BANSHEE BREEZE RETIRED

Banshee Breeze (Unbridled--Banshee Winds {Known Fact}), who most recently was a closing second in the Breeders' Cup Distaff, has been retired from racing by her owners, James B. Tafel and Jayeff B Stables. The four-year-old filly will be sent to Claiborne Farm outside Paris, Ky. No breeding decision has been finalized. Last year's champion three-year-old filly, Banshee Breeze won 10 races and placed in seven more of her 18 starts, earning \$2,784,798. Among Banshee Breeze's most memorable efforts are her victories in the GI Alabama, GI Coaching Club American Oaks, GI Go for Wand, and GI Apple Blossom, as well as a 12-length runaway in the 1998 GI Spinster S. at Keeneland. Banshee Breeze was bred in Kentucky by James B. Tafel and is the first foal out of Banshee Winds. Tafel purchased Banshee Winds at the Keeneland September yearling sale in 1991 and raced her with success, including a second in the GII Arlington-Washington Lassie. Banshee Breeze raced solely for Tafel until Jayeff B Stable purchased a half-interest in the filly prior to the Breeders' Cup last year.

KEENELAND SALE CONTINUES

Two mares reached \$80,000 to top yesterday's session of Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. The first to sell was Fletch (Green Dancer), a five-year-old mare from the consignment of Brookdale Farm, agent for So True Stables. A broodmare prospect, Fletch was purchased by Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey. River Farm purchased Frienziedfruitcake (Wild Again), in foal to Cape Town, from the consignment of Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent XV, also for \$80,000. The top-selling weanling Tuesday was hip number 3513, a son of Victory Speech--Free Hair (Fr) (Saint Cyrien). Dapple Bloodstock, agent, purchased the bay for \$72,000 from Golden Gate Stud. Bidding at today's session commences at 10 a.m. and the sale runs through Friday.

Running Stag Upset in Hong Kong Prep:

There was a shock at Lingfield yesterday when oddson favorite Running Stag (Cozzene) was beaten in the Independent Purchasing Associates Conditions S. at odds of 1-3. He was always travelling smoothly under Pat Eddery and looked to have the race won with a half furlong remaining, but he was worn down close to home by Brilliant Red (Royal Academy). Running Stag is still expected to start in the Dec. 12 Hong Kong International Cup. Trainer Philip Mitchell explained, "He has had a bit of a holiday since his last run 59 days ago and he worked well here last week. He was fine but obviously had not done enough and so he just got tired."

The Japan Racing Association has announced the Japanese horses chosen to run in the Nov. 28 Japan Cup. The eight horses are Embrasser Moi (Jpn) (Russian Bond), Osumi Bright (Jpn) (Last Tycoon {Ire}), Rascal Suzuka (Jpn) (Commander in Chief {GB}), Special Week (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), Stay Gold (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), Stinger (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), Suehiro Commander (Jpn) (Commander in Chief {GB}), Umeno Fiber (Jpn) (Sakura Yutaka O). The lone also eligible horse is Hishi Pinnacle (Theatrical {Ire}).

Seattle Slew and Nureyev were very different types of racehorses and very different physical specimens. Despite that, and despite the fact that they are not the most obvious horses to combine, we are beginning to think that the pair have something of an affinity. The cross of Seattle Slew and his sons over Nureyev mares has produced four stakes winners, including Let, who took the GII Churchill Downs Distaff H. over the weekend, and Grade II winner Borodislew, Nurevey has sired stakes winner Social Charter out of a Seattle Slew mare, and his son Theatrical (Ire) has been represented by Humbel, a Group 2 winner bred on the cross. We can also note Group/Grade 1 winners El Condor Pasa and Lemon Drop Kid, and stakes winner American Odyssey, all sired by Kingmambo (dam by Nureyev) out of Seattle Slew mares.

Oddly enough, while Seattle Slew's sphere of influence has predominantly been North America, and Nureyev's Europe, the pair may be linked by a star from a third continent, the South American runner *Forli (Nureyev's broodmare sire).

Seattle Slew sired the ill-fated Kentucky Derby and Belmont S. victor Swale and the multiple graded stakes winner Yonder out of mares by Forli. There are also a number of other talented performers whose pedigrees combine Seattle Slew and Forli, including Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero Helissio (by Fairy King, a three-quarters brother to Nureyev, out of a mare by a son of Seattle Slew), Golden Missile (a 1999 graded stakes winner by A. P. Indy), Prado's Capote (by El Prado, a son of Nureyev's three-quarters brother Sadler's Wells), graded stakes winner Nijinsky's Passion, Time to Meet and Rio Oro.

If there is something in this Seattle Slew/Forli connection, it probably stems from the relationship between Seattle Slew's broodmare sire Poker and Forli. Round Table, the sire of Poker, has several background similarities to Forli, including the fact that he traces to the famous foundation mare Aloe, whose full brother Foxlaw is in Forli's pedigree. Poker's broodmare sire Nasrullah is by a son of Pharos out of a daughter of Mumtaz Mahal. Forli is inbred 3x3 to the three-quarters siblings Riot and Fair Trial, one by Colorado (three-quarters related to Pharos) and the other by Fairway (brother to Pharos) and both out of Lady Juror, a half sister to Mumtaz Mahal. It's worth noting that Forli worked extremely well with mares by Nasrullah's most famous stallion son, Bold Ruler (also in the male line of Seattle Slew), the cross producing such excellent runners as Posse, Intrepid Hero, Home Guard and Boone's Cabin.

