DANCE DESIGN TOPS KEENELAND

SCORCHER The last time Irish champion Dance Design (Ire) (Sadler's Wells--Elegance in Design {Ire} {Habitat}) went through a sale's ring, she fetched a world-record 2,500,000 guineas at Tattersalls. When she made her way into the ring towards the end of last night's sizzling second session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, fireworks seemed inevitable and she did not disappoint. Bloodstock agent Hugo Lascelles was forced up to \$4.7 million to purchase the six-year-old mare, in foal to A. P. Indy. Dance Design was part of the Padua Stables reduction. "I bought her for an English breeder," Lascelles said. "I can't say any more about it. She will remain here and be bred to American stallions. I don't know where yet and I don't know who we will breed her to." Of the price tag, the fifth highest for a broodmare, Lascelles added, "That was a tad more than what we had in mind." Also breaking the \$4-million plateau yesterday was the graded stakes winning mare Winglet (Alydar--Highest Trump (Bold Bidder)). In foal to Storm Cat and the already the dam of champion three-year-old Ajina (Strawberry Road {Aus}), Winglet was purchased for \$4.6 million by Coolmore's John Magnier. "She's beautiful," said Demi O'Byrne who signed the slip on behalf of Magnier. "She has everything you look for. She's absolutely fabulous. There are not many that you classify as exceptional, but she is." Leading the rest of the pack of million-plus mares was Lady Reiko (Ire) (Sadler's Wells--Willamae {Tentam}). In foal to Coronado's Quest, she brought \$2.1 million. The mare was consigned by Claiborne Farm, agent and Claiborne President Seth W. Hancock signed the sales slip as agent. "I was sitting down waiting for her to sell and Bruce Lunsford came in and sat down," explained Hancock. "He told me that he wanted to buy a really nice broodmare and I told him that this was the best mare that we had." By the end of the night, 15 mares and two weanlings had sold for \$1 million or more.

He is at home in Florida and was watching on the computer. I think he was very happy with the results."

Yesterday, Keeneland sold 277 horses for a sale's record \$99,318,000. The average was \$358,549 and the median was \$200,000. Asked if he was pleased with the frenetic session, Keeneland's Director of Sales W. B. Rogers Beasley said, "Absolutely. This is certainly a record for November. I know we've never done \$99 million in one day in November before. But I think it certainly helps having this sale right after the Breeders' Cup. Everybody is pumped up. The industry is pumped up." The 13-day sale continues today at 10 a.m.

Sadler's Wells Colt Tops Weanling Sales...

The top-priced weanling at the session was hip number 645L, Restoration (Sadler's Wells--Madame Est Sortie {Fr} {Longleat}). From the Padua reduction, the colt brought a final bid of \$1.4 million from Maurice Miller. The price tied Restoration as the second highest weanling colt ever sold at the Keeneland November sales. The other weanling to break into seven figures last night was hip number 468, a son of A.P. Indy-Lovlier Linda (Vigors). Paul Shanahan purchased the chestnut for \$1.3 million--fourth highest in sale's history. The colt, from the consignment of John R. Gaines Thoroughbreds, agent, is a full brother to MGSW Old Trieste. "He's a grand horse," Shanahan said. "We're planning on re-selling him as a yearling. We're planning on a public sale in July for this one."

SALE OF THE CENTURY

You've seen that slogan probably your whole life--"sale of the century"--but this time it's really true. It's the last Keeneland sale of the century and, after the first two days, it's firmly, irreversibly on course to break last year's record of \$264 million for the highest-grossing Thoroughbred horse sale of all time. Four dispersals totaled just a hair under \$40 million on Sunday--\$19 million more than last year's Fares dispersal on the corresponding Sunday--and yesterday's \$99.3-million session ran \$15 million ahead of the first Monday in 1998. If Monday's 17-percent gain in gross is repeated in all remaining sessions of the sale, this century's last and greatest Keeneland sale of all could see a \$300-million gross.

In any event, \$139,272,000 worth of horses have already been sold in the sale's first two days, including 23 horses already--21 mares and two weanlings--who have made over \$1 million. Of the six mares who brought over \$2 million, four were bought by John Magnier, though the narrow \$4.7-million saletopper (Dance Design), was bought by Hugo Lascelles, reportedly for British owner-breeder Martin Arbib. Seth Hancock signed for the sixth.

The performance of young sires at the sales is always watched with great attention and interest. Among those with their first weanlings being offered this year, 1997 Breeders' Cup Mile winner Spinning World has already made quite an impression: all seven of his foals offered in Books 1-2 were sold, none for less than \$210,000, with the two highest being well-bred fillies who brought \$575,000 and \$550,000. The seven Spinning World's through the end of yesterday's session averaged \$380,000. The only other stallion to have had as many as three sell so far is Boston Harbor (\$143,333 average for three), though Atticus, Langfuhr and Pulpit each had a

weanling sell for \$300,000 +. But Spinning World has definitely been the star of that particular show thus far. Even more dramatic has been the performance of Coronado's Quest as a covering sire. Three of the eight mares in foal to him brought \$1 million-plus, and his average for eight mares sold in foal is a staggering \$1,001,125. That must be a record for a first-year sire. The Stronach stallions Awesome Again and Touch Gold had quite a few sell--seven mares in foal to Awesome Again averaged \$275,000, and five in foal to Touch Gold averaged \$194,000.

