AFFIRMING SUCCESS IN THE CIGAR

It has been said that racing is a game that goes in circles, and it has certainly proved to be so for Affirmed Success (Affirmed) and his connections. When pre-race favorite Artax was injured Wednesday, trainer Rick Schosberg grabbed the suddenly available jockey Jorge Chavez and entered the venerable Affirmed Success, a horse which had not won in over a year, in yesterday's GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct. The move proved a success as the five-year-old cruised to a five-length victory. "Having different riders on him wasn't working out," said Schosberg. "Jorge was the rider that got the most out of him." Together with Chavez, the top-notch sprinter reeled off three straight races in 1998, including the GI Vosburgh, on his way to favoritism in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. But after running a disappointing sixth to Reraise in the Sprint at Churchill, he returned to New York and finished second in the '98 Cigar Mile. The bay started his 1999 campaign with a bang-up second to Artax in the May 2 GI Carter H. in track-record time and was a narrow second to Crafty Friend (Crafty Prospector) in both the GII Tom Fool H. in July and the GII Forego H. in September. Shipped to Gulfstream for another tilt at the Breeders' Cup, the gelding never got untracked and finished 12th under Jerry Bailey. Reunited with Chavez, the 5-2 shot settled just off the early pace of Yankee Victor (Saint Ballado) before angling out for the drive. Gaining command after three-quarters in 1:08 4/5, he was kept busy en route to an easy win. "Finally! That's the headline. He vindicated himself," enthused Schosberg. "I think the Breeders' Cup (Sprint) was a complete throw-out. Maybe in the long run, it leads up well to this race because he wasn't persevered with in the Breeders' Cup. It left us enough horse to ship him back here...and run one more time this year. He showed the quality horse that he is. Down the lane, it was just a matter of whether the extra furlong was going to bother him and this year, it didn't." Chavez, philosophical about his shift in fortunes, said, "With Artax out, it broke my heart because I won a Breeders' Cup on him and he was such a strong and fast horse. But that's the way this game goes. I'm glad I got the mount." Crafty Friend, the 2-1 choice, chased the pace, but weakened to be fourth. (Chart, p2)

MORE MOOLAH FOR MULA GULA?

Mula Gula (Lil E. Tee) won a stakes on the dirt at Emerald Downs last season, but has blossomed since switching to the turf for the last four starts of this campaign and is the lukewarm favorite against an overflow field in today's GI Early Times Hollywood Derby. The bay captured the July 22 Oceanside S., ran fourth after fighting his rider early in the Aug. 15 GIII La Jolla H., then made amends in his last two, taking the Sept. 25 GIII Bay Meadows Breeders' Cup Derby and the Oct. 23 GII Oak Tree Derby. Gary Stevens will keep his engagement aboard the colt despite a cyst outside of his right knee which will require surgery next week. Super Quercus (Fr) (Hero's Honor), never worse than second in his six European starts, was a listed stakes winner in his final French appearance. He made his U.S. debut in the Oak Tree Derby and rallied after a slow start to be third, beaten a length and a half. Manndar (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}), another by the sire of the great Daylami (Ire), also had his first American outing in the Oak Tree Derby, getting fourth (a head behind Super Quercus) after lugging in and getting steadied at the eighth pole. A listed winner in Britain, he was third to the highly regarded Dubai Millennium (GB) in the G2 Prix Eugene Adam in July and third again in the Sept. 18 G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange at Longchamp in his final European effort.

A perfect three-for-three at the distance coming into the Citation, Brave Act had earned his last victory in the 1 1/16-mile GIII Inglewood H. over this course. He had run into Silic (Fr) in three of his four starts since, finishing fifth behind that one in the June 13 GII Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile, third to him in the Oct. 16 GIII Oak Tree Breeders' Cup Mile and sixth to his nemesis after pressing the pace in his latest effort, the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 6. With no Silic to fear this time, the dark bay trailed the field while saving ground through six furlongs in 1:09.54, swung to the outside for the stretch drive and finished fastest of all to get the nod in a tightly packed finish. "We were farther back than I thought we would be, but I was following Pat (Day, on Hawksley Hill {Rahy}) all the way around there," said winning jockey Alex Solis, riding the five-year-old for the first time. "We got to the turn and it was kind of crowded there; I just had to be patient. Finally I got him out in the clear and let him run. I've seen his races where he's had that big turn of foot and believe me, when I got him into the clear, he threw me right into the back seat." As for the winner's future, trainer Ron McAnally said, "More than likely he will continue to race." The 19-10 favorite, Hawksley Hill moved from next-to-last while along the inside on the final bend, was caught in traffic as they came into the stretch, but got through late to get up for fourth.

