#### YOUNG GUN TOPS KEENELAND DAY FOUR

The Keeneland November Sale continued to steamroll its way towards a record and even though day four did not produce the fireworks of the first three sessions, steady trade ensued to produce an average of over \$93,000 and a median of \$72,000. For the first time during the sale, a weanling topped the day's ledger as hip number 1320, a colt by GI Oaklawn H. winner and mile world-record holder Atticus brought a final bid of \$400,000 from Russell Jones of Walnut Green Farm. "This was the best one of the day for me," said Jones. "I bought her for Hickory Tree Farm in Virginia and they are into racing. They have horses with Bill Mott. I guess we'll se what happens." Out of Seattle Surprise (Seattle Slew), a half sister to Lovlier Linda, the dam of recently retired Old Trieste, the filly is herself a half sister to GIII Thoroughbred Club of America S. winner Surprising Fact. A pair of broodmares accounted for the afternoon's co-second highest lot. Consigned by Eaton Sales, hip number 1175, Helwa (Silver Hawk), sold for \$350,000 to John Mabee of Golden Eagle Farms. Pointing out the fact that the filly is in foal to Spinning World, Mabee commented, "I think that helps. Plus, there is a full sister to this mare that has won two races in Ireland and I understand they are they are very high on (her). That is an update in the catalog and it shows me the family is live right now." Helwa is out of Team Colors, a full sister to the great undefeated racemare Personal Ensign. Also selling for \$350,000 was six-year-old Signoretta (El Gran Senor) to the successful bid of J.M.J. Stables Corporation. Consigned to the sale by Pegasus Stud/Nardelli Sales as agent, the chestnut is in foal to Silver Hawk from an April 1 cover. The 13-day sale continues this morning at 10 a.m.

**ALMUTAWAKEL TO REMAIN IN U.S. Dubai** World Cup winner Almutawakel (Machiavellian) was shipped to Shadwell Farm in Lexington after his fifthplace finish in Saturday's Breeders' Cup Classic and is expected to remain there for two weeks before heading back to Florida to prepare for an American campaign next year. "He's obviously a dirt horse," said Rick Nichols, manager of Shadwell's North American operations. Nichols indicated that plans call for the four-yearold to join the Shadwell stallion roster in 2001. "Since he is a dirt horse, we need to stand him in America and we would really like him to win a Grade I in America before he goes to stud," Nichols added. The likely first seasonal start for the Sheikh Hamdan-owned colt is the Feb. 6 GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park. A North American trainer for Almutawakel will be announced shortly. according to Nichols.

Great stallions ought to become great broodmare sires, if only because their daughters which excel on the track will be given access to all the best stallions. It was no surprise, then, to see Sadler's Wells ranked as high as joint-fourth on TDN's recent list of leading broodmare sires of 1999 unrestricted SWs, even though, at 18, he is the youngest of the 21 stallions on the list.

However, a closer look at Sadler's Wells' record reveals that his success as a broodmare sire isn't based solely on his most talented racemares. In fact the reverse is almost true, because his current success owes a great deal to daughters which failed to earn black type.

When Silic edged home in Saturday's Breeders' Cup Mile, he moved Sadler's Wells into first place on the list of broodmare sires of 1999 Gl winners, with a total of five. The four other G1 winners are Dark Moondancer (Prix Ganay and Gran Premio di Milano), El Condor Pasa (Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud), Diktat (Prix Maurice de Gheest and Stanley Leisure Sprint Cup) and Sumati (Gran Premio del Jockey Club).

It makes a revealing exercise to look at the racing records of the dams of these winners. Timeform, the respected British handicappers who normally rate horses on a scale of up to 133, rated Sumati's dam Swell Time as low as 30, while Turform, the Irish counterpart to Timeform, gave a rating of only 45 to El Condor Pasa's dam Saddlers Gal. Silic's dam Balletomane managed to win at the low-grade Catterick track, earning a Timeform rating of 80, and Diktat's dam Arvola, another maiden race winner, was rated 75. Dark Moondancer's dam Oh So Well never raced after making only 25,000 guineas as a yearling, which was roughly a quarter of Sadler's Wells' fee at the time of her conception.

These five mares come from impressive female lines but they haven't all had success handed to them on a plate as broodmares. Oh So Well produced Dark Moondancer to Anshan, a stallion whose 1994 fee was only £2,500, and it was Balletomane's mating with Sillery, at a fee of 50,000 FF (around \$8,200), which produced Silic.

Is it any wonder, after these outstanding results, that Sadler's Wells' stakes-winning daughters Dance Design and Lady Reiko sold for \$4,700,000 and \$2,100,000 respectively at Keeneland on Monday?

Silic is one of four Group or Graded Stakes winners that Sadler's Wells mares have produced to stallions from the Blushing Groom male line. He is the best winner so far by Sillery, a son of two classic-winning parents. Although Sillery didn't rise to classic heights, he became a G1 winner in the 1991 Prix Jean Prat over 9.2 furlongs and later failed by only a head to catch Zoman in the GI Budweiser International at Laurel. He was also tough and determined, as his record of seven wins and six seconds from 18 starts testifies, and Silic seems to have inherited these qualities.

Sold as hip number 160, the bay, in foal to 1998 Breeders' Cup Classic winner Awesome Again, was purchased by Miller Thoroughbred. The evening's second-highest lot followed immediately thereafter when hip 161, threeyear-old Indy Bold (A.P. Indy) went for \$330,000 in foal to the 1996 Breeders' Cup Classic hero Alphabet Soup to agent Buzz Chace, who signed the ticket for Daniel Borislow. A total of 58 lots sold for \$3,930,000 for an average of \$67,759.

