NOVEMBER BREEDING STOCK SALE SOARS

TO GREAT START Early Sunday morning, Duncan Taylor and his family's Taylor Made Farm chartered a Delta 757 jet to help transport some of racing's leading horse people here from the Breeders' Cup in Miami for the first day of fall Thoroughbred sales season. "We wanted to make sure the people got back here safe, sound and fast," said Duncan Taylor, whose family farm consigned horses for three major dispersals on Sunday. The designated driver program worked - especially for Taylor Made Farm and its clients. Right from the start, the action was flying high. Soon after the jet hit the runway across the street, Keeneland got its marathon November Breeding Stock Sale started, selling horses made available in four major dispersals. The dispersals included horses from the Wycombe House Stud of Ms. Georgia Hofmann, from Robert and Bea Roberts, from Sliverleaf Farm, and from the estate of Paul Mellon. At the end of Sunday's opening round at Keeneland, 270 horses had sold for \$39,954,000 for an average of \$147,978 and a median price of \$40,000. Taylor Made Sales Agency was the leading consignor with sales totaling \$22,845,000. "It was a great opening day," said Frank Taylor, of Taylor Made Farm Sales Agency. "Great." The mammoth sale, which will run for 13 straight days, will continue today at 10 a.m.

LOOKING AHEAD WITH RETROSPECTIVE

Coolmore Stud's John Magnier paid the top price of \$2.9 million for the seven-year-old broodmare Retrospective (Easy Goer--Hay Patcher, by Hoist the Flag) to top the opening session of the Keeneland November Sale. In foal to two-time leading sire Deputy Minister, the mare was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency for the Wycombe House Stud Dispersal. The half-sister to Broad Brush is also the dam of Mull of Kintyre (Danzig), winner of the G2 Scottish Equitable Gimcrack S. at York and fourth in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. She has also produced a weanling colt and a yearling colt by Danzig. "We thought that she was a tremendous mare," said Irish bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne, who advises on Coolmore purchases. Nineyear-old Sky Beauty (Blushing Groom {Fr}--Maplejinsky, by Nijinsky II), who fetched the co-second highest price of \$2.85 million, was also bought by Magnier. Known in her racing days as the Queen of Belmont Park, Sky Beauty won nine Grade I stakes in her career, earned \$1.3 million and was named the Champion Older Mare in 1994. Sky Beauty has produced a Danzig colt and fillies by Storm Cat and Deputy Minister. She was mated to Gone West this year, but was not in-foal when sold on Sunday. "She was a good runner and about as consistent as you could get," said Magnier. When asked about the price tag Magnier replied, "I guess (it was what they expected to pay). We bought a vearling out of this family earlier this year and paid more money for that one and we don't know one thing about that horse, whether it can run or not. This is an in-exact science. You just try to do the best you can." As of Sunday, a final decision has not been made on whom Coolmore Stud will mate to its newest member of the broodmare band. Late in the session, Barronstown Stud went to \$2.85 million to acquire nine-year-old Warm Mood (Alydar--Sunmmer Mood, by Raja Baba). In foal to Danzig, she was consigned to the sale by Taylor Made Sales Agency. "She's a very nice young mare," said Taylor Made's Duncan Taylor. "She's already thrown a Group 3 stakes winner and is in foal to one of the world's top stallions. What more could you ask for?" Rich Santulli's Jayeff B Stables was the underbidder on the two top lots, but he did manage to take home GI Gazelle H. winner Royal Indy (A.P. Indy) for \$1.65 million. She is a half sister to Preakness

SAINT FILLS THE ROBERTS' CUP Lemon Drop Kid may have cashed the healthiest check on Travers Day Aug. 28, but two-year-old Saints Cup (Saint Ballado) accounted for that day's most scintillating performance when defeating a solid group of maidens by 9 3/4 lengths in his only race to date. Consigned to the Keeneland November Sale as part of the Robert and Bea Roberts dispersal, the dark bay brought a final bid of \$850,000 from New York-based trainer Billy Badgett to top the list of those horses sold Sunday as racing prospects. The horse is to be owned in partnership by Peter Callaghan, owner of GI Futurity winner Bevo, and Barry Golden, who campaigned Mill Ridge stallion Golden Gear. Another runner from the Roberts' dispersal accounted for the second-highest lot, the stakes winning, graded stakes placed three-year-old filly Gold From the West (West by West). Consigned to the sale by trainer Stan Hough, acting as agent for the Roberts', the chestnut was knocked down for a final bid of \$575,000 from Rutledge Farm.

