KEENELAND NOVEMBER BEATS THE STREET

The 1999 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, which ended Friday in Lexington, enters the history books with the highest aggregate ever for a Thoroughbred auction. Gross sales totaled \$317,666,000, topping the previous record of \$264,657,700 set at last year's November sale. A record total of 3,461 horses passed through the ring. Boosted by the dispersals of Padua Stables, the late Georgia Hofmann's Wycombe House Stud, Robert and Bea Roberts, the estate of the late Paul Mellon and Silverleaf Farms, the gross was up 20 percent from 1998, while the average rose 17 percent and the median increased 18.5 percent. Irish champion Dance Design (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), part of the Padua Stables consignment, topped the 13-day marathon. The mare, who had sold for a world-record 2,500,000 guineas at Tattersalls December two years ago and is in foal to A.P. Indy, attracted a bid of \$4.7 million from Hugo Lascelles, agent for an undisclosed buyer. It was the fifth-highest price ever for a Keeneland November purchase. Overall, Padua sold 12 lots for \$10,845,000, an average of \$903,750. The Roberts' 185-horse consignment brought \$12,225,000 for an average of \$66,081; the Silverleaf Farms offering of 52 lots sold for \$10,583,000, an average of \$203,519; and the Mellon estate realized \$4,884,000, averaging \$444,000 for 11 lots. Wycombe House Stud's 22 horses brought \$12,262,000, an average of \$557,364. Friday's finale saw a weanling colt by Pioneering top the session. Consigned by Dixiana Farm, Inc. (Bruce Kline), agent, the chestnut was purchased for \$37,000 by John D. Murphy, Sr. The top-selling broodmare yesterday was Cherub (Halo), in foal to Williamstown, who brought \$35,000. A winning half sister to MGSW Darien Miss (Mr. Leader) and GSW Andover Man (Mr. Redoy), the nine-year-old was consigned by Dunford Farm, agent, and purchased by Gus Bell, agent.

"PERSIAN" RULES RED SMITH?

New York's final graded turf stakes of the season, the GII Red Smith H., has attracted an overflow field, including highweight Persian Ruler (GB) (Don Roberto), who carries 120 pounds. The four-year-old, a Group 3 winner in France and a Listed winner in Spain, comes off a seventh-place finish in the G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris at Longchamp Oct. 17. Christophe Clement saddles the colt for trainer Dominique Sepulchre. "He only arrived here on Sunday, so I have not had a lot of time to evaluate him," Clement said. "He seems to be a horse that is just a cut below the very best horses in Europe. But he is a good horse and very consistent. He will stay the distance and that is important." Veteran John's Call (Lord at War {Arg}) is sure to get the distance as well. The eight-year-old gelding has finished first in three in a row, losing out on the Sept. 6 Sussex H. via a stewards' disqualification, but picking up wins in the Oct. 24 Bald Eagle Breeders' Cup H. at a mile and a quarter and the Nov. 11 GIII Laurel Turf Cup at a mile and a half. He has tried out the Aqueduct turf only once before, breaking his maiden by a nose over the course just over five years ago.

LONESOME GLORY RETIRED Four-time American steeplechase champion Lonesome Glory (Transworld) has been retired after injuring a tendon during training Wednesday. The 11-year-old gelding, who raced over hurdles for nine seasons and captured four Eclipse Awards, was getting ready to try for his fourth win in the GI Colonial Cup when he was injured. The chestnut's career highlights included earning the King's Novice Series Bonus for winning a race in America and one in England during his four-year-old season in 1992; and taking the last Breeders' Cup Steeplechase, held at Belmont Park in 1993, by his biggest winning margin in the U.S., eight lengths. In 1995 he returned to England and won a race at Sandown by 11 lengths. The champ retires with 19 wins--10 in Grade I 'chases--from 35 steeplechase starts and earnings of over \$1.3 million.

The chestnut ended her Irish campaign with a maiden win at Tipperary and a stakes score in the G3 Futurity S. at The Curragh, then added victories in a Saratoga allowance and the Marie De Bartolo H. at Louisiana Downs in her first two stateside tries. She set the pace in her latest, the Nov. 7 Pebbles S. going 1 1/16 miles at Gulfstream Park, and just missed, finishing second by a half length.

Three of the competitors headed for the Nov. 28 Japan Cup arrived in Tokyo Thursday. Indigenous (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) had the shortest trip, shipping in from Hong Kong. Fruits of Love (Hansel) and High Rise (Ire) (High Estate {Ire}) came in from England, Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Borgia (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) arrived from France and Mash One (Chi) (Mashkour) flew in from the U.S. All were reported to have traveled well, and will be quarantined at the Japan Horseracing School before moving on to Tokyo Racecourse.

