RED RANSOM MARE TOPS KEENELAND SUNDAY

Felony One (Red Ransom), a seven-year-old broodmare from the Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent LVII, consignment, brought a final bid of \$330,000 to top Sunday's session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington. Purchased by Arthur Hancock, the dark bay is in foal to Grand Slam (Gone West), the winner of the GI Champagne S., GI Futurity and GI Peter Pan S. and runner-up in the 1998 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint who stood his first season at Ashford Stud this year. Felony One, a half sister to MGSW Jamies First Punch (Fit to Fight), is herself a stakes-placed winner who has produced just one other foal, a weanling of 1999 by Candy Stripes. The top-priced weanling yesterday was a filly by Forest Wildcat out of Stolen Pleasure (Marfa). The bay, who is out of a half sister to MGSW Caller I.D., was consigned by Ashleigh Stud, agent, and purchased for \$165,000 by Chad Johnson. The 13-day November Sale continues this morning at 10 a.m.

Pratella rode a two-race winning streak into this event after taking a Keeneland allowance Oct. 13 and the Bryan Station S. over that course nine days later. Let go at 6-1 in her attempt at three straight, the chestnut tracked 8-5 favorite Witchful Thinking (Lord Avie) for six furlongs, forged to the front at the quarter pole and drove home a clear winner. "She's so good," trainer Burk Kessinger Jr., who also handles the second-place finisher Mingling Glances, enthused. "I can't believe how good she has gotten. And I can't say enough about (Mingling Glances). She hasn't galloped in three weeks, other than on (a treadmill). So, it's just tremendous." The runner-up was off a step slowly, but ranged up to reach contention on the backstretch. She moved into second at the top of the lane, but couldn't get past the winner in what was her final career start. She will be bred to A.P. Indy next year.

Winner of the Listed Kölner Sprint Preis in Cologne in late October of 1998, Key Royal was absent from the track for over 11 months until returning to finish unplaced in the Flieger Preis at the same track at the end of September. He got back to winning form when claiming the Listed Dortmunder Fliegerpreis Oct. 3, then ran fourth in the G3 Prix du Petit Couvert at Longchamp Oct. 24. Relishing the heavy conditions here, the Gestut Wiedingen homebred was always in control, going clear in the final furlong to score easily from Su Tirolesu.

WRITERS UP

A STRIP SHOW

Three longshots won Breeders' Cup races. All three ran the best races of their lives. All three wore nasal strips. Just a coincidence?

Perhaps it's too early to answer that question, as the equine version of Breathe-Right strips just made their Breeders' Cup debut last week at Gulfstream Park and are permissible, so far, in only four states: Florida, Kentucky, Oklahoma and Delaware. There's not a lot of data available to assess their effectiveness, but this much is certain: so far, so good.

Juvenile winner **Anees** (Unbridled), Juvenile Fillies winner **Cash Run** (Seeking the Gold) and Classic winner **Cat Thief** (Storm Cat) wore the strips, which are supposed to help horses breathe more easily, also reducing the chances of exercise-induced pulmonary hemorrhage. Cat Thief was a case of a double dose of strips. His jockey, Pat Day, wore one as well.

The strips-on Breeders' Cup trio paid a combined \$170.80 for \$2 win bets, making it a big day not only for CNS Inc., which manufactures the product, but anyone having the foresight to bet on each and every horse wearing the strips. According to the footnotes in the Equibase charts, 35 of the 114 horse who competed in the 10 races carded on Breeders' Cup Day at Gulfstream wore the strips. There was also a fourth winner, **Nite Dreamer** (El Prado {Ire}) who paid \$3.60, wearing a Breathe-Right strip in the opener. Over the three-day Gulfstream mini-meet, 74 of the 287 horses racing wore the strips and they combined to win 10 of the 30 races held.

The four-inch-by-six-inch strips, which retail from \$10 to \$15 each and can be used just once, hold a horse's nasal passages open. Because a horse breathes only through its nose, the soft outer nasal passage tissue can collapse during strenuous exercise, a collapse that may be prevented by use of a strip.

According to a statement released by CNS Inc., Dr. Howard Erickson conducted tests at Kansas State University and found that horses wearing the strips used 5 percent less energy at high speeds and during recovery.

The only results that will matter are the ones that happen on the racetrack. So far, trainers aren't necessarily convinced, even those who have won with the strips.

"I first used them at Del Mar, when I tried them on a few horses in the mornings," said Alex Hassinger Jr., the trainer of Anees. "It was hard to see any advantage when they were breezing. But I've used one myself and they seemed to help me. I just figured they couldn't hurt. I figured, why not? Anees was an improving colt and I think his winning was a combination of things. It would be hard for me to say that the strip was the reason he won."

"We were introduced to nasal strips this week," said Wayne Lukas, trainer of Cash Run and Cat Thief. "I'd be careful not to give too much credit to them right now. I'll take a neutral position."

