BOMBS AWAY AT BREEDERS' CUP XVI

Longshots were the name of the game at Breeders' Cup XVI, lighting up the tote board at Gulfstream Park yesterday afternoon in three of the eight championship events. **Cash Run** (Seeking the Gold) got it started with a record-setting \$67 payoff in the Juvenile Fillies and **Anees** (Unbridled) added to the electric bill, paying \$62.60 in the Juvenile, a new mark for the race. **Soaring Softly** (Kris S.) grabbed one for the favorites when she captured the first running of the Filly and Mare Turf at 7-2 and **Daylami (Ire)** (Doyoun {Ire}) helped the chalk players--and also got Team Europe off the Gulfstream schneid--with his impressive score in the Turf at 8-5. But the \$4 million Breeders' Cup Classic saw **Cat Thief** (Storm Cat), off at 19-1 despite stellar connections, scratch and claw his way to a 1 1/4-victory. It was the 15th Breeders' Cup winner for trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who picked up number 14 with Cash Run, but his very first in the Classic. "It's been a great day," Lukas said. "This horse has been a hard-knocker all year, he just hadn't gotten the brass ring. When he saddled so well and warmed up so well, I thought we had a shot." Jockey Pat Day, on the other hand, was winning the Classic for the fourth time and now boasts 11 Breeders' Cup trophies, two more than Jerry Bailey, who scored with Cash Run and Soaring Softly yesterday. Distaff winner **Beautiful Pleasure** (Maudlin) gave jockey Jorge Chavez his first Breeders' Cup tally; Chavez came back aboard **Artax** (Marquetry) and the two sizzled to a six-furlong record of 1:07 4/5 in the Sprint. But it was a tough day on trainer Bob Baffert, who saddled eight runners, four of them favorites, without success; **Silverbulletday** (Silver Deputy), off at 8-5 in the Distaff, ran sixth; **Chilukki** (Cherokee Run) went down to defeat for the first time, running second at 15-10 in the Juvenile Fillies; **Forestry** (Storm Cat) was fourth as the 7-2 choice in the Sprint; and **Forest Camp** (Deputy Minister) tired to be sixth as the 5-2 favorite in the Juvenile. "We came in here with a lot of good horses and we tried to get one more strong inning out of them," Baffert said. "Silverbulletday may have bled a little. **Tuzla (Fr)** (Panoramic {GB}) (second by neck in the Mile) almost saved the day and made me a bona fide turf trainer, but it wasn't meant to be. It was still a great day and all my horses ran hard." A crowd of 45,124 was on hand at Gulfstream Park, the fourth-smallest Cup attendance.

CAT THIEF STEALS THE SHOW

The beaten favorite when third in the GII Kentucky Cup Classic H. at Turfway Park last time out, **Cat Thief** (Storm Cat) was ignored at the windows on racing's championship day. But the colt, on the board in five Grade I races this year but with only one win (in the GI Swaps S. at Hollywood in July), came through when it counted, charging down the stretch to win the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Sitting second along the inside as **Old Trieste** (A.P. Indy) set sail through fractions of :45 3/5 and 1:09 4/5, the three-year-old was eased back to angle out as they raced down the backstretch and came with his bid to take the lead as they straightened into the stretch. He was joined by 26-1 **Budroyale** (Cee's Tizzy) and 75-1 **Golden Missile** (A.P. Indy) as they raced to the wire and there was a bit of bumping inside the eighth pole, but jockey Pat Day, who took the Classic last year with **Awesome Again**, switched to a right-handed whip and his colt drew clear. "We had such a good feeling about him," Day said. "I don't know what (D. Wayne Lukas) had done differently in his preparation, but he was more relaxed and willing to do what I wanted." Added Lukas, "I called on every bit of knowledge, every bit of expertise to try and get the key. The key is relaxation with this horse. I felt good about him, but going into the Classic you can never go and stick your chest out and say 'bring 'em on.'" The \$50,000 "Claim of the Century," **Budroyale** just missed, but earned another \$800,000 for his connections. "I call him the Muhammed Ali of horse racing," jockey Garrett Gomez said. "I've never had a fighter like this horse fights." **Behrens** (Pleasant Colony), the 2-1 favorite, was 10th early and could only make his way up to seventh. "I don't have any excuses," jockey Jorge Chavez said. "He broke clean, but that was it. He just never picked up his feet today." Second choice **General Challenge** (General Meeting) never mounted a challenge, finishing 10th. "I got shut off right out of the gate and had no chance from there," jockey David Flores said. "This is a horse that needs to be close." **Chester House** (Mr. Prospector), off at 63-1, stumbled at the start. He was six lengths behind the field after a half and three lengths behind after six furlongs, but finished well to get up for fourth. "I lost all chance when he stumbled," jockey Corey Nakatani said. "That cost me the race." (*Classic chart, p2*)