U.S. Reserves Make Hong Kong Fields:

Ladies Din (Din's Dancer) will join Bouccaneer (Fr) (Hero's Honor) and Breeders' Cup Mile winner Silic (Fr) (Sillery) as the U.S. representatives in the G2 Hong Kong Mile, to be run Dec. 12 at Sha Tin. Following the withdrawal of Kona Gold, Lexicon (Conquistador Cielo) and Riviera (Fr) (Kris {GB}) will join Big Jag (Kleven) as America's hopes for the Listed Hong Kong Sprint, the world's richest five-furlong race. Big Jag was third behind Artax in the Breeders' Cup Sprint at Gulfstream Park Nov. 6.

DICKINSON LINKED TO BREEDERS' CUP

INTRIGUE Trainer Michael Dickinson has been connected to two private investigators who were ejected from the Gulfstream Park backstretch on Breeders' Cup Day. Gulfstream disclosed yesterday that two men had made their way onto the Gulfstream backstretch with quest passes that initially had been issued to Dickinson, who ran Supreme Sound (GB) in the Breeders' Cup Classic. Reportedly, the Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau, which conducted the investigation into the incident, has reason to believe the two private eyes were there to observe horses trained by other individuals, trying to catch them in the act of administering prohibited substances. Dickinson did not return phone calls vesterday, but told the TRPB he has "done nothing wrong." Gulfstream declined to identify the invesigators or say which trainers they were targeting, but one of the men was first noticed at Payson Park on Breeders' Cup Day and appeared to be watching horses trained by Jim Bond. That person then followed Bond's van from Payson to Gulfstream and at one point, Bond said, tried to run it off the road. Another private eye was observed on the Gulfstream backstretch near horses trained by Bond, Elliott Walden and Jimmy Toner. Gulfstream has confirmed that one of the two individuals was carrying a gun. "Why did (Dickinson) do it? I'm puzzled," Bond said. "I'm totally shocked. There doesn't appear to be any rhyme or reason to what he did. I hope Michael Dickinson will tell me or someone else what was going through his mind." Walden also had a difficult time coming up with an explanation for Dickinson's alleged actions. "I don't know what to think about it," he said. "It's just an odd situation." The Walden and Bond stables both had unsuccessful Breeders' Cup Days, but neither trainer would blame the incident for their horses' poor showings.

HUSBANDS BREAKS WOODBINE MARK Jockey Patrick Husbands raced past the Woodbine single-season earnings mark yesterday afternoon, bringing this vear's bankroll at the Canadian track to \$5,123,693 after winning the second, third and seventh races on the card. The 26-year-old surpassed the record of \$5,117,385, set by Todd Kabel in 1995, with seven days left in the 1999 season. A candidate for the Sovereign Award as the year's top rider, Husbands leads the Woodbine standings with 168 wins.

Miss Tobacco Coming to America:

Rudolf Eisemann's three-year-old filly Miss Tobacco (Forty Niner), winner of the G3 Ostermann-Pokal Aug. 1 at Cologne, has been sold to an undisclosed American owner. The \$220,000 KEENOV weanling has won four of her 10 career starts, including two of her last three. She will head to New York next week, where she will be quarantined. It has not yet been decided whether she will remain in training or head to the breeding shed.

BIN SUROOR FINED FOR DRUG POSITIVE

Trainer Saeed bin Suroor was fined a total of £1,000 by the Jockey Club's disciplinary committee at a Thursday hearing into a positive test for the prohibited substance pentoxifylline by Godolphin's Royal Line (GB) (Saint Estephe {Fr}) after winning the Listed Bahrain Trophy at Newmarket in July. Bin Suroor was fined £750 for the offense and £250 for failing to keep a proper medication record as required under Jockey Club Rules. Royal Line was disqualified from the Newmarket race, which has been awarded to the Aidan O'Brientrained Moon Dragon (Ire).

FOAL CROP AT A RECORD LEVEL

There were more foals born in Britain and Ireland in 1999 than ever before, according to the just-published Weatherbys Return Of Mares. Up until Sept. 30, there were 13,115 born in 1999, compared to a final figure of 12,704 for 1998. The Coolmore duo of Grand Lodge (USA) and Perugino (USA) were the most prolific flat stallions during the 1999 breeding season in Britain or Ireland. Both sires covered books of 167, with the champion Sadler's Wells (USA) narrowly behind on 162 (he covered 196 mares last year). There were 26 flat sires who covered three-figure books, including Sri Pekan (USA), 160; Entrepreneur (GB), 152; Barathea (Ire), 147; Danehill (USA), 147, Eagle Eyed (USA), 147; Spectrum (Ire), 146; Desert King (Ire), 141; Victory Note (USA), 137; College Chapel (GB), 136; and Night Shift (USA), 131; In his first proper season, the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Peintre Celebre (USA) serviced 120 mares, but he had already covered at least 10 on southern hemisphere time at the end of 1998. But as ever, it was the National Hunt stallions who led the way, headed by Oscar (Ire), whose book of mares numbered 290 with Supreme Leader (GB) close behind on 264.

GOOD YEAR FOR DONCASTER SALES

Doncaster Bloodstock Sales posted a record annual average for 1999 and a second-highest aggregate that fell just short of last year's record.