SEA HERO TO TURKEY 1993 Kentucky Derby winner Sea Hero (Polish Navy--Glowing Tribute, by Graustark), who went as hip number 207 at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, was purchased by the Turkey Jockey Club for \$700,000. Consigned by Lane's End Farm as part of the Estate of Paul Mellon dispersal, the nine-year-old stallion is the sire of GII San Rafael S. winner Desert Hero, and GISP Medievil Hero. He is also from a prolific female family that includes Hero's Honor, Glowing Honor, Wild Applause, Coronation Cup and others. The sales slip was signed by Jean-Pierre Deroubaix, President of the French Breeders' Association and a bloodstock agent for the Turkey Jockey Club. "We are thrilled. We like black-type winners with very good pedigrees and he is that. He won the Kentucky Derby. It will be a great thing for the Turkey Jockey Club. "We are surprised (at the price). We paid a lot less than we expected. We have both grass and dirt races in Turkey and he has the pedigree for both," said Deroubaix, who confirmed that Sea Hero would depart for Turkey in approximately three weeks. Once in Europe, Sea Hero is expected to cover about 40 to 45 mares a season.

CATINCA TOPS FASIG SALE GI Ruffian H. winner Catinca (Storm Cat) sold for a whopping \$2.8 million to easily top the one-session Fasig-Tipton November Selected Sale in Lexington, highlighted by the dispersal of the racing stock of Robert K. Waxman. Mrs. Betty Moran of Brushwood Stables signed the ticket for the four-year-old, whom Mrs. Moran will continue to race through at least her five-year-old season. John Kimmel will continue to train. "You love to have a Storm Cat in your broodmare band," said Moran. Duncan Taylor of Taylor Made Sales Agency consigned the filly. "I think Storm Cats are going to make great broodmares. They are going to be awesome and this is a good sign." In addition to Catinca, two-year-old Chancery Court (Seattle Slew) brought a final bid of \$575,000 from Kirkwood Thoroughbreds. Second in his career bow at Belmont Oct. 2, the bay colt returned to break his maiden at Aqueduct Oct. 27 by 2 3/4 lengths.

Germany's champion three-year-old filly last season, Elle Danzig claimed the G2 German 1000 Guineas and G2 Oaks, before adding the G2 Idee Hansa-Preis and the G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis. This year, she finished runner-up in the G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica at Rome May 16, to Central Park (Ire), the subsequent runner-up in the G1 Melbourne Cup. She took the G3 Spretl-Rennen at Baden-Baden Aug. 28, then finished fourth behind Diamond White (GB) in the G2 Prix de L'Opera at Longchamp Oct. 3. It had looked as if perhaps her best days were behind her, yet she bounced back with victory here, producing a thorough staying performance in heavy ground. She was always prominent with the pace, before her jockey opted after the bend to switch her across the track to the stands rail, where the ground was riding better. It proved a sound maneuver, as she hit the front a quarter-mile out before running away from the chasing pack. Only Handsome Ridge was able to throw down a challenge and he closed the gap in the final furlong, only for the filly to see him off and lengthen away again.

She settled behind pacemakers Party Queen (Gold Brose {Aus}) and Ambitious and traveled kindly throughout for Leith Innes. Rounding the home turn, Innes angled the gray filly into the clear, and while made to work hard for victory by Ambitious, she timed her run well to collect the trophy in a tight finish. Ad Alta had already tasted success in both a Listed race and a Group 2 race this season. She will now attempt to rewrite the history books by taking on the colts and geldings in the New Zealand 2000 Wednesday to complete a double that has never previously been achieved. Trainer Tony Gillies said, "We kept her for this meeting. She hadn't raced for five weeks, and if anything, I think that she will improve a lot."