Events over the next few days will help clarify the specific levels this sale will achieve, but it is about 98-percent certain to be the greatest horse sale of all times, judged by gross handle. So, early indications do suggest that we really are at the beginning of the Horse Sale of the Century.

A postscript to yesterday's edition which informed us that the sole winning Pick-6 ticket, worth over \$3 million, was won by a group from Lexington's Hammond Productions, and fronted by veteran (meaning he's been around for almost as long as me) cameraman and videographer G.D. Hieronimus. G.D.'s a real industry treasure. It's a really hard-working group, and it proved a popular topic of conversation at the sales. Don't spend it all on horses, guys. Well done.

The Breeders' Cup and Unbridled have certainly worked to their own mutual advantage. It was his win in the 1990 Breeders' Cup Classic which provided this son of Fappiano with his biggest paycheck on the track and Unbridled has continued to make his mark on the Cup through his progeny. He first struck at the 1995 meeting, when Unbridled's Song pegged back Hennessy for a neck win in the Juvenile, and he very nearly hit the winners' circle again last year, when Banshee Breeze missed by a nose in Escena's Distaff.

Unfortunately for Banshee Breeze, she again found one too good for her in Saturday's Distaff won by Beautiful Pleasure, which also featured Manistique, another of Unbridled's Grade I-winning daughters. However, Unbridled bounced back a few hours later when his son Anees showed a terrific turn of foot to come from last to first in the Juvenile.

As Unbridled is also the sire of Grindstone, winner of the 1996 Kentucky Derby, Unbridled has now sired five absolutely top-notch Grade I winners from as many crops, which means that leading breeders ignore him at their peril. The same applies to buyers at the sales. The Thoroughbred Corporation paid \$330,000 for Anees at last year's Keeneland September Sale, a sale which this year saw one of his sons realize \$2 million.

The problem is that Unbridled's five Grade I winners come from a total of only six graded stakes winners (his sixth being Unbridled Hope, winner of the GIII Ladies H. last year), and his career figures are inconsistent. While his percentage of Grade I winners compares

with those of such as Deputy Minister, Pleasant Colony and A.P. Indy, his overall percentage of graded winners (less than three percent) falls markedly short of those achieved by the superstar American stallions, such as Danzig, Storm Cat and Nureyev.

Perhaps Unbridled's figures will improve now that breeders have hard evidence on the track of what works and what doesn't. It is beginning to look as though inbreeding to Raise A Native is one of the things which does work. Boom Town Girl, a runner-up at Grade II and Grade III level, is out of a Raise A Native mare and is therefore inbred 4 x 2; Anees is out of an Alydar mare and is therefore inbred 4 x 3; and Unbridled Jet, recently beaten a nose in the GII Pegasus H., is out of a mare by Alydar's son Easy Goer. Red Chili Pepper, a smart Japanese filly, is also inbred 4 x 3 to Raise A Native.

While the inbreeding in Anees' pedigree may have helped, the colt has every right to be a top-notch performer. He comes from a magnificent female line tracing to the champion mare Vagrancy through her daughter Natasha and granddaughter Natashka. His dam Ivory Idol follows Touch of Greatness as the second unraced daughter of Ivory Wand to produce an important winner. Touch of Greatness' graded winners are the record-breaking miler Elusive Quality and the 1999 Irish juvenile Rossini (both products of the Mr. Prospector male line, as is Anees).

Ivory Wand, who won the Test S. in the days when it had Grade III status, was a half sister to Gregorian (G1), Truly Bound (GII), the classic-placed Arkadina (G3) and Blood Royal (G3). Ivory Wand produced the top European horse Gold And Ivory to Key To The Mint and her daughters Land of Ivory and Radiant have both done well as broodmares.

In view of this illustrious background, Mike Ryan did very well to pick up Anees' dam for only \$90,000 when she was sold by Rokeby Stables at Keeneland seven years ago. The price no doubt owed something to Ivory Idol's previous record, which included only one live foal over the previous four years. Now, together with Cat Thief's dam Train Robbery, Ivory Idol has given Alydar a live chance of ending the year as leading sire of broodmares.

The 53-year-old tenure of Messrs J P Botterill as the auctioneers at Ascot came to an inauspicious close yesterday with a sale that saw just two lots make more than 5,000 guineas. The first of the duo to be offered was Regardez-Moi (GB) (Distinctly North {USA}), who will be returning to Tony Carroll's stable under new ownership after realizing 7,200 guineas. Carroll said of the two-year-old, "She's a nice filly, but she won't be running on the all-weather, we'll keep her for next season." The second-highest price was the 6,600 guineas paid for novice hurdler Sherganzar (GB) (Shernazar {GB}) by trainer Dominic ffrench-Davis. After knocking down the hammer for the final time, auctioneer John Botterill, who has sold at Ascot for 36 years, said, "We would like to express our gratitude to all of our many clients past and present, a lot of whom are no longer with us, for all of the business they have put our way." The Ascot annual figures failed to reach one million guineas for the first time since 1975.
