GEORGIA HOFMANN DEAD

Georgia Hofmann, one of the matriarch's of Thoroughbred racing, has died. Hofmann, who attended this year's Breeders' Cup at Gulfstream Park and was on hand for the dispersal of her Wycombe House Stud horses at Keeneland Nov. 7, passed away at her home in Bal Harbour, Florida Sunday after a long illness. A lifelong racing fan, Hofmann became an owner after C.T. Chenery sold her a broodmare in the '60s. She married Philip Hofmann, the retired chairman and CEO of Johnson & Johnson, in 1968, and the two purchased a farm near Reddick, Florida in 1972 and named it Wycombe House. There they bred the champion sprinter of 1982, Gold Beauty. The Hofmann's holdings grew to the point that, by 1984, they owned 95 horses and decided to disperse the majority of their breeding stock. Gold Beauty was included in that dispersal, but she failed to reach her reserve of \$4 million and the Hofmanns bought her back. She went on to produce European champion Dayjur, whose shadow-jumping near the wire of the 1990 Breeders' Cup Sprint cost him the race; and Maplejinsky, winner of the 1988 GI Alabama S. and dam of 1994 Champion Older Mare Sky Beauty. The Hofmanns sold Maplejinsky as a yearling for \$750,000. Mr. Hofmann passed away in 1987, but Georgia remained active in the business, and in 1991 she purchased Sky Beauty as a yearling for \$355,000. The filly went on to win nine Grade I stakes, including New York's Triple Tiara. She sold last Sunday at Keeneland for \$2,850,000. Hofmann also bred 1996 Preakness hero Louis Quatorze and raced him in partnership with Bill Condren and Joe Cornacchia. There will be a private funeral service.

BREEDERS' CUP BREAKS \$100 MILLION

Total wagering for this year's 10-race Breeders' Cup program set an all-time North American single-day handle record of \$100,336,230, marking a 10-percent increase from 1998. The handle on the eight Breeders' Cup Championship events was \$96,485,255, also a record and a jump of 16 percent from last year. A total of \$12,541,833 was bet in New York on the program, with another \$12,061,607 wagered in California. International handle reached a new high of \$7,438,035. Canada led all countries with more than \$4.2 million bet, followed by France at more than \$1.5 million.

KEENELAND MONDAY RESULTS

Sidonia (Seattle Slew), a winning daughter of French stakes winner and group-placed Nureyev's Best (Nureyev), brought a final bid of \$185,000 to top Monday's session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. In foal to Jade Hunter, the six-year-old mare was consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, agent for Brookside Farms, and purchased by Everest Stables, Inc. The top-selling weanling Monday, a filly by American Chance out of Sunny's Rose (Sunny's Halo), sold for \$125,000. Her dam is a half sister to GISP No More Flowers (My Gallant) and MGSP Aljadeer (Alleged). From the Glennwood Farm, Inc., agent, consignment, she was bought by Marshall W. Silverman, agent. Keeneland's 13-day November Sale continues through Friday, with bidding beginning at 10 a.m. daily.

SELLERS CANCELS BRITISH TRIP

Jockey Shane Sellers has had to cancel his trip to Britain to ride **Running Stag** (Cozzene) at Lingfield today, as he has not fully recovered from a spill at Churchill Downs Friday. Sellers rode a winner on Saturday, but then suffered a relapse and will miss the mount. Trainer Philip Mitchell said yesterday, "It's very, very unfortunate. When I spoke to him (Sunday), he could hardly walk. He went to the track (Saturday), where he had physio and a whirlpool and rode in the first race, but he literally had to be helped back into the weighing room. He said he would not be able to do justice to the horse, particularly after stiffening up with eight hours on the plane. But Pat Eddery is not a bad deputy." Running Stag is having a prep race for the Dec. 12 Hong Kong International Cup.

Japan Cup Invitees:

The Japan Racing Association has released the final list of invitees for the Nov. 28 Japan Cup. The lone North American representative will be **Mash One** (Chi) (Mashkour). Europe will be represented by **Tiger Hill** (Ire) (Danehill), **Fruits of Love** (Hansel), **Montjeu** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), **Alborada** (GB) (Alzao), **Borgia** (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) and **High-Rise** (Ire) (High Estate {Ire}). The representative from Oceania will be **Indigenous** (Ire) (Marju {Ire}). The Japanese runners will be selected on Tuesday.

International Interest in Singapore Airlines Int'l Cup:

The inaugural Singapore Airlines International Cup, a 1 1/4-mile turf test to be run Mar. 4, 2000 to commemorate the official opening of the Singapore Turf Club's new racecourse at Kranji, has attracted nominations from 11 countries. A total of 107 horses have been entered for the S\$3 million event, including **Alborado** (GB) (Alzao) and **Fruits Of Love** (Hansel) from Britain, **Jim and Tonic** (Fr) (Double Bed {Fr}) and **Spadoun** (Fr) (Kaldoun {Fr}) from France, **Sunline** (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) from New Zealand and **Val's Prince** (Eternal Prince) from the U.S.

Indian Ridge Colt Tops Dubai Sale:

Thekryaati (Ire) (Indian Ridge {GB}) was the top lot at the 1999 Dubai Horses in Training Sale, held on Sunday night at Nad Al Sheba Racecourse. A total of 42 lots from the 44 catalogued went through the ring for just over Dhs4.25million, an average was just over Dhs100,000, and the proceeds from the sale go straight back to benefit horse racing in the Emirates. **Thekryaati**, who had four wins and six seconds in Britain this year brought Dhs340,000 to the bid of Dubai businessman Mohammed Saeed Hareb, who is likely to send the four-year-old to trainer Paddy Rudkin. Seven sold for Dhs200,000 or more. "This sale is a major success," said Nick Nugent, the director of Ireland's Goffs and the auctioneer for the sale. "I sell on four different continents and the possibilities for this auction are endless." The Dubai Horses in Training Sale has a history of producing quality winners, both in the UAE and abroad, its most famous graduate being **Cezanne** (GB), who went from the Dubai sale to win the domestic highlight, the Maktoum Challenge, before heading to Ireland to win the G1 Irish Champion S.

