BELL RINGS UP SALE TOPPER ON KEENELAND DAY FIVE

Reynolds Bell Jr. is used to purchasing high-priced horses for high-powered clients with high-flying checkbooks. He was back in action Thursday, but he may have been flying solo. Bell purchased Bonnie Byerly (Dayjur), in foal to the hot young sire Unbridled, for \$410,000 to top the action on day five of Keeneland's mammoth November Breeding Stock Sale. The purchase was for a group led by Bell. "I really don't know," he said with a smile when asked for whom he was buying the mare for. "It might be for me. But I just thought there was too much here to let her go by. She has a lot going for her." So did most of the horses that were led through the Keeneland sales pavilion Thursday. When the day was done, Keeneland had sold 270 horses for \$20,959,200, an average of \$77,627 and a median of \$57,000. After five days, Keeneland has sold 1,360 horses for \$256,478,200. The overall average stands at \$188,587 with the median at \$90,000. Bonnie Byerly is out of Plenty of Grace, who won eight races, including the GI Yellow Ribbon Invitational S., earning over \$744,000. Second dam Wings of Grace is also the dam of Soaring Softly (Kris S.), the mare who just won the inaugural running of the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf. The top weanling was Hip 1672, a colt by Forest Wildcat--Platinum Punch, by Two Punch, purchased by bloodstock agent Buzz Chace for \$340,000. Forest Wildcat won the Grade III Finger Lakes Breeders' Cup and the Grade III Maryland Breeders' Cup, equaling the track record for six furlongs in 1:09, and earned more than \$478,000. A son of Storm Cat, Forest Wildcat also equaled the track record for six furlongs at Pimlico in winning the Ben Cohen S. in 1:09. His first foals are yearlings of 1999. "He took your breath away from the day he was born. He was absolutely beautiful," said David Hayden, who operates Dark Hollow Farm in Maryland and raised the weanling. "We were not surprised at all by the price. He is a very, very correct and good-looking colt and there were a lot of people that came to look as soon as he got off the van. He really was the center of attention at the barn since he arrived. He is the fifth \$300,000 or better sale that we've had out of mares that cost less than \$12,000." (Sales Statistics P. 2)

Best of Luck rallied up the center of the track for his first score since capturing the GII Peter Pan S. at Belmont May 23. The colt finished fourth in the GI Belmont S. before getting a freshening and returned with a fourth in the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga Aug. 8. Fifth in the GI Travers, the sophomore colt tried the turf to no avail, finishing seventh in a Belmont allowance Sept. 24. Back on the main track, he returned to form with a sharp second to Durmiente in an allowance Oct. 14 and rallied for the place spot behind Adonis in the GIII Discovery H. Oct. 27. Unhurried early, the bay colt settled near the rail, 10 lengths off Tejano Couture's early fractions. Responding to jockey Mike Smith's urging, he picked up the beat on the backstretch, came wide for the drive and just got up in the final yards. "This was his last start of the year," said trainer Allen Jerkens. "He's come around a little bit lately and it's nice to win against older horses."

John's Call made a wide move to notch the first graded stakes victory of his career. The eight-year-old had enjoyed a successful season, finishing unplaced only once when fourth in the GII Bernard Baruch at Saratoga July 30. Disqualified and placed second in the Sussex H. at Delaware Sept. 6, he returned with a sharp score in the Bald Eagle Breeders' Cup H. over this course Oct. 24. Heavily favored here, he rated patiently between rivals through a mile in 1:44 1/5 over the yielding ground and was taken four wide through the final turn. Set down for the drive, he accelerated sharply and came home impressively. "I was a little concerned about the distance," said trainer Tommy Voss. "We'll point for some graded races again next year, but I don't think he's quite up to Breeders' Cup material. He had a year off after winning two jump races. He bowed a tendon and didn't come back until he was five."

