FULL FIELDS ABOUND FOR BREEDERS' CUP XVI With the

exception of the two Juvenile events, Saturday's Breeders' Cup at Gulfstream Park will feature full and contentious

fields, headed by mostly lukewarm favorites, according to the morning line. Only two of the top choices will start at less than 3-1 odds, undefeated juvenile filly Chilukki (Cherokee Run), established as the 8-5 pick in her race, and Distaff favorite Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) at 5-2. Behrens (Pleasant Colony), who can cement his case for Horse of the Year honors with a victory in the Classic, has been installed as the 3-1 favorite for the \$4 million centerpiece. He faces 13 others and will break from the two hole. "He likes Gulfstream. He broke his maiden here in the first start of his life," said trainer H. James Bond. "The number two post is number one in terms of the number of 1 1/4-mile races won, so I'm happy with it," he added. The five-year-old will have to contend with 4-1 second choice General Challenge (General Meeting), leader of the five-strong three-year-old brigade, and one of eight horses being sent out by trainer Bob Baffert. The John and Betty Mabee homebred proved he could hold his own against older horses with a powerful three-length victory in the GI Pacific Classic, accounting for River Keen (Ire) (Keen {GB}) in the process. Europeans have fared poorly in two prior Breeders' Cups at Gulfstream (1989, 1992), but 7-2 Turf favorite Daylami (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}) stands the best chance of reversing those fortunes. The gray five-year-old couldn't handle the sticky going at Longchamp in the Oct. 3 Arc de Triomphe, but in his previous start demolished a good field in the G1 Champion S. at Leopardstown. American hopes in the Turf are carried by GI Turf Classic winner Val's Prince (Eternal Prince), defending champion Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher) and Yagli (Jade Hunter), who set a track record at Gulfstream this past winter. Other favorites include Soaring Softly (Kris S.), 7-2 for the new Filly/Mare Turf; Brave Act (GB) (Persian Bold {Ire}), 7-2 in the Mile; Artax (Marquetry), 7-2 in the Sprint; and Forest Camp (Deputy Minister), 3-1 in the Juvenile.

When all was said and done, the bay four-year-old stopped the clock in :48 1/5, which caught trainer Tom Amoss a bit off guard. "This close to the race, I certainly didn't want to let her do anything more than let her stretch her legs," he said. "We let her finish up a little bit today in the work, but it was really designed to be a maintenance work. I thought she'd go a little slower than that."

Trainer Frank Alexander sent out his Sprint hopeful Good and Tough for a three-furlong breeze which was clocked in :36 1/5. "His last eighth of a mile was exceptional," Alexander said. "He seems to be coming up to the race real good." Cherokee Run won the 1994 Sprint for Alexander. The GI Florida Derby winner over this track, Vicar drilled four furlongs in :48 3/5 and galloped out five panels in 1:01 4/5 for trainer Carl Nafzger. "It was what I wanted for him and he's coming up to the race in great shape," Nafzger said of his Phoenix S. runner up.

Lukas Horses To Breathe-Right

Wayne Lukas announced vesterday that his seven Breeders' Cup starters will be equipped with the Breathe-Right nasal strips that are threatening to become the latest fad in racing. Similar to the nasal strips worn by human athletes, they are supposed to help horses breathe better and therefore run faster. Trainers Bobby Frankel and Joe Orseno are among others who have said they'll use the strips. "I'm using them because there's nothing to lose," Lukas said. "They're harmless and easy to apply, just like you and I would use them for a pickup basketball game. I thought I'd give them a try. I've never even galloped horses in them. How can they hurt?" Under Florida racing regulations, trainers do not have to report the use of nasal strips at the time of entry. The information as to who is using them will not be made available to the public.

Turf Course Open For Training Today

The soft Gulfstream turf course was rolled yesterday and will be open for turf works today. Friday's turf stakes are expected to be conducted as scheduled and the course should be listed no worse than "good", according to superintendent Ted Malloy.

EUROPE BANS TRI-STATE AREA HORSES According to published reports, the European Commission has banned the importation of horses from New York, New Jersey and Connecticut. The ban was issued after horses on Long Island tested positive for the West Nilelike fever, the disease which has been blamed for six human fatalities. Horses returning to Europe from the Breeders' Cup which had been scheduled to leave the U.S. from New York's Kennedy Airport may have to change their route home to avoid the area.

Sunline Targets Hong Kong Cup:

New Zealand champion Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) will make her next start in the 1 1/4-mile Hong Kong International Cup at Sha Tin Dec. 12. "The combined effects of inoculation and her hard run in the Cox Plate left her a little jaded," trainer Trevor McKee said. "We'll take her home to New Zealand, where she'll have some time to recover before going to Hong Kong." The winner of the G1 W.S. Cox Plate in her last start, the four-year-old filly will be joined in Hong Kong by Australian Group 1 winner Northern Drake (Aus) (Varick), who is entered in both the Hong Kong Cup and the 1 1/2-mile Vase.