Daylami's 1999 campaign began innocently enough on the sands of Dubai, with a fifth-place finish to stablemate Almutawakel (GB) in the Dubai World Cup, but it wasn't long before the gray got his feet back under him. Second in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup in May, the five-year-old went on a three-race winning streak, taking the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom and the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth II Diamond S. before his nine-length demolition of a good field in the G1 Champion S. at Leopardstown Sept. 11. An excusable ninth-place result in the Arc might have led the Godolphin braintrust to put Daylami away for the year, but the decision was made to contest the Turf. Defending champion Buck's Boy led from the start, as expected, and cut out a demanding pace with Royal Anthem tracking intently in third and Daylami in a cozy spot along the rail towards midpack. As the field reached the far turn, jockey Frankie Dettori sent his mount to the outside around Buck's Boy and Royal Anthem, motored by those two at the eighth pole and scored the popular victory. For Dettori, whose ride aboard Swain (Ire) in the 1998 Classic arguably cost Godolphin the race, revenge was sweet. "It's been a wicked 12 months," he said. "All the press eyes were on me just waiting for me to (mess) up. Daylami came to the rescue." The win put Daylami well out in front in the Emirates World Series Racing Championship with 38 points, 24 more than Almutawakel (GB).

Soaring Softly had been hard to beat in '99, winning six of seven starts as she climbed from the allowance ranks to become a Grade I winner after taking the Flower Bowl Invitational H. at Belmont Oct. 3 in her latest effort. Post 12 was a concern, as was an expected slow pace, but the four-year-old rose above those minor difficulties to clinch her place, as track announcer Tom Durkin exclaimed, "as the Queen of the American green." Canadian **Gandria** (Green Dancer), a 115-1 longshot, led the field through a half mile in :49 1/5 as Jerry Bailey rated **Soaring Softly** in ninth in an attempt to save some ground. **Anguilla** (Seattle Slew) took over at the half, but backed up after a mile, and it was **Coretta** who then inherited the lead, followed by **Zomaradah**. Bailey swung his mount four wide and the 7-2 favorite began her usual late surge, catching **Coretta** with 70 yards to run. "Yes, the pace was slow, but that really doesn't matter with this filly," said Bailey. "I took whatever spot opened up and was two off the fence. I just wanted to keep her clear." The 4-1 second choice **Spanish Fern** (El Gran Senor), trying to break an O-for-30 streak for trainer Bobby Frankel, settled at the back of the pack through the early going and then unexpectedly bore out at the top of the stretch to lose all chance. She stopped badly and finished last. "I really don't know what to say," jockey Chris McCarron commented. "She just didn't run at all. Something must have happened to her."