Unraced when under the care of David Loder last year, Neptune's Bride's first six runs this term had vielded four wins, two in Class A provincial conditions events and two in stakes company. After winning the listed Prix Occitanie at Toulouse Sept. 19, the filly traveled to Milan, where she finished a game third in the Oct. 17 G3 Premio Bagutta. That performance stood her in good stead, and she returned to the scene of her most recent win to record her first win at group level with a strong late run despite experiencing traffic problems. Exit To Ville (Exit to Nowhere), acting as pacemaker for Kadance Ville (Kaldoun (Fr)) went straight to the front and led from Histoire Sainte (Kendor {Fr}) and Sinueuse (Fabulous Dancer), as Intuition raced in midfield ahead of Bela-M and Neptune's Bride. Inside the final furlong, Neptune's Bride became stuck behind a wall of horses, but finally found racing room with half a furlong to run, and finished fast to claim the lead in the dying strides for a deserved win. Winning trainer Henri-Alex Pantall said, "She is supposed to continue her career in America, where she could become a top filly. We are proud of the job we have done with her as she was guite difficult in the beginning. She has gained confidence with time and she might still have some improvement in her."

RECORD FALLS TODAY ... YOUNG SIRE REPORT

Janet Patton, who's covering the sale for the Lexington *Herald-Leader*, has been keeping the townsfolk informed of the Sale of the Century's inexorable progress to the all-time horse sale revenue record ... today's the day, Janet. At the close of business yesterday, the Keeneland gross for the first five days was \$256 million, so once today hits \$9 million, the whole thing's uncharted waters. It's a hugely impressive performance, even in the context of the overall economic performance world-wide which has undoubtedly fueled (if not totally financed) the current horse boom, so a word of congratulations to the Keeneland team, from Ted Bassett, Bill Greely, Rogers Beasley, and Tom Caldwell on down ... you're a late 20th-century Institution, you are. So bring on 21.

Time to review the young sires so far, Keeneland's first three books plus the two Fasig sales, through yesterday. Thirteen stallions have had two or more sell from their first crops, foals of 1999 so far. Pulpit (Claiborne) has the highest average (\$355,000), but with just three sold. Spinning World (Ashford) has had 14 sell, from 20 offered, and has averaged \$274,643, which I reckon just abut puts the two of them level as the F99's top two. Atticus (Three Chimneys) claims third spot, as a couple of big sales propelled him to a \$161,500 average (for 6), but, again, Boston Harbor (Overbrook) had 11-of-11 sold and averaged an equally impressive \$141,545. Siphon (Airdrie) rounds out the top five, selling nine-for-nine and averaging \$110,222, more than seven times his 1998 fee. Then come: 6-Langfuhr (8/\$99,000), 7-Smoke Glacken (3/\$89,000), 8-Marlin (2/\$62,500), 9-Louis Quatorze (6/\$60,500), 10-Alphabet Soup (3/\$56,667), 11-Editor's Note (4/\$48,000), with 12-Benny the Dip (2/\$18,500) and 13-Top Account (5/\$13,600) tailing the field at this point.

Nineteen stallions have had two or more in-foal mares sell from their first coverings season, and here Coronado's Quest (Claiborne) distances the field, with 12 in-foal mares averaging \$806,667. Of course, we must remember in-foal mare averages really gauge more the kind of mare the stallion is getting, whereas foals on the ground determine weanling averages. Two of Adena Springs' first-year sires are among this group's top four in average: Awesome Again, second (11/\$290,000), and Touch Gold, fourth (11/\$194,545). These are split by Swain (4/\$276,250). Then follow: 5-Banker's Gold (5/\$159,000, one for \$500,000, four others averaging \$73,750), 6-Skip Away (5/\$153,000, four not sold), 7-Deputy Commander (10/\$150,200), 8-Favorite Trick (8/\$138,875), 9-King of Kings (5/\$126,000, six not sold), 10-Grand Slam (15/\$119,733), 11-Arch (2/\$113,500), 12-Gentlemen (3/\$110,000), 13-Tale of the Cat (11/\$89,364), 14-Elusive Quality (2/\$86,500), 15-Souvenir Copy (3/\$79,667), 16-Wild Rush (8/\$71,750), 17-Joyeux Danseur (4/\$65,000), with 18-Lucky Lionel (4/\$28,250) and 19-Indian Charlie (2/\$28,000) thus far tailing this field. These in-foal averages are subject to revision if any mares which slipped need to be subtracted.