Whether or not similarities between the pedigrees of Forli and Poker are the key, it does look as if the combination of Seattle Slew and Nureyev is one to bear in mind.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Multiple linebreeding to the La Troienne family struck in Japan when Select Green (c, 4, Capote-Damewood, by Majesty's Prince) captured the G3 Tokyo Chunichi Sports Hai Negishi S. Select Green has the sisters Striking and Busher 6x6x5 and for good measure, her fifth dam Leading Home is a half sister to Sailing Home, who appears in the pedigree of Capote's sire, Seattle Slew.

Vettori (Ire) (Machiavellian--Air Distingue, by Sir Ivor), who shuttles between England and Australia, has made an excellent start with his first European two-year-olds, and when Hightori (Fr) (c, 2, Vettori {Ire}--High Mecene {Fr}, by Highest Honor {Fr}) took the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon, he became the third stakes winner for his sire. Hightori has an intriguing pedigree with Sir Gaylord 4x5x5 and the three-parts relatives Quill and Prince John 4x6.

Freshman sire Not For Love (Mr. Prospector--Dance Number, by Northern Dancer) recorded a second stakes winner when **Summer Swing (c, 2, Not For Love--Summer Semester, by Better Arbitor)** captured the New Jersey Futurity. Summer Swing has a very clever pedigree since Not For Love is out of a mare by Northern Dancer, and his broodmare sire Better Arbitor is out of Arctic Ava, a seven-eighths sister to Northern Dancer.

BLUSH RAMBLER TO FRANCE First-crop sire Blush Rambler (USA) (Blushing Groom {Fr}--Romanette {USA}, by Alleged {USA}) will relocate to France for the 2000 northern hemisphere breeding season and will stand at Alain Brandebourger's Haras des Chartreux near Deauville. No stud fee has been announced as yet. The nine-year-old, who stood this year at Brereton C. Jones' Airdrie Stud in Midway, Kentucky, is the sire of five juvenile winners, including G3 Prix de Conde winner Lord Flasheart as well as GSP Geronimo's Joy. "From both breeding and racing standpoints, Blush Rambler appears such a good fit for European breeders that we were delighted with this opportunity to stand the horse in France," said Jones.

O'BRIEN MULLS OPTIONS FOR KINTYRE Victor Chandler has established G2 Gimcrack S. hero Mull of Kintyre (USA) (Danzig {USA}) as one of the early favorites for the 2000 Kentucky Derby, according to the Thoroughbred Times Online. Owned by Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier, the bay colt is being offered to bettors at 16-1 off his good fourth-place effort in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, his first try on the main track. "He ran a big race and I was very pleased with his performance," trainer Aidan O'Brien told the Thoroughbred Times. "Being by Danzig, there would have to be doubts about him getting a mile and a half next year. That would make a(n) (English) Derby bid unlikely. I see him as a possible (2000) Guineas horse with the Kentucky Derby an alternative target, all going well," O'Brien added.

Having won the G3 Prix des Reservoirs at Deauville on the second of two unbeaten juvenile starts, Comillas wintered as a candidate for Classic glory. Her first start as a three-year-old was a touch disappointing as she could only manage fourth place in the G3 Prix de la Grotte. She lost some ground at the start that day because she reared up and then fly jumped upon leaving the gate. She disappointed after that when well in arrears in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp May 16 and didn't reappear until finishing fifth in the Listed Prix Casimir Delamarre at Longchamp Oct. 21. Showing a tendency once more to rear as the gate opened, she soon led here from The Good Life (Ire) (Rainbow Quest {USA}) and Miss Bedouine (Fr) (Bering (GB)) as Cerita and Quittance raced in rear. She remained in control once into the straight, committed for home at the guarter-mile marker and responded eagerly to Sylvain Guillot's urgings. She kept on well all the way to the line and safely held the late challenges of Cerita and Quittance, who both ran on from behind without neither posing a serious threat. Winning trainer Jean de Roualle said, "She scared me again when she went up in the air at the start, but once in front she fully dominated the race, proving she is back to her best. We will discuss her future with her owner, but there is a strong chance that she will remain in training."

After two days of National Hunt selling, Flat horses of all ages-from yearlings to potential broodmares-are offered at Doncaster's November Sales today. Lot 391, offered for the Hong Kong Jockey Club by Herringswell Manor is sure to create interest. The Fairy King (USA) colt, who has had a cyst removed, made Ir120,000gns as a yearling at Goffs last year. He has missed his appointment at the Hong Kong Breeze-Up Sale as have Lots 392 and 392A, who have now also been withdrawn from Doncaster. There are also some decent Flat horses-in-training on offer including Lot 341, the Aga Khan's Shaylan (Ire) (Primo Dominie {GB}), a dual winner this season, Lot 348, Sir Mark Prescott's two-year-old all-weather winner Dance In Tune (GB) (Mujtahid {USA}) who should be suited to racing in America, and Lot 402, Jazil (GB) (Nashwan (USA)), who was Listed-placed for John Gosden this year.

GRAND NATIONAL WORTH HALF MILLION FOR 2000

Prize money for the Martell Grand National next year has been boosted by nearly 20 percent to £500,000, meaning that world's most famous jump race, staged at Aintree, now rivals many Flat races in value. 