As a Godolphin representative, Oriental Fashion knows all about visiting the various countries of Europe. After a decent third in the Listed Lupe S. at Goodwood May 19, she was sent on her travels to France, where she did not cover herself in glory at the first attempt, finishing last of three in the Listed Prix Amandine at Maisons-Lafitte June 28. She ran well enough as runner-up at Deauville in the Listed Prix de Lieurey on heavy ground Aug. 22, and entered this contest as the favorite to continue her connections' celebrations after their Breeders' Cup success the day before. After a tardy start, she moved up to mid-divison on the bend, and after tackling Alabama Jacks three furlongs out, it was soon clear that her turn of foot would be the undoing of the home defense. And so it proved, as she ran away, unchallenged, for an impressive win in her first try at Group company. Last year's winner, Midyan Call, was a distant third on ground that may have been too heavy for his liking, having last year set a course record over seven furlongs in a Listed race here on firm ground. That the racecourse moved the two big races so that Frankie Dettori could ride after traveling back from the United States is testament to Godolphin's influence worldwide.

BREEDERS' CUP WRAP UP

D. Wayne Lukas had saddled the winner of three Breeders' Cup races in one day and the top three finishers in one race, but hadn't saddled the winner of a Classic until sending out Cat Thief (Storm

Cat) to win Saturday's main event. "I don't think you can ever doubt the experience factor," Lukas said. "We really tried to time things out. I think we probably got this right on target." Cat Thief is to return to California and will contest the Strub series, which begins with the GI Malibu S. Dec. 26. Juvenile Fillies third Surfside (Seattle Slew) is done for the year, but Lukas said that Juvenile Fillies winner Cash Run (Seeking the Gold) could race again this year. "We'll look at something at Churchill Downs because that championship is up for grabs now." Another championship which is very much in disarray is that of older handicap horse, in light of the seventh-place peformance of favored Behrens (Pleasant Colony) in the Classic. "He (Behrens) is feeling a lot better than a lot of us up here," said Mark Shuman, assistant to trainer James Bond. "I don't think he got to run his race yesterday. He'll run next year, but we just don't know when," Shuman added. Trainer Bob Baffert reported that his soon-to-be three-year-old filly champion Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy), sixth in the Distaff, bled during the race. "That's not really an excuse. She just ran a flat race," he said. River Keen (Ire) (Keen {GB}), 11th in the Classic, was reported to be fine yesterday morning. "I don't think the foot was a problem," Baffert said referring to the quarter crack which has been plaguing River Keen. Alex Hassinger won his only other Breeders' Cup race at Gulfstream Park in 1992 with Eliza and reported that his Juvenile winner Anees (Unbridled) returned in good order from his effort. An appearance in the Dec. 18 GI Hollywood Futurity is possible, though unlikely, for Anees, according to Hassinger. Anees will begin his three-year-old campaign in California, but "we know he likes this track (Gulfstream), so maybe he'll come back for the Florida Derby," said the conditioner. Distaff heroine Beautiful Pleasure (Maudlin) cooled out well and was squealing and playing after her victory, according to trainer John Ward. "She is remarkable how fast she recovers from a race," he said. The four-year-old is likely to remain in training next year, Ward added.

How \$196 Becomes \$3 Million:

A group of Lexington, Kentucky, bettors pooled their resources and somehow managed to come up with the only correct Pick Six ticket at Saturday's Breeders' Cup, resulting in a payout of \$3 million for their \$196 investment. According to G. D. Hieronymous, a member of the syndicate, 16-18 people comprised the partnership, some of whom contributed as little as \$5 to the wager. The sequence featured only two favorites (Soaring Softly and Daylami) and two horses in excess of \$40 (Cat Thief and Anees).





KENDALL STILL UNCONSCIOUS AFTER FALL

Amateur rider Beverley Kendall, who suffered a horrific fall at Doncaster Saturday, remains in stable condition, although she has not yet regained consciousness. Kendall, 20, was partnering trainer Jack Berry's final runner, Best Of All (Ire), when she came down. Leading amateur jockey Lydia Pearce said yesterday that she may appeal against her disqualification from second place on King Priam (Ire), having been found responsible for the fall of Best Of All. The ruling, which included a six-day ban, means that Pearce loses out on the lady amateur riders' championship. "They've blamed me and I can't believe it. Something else has come across and clipped the heels of the horse that fell."

BRITISH PAIR REPORTED TO BE HONG KONG-BOUND

Reports in Hong Kong suggest that British-trained sprinters Rudi's Pet (Ire) (Don't Forget Me {GB}) and Tedburrow (GB) (Dowsing {USA}) have both been invited to take part at next month's International meeting.
