ALFRED VANDERBILT DEAD Alfred Gwynne Vanderbilt, a driving force behind American racing for much of this century, died at his Mill Neck, New York home vesterday morning. He was 87. Vanderbilt had just returned from his daily visit to Belmont Park where he watched his horses work, when he died. A former chairman of the New York Racing Association, he was a founder of NYRA's predecessor, the Greater New York Association. He was also president of the Westchester Racing Association, which operated Belmont Park in 1940 and 1941 and president of Pimlico from 1938-42. Vanderbilt, born in London in 1912, was enjoyed racing success right from the start when his first horse Discovery won the Brooklyn H. three years running (1934-36). Native Dancer, a descendant of Discovery, became the sport's first televsion hero when he won 21 of 22 starts. His lone loss was in the 1953 Kentucky Derby, but he came back to win that year's Preakness and Belmont and was named the 1954 Horse of the Year. Other racing stars who carried Vanderbilt's cerise and white diamonds include Bed o' Roses, Find, Gash, Local Problem, Loser Weeper, Next Move, Over the Brink, Social Outcast, Tall Glass o' Water, Traitor and Upon My Soul. Vanderbilt was awarded the Silver Star in the Pacific during World War Il and received a Presidential unit citation. He was elected a member of The Jockey Club in 1935 and served as president of the Thoroughhred Owners and Breeders Association. Vanderbilt is surved by his sons Alfred, Jr. and Michael and his daughters Heidi, Wendy and Victoria. Funeral details are pending.

RECORD FALLS AT KEENELAND Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale set a new world record Friday, surpassing the previous mark set last November. Through the first six days of the auction, Keeneland has generated \$271,672,200 million in gross sales, topping last year's record of \$264,657,700, set over the course of a 14-day sale. "This is a wonderful milestone for Keeneland," said W. Rogers Beasley, Keeneland's director of sales. "We anticipated a strong sale, but to break a record on only the sixth day of the sale is tremendous. And, we have a number of outstanding mares and foals still to go through the auction ring." Beasley attributed the strong sale to a combination of factors. "First and foremost, this is a testament to the quality of the horses we're selling," said Beasley. "Also, when the economy--both domestic and worldwide--is strong, it has a positive impact on our sales." Continuing the strong showing by weanlings at the 1999 sale, Friday's session topper was a son of Silver Deputy purchased by Atlantic Venture. His dam, the winning Relaunch mare Attractive Missile, is a half sister to G2 winner Andros Bay. Two mares brought bids of \$210,000: G2placed Forest Treasure (Ire), in foal to Woodman; and the unraced Alysheba mare Sheba's Step, in foal to Tale of the Cat. Forest Treasure, a half sister to Glplaced Santella Mac, was purchased by Walnut Green Bloodstock. Sheba's Step, produced from GI winner Pattern Step, was sold to Arch Bloodstock LLC. The 13-day sale continues this morning at 10 a.m. (Keeneland Results p.2)

Free Vacation won the Breeders' S., the final leg of the Canadian Triple Crown, in August and added another restricted stakes victory when she returned to the races in October. Buzz Lightyear broke in stride and raced aggressively to get to the lead ahead of Dazzling Belle and Thee Old Dragon. He settled well, and by the straight he and Thee Old Dragon had put a few lengths on the chasing field. The pair were side by side at the top of the straight before Buzz Lightyear kicked away to win comfortably with favorite Ad Alta, who had won the 1,000 Guineas just four days earlier, running home well for third. Part-owner Terry Jarvis, who races the colt with his sons, was confident that 'Buzz' could see off Thee Old Dragon. "I thought at the 300 meters [jockey] Opie [Bosson] was just sitting on him and the other horse was under the whip", he said. "I thought he should get home from there." Buzz Lightyear is the first G1 winner for his sire Gold Brose (Aus) (Huntingdale {Ire}), who stands at Russell Warwick's Westbury Farm in the Waikato, New Zealand. Buzz Lightyear's next mission is the G1 NZ\$150,000 Bayer Classic Nov. 25 at Otaki. The win was the ninth Group 1 for star apprentice Bosson, who won the race last year on Danske (NZ).

