#### A LYON IN LATE FALL

Spectators had to wait until late into Monday's session to see Dance Design (Ire) sell for \$4.7 million, so if they had to sleep in a little later Tuesday morning, they likely missed Advancing Star (Soviet Star--Fair Advantage (Raja Baba)) bring a final bid of \$3.2 million to top vesterday's third session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. The multiple graded stakes winning Advancing Star, in foal to Storm Cat, was consigned by Eaton Sales, agent and Frank and Jane Lyons of Summer Wind Equine LLC made the winning bid. "She was a great racehorse and she has a beautiful pedigree," said Frank Lyons. "We're looking to buy some top broodmares and sell commercially and she fits perfectly into our plans." Summer Wind Farm in Georgetown, Kentucky, is already the home of the Ingot Way and Evil Elaine, dams of Horses of the Year Skip Away and Favorite Trick, respectively. Lyons added that he and his wife were constantly looking to upgrade their 20-strong broodmare band and he didn't wait look to continue the process. The couple purchased the seven-year-old mare Ski Dancer (Baldski--Dance Song {Run Dusty Run}) from the consignment of Denali Stud for \$1.8 million. The two-time graded stakes winner, already the dam of a Boston Harbor weanling, is in foal to Mr. Prospector. During vesterday's session, Keeneland sold six mares for \$1 million or more.

Among the seven-figure mares was Lotta Dancing (Alydar--Lotka {Danzig}). The eight-year-old bay was consigned to the sale by Eaton Sales, agent and was purchased by Alex Scrope, agent, with a final bid of \$2.7 million. Lotta Dancing, who is in foal to Storm Cat, is a graded stakes winner. She has a yearling by Seattle Slew and a weanling by Pulpit. Another mare who broke the \$2-million mark is the four-year-old Dance Swiftly (Danzig--Classy 'n Smart {Smarten}). In foal to Gone West, the mare was purchased for \$2.4 million by the newly formed Bloodstock Advisory of Bill Casner and Kenny Troutt. Dance Swiftly, from the consignment of Anderson Farms, agent for Sam-Son Farm, is an unraced full sister to champion Dance Smartly and a half sister to Grade I winner Smart Strike (Mr. Prospector). "This is absolutely one tremendous family," said Casner, a former trainer. "She is by Danzig and she is one of the prettiest Danzigs that I've ever seen. We really, really like her. Plus, we think that Gone West is the heir apparent to Mr. Prospector. His foals are averaging a whole lot of money and we think he's the real deal." Two hips brought \$775,000 to top the weanlings sales at yesterday's session. Hip number 718, a daughter of Forest Wildcat--Raise the Standard (Hoist the Flag) was from the Brookdale Farm consignment and was purchased by Wertheimer Et Frere. The filly is a half sister to Coup de Folie, the dam of Machiavellian (GB) and Exit to Nowhere. Hip number 741, a son of Hennessy--Emmaus (Silver Deputy), was consigned by Nursery Place, agent and purchased by Indian Hill Farm. The 13-day sale continues today at 10 a.m.

#### THE BETTING IS ...

Last year, The Sale of the Century grossed \$264 million. Admittedly boosted by nearly \$20 million in dispersal sale revenue, this year's Keeneland November Sale has grossed \$210 million in three days. This sale is already 80 percent of the way to last year's record horse sale of All Time, and there are still 10 days to go! The question is not if, but when last year's gross will be passed, and just how far past \$300 million this sale will end up. The early betting forecast here is that the old record will fall Thursday or Friday, the sale will hit \$300 million over the weekend, and I'll take \$330 million (a conservative estimate, I think) as the final total. It's staggering.

Here's another staggering statistic: in 1993-- admittedly, the Thoroughbred market was at a very low point then--the entire Keeneland November sale grossed \$91 million. This year, the Monday session grossed \$99 million. That's in six years. Case closed. Next case.

All this, and again the Tuesday session was well below Monday's, grossing just under \$71 million. Keeneland sales director Rogers Beasley ascribed this to more of the larger Tuesday consignors selling more weanlings, which do not average as much as mares, whereas Monday's biggest consignors tend to sell, according to Beasley, more mares.