Ever since Victory Gallop arrived at Prestonwood Farm in early September, Prestonwood's established star, the 22-year-old Kris S., has made sure that the young upstart hasn't received all the attention.

On Sept. 14, Kris S.'s striking son out of Mr P's Princess set a September Sale record of \$3,900,000 and, on Oct. 3, Kris S.'s daughter Soaring Softly became a Grade I winner in the Flower Bowl Invitational H. Within five weeks Soaring Softly had taken the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf to credit her sire with no less than his fourth Breeders' Cup success, following Prized in the 1989 Turf, Hollywood Wildcat in the 1993 Distaff and Brocco in the 1993 Juvenile. This fall has also seen Kris S. enjoy graded-stakes success with Adonis in the GIII Discovery H. and now with Midnight Line in Saturday's GII Long Island H.

No wonder Kris S.'s fee for next season remains as high as \$75,000, which is a remarkable contrast to the fee of \$3,500 which he commanded at the start of his career in 1982. His stud debut followed a spell in limbo for the very big son of Roberto, who made the last of his five appearances on the racetrack in March, 1980. As he came out of that race, the GII San Felipe H., with a bowed tendon, he eventually retired as a winner of nothing more important than the Bradbury S.

No wonder breeders in Florida soon started to lose interest in him--his third crop contained only 18 named foals and his fourth only 19--but that all changed as soon as his first juveniles appeared. His 10 winners from 20 runners were headed by the smart filly Always Be Mine and plenty more stakes winners soon followed.

It was his small third and fourth crops which provided incontrovertible proof of his ability to upgrade his mares. The 1985 foals included the Grade I winner Evening Kris, who was his dam's ninth foal and first stakes winner, and the 1986 crop did even better thanks to the Grade I successes of Prized and Stocks Up.

Kris S.'s transfer from Florida to Prestonwood in Kentucky after the 1993 breeding season provided easier access to high-class broodmares, fine examples being the dams of Soaring Softly and Midnight Line. Both mares were Grade III winners, but Midnight Line's dam, Midnight Air, was unlucky not to have a Group 1 win to her credit. She crossed the line three parts of a length ahead of Culture Vulture in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Ascot as a two-year-old, but was demoted to last place for causing serious interference. Whereas Culture Vulture went on to win two more Group 1 races, Midnight Air failed to reproduce her juvenile form at three, despite being tried from seven furlongs to 1 1/2 miles. However, that did not stop her realising 270,000 guineas, the second-best price for a filly, at Tattersalls' 1992 December Sales.

She was bought by the shrewd Anthony Penfold for Fahd Salman's Newgate Stud. Midnight Line is her second foal and she also has a yearling Gone West filly and a weanling brother to Midnight Line. Midnight Air's half-sister Multimara also has a notable daughter representing her this year, in the form of Imperial Beauty, one of the fastest fillies in Europe. Midnight Line must be an excellent broodmare prospect, especially as her third dam, Nellie Forbes, was a half sister to Bold Forbes (Kentucky Derby and Belmont S.), Priceless Fame (dam of the Grade I-winning juveniles Saratoga Six and Dunbeath) and See You At The Top (dam of the high-class American filly Life At The Top).

SANTA ANITA WRAP-UP The 31st Oak Tree Racing Association meet at Santa Anita, which ended Nov. 8, saw on-track handle rise 3 percent despite a 7.5-percent dip in attendance. The season's on-track average daily handle was \$2,380,685, while attendance averaged 11,646. The average daily total handle was \$9,500,966, down 1.6 percent. "The weather was certainly a factor, with temperatures over 90 degrees on 12 days of the meeting and over 95 degrees on five of those days," Sherwood C. Chillingworth, executive vice president of Oak Tree, said. David Flores captured his first Oak Tree riding title with 27 winners, while Bob Baffert, who saddled 21 winners, topped the trainers' standings for the third straight year.

ARTAX TO NEW YORK IN 2001 Breeders' Cup Sprint champion Artax (Marquetry--Raging Apalachee {Apalachee}) is expected to retire to Center Brook Farm in Climax, New York at the end of his racing career. Owner Ernie Paragallo said the four-year-old record-breaker is being readied for a 2000 racing campaign and would likely go to Center Brook for the 2001 breeding season.

CORRECTION: The grade was inadvertently left off the result of Saturday's California Juvenile H. from Bay Meadows. The race was a Grade III event.

"We all know that Sadler's Wells' offspring can make very good hurdlers but we have never, ever considered sending Saffron Walden hurdling. He is much too good for that." The three-year-old, unraced since a last-place finish in the Aug. 17 G1 Juddmonte International at York, will point toward next year's Lockinge S. or Prix Ganay as early season targets, said O'Brien. "He jarred his near fore fetlock when he was second in the (G3) Meld S. (July 23) at The Curragh. I didn't realise how bad the jarring was until I ran him in the Juddmonte International, and I take the blame for his poor effort at York. I am please to say that he is fully recovered and he has done very well physically. I am looking forward to campaigning him in Group 1s between a mile and 10 furlongs next year."
