DAYLAMI EUROPEAN HORSE OF THE YEAR

The ninth Cartier Awards, presented at the Four Seasons Hotel in Park Lane, London last night, honored a series of European champions, most notably Daylami (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}), who won the Cartier Horse of The Year Award and the Older Horse Award. To trainer Saeed bin Suroor, Daylami was "the best horse I have ever trained" while Godolphin racing manager Simon Crisford highlighted, "Daylami has proved to be a tremendous advertisement for Godolphin's global international policy--he has been such a wonderful horse that we have so much enjoyed running all round the world. He has won seven championship races, having been campaigned at the highest level in five different countries on three continents. It gives us great pleasure tonight to be here to celebrate the perfect modern-day thoroughbred." Daylami beat off the cream of European-trained thoroughbreds Sendawar (Ire) (Priolo), Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Ramruma (Diesis {GB}) to win European Horse Of The Year accolade. The other Godolphin horse to achieve an award was Kayf Tara (GB), voted Stayer of the Year. The Daily Telegraph Award of Merit went to Peter Walwyn, who has just retired after a 40-year career as trainer. A moving filmed tribute brought tears to eyes of the recipient, who was honored for his charitable work as well as his equine exploits with horses like Grundy, Crow and Humble Duty. Other awardees were Montjeu (Ire), Three-Year-Old Colt; Ramruma, (Three-Year-Old Filly); Fasilyev (Nureyev), (Two-Year-Old Colt); Torgau (Ire) (Zieten), (Two-Year-Old Filly); Stravinsky (Nureyev), (Sprinter).

MISSLE IS PLENTY ATTRACTIVE Her weanling colt by Silver Deputy topped the activity of last Friday's session at \$230,000, and now Attractive Missile (Relaunch) herself brought a bid of \$115,000 to top the 11th day of the Keeneland November Sale. In foal to Roy, the seven-year-old was consigned to the sale by Tattenham Corner, agent for Rich Meadow Farm and was purchased by Burning Daylight Farm. The afternoon's top selling weanling was hip number 3846, a colt by 1995 Breeders' Cup Sprint runner up and 1999 freshman sire Mr. Greeley. Consigned by Jonabell Farm, Inc, agent, the chestnut was taken for \$60,000 by Joe Cornacchia. The penultimate session of this year's sale begins this morning at 10 a.m.

Burnett-Wells reported that the colt was for an existing American client, but did not disclose the name. Another who had been returned at Tattersalls was Jazil (GB) (Nashwan {USA}), a Listed-placed four-year-old out of a full sister to MGISW Maplejinsky (USA). He sold for 42,000gns at Newmarket and 31,000gns vesterday to join jumping trainer Kevin Morgan. The two-year- old Al Euro (Fr) (Mujtahid {USA}) was bought for 23,000gns by agent Fiona Needham as a breeding prospect. Tony O'Callaghan of Tally-Ho Stud was underbidder. The maiden filly is a half-sister to G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. winner and National Stud sire Air Express (Ire) (Salse {USA}). The five-day sale continues today at 10 a.m.

PLANS SET FOR ENGLISH GUINEAS WINNERS

It was confirmed yesterday that the Godolphin-owned three-year-old colt Island Sands (Ire) (Turtle Island {Ire}), winner of the G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket in May, will remain in training as a four-year-old. Reported to have sustained a foot injury after finishing fifth in the G1 Entenmann's Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh three weeks after his Newmarket victory, Island Sands missed the rest of the European season. The colt. with three wins from four career starts, is now wintering at Godolphin's base at Al-Quoz in Dubai. Prince Khaled Abdullah's three-vear-old Wince (GB) (Selkirk {USA}), heroine of the G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas after taking the G3 Dubai Duty Free S. at Newbury two weeks earlier, has been retired to the breeding shed. The filly won four of her nine starts, with a second and a third, for earnings of \$273,127. She made her last start in the May 23 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, finishing fifth. No mating plans have been announced.

BALISADA BOUND FOR DUBAI? It had been anticipated that Anthony Oppenheimer's homebred threeyear-old Balisada (GB) (Kris {GB}) would be retired, but although she has been provisionally booked to visit Coolmore Stud stallion Sadler's Wells (USA) next covering season, there is still a possibility of her staying in training at Newmarket with Geoffrey Wragg. Wragg saddled the filly to cause a 16-1 upset in the G1 Coronation S. at the Royal Ascot meeting in mid-June and also finish runner-up in both the G2 Greene King Falmouth S. at Newmarket and the Listed EBF Conqueror S. at Goodwood. Oppenheimer, who is on a business trip in South Africa at present, said: "Balisada is still at Geoffrey Wragg's stables in Newmarket and I am waiting to look at the pre-entries for a valuable nine-furlong turf race in Dubai in the spring before I make a definite decision about her future, which I hope to do next week. If she is retired, she will visit Sadler's Wells."

Dansili to Campaign at Four:

Prince Khaled's three-year-old colt Dansili (GB) (Danehill {USA}) will remain in training next year. Conditioned in France by Andre Fabre, Dansili was second to the Aga Khan's Sendawar (Ire) in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) at Longchamp in May and went on to win the G3 Prix Messidor at Deauville in July. He later finished third to Dubai Millennium (GB) in the G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard-Jacques Le Marois at the same track in mid-August and third to Sendawar in the Sept. 5 G1 Emirates Prix du Moulin de Longchamp in his most recent start.

Primo Donnas Honored:

The 12-strong partnership called the Primo Donnas, owner of smart two-year-old Primo Valentino (Ire), winner of five of his last seven starts including the G2 Mill Reef S. and the G1 Saudi Arabian Airlines Middle Park S., has been awarded the first Weatherbys/Racehorse Owners' Association annual Flat award. The members of the partnership pay £325 a month, all inclusive, to trainer Peter Harris, who has specialised in this sort of ownership, and have already earned £124,300 in prize money. They collected their award--a specially commissioned painting of Primo Valentino--yesterday at a luncheon at Mosimann's Dining Club in London. Partner Olive Smith said: "This horse is a dream come true for us all. The sense of exhilaration when he won the Middle Park was amazing. It took me days to come down and I am not sure I have totally done so yet." The idea behind the award, which was previously sponsored by brewers Courage, is to highlight owners and horses outside the highest echelons.

Chapple-Hyam Scores in Hong Kong:

Trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam had his first victory in Hong Kong when Lyphard's Lad (USA) won at Sha Tin racecourse yesterday. The former British-based trainer was having his 19th runner since arriving in Hong Kong last month. He said: "It is great to get that first winner behind us. The training environment is totally different here, but we have been learning on a day-to-day basis."

Totalbet.com Lowers Take-out:

British-based Internet betting company Totalbet.com has decided to undercut all opposition by lowering its deduction of punters to 2 percent for horseracing and sports betting. The move comes after off-shore telephone and Internet betting companies started trading with 3-percent deductions and British-based Internet rival Blue Square last month offered 2.5-percent deductions. British-based betting operations have to pay the government a 6.75-percent tax on total stakes and approximately 1.2 percent in Levy to horseracing, whereas overseas entities do not face either charge. Totalbet.com is making the move at the expense of its profit margin to remain competitive. David Annat of Totalbet.com, said: "Online gambling is going to be big business--estimated to be over US\$6 billion by 2002. We cannot afford to be disadvantaged in a world market because of the UK tax position."