Though the momentum slowed a taste on Tuesday-- there were six million-dollar plus mares (taking the total to 21, including nine, I believe it is, for \$2 million plus)-- we have still seen some right impressive sire averages. The all-conquering Storm Cat has had three mares sell in foal to him: Winglet, for \$4.6 million (John Magnier); Advancing Star, \$3.2 million (Summer Wind); and Lotta Dancing, \$2.7 million (Alex Scrope). Average: \$3.5 million. Two more bought back.

Four other stallions have averaged between \$950,000 and \$1,050,000 (so let's say, around a million), for a total of 38 in-foal mares. Among them: Deputy Minister has averaged \$1,05 million for seven in-foal mares, two of those at \$1 million plus, including Retrospective (John Magnier). The late, great Mr. Prospector had 10 in-foal mares from his last covering season, age 29, average \$982,500, four of those at \$1 million plus. A.P. Indy has averaged over \$976,000 for 15 in-foal mares, his five seven-figure mares including the saletopping Dance Design (Hugo Lascelles, reportedly for Martin Arbib); and Gone West had six average \$950,000, though just one cracked seven figures, Dance Smartly's sister Dance Swiftly (Bloodstock Advisory Services).

First-year leader Coronado's Quest suffered a drop-off on Tuesday, when all four of the mares sold in foal to him brought between \$400,000-\$440,000. Twelve mares had sold in foal to him by the end of Tuesday's session--none for less than \$400,000--and had averaged \$806,667. That's a horse getting very good mares.

Monday sensation Spinning World also dropped off pretty good on Tuesday, when just five of 14 weanlings catalogued from his first crop eventually sold (four withdrawn, five not sold). Even so, the 12 sold so far have averaged \$282,917--over five times his stud fee, which is a pretty good statistic when you think we're talking about weanling average to stud fee, not yearling average. Pulpit, like Coronado's Quest a Claiborne stallion, did have a higher average (\$351,667), but with just three sold to the Ashford stallion's 12. Boston Harbor also sold well, his five averaging \$156,400-- over six times his '98 fee.

Coming into the race with a record of two wins from two starts, Texalina was taking a big leap in class but that did not detract racegoers from making her an oddson favorite. She had previously won two conditions races at, Chantilly Sept. 9, and Longchamp Oct. 10, and did not disappoint her supporters as she won in good style, going away from her rivals in the last half furlong. Texalina controlled the pace from the front, racing wide, and was followed by Acceleration and Tindari Maria, who were to prove her nearest challengers at the business end of the race. Danni La Rose (Fr) (Lycius) made her effort by cutting the corner and taking the shortest route to lead into the straight but her move was to no avail as Texalina was back in front, although under pressure, with 11/2 furlongs to run. Both Acceleration and Tindari Maria looked serious dangers entering the final furlong but Texalina soon had their measure and began to extend clear in the final 150 yards to pass the post a comfortable winner. In a battling finish for second Acceleration proved marginally the better.

#### **Cup Winner to Run Saturday:**

Melbourne Cup winner Rogan Josh (Aus) (Old Spice {Aus}) will end his spring campaign in Saturday's Aus\$500,000 G2 Sandown Classic (2400m). "I don't think the step back from two miles to 2,400m will be a problem," said jockey John Marshall. "He went from 2,000m of the G1 Mackinnon up to the two miles in the Cup and handled it well. He's hard fit--and (trainer) Bart (Cummings) wouldn't run him if he felt the horse wouldn't handle another run."

#### \$1.2 Million Colt Debuts:

Colombia (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), the Aus\$1.2 million full brother to Australian Horse of the Year Octagonal (NZ) and champion three-year-old Mouawad (NZ), will make his debut in the Baryshnikov H. at Sandown on Saturday. Trainer Lee Freedman said Colombia had "shown ability, but it's definitely a case of the longer the better for him. All we are trying to do at this stage is see where he is at, with the Autumn the prime objective. He will have a couple of starts and then be spelled."