Breeders' Cup Hopefuls Top Hong Kong Nominations:

Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher), Thornfield (Sky Classic), Val's Prince (Eternal Prince) and Yagli (Jade Hunter), all pointing for Saturday's Breeders' Cup, head the list of nominations for this year's Hong Kong International races, to be run at Sha Tin Dec. 12. All four are crossentered in the 1 1/4-mile Hong Kong International Cup, with a purse of HK\$10 million, and the 1 1/2-mile Vase, with a purse of HK\$7 million. Also on the International card are the HK\$7 million Hong Kong Mile, which has drawn the likes of Anguilla (Seattle Slew) and Hawksley Hill (Ire) (Rahy), and the HK\$5.3 million Hong Kong Sprint, the richest five-furlong test in the world. Each of the four stakes is limited to 14 starters--10 from overseas and four from Hong Kong. Overseas invitees and reserves will be announced Wednesday, Nov. 10.

BREEDERS' CUP SIRES--AND SIRE LINES

We used to talk about how the Eclipse line dominated Thoroughbred breeding--well, maybe not that many of us used to talk about it, but that's how it was referred to, the dominance of the Eclipse line over all others. Judging from a quick scan of the fields for the 1999 Breeders' Cup, Eclipse has been eclipsed. Now, call it Phalaris.

Because even Phalaris was foaled as long ago as 1913--such an announcement on the eve of what is still the best single day's racing on the planet in the last year of the twentieth century may not seem that important compared to the mammoth, if not impossible task, of trying to sort out a few winners for Saturday. And probably, in spite of our fanciful hopes that generalities about breeding can somehow be reduced to doping out the winners of specific races, talking about sire line trends will not find this weekend's winners. But there are some mighty interesting trends.

For me, the Phalaris line can be separated into four huge, major branches--Native Dancer; Dante/Turn-to; Nearctic/Northern Dancer; and Nasrullah. The second of those, what I call Dante/Turn-to, is now primarily Halo and Roberto, two sons of Hail to Reason, and happens to only have three 1999 Breeders' Cup starters representing it. Generally, though, it is a line which still threatens to take its place alongside the other 'Big Three'. The three Hail to Reasons this year all happen to be Roberto-line: Red Ransom (Perfect Sting) and Kris S. (Soaring Softly), two of the favorites in the new Filly/Mare Turf race; and Kissin' Kris, a son of Kris S., who has John Franks' Kiss a Native running for him in the BC Juvenile Colts. But, as I say, that line generally is stronger than that. Of 102 horses down to run in this year's Breeders' Cup, 94 of them are by Phalaris-line stallions, and 90 of those hail from the Big Three Branches--26 each for Native Dancer and Nasrullah, and 38 for Nearctic/Northern Dancer (of which 37 are Northern Dancer).

In some respects, it is therefore more important to talk about how the lines break down than which individual stallions are most prominently represented.

Having said that, 1999 Champion Sire-elect Storm Cat leads all sires with six individual runners this year, and runners by three other stallions either by Storm Cat (Mountain Cat) or Storm Bird (Summer Squall, Personal Hope) make a total of nine for what I call, for the moment at least, the Storm Bird branch of Northern Dancer, Vice Regent has six, consisting of three by Deputy Minister--all with pretty good chances, too-plus Silverbulletday, by Silver Deputy, and two by Dehere, now ticketed for Japan, in the BC Juvenile Colts. You know what that probably means. The Nijinsky branch pops up with seven, Danzig with five, Nureyev three, Sadler's Wells two, and a few others (including two by Dixieland Band) run the total to 38 of the 102 probable starters--well over a third. Nasrullah, led by the Seattle Slew branch (eight by five stallions, including two by A.P. Indy and three by the old man himself), and Native Dancer, led by the Mr. Prospector branch (12, by ten different stallions) each have 26 declared runners -- for over a quarter each. Two quarters and a third don't leave much room for the Rest of the World. At least Phalaris doesn't guite yet dominate to that extent on the damsire side, though two-thirds of the runners are still Phalaris line on the bottom. Ribot (9), Damascus (5), and In Reality (4) are the leading non-Phalaris lines represented by runners this year. Michael Tabor, owner of Juvenile contenders Brahms (USA) (Danzig {USA}) and Mull of Kintyre (USA) (Danzig {USA}) and Sprint candidate Stravinsky (USA) (Nureyev {USA}), said of his run-

ners' post position draws, "The draw is ideal for Mull of Kintyre (post 5) and Stravinsky (post 7). Brahms is not a good draw on the outside, but you can't have everything. We thought 5 to 8 would be ideal, in the middle of the pack. We'll discuss what strategy we'll use with Brahms."

Trainer Michael Stoute was also less than pleased with the post position of his Mile runner, Susu (GB) (Machiavellian {USA}), who will break from stall 13. "It could not have been much worse," said Stoute. "It doesn't set up well coming from outside at a mile. She will have to run faster than she has ever run in her life from out there."

Europeans will be side by side in the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf, with Zomaradah (GB) (Deploy {GB}) drawing the 6 and Insight (Fr) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) getting the 7. "I'm very happy with number 6," trainer Luca Cumani said. "It's not inside where you can get stuck, or outside where you might get a view of the car park." John Hammond, trainer of Insight, looked at his filly's morning-line odds and said, "I think 20-1 is quite generous. I'll back her each way at that price."

Steward's Secretary Robert Earnshaw told Sporting Life, "The stewards held an inquiry (after the course was inspected) and after speaking to everyone, it was decided that racing should continue. All the jockeys were happy enough to carry on." Clerk of the Course Bill Farnsworth was quoted by the paper as saying, "I don't know what the problem might have been and I will have to have a good look at it (Thursday) morning."