Invitations for the foreign runners in the four Hong Kong international races, to be run Dec. 12 at Sha Tin, were announced yesterday. Val's Prince (Eternal Prince) will make a return trip to the Far East for the G1 Hong Kong Cup at 1 1/4 miles, a race he won in 1997. Val's Prince was a disappointing 11th in the Breeders' Cup Turf in his last start. He could face dual G1 Champion S. winner Alborada (GB) (Alzao). Jim And Tonic (Fr) (Double Bed {Fr}), France's top miler, has also been selected to take part in the Hong Kong Cup, after a disappointing ninth behind Silic in the Breeders' Cup Mile. Jim And Tonic won the seven-furlong Hong Kong Bowl last year. Silic (Fr) (Sillery), winner of the Breeders' Cup Mile, will be heading to Hong Kong after accepting an invitation to compete in the G2 Hong Kong Mile, while Breeders' Cup Turf third Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher) heads the guest list for the 1 1/2-mile G2 Hong Vase.

STRONACH AND NTRA--ROUND TWO Less than a week after saying that he was considering pulling his five tracks from the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, Frank Stronach has reversed that opinion, the Daily Racing Form reported yesterday. "We will in all likelihood stay in," Stronach said. "A national organization is very important." At a press conference just prior to the Breeders' Cup, Stronach said that his tracks--Gulfstream, Santa Anita, Thistledown, Remington and Golden Gate--would be withdrawn because the NTRA "had veered out in so many different directions." "I talked with Tim Smith about our concerns, and I was concerned that the papers were reporting negative things, and I never intended to make any negative comments about the NTRA," said Stronach. "We want to be constructive in this process, not destructive."

TRF OPENS LEXINGTON FARM The third major Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation facility for the rehabilitation and retirement of former racehorses will open Nov. 19 at the Blackburn Correctional Complex in Lexington, Kentucky. Set on 100 acres donated by Governor Paul Patton, and established with funds from Churchill Downs, Keeneland, John Williams and the F.A.R.M. Foundation, KTA, KHBPA, The Blood-Horse, TCA, and Shadwell Farms, the farm will provide a home for 65 to 70 former racehorses. Inmates at the facility have done all the construction on the site and will provide the care for the retired horses as part of the TRF's vocational training program. "With the help of our very strong and active committee in Kentucky, we have established a terrific network of volunteers and supporters to help make this program a huge success," said John Stuart, president of Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services and the TRF Kentucky Committee. "We anticipate saving and placing many hundreds of horses each year through Blackburn. Our industry should be very proud." The TRF is a non-profit corporation dedicated to the humane retirement and treatment of Thoroughbred racehorses, and is wholly supported by donations from private citizens and the racing industry. A pioneer in horse rescue programs, the TRF remains the largest organization of its kind in the nation, providing lifetime homes for former racehorses at farms in 10 states.

'CAT STORMS STALLION ACCESS Two no-guarantee nominations for 2000 to top sire Storm Cat (Storm Bird) topped Fasig-Tipton's Stallion Access, Inc. Fall Sale of Selected Seasons and Shares. The two seasons, purchased for \$430,000 and \$415,000 respectively, underlined Storm Cat's success and popularity. Sire of GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Cat Thief last weekend, Storm Cat stands at Overbrook Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. Other 2000 seasons sold included Danzig (\$290,000) and Red Ransom (\$66,000).

AGENT CHARGED WITH BIDDING FRAUD

Fraudulent "collusive bidding" took place between trainer Paul Webber, then an agent for the Curragh Bloodstock Agency, and trainer Oliver Sherwood, at Doncaster's 1995 Spring Sales, a judge ruled in the High Court yesterday. Agency director Gary Heywood did not know that Webber was also an adviser to the vendor of the horse, and had an interest in the seller making a profit. Heywood ended up paying 28,000 guineas for the four-year-old gelding who was to be named Pru's Profiles (Ire). The judge ruled that the horse was worth no more than half that. He had been bought at Tattersalls (Ireland) a year earlier for Ir8,000 guineas by Webber for the vendor, Jan Steinman. Judge William Crawford said Sherwood, Webber's friend, agreed to bid against him so as to push Heywood to his limit. The judge ruled that no competent agent would have advised Heywood to pay more than 14,000 guineas, and that there was a conflict between Webber's duty to Heywood and his interest in Steinman's profitability.