Unbridled is earning himself a reputation. The winner of the 1990 Classic, he got his first Breeders' Cup winner as a sire with his first starter, 1995 Juvenile hero **Unbridled's Song**, and is now two-for-two in the race after his son **Anees** stormed from last to first to win at long odds. Third to **Dixie Union** (Dixieland Band) and **Forest Camp** (Deputy Minister) in what was only his third career start, the Oct. 10 Gil Norfolk S. at Santa Anita, he was ignored at Gulfstream as his two Norfolk rivals were sent off as second choice and favorite, respectively. It looked like the handicappers were right during the first half of the race as **Anees** trailed the field, but the bay came flying down the lane to catch **Chief Seattle** and draw clear. "Yeah, I got a little dirty," winning jockey Gary Stevens, enjoying his seventh trip to the Breeders' Cup winner's circle, said. "But I was expecting big things from (**Anees**) today. He has worked tremendous. This colt has moved along with every race. We're looking forward to next year." Looking ahead to the Kentucky Derby, the colt will have to break the jinx which has prevented every Juvenile winner from wearing the blanket of roses on the first Saturday in May. **Forest Camp** pressed the pace and took the lead after six furlongs in 1:10 1/5, but tired to be sixth, while **Dixie Union** raced wide throughout and finished a lackluster fifth.

Artax is like a box of Keebler cookies--uncommonly good. After the dissolution of the Randy Bradshaw barn, the flashy dark bay was transferred to the barn of Louis Albertrani, for whom Artax promptly set a track record in the GI Carter H. at Aqueduct. Impeded by a crazed fan in the GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup on the Preakness undercard, the four-year-old threatened graded-stakes company throughout the summer, but scored his first victory since the Carter in the GI Vosburgh, a race no horse had parlayed into success in the Sprint. As if that were not good enough, he returned in his most recent effort to break another track record, clocking 1:07 3/5 in a 6 1/2-length GII Forest Hills H. victory at Belmont Park. Drawn well for this effort, Artax got the clean break he needed and sat just off the early pace in second for the opening two furlongs. Midway on the turn, the Paraneck colorbearer assumed command and began to inch clear. Kona Gold, recipient of a ground-saving trip, advanced along the rail and loomed a serious threat, but Artax held on to equal Mr. Prospector's 1973 Gulfstream Park track record. "I have an amazing horse in Artax," Albertrani said. "I knew once he got the lead they would have trouble catching him." Favored Forestry (Storm Cat) was beaten 3 3/4 lengths in fourth. "He made a little move in the stretch, but then flattened out," said trainer Bob Baffert. "It was a tough race. He was good to get fourth."

Silic started his career in his home country, where he managed a Group 3 win in June of last year, but he has campaigned in the U.S. since last November and denied his European compatriots a first Gulfstream Breeders' Cup win here. Off the board in his lone American outing last season, the bay was fourth behind Tuzla in the Apr. 25 San Francisco Mile after a 5 1/2-month layoff, but came back to win the June 13 GII Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile. Given another three-month break, he was then a close-up fifth in the Sept. 19 GI Atto Mile, but he got it done in his second start back once again, taking the Oct. 16 GIII Oak Tree Breeders' Cup Mile. Tenth as Garbu (Strawberry Road {Aus}) skipped through a half in :47, Silic had moved up to fifth as the pacesetter got the six furlongs in 1:10 4/5 and cruised into second as Godolphin's Lend A Hand (Great Com-motion) took over on the front end. He caught that one in the final furlong and dug in at the wire to hold off the fast-closing Tuzla. "After the Yankees won the World Series, I didn't think there could be anything better," winning co-owner Bernard Schiappa said. "There are a lot of things that go into the Breeders' Cup--a lot of luck, a lot of patience. The goal was to see how good he really was." Jockey Corey Nakatani picked up his fifth Breeders' Cup win, but his first championship event on the grass. Jockey David Flores, aboard Tuzla, said, "I was just waiting for a hole, because we were in so tight. I had to wait to move out to make my run, but then she just exploded. I thought we were going to get there. I just needed a couple more jumps." Jim and Tonic (Double Bed {Fr}), the 4-1 favorite in the well-matched field, was steadied while just behind the leaders on the first turn, raced just off the pace down the backstretch, was checked sharply on the second turn and had nothing for the finish, running ninth.