#### **AJC to Oppose Restructuring:**

The Australian Jockey Club is expected to strongly oppose a radical restructuring of the NSW Thoroughbred Racing Board, the controlling body for the state's Aus\$4 billion a year racing industry. Legislation was introduced into State Parliament Monday night to slash board numbers from 10 to seven with AJC representation stripped from four to one. The Sydney Turf Club, which will have its representation cut from two to one, has welcomed the change. Sydney's two race club's voting power will be reduced from 50 percent on a board of 10 to 28 percent on a board of seven. The TRB took the reins of NSW racing from the AJC in the wake of the Temby Report into racing two years ago.

#### Desert Sun to Ireland:

Desert Sun (GB) (Green Desert--Solar {GB}, by Hotfoot {GB}) will serve northern hemisphere duties at Oak Lodge in Ireland at a fee to be announced, Victorian-based Eliza Park Stud spokesman Grant Morgan said yesterday. Desert Sun is best known as the sire of Cox Plate winner Sunline (NZ), but with his oldest crop aged four, the stallion is on a roll at present with recent winners Rose Of The Desert (NZ), Dazzling Bell (NZ), Real Time (NZ) and Thee Old Dragon (NZ).

#### BREEDERS' CUP WRAP-UP

The Mr. Prospector line confirmed itself as the most powerful male-line force in North American breeding with three Breeders' Cup victories Saturday which also underlined its reputation for precocity and speed, coming as they did in the Juvenile (Anees), Juvenile Fillies (Cash Run) and Sprint (Artax).

The remaining five races went five different ways. Storm Cat, who is battling with the older Deputy Minister to establish the most important North American branch of Northern Dancer's sire line, nailed down 1999 Leading General Sire with Cat Thief's victory in the Classic.

The "third force" of North American male lines, Hail to Reason, notched a tally when Soaring Softly, a daughter of the Roberto stallion Kris S., became the first ever winner of the Filly and Mare Turf event.

Bold Ruler, who appears in the male line of major winners almost exclusively through Seattle Slew these days, turned up through a less common route (Maudlin--Foolish Pleasure--What a Pleasure) in the male line of Distaff victress Beautiful Pleasure.

The two open grass events (the Turf and the Mile) went to descendents of stallions from the same immediate family. Daylami, probably the outstanding middle-distance turf horse in the world this year, is by Doyoun, a son of Mill Reef. Mill Reef's third dam is extremely closely related to the granddam of Blushing Groom, and mile hero Silic is by the Blushing Groom stallion Sillery.

The pedigrees of the Breeders' Cup winners revealed some tried and true patterns and some emerging ones. Among the most interesting in the latter category is Juvenile victor Anees (c, 2, Unbridled-Ivory Idol, by Alydar). Just last week we were noting that the Mr. Prospector/Alydar cross had supplied the first two home in the GII Pegasus S., with the sec ond home--Unbridled Jet--being bred on an identical Unbridled/Alydar cross to Anees. It looks as if the combination of these two similarly bred sons of Raise a Native (Mr. Prospector and Alydar) is going to be one worth persisting with.

That could be excellent news for the stud career of Breeders' Cup Classic winner Cat Thief (c, 3, Storm Cat--Train Robbery, by Alydar). His sire has a strong affinity for both Alydar and Mr. Prospector, and at least on pedigree Cat Thief, looks an ideal stallion to cross with that legion of Mr. Prospector line mares out there.

The Juvenile Fillies event was captured in game front-running style by Cash Run (f, 2, Seeking the Gold--Shared Interest, by Pleasant Colony). This is a beautifully structured pedigree as her third dam Bold Sequence is a three-quarters sister to Gold Digger, the dam of Mr. Prospector (sire of Seeking the Gold), so Cash Run has Gold Digger and Bold Sequence 3x3. She also has genetic relatives from the La Troienne family in Busanda (dam of Seeking the Gold's broodmare sire Buckpasser) and Better Self (broodmare sire of Dr. Fager, who in turn is sire of Cash Run's granddam). Oddly enough, on the same afternoon, the GII First Flight H. was taken by Country Hideaway (f, 3, Seeking the Gold--Our Country Place, by Pleasant Colony), who is not only bred on an identical cross to Cash Run, but is also inbred 2x4 to Mr. Prospector (sire of her third dam, champion sprinter Gold Beauty). Incidentally, of the first four unrestricted stakes winners sired by Mr. Prospectorline stallions out of Pleasant Colony mares, three are by Seeking the Gold.

