," said trainer Rick Schosberg. "I know he can go in :33 on a track like that because he loves it, but what's the point? This was just to open his lungs a little."

Enjoy the Moment (Slew's Royalty) had been scheduled to breeze yesterday, but due to the sloppy conditions only had a strong gallop. "If weather permits, she might have another strong gallop on Friday," said trainer Bill Spawr.

☀ **And Now for the Weather...**

In its five-day forecast, the National Weather Service calls for partly cloudy conditions through Saturday in the Gulfstream Park area. No further rain is expected in the region. Through the end of the week, lows are expected in the upper 50s (F) with highs in the mid to upper 70s. For raceday Saturday, the forecast calls for a low of 60 and a high of 82.

MELBOURNE CUP WRAP-UP

For Green, It's Worth The Trip:

Darwin schoolteacher Wendy Green drove more than 4,000kms through Australia's outback to see her angular veteran **Rogan Josh** (Aus) (Old Spice {Aus}) elevated from provincial tracks in the nation's west to become the 11th Melbourne Cup winner for 72-year-old trainer Bart Cummings. "I'm Wendy in wonderland," said Green. Cummings was equally thrilled. "This is my 11th Cup but they are still hard to win mate, I tell you. My first association with this race was in 1950 when my father trained **Comic Court** to win and I was only a little boy and I thought it was terrific. I never dreamed I would win it 11 times," he said.

Winner to Get a Rest:

Cummings said although Rogan Josh was nominated for two invitation races in Hong Kong next month, he was unlikely to make the trip. "Now he's won the Cup he can rest on his laurels," he said. "He's a very clean winded horse and that is a big factor and he has a tremendous girth and wonderful conformation. I know 11 Cups is a lot but I keep looking ahead."

Godolphin Falls Just Short; Vows Return:

An Irish horse, an Italian jockey and a trainer from Dubai couldn't beat Bart yesterday, but Godolphin trainer Saeed bin Suroor vowed he'll be back for the 2000 Melbourne Cup after Rogan Josh beat Central Park by half a length. "We thought we had the right horse to do it and it was a shame he hurt himself," he said of the scratched **Kayf Tara** (GB) (Sadler's Wells), "but this race is very important to us and we know what we have to do. It is a wonderful race and we really want to win it." Dettori, who set the pace on **Central Park (Ire)** (In the Wings {GB}), said, "The winner went by me and was too good. It was a great run."

Shawnee Country won at first asking at Belmont June 19 and captured a Saratoga allowance Aug. 2, but had come up empty in her stakes forays. Fifth in the GI Matron S. and sixth as the favorite in the GII Astarita S. Oct. 19, the dark bay was sent off as the third choice in a short field of five juvenile fillies. Despite jumping tracks in the chute, she was close up early, but dropped back slightly on the turn. The Kentucky bred came again in the stretch, getting up just in time to outpoint pacesetter To Marquet at the line. "We always liked her, but we were disappointed in her last two, for whatever reason we don't know," said Mike Marlow, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "She's trained well, she's done everything right, but she was just not performing in the afternoons. Around the turn, I thought she just wasn't that good. She finished up well and this is what we thought she could do in the beginning. The Demoiselle (GII, \$200,000, 9f, Nov. 27) will be a possibility."

Trainer Criticizes Dettori's Ride:

Jockey Frankie Dettori clashed heatedly outside the stewards' room with West Australian trainer Dave Edwards after the Melbourne Cup yesterday. Edwards complained to stewards about the jockey's G1 Victoria Derby ride aboard Unlimiting, who beat only two home Saturday. Edwards said Dettori was told to settle back on Unlimited but led the race instead. "Doing this is unprofessional and below the belt. I'm surrounded by writers and the like and you are saying these things," a fired-up Dettori responded to Edwards outside the stewards room. "Why didn't you pull me into a corner and have a quiet discussion if you were upset with my ride?" Dettori said Edwards was "small minded" and had blown the incident out of proportion. Stewards did not take any action against the jockey.

Dettori Earns First Aussie Win:

In happier news for Dettori, he broke a five-year Australian winning drought when he piloted La Zoffany (Aus) to win the Listed Great Western H. by a nose. "At last I've done it," said Dettori in mock prayer. "I thought it might be my last chance. If I didn't win, I didn't think anyone else was going to give me a chance. Five years of great times in Australia went through my mind in the last 100 yards."