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas was looking for his fourth win in the Juvenile Fillies, but everyone expected Surfside, a daughter of 1994 heroine Flanders, to carry the day for the team. Instead, there were a few happy bettors cashing tickets on the longshot Cash Run. Off at 9-5 when she was third to Scratch Pad (Notebook) after setting the early pace in the Oct. 17 GII Walmac Int'l Alcibiades, the dark bay was let go at 32-1 this time. She broke on top and led through fractions of :22 3/5 and :45 4/5. The 15-10 favorite Chilukki put a head in front after six furlongs in 1:10 1/5, but Cash Run, sporting a nasal strip, battled back and was drawing off at the end. "The idea was to try and rate her, but then I decided to just let her run free," jockey Jerry Bailey, who won the '95 Juvenile Fillies with My Flag, said. "I was concerned about Chilukki, but when she didn't get by us at the quarter pole, I knew..." Chilukki suffered her first career loss after six straight wins. Trainer Bob Baffert said, "We thought Cash Run was the rabbit, but the rabbit stayed on to win. Maybe we should have taken that one on earlier, but Chilukki still ran a big race." Surfside, the second choice off her win in the GI Frizette S., was hung out five wide on the first turn, saved some ground on the second turn, then rallied to get third. "I had to ask her for any running that she did," jockey Pat Day said. "She just wasn't into it." By Seeking the Gold, who also sired Flanders, and out of Shared Interest, who was 11th in the 1992 Distaff, Cash Run gave Lukas his 14th Breeders' Cup score.

"I just let her go wherever she wanted," said jockey Jorge Chavez, getting his first Breeders' Cup win in his 20th try. "I knew she was going fast, but I was not worried about her. She can go forever." Banshee Breeze had to settle for second for the second straight year, while favored Silverbulletday, forwardly placed to the far turn, was empty when called upon and was not persevered with late. The victory is the first Breeders' Cup success for trainer John Ward.

TODAY Horse buyers have come to expect and inspect some of the best Thoroughbreds at the annual Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sales. This year's version will not disappoint. The 1999 November Sale, which will begin at noon today with four major dispersals and continues for 13 consecutive days until its conclusion on Nov. 19, will include some of the game's best names and pedigrees. There is Irish champion **Dance Design (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), who was purchased at Tattersalls a couple of years ago for a world-record 2,500,000 guineas. Owned now by Satish Sanan's Padua Stables, the six-year-old is in foal to A.P. Indy. There is nine-year-old **Sky Beauty** (Blushing Groom {Fr}), a champion older mare who won nine Grade I stakes and earned over \$1.3 million. Part of the Wycombe House Stud Dispersal of Georgia Hofmann, she is not in foal. The catalogue, with a near-record 4,862 lots and two stallion shares, includes 10 mares on the first three days that are in foal to the great, late Mr. Prospector. "I think this November is going to be gangbusters," said Tom Van Meter, who heads the Eaton Sales Agency. "There are some of the best mares in the world in this sale. The dispersals are jammed with unbelievable horses. These might be the strongest catalogs that I've ever seen." Opening day at Keeneland November offers major dispersals by Georgia Hofmann and her Wycombe House Stud, Robert and Bea Roberts, the estate of the late Paul Mellon and Silverleaf Farms. **Sea Hero** (Polish Navy), winner of the 1993 Kentucky Derby, will be part of the dispersal of the Mellon estate. Taylor Made Farm consigns the Wycombe House Stud horses. "There is tremendous depth to this sale," said Duncan Taylor. "There are a lot of world-class mares and families. There are a lot of hot young stallions represented and mares in foal to the world's premier sires like Gone West, Storm Cat and Deputy Minister. There's a lot to look at." On Monday, Sanan, who has been one of the most active buyers over the past couple of years, will sell 14 horses with Van Meter and Eaton as agents. "Satish...has taken a little hit in the stock market and he's selling some horses in this short-term crunch," said Van Meter. "I went down to Florida to take a look at all the horses and (Dance Design) looks absolutely fabulous. I'm really excited about this upcoming sale. I think it will be up 30 to 40 percent. With the market being as strong as it has been all year and the quality in this sale, I'm real bullish. I think it's going to be tough to buy the top mares. There's going to be a lot of competition, that's for sure." After the opening day, sessions will begin at 10 a.m. daily.