But something intrigued Lukas about the strips. He said that he used them on every horse he ran at the three-day meet. He wasn't the only one. Hall of Famer Bobby Frankel also jumped on the nasal strip bandwagon, as did several others. Even Bob Baffert couldn't resist. After telling the media all week that he wouldn't try the strips, he used them on four of his eight Breeders' Cup starters. None won, but then again, neither did any of Baffert's other starters.

"That's horse racing," said Jim Bond, who used the strips on Breeders' Cup also-rans **Val's Prince** (Eternal Prince) and **Behrens** (Pleasant Colony). "If a guy paints a white line on his horses and the first five win, everyone's going to start painting them with the white lines. I will keep using them on some horses. I don't think they'll move a horse up a whole lot, but neither do I think they'll hurt a horse."

While trainers mull their effectiveness, other states are deciding whether or not they will permit the use of the strips. Is it just a fad--the next Aeroform silks? Or is there something to this? Stay tuned.

CAL PARTEE. SR. PASSES AWAY William Calhoun "Cal" Partee, Sr., who won the 1992 Kentucky Derby with Lil E. Tee, died late Friday in an Arkansas hospital from complications related to congestive heart failure. He was 89. Born in Arkansas on Feb. 10, 1910, Partee was involved in the timber and oil businesses and founded the Partee Flooring Company, which is still run by the family, in 1948. A Thoroughbred owner since 1954, Partee's stakes horses included At The Threshold, 1959 Brooklyn H. winner Babu, Big Pistol, Classy Irene, Arkansas Derby hero J.R.'s Pet and Phantom On Tour. Lil Irene, a daughter of Lil E. Tee and Classy Irene, was Partee's final runner, winning Saturday's eighth race at Churchill Downs. "Fate plays a funny hand sometimes," Partee's longtime trainer Lynn Whiting said, adding, "I was okay until the filly won. He was a great, great man." Partee is survived by his son Cal, daughter Jane Burrow, 10 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren. A service will be held today at 2 p.m. at First United Methodist Church in Magnolia, Arkansas. Memorials may be made to the First United Methodist Church Building Fund, the Parkinson's Disease Foundation or the Racetrack Chaplaincy of America.

ARTAX TO CIGAR MILE Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Artax (Marquetry) has come out of his track-record tying victory in fine fettle and will point next for the GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 27. "He has already been back to the track," trainer Lou Albertrani said. "He's full of himself. You can't keep him away from the track for too long--he keeps playing and jumping."

Dat You Miz Blue cruised to a 10 1/4-length romp in the Oct. 6 Joseph A. Gimma S. two starts back, then stretched out to a mile for the Oct. 23 Maid Of The Mist S. and ran second as the 4-5 favorite after cutting out the early fractions. Dropping back to a sprint, the bay was bet down to 1-10 and lived up to her odds, taking over after a half in :46 and leaving her rivals in the dust in a dominating display. "We knew we had this one when the overnight came out," winning jockey Jerry Bailey said. Trainer Bill Badgett Jr. blamed an oncoming illness for the filly's last loss. "She got sick after the last race," he said. "She had a 103 temperature and when we scoped her, she was loaded with mucous. She cooled out fine...we didn't notice it until the next day when she didn't eat up. She didn't have much fight in her last time, and that's not like her." As for the future, Badgett said, "I doubt she'll start again this year. We'll put her away, give her a little rest and let her grow." There was no show wagering in the race, which fielded only five horses.

Entrepreneur had raced with blinkers in all of his first six starts, but had the hood removed for his latest and came away with a half-length victory in the restricted Sleepy Hollow S. at Belmont Oct. 23. Perhaps unimpressed by the margin of victory, trainer Pat Byrne put blinkers on once again for this outing and was rewarded as his colt led every step en route to an easy score. "He's got an awful lot of speed," winning jockey John Velazquez said. "I helped him along for the first few jumps, but after that I was just a passenger. Their leading performers are G2 Henninger Trophy winner **Catella (Ger)** (Generous {Ire}) and group scorer **Tertullian (USA)** (Miswaki {USA}), as well as the leading juvenile filly **Sommernacht (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}).

The list of leading breeders is topped by Gestut Fahrhof for a record-breaking 14th time, with earnings of DM1,961,250. Horses bred by Gestut Auenquelle have earned DM1,455,00 with Gestut Schlenderhan on their heels at DM1,447,050.

The current leading trainer is Hans Walther Hiller, whose first pattern winners were leading juvenile colts **Auenklang (Ger)** (Big Shuffle {USA}) and **Glad Master (Ger)** (Big Shuffle {USA}). Hiller leads by four victories over Peter Schiergen who had a great year and has clearly established himself as a leading trainer in Germany. The jockey's table is dominated by Andrasch Starke as the first-string jockey for Andreas Schutz. He has registered 177 wins this season, some 54 victories better than the 123 wins logged by Andreas Suborics. Torsten Mundry stands third with 114 victories.