## SO, WHO'S HORSE OF THE YEAR? By Bill Handleman

The Breeders' Cup ends, the real campaigning begins. From now until the end of December, when the ballots are cast, arguments will be breaking out like brushfires across the racing landscape. Only this year they might not be able to put out the raging debates. Not even if they hose down the advocates for the various candidates. That's because all the candidates for Horse of the Year come in with such weak credentials.

This may be the worse year ever, worse than 1991 when they had to give it to Black Tie Affair by default. The moment Cat Thief hit the wire in the Breeders' Cup Classic, you just knew there was trouble ahead.

With Silver Charm, Victory Gallop, Real Quiet and Mazel Trick all retired, Behrens was the only older horse left standing. And after he ran seventh in the Classic, he wasn't standing too damned tall. Finish the year by losing three straight races, and normally you can forget about Horse of the Year. Of course these are hardly normal circumstances. A look at the candidates...

- •Artax (Marquetry)? Granted he broke two track records and tied another, records held by the likes of Dr. Fager, Groovy and Mr. Prospector, but when was the last time a sprinter won Horse of the Year? How about never. Housebuster might have won it had he not finished ninth in the 1991 Sprint, and Groovy certainly would have received some consideration had he won the race in '87. But aside from those two, what sprinter has ever stirred anyone's Horse of the Year fancy?
- •Charismatic (Summer Squall)? Won the Derby, won the Preakness, broke down in the Belmont, and that was it, unless you count the Lexington, a losers-bracket type affair, and the \$62,500 claiming race he won by disqualification. Besides which, how good was this 3-year-old class? Not very, not unless you happen to think the group was somehow validated by Cat Thief's victory in the wacky Classic. If that's the case, I suggest you seek professional help.
- •Victory Gallop (Cryptoclearance)? Won the best race of the year, running down Behrens in the Whitney, then got hurt. Other than the Whitney he won the Stephen Foster and an allowance race. Let's put it this way: He's a tough sell. (Handleman cont. p6)

- Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy)? Where was she the day of the Breeders' Cup? They're still looking for her. Had she won the Distaff, considering how Behrens ran later that day, she would have been Horse of the Year. hands down. But now that she has been badly beaten two times in a row, she's not such a hot property anymore.
- •Beautiful Pleasure (Maudlin)? She won the Distaff, she won her last three races, all Grade I stakes, she finished the year with a bang. The problem? She's a she. The last filly to be named Horse of the Year was Lady's Secret, in 1986.
- •Soaring Softly (Kris S.)? If you think Beautiful Pleasure is up against it, what about this one? She's a filly (ital)and(end) a grass horse. That's two strikes, and the ump behind the plate is giving the pitcher anything remotely close to the plate. Yet Soaring Softly has done nothing wrong this year. She is 7-for-8, she has won back-to-back Grade I stakes, and you could see her coming all the way back in May when she destroyed a field in the Sheepshead Bay by 5 1/2 lengths. "It says Horse of the Year," notes her trainer, Jim Toner. "It doesn't say Colt of the Year, it doesn't say Filly of the Year, It's best horse, from March to November. So why not?" A good question.

● Daylami (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire})? Unless the Godolphin people decide to run him in another American race between now and the end of the year, there's no way he can be Horse of the Year, no matter how impressive he was at Gulfstream. While there's still the Hollywood Turf Cup to consider, it's generally assumed the Sheikh has better things to do with his time. If he couldn't make it here for the Breeders' Cup, why would he bother sending this horse halfway around the world to run in California seven weeks from now?

Meanwhile, D. Wayne Lukas was still keeping his mouth shut, so as not to offend anyone. Namely Bob and Beverly Lewis, who own Charismatic, and Bill Young, who owns Cat Thief.

So who's going to wind up with the grand prize then? Well, from preliminary samplings, it looks like it might come down to Artax, the record smasher, and Charismatic, the sentimental favorite.

Who deserves it? Probably Soaring Softly. But she won't get it.

See what happens when you slap a nasal strip on Cat Thief and turn him loose on a speed-favoring, rail-biased track?

A strong team of British horses has been invited to take part in next month's Hong Kong International races, among them two-time G1 Dubai Champion S. winner Alborada (GB) (Alzao {USA}), Gl Canadian International runner-up Fruits Of Love (USA) (Hansel {USA}), Docksider (USA) (Diesis {GB}), third in the Breeders' Cup Mile, MG1SW Silver Patriarch (GB) (Saddlers' Hall {Ire}) and Irish champion sprinter Tedburrow (GB) (Dowsing {USA}). The four races are held at Sha Tin raceourse on Dec. 12.

#### **Jockey Sponsorship Rule Change:**

The rules governing when jockeys are allowed to sport advertising logos in racing are scheduled to change on Feb. 1, the British Horseracing Board announced vesterday. At present, owners choose either to take part in the scheme in its entirety or otherwise register a right of non-participation. Many owners registered their non-participation because of concerns that future sponsors would be unacceptable to them. BHB communications director Peter Bell said: "A number of owners have said they would welcome the opportunity to take part in jockeys' sponsorship if their participation could be limited to known group sponsors, such as the Tote. From the jockeys' point of view the new rule obviously has the potential to increase the number of owners taking part in the scheme and thus to increase sponsorship income."