In a \$256 million market, total sales of 80 weanlings by first-crop foal sires (\$10.6 million) and 130 mares in foal to first-year stallions (\$25.8 million) have actually accounted for only about 13 percent of total revenues. But it's also true that in a market at or approaching a peak (or a trough), it is often meaningful if a stallion makes a strong impression one way or the other. Spinning World, Boston Harbor, and Siphon have had 34 weanlings from their first crops sell among the three of them, and have made a good impression. It's tougher to pinpoint those with their first mares in foal, but certainly Coronado's Quest got some cracking mares, and it looks as though Swain is going to be highly sought after, though, like Pulpit among those with first foals, there may not be so many offered at auction. I also thought a lot of those first-year sires (with first mares in foal) evidently didn't get such great mares -- judging, at least, from those in the sale.

Lucavan Prince (USA) (Fast Play {USA}--Now That's Funny {USA}, by Saratoga Six {USA}) will join the 2000 stallion roster at Tweenhills Farm and Stud in Gloucestershire. The champion three-year-old sprinter of 1996 won the G3 Jersey S. at Ascot and was second in the G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket. He was named Irish champion sprinter the following year and was moved to North America during 1997, running second in the GI Cigar Mile H. at Aqueduct. "He had everything you that you looked for in a top-class horse," said trainer David Loder. "He had the precocity to win a Newmarket two-year-old maiden in April and the physique to become a Group 1 performer at three and four years over any distance between six and eight furlongs. As the highest-rated horse to retire to stud in Britain this year, he must be a leading contender for champion first-season sire of 2003." The six-year-old retires with six wins in 32 starts and earnings of £245,568. He will stand for £2,750, Oct. 1 terms.

BREEDER PETER WINFIELD PASSES AWAY

Flat racing lost one of its best-loved owner-breeders yesterday when Peter Winfield died at the age of 72, having succumbed to his battle against cancer fought over the past 18 months. Winfield was best known as the owner-breeders of Silver Patriarch (GB) (Saddler's Hall {Ire}), who lost out to Benny the Dip (USA) (Silver Hawk {USA}) in the 1997 G1 Derby, and later that year took the G1 St Leger at Doncaster. Winfield began breeding in his retirement in 1988. He bought Silver Patriarch's dam Early Rising (USA) (Grey Dawn II (Fr)) for \$160,000 in the Paul Mellon dispersal at Keeneland November that year. Silver Patriarch's trainer John Dunlop said, "Peter Winfield was not only the perfect owner for over 20 years, but he and his whole family became great friends and supporters of all of us at Arundel. He was a sportsman in the truest sense of the word, a hugely enthusiastic winner and, more importantly, an understanding and generous loser, which was so apparent after the heartbreakingly narrow defeat of Silver Patriarch in the Derby."

TOTE TO BE PUT IN A TRUST

Agreement was reached yesterday over the proposed formation of a Racing Trust to safeguard the future of the Tote. The British Horseracing Board and Tote will make a joint submission to the government centering on the formation of a new company, Tote plc, which would own the license to run pool betting on horse racing as long as the Racing Trust retains 100 percent of the company's issued equity. There would be eight trustees on the Racing Trust, one each nominated by the BHB, Industry Committee (Horseracing), Jockey Club, Racecourse Association, Racehorse Owners' Association, the staff of the Tote, an independent chairman nominated by the Trustees and an additional representative of punters' interests. "It has taken some hard negotiations to determine what was best for all parties," said Tote chairman Peter Jones. "It has always been our priority to achieve consensus about the best way forward and we hope the Government will look favorably on the structure we submitted to them today."