There is little doubt that the two most influential sons of Raise a Native have been Mr. Prospector and Alydar. This pair were produced by mares with very similar genetic backgrounds. Mr. Prospector's dam Gold Digger was by a son of Nasrullah and her granddam was by Bull Dog out of a Blue Larkspur mare. Alydar's dam Sweet Tooth was by a son of Nasrullah and her granddam was by a son of Bull Dog out of a Blue Larkspur mare. Oddly enough, these two similar pedigrees resulted in a pair of individuals who were strikingly dissimilar in type, aptitude and influence. Mr. Prospector, brilliantly fast, but a speedster pure and simple, succeeded Northern Dancer as the leading sire of sires of the latter part of the 20th century; while Alydar, far more of a stayer and an influence for stamina, disappointed as a sire of sires, but has become a superb broodmare sire.

Their impact at stud guaranteed that Mr. Prospector and Alydar would begin to appear together in pedigrees. Probably the first stakes winner to own the pair was Rare Pick (by a grandson of Mr. Prospector out of an Alydar mare), who took the GIII Fair Grounds Oaks in 1991, and she was followed by the 1994 GII Sapling S. winner Boone's Mill. Like the combination of Storm Bird and Nijinsky II/The Minstrel, however, which is just taking off now about 10 or 12 years after it was first predicted in print, the Alydar/Mr. Prospector combination could be expected to take time before it really started to bear fruit, and so it has proved. Last year the pair appeared in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup victor Wagon Limit and they are also in 1999 Group 1 winner Teggiano (one of the top British juvenile fillies of the current season), as well as in Soft Senorita and Binalong Rose, respectively the first stakes winners for Senor Speedy and Binalong.

The Mr. Prospector/Alydar combination reached another milestone on Friday night at The Meadowlands in the GII Pegasus S., where Forty One Carats scored by a nose from Unbridled Jet (Unbridled--Easy Summer, by Easy Goer), this pair both being by grandsons of Mr. Prospector out of mares by sons of Alydar.

Forty One Carats, who has won five of his last six starts, is one of three stakes winners (two graded) to appear from the first crop of the young Florida-based sire Tactical Advantage (Forty Niner--Twitchet, by Roberto). The presence of Roberto adds to the background of Mr. Prospector and Alydar. Roberto's dam Bramalea is by a son of Nasrullah out of Rarelea (Bull Lea--Bleebok, by Blue Larkspur). This means that Bramalea is a close relative to both Gold Digger and to Sweet Tooth. In fact, Roberto's granddam Rarelea is a genetic relative to Alydar's third dam Real Delight (Bull Lea--Blue Delight, by Blue Larkspur).

Given the number of Mr. Prospector-line sires about, and with the sons of Alydar making promising broodmare sires, and with stallions out of Alydar mares retiring to stud, we can expect the pairing to appear together in major stakes winners with increasing frequency.

PEDIGREE SHORT

We don't see too much closer inbreeding than that found in the pedigree of **Atlantic Destiny (Ire) (f, 3, Royal Academy--Respectfully, by The Minstrel)**, winner of the second division of the Park Heights S. at Laurel over the weekend. Already a stakes winner at two in England, Atlantic Destiny is by a son of Nijinsky II, who in turn is a three-quarters brother to Atlantic Destiny's broodmare sire, The Minstrel. Despite having these Derby winners 2x2 in her pedigree, Atlantic Destiny has speed in excess of stamina, her stakes win here coming over six furlongs.

BOLA AT ODDS WITH GOVERNMENT

The main British bookmaking trade body, the Betting Office Licensees Association (BOLA), yesterday denounced a government response to a question over off-shore betting. Stephen Timms, the Financial Secretary, told the House Of Commons Monday about the government's concern of off-shore betting and that they were "currently considering how best to ensure that bookmakers in the United Kingdom pay their fair share of taxes and are protected from unfair competition." But BOLA issued a statement that commented, "We are deeply disappointed by Mr. Timms' statement in the House yesterday. The Government must understand that it cannot resist the global economy and the threat posed by technology to the betting industry. Betting is the most highly-taxed gambling activity in the UK and, at present levels, the industry has no means of competing with the growing number of low-tax, off-shore telephone and Internet operators. If UK betting remains captive in a high-tax environment, there will be an inevitable decline in its contribution to employment, the revenue and to the funding of horseracing. Thousands of jobs are at risk and the Government cannot afford to take a short-term view when deciding how to respond to this major challenge." BOLA also urged the government to include a reduction in betting duty in the Chancellor's pre-Budget statement next week.