The third Mr. Prospector-line Breeders' Cup winner, Artax (c, 4, Marquetry--Raging Apalachee, by Apalachee), is building a reputation as one of the fastest horses since the days of Dr. Fager, a horse who just happens to appear as sire of Artax's second dam. He is also a reminder that Apalachee is a very underrated broodmare sire, and one who seems to be able to transmit considerable speed through his daughters. Artax has Polynesian (himself a champion sprinter) and Nasrullah focused through his greatgrandsire Mr. Prospector (the horse whose track record Artax tied in the Sprint) and through Power Ruler, sire of his third dam. The Nasrullah influence is extremely strong in Artax as he not only has two crosses of Nasrullah via Bold Ruler (another champion sprinter), but three other crosses through Nashua, Never Bend and Nantallah, a trio who are also somewhat related to each other on the distaff side.

Having appeared together in Artax, Bold Ruler and Dr. Fager are also in tandem in the pedigree of Maudlin, sire

of Beautiful Pleasure (f, 4, Maudlin--Beautiful Bid, by Baldski). Beautiful Pleasure is a full sister to the \$2,470,550 earner Mecke, and this pair have an unusual variation on the Tom Fool/Nijinsky theme. Maudlin's sire Foolish Pleasure is out of a mare by Tom Fool (a horse to whom he bore considerable resemblence). The broodmare sire Baldski is a son of Nijinsky II. This Foolish Pleasure/Nijinsky II combination is turning out to be a very useful little cross and the pair are also found in Group 1 winner Caitano, and other stakes winners Strelka, Basse Besogne, Adel, Street Theatre, Too Cool Too Fool, Cupid and Shereefa.

Another variation on a very common theme is that found in the pedigree of Silic (Fr) (c, 4, Sillery-- Balletomane {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells). We all know that Sadler's Wells--who is out of a mare by Bold Reason-has worked phenomenally well with mares carrying Bold Reason's half brother Never Bend. Now the reverse cross--stallions carrying Never Bend over Sadler's Wells mares--is beginning to score significant victories. In fact, Silic--whose sire Sillery is by Blushing Groom and has Never Bend through Riverman--is one of at least 10 stakes winners bred on the pattern, this group making up around a third of the stakes winners produced by Sadler's Wells mares to date.

The inaugural Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf secured a championship for Soaring Softly (f, 4, Kris S.--Wings of Grace, by Key to the Mint). A member of the great Darby Dan family which traces to her third dam Soaring, Soaring Softly is inbred 3x4 to Princequillo. He appears as broodmare sire of both Kris S. and Key to the Mint. As we have said before, we think the pattern of inbreeding to the broodmare sire of a sire can frequently be a good one, and it certainly seems to do the job for Kris S., as it is found in around 40 percent of his unrestricted stakes winners, including group or graded stakes winners Cheval Volant, Diamond on the Run, Adonis, Midnight Line, Dr Fong, Peshtigo and Lyin to the Moon.

Princequillo is also a feature in the pedigree of Daylami (Ire) (h, 5, Doyoun {Ire}--Daltawa {Ire}, by Miswaki), who triumphed in the Breeders' Cup Turf. Daylami is an Aga Khan bred, so we can expect an interesting pattern. Here we see Nasrullah/Princequillo crosses through Mill Reef in the male line and through Rose Bower as the granddam Miswaki. To these is added a strain of Prince Taj, who is by Prince Bio (a son of Princequillo's sire Prince Rose) out of Malindi (a full sister to Rivaz). Daylami is yet another example of the Aga Khan's program producing a major winner by a stallion outside breeders almost totally ignored.

2000 SANTA ANITA DERBY WORTH \$1M Santa Anita released a 1999-2000 stakes schedule worth \$11.5 million, yesterday. The track's centerpiece, the GI Santa Anita Derby, will be worth \$1 million when it is run for the 68th time on Apr. 8. Sharing the spotlight during the 87-day meet is the Mar. 4 GI Santa Anita H., also worth \$1 million. "We are pleased that Santa Anita's first meeting of the new century will feature more \$100,000 or greater stakes races than any track in the nation," said Lonny Powell, Santa Anita's president and chief executive officer. "We also believe that no track can match the history, tradition and importance of our two \$1 million signature races."