The runner-up by a neck in the Sept. 16 GI Futurity in his stakes debut, Greenwood Lake came from out of the clouds to win the Oct. 9 GI Champagne S. in his next start and then was given a break. The colt skipped the Breeders' Cup, but was the even-money favorite to beat this field. Biding his time at the back of the pack early, as is his style, the bay was 4 1/2 lengths behind the next-to-last horse after a half mile as Windrush (Seeking the Gold) set the early pace, but swept six wide around the turn and flew down the lane to get up in the last jump. "This track has been favoring speed, and (Greenwood Lake) hadn't run in 7 1/2 weeks, so it was a pretty big effort," trainer Nick Zito said. "He's an exceptional horse." Hoping to get a little Eclipse buzz going, Zito added, "I think he was equally impressive as Anees in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. I think my horse warrants championship consideration--no matter how you look at it, it's going to be close for the two-year-old championship." It was the second Remsen score for two-time Kentucky Derby winner Zito, who also took the race with Go for Gin in 1993, then came back with that colt to win the 1994 Derby.

Captain Steve returned to Kentucky and captured his second graded-stakes event. After waltzing home by seven in his second start at Del Mar, the chestnut colt finished third in a pair of stakes, the GIII Best Pal and the GII Del Mar Futurity to stablemate Forest Camp. Shipped to Keeneland, he sailed through the slop while leading every step in the GII Lanes' End Breeders' Futurity, but could only manage 11th in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 6. Stalking the leaders while three wide early this time, he took command on the turn for home and extended his advantage through the stretch despite swerving in and out through the final furlong. "I remember standing here two years ago with (1998 Kentucky Derby winner) Real Quiet and finishing third and walking out with a smile," owner Mike Pegram said. "The only thing you think about in this business is the Kentucky Derby. We know (Captain Steve) likes Churchill now and we know distance shouldn't be a problem. You just hope and pray that you keep them healthy."

GOLD TEAR TOPS GOFFS SATURDAY Two lots stood out on paper from among the 230 on offer at yesterday's opener of the mare offering at the Goffs November sale in Co. Kildaire, Ireland, and they duly made prices far in excess of any others on the day. Topping the session was Lot 816, Forenaghts Stud's nine-year-old mare Gold Tear (Tejano), a half-sister to French Group 1 winners Gabina and Galetto (Fr) as well as to the dam of G1 Grand Criterium victor Goldmark. Carrying to an April cover by Green Desert, she was the subject of a bidding duel between agents operating on behalf of different Japanese clients, and it was Pro-Am Bloodstock's Thierry Storme who had the final say, bringing her down with a bid of £280,000. The Aga Khan's 15-year-old mare Dabiliya (Ire) (Vayraan {Ire}) always looked likely to fall to the bid of someone with access to top-of-the-market sires at less than market prices and so it proved, with the half-sister to Darshaan (GB) eventually going for £200,000 to successful Classic breeders David and Diane Nagle's Barronstown Stud. It's odds-on that she will be among the elite book of mares to visit Sadler's Wells next year; her half-sisters Darara (Ire) and Dalara (Ire) are already dams by that sire, respectively, of Australian Group 1 and French Group 2 winner Darazari (Ire), and this year's dual Derby runner-up Daliapour (Ire). The only other lot to make six figures was the stakes-placed Ela-Mana-Mou (Ire) matron Strutting (Ire), in foal to Mottistown Lattin Stud's second-season sire Revoque (Ire). A daughter of Irish 1000 Guineas third Taking Steps (GB) from the family of Sharpen Up (GB), the seven-year-old is dam of a Danehill yearling filly which made 155,000 guineas last month, and was acquired here by agent Peter Doyle. The Goffs November mare section concludes today. (All prices are in Irish pounds).

NUMBERS UP AT CHURCHILL FALL MEET

Churchill Downs wrapped up its 125th season of Thoroughbred racing yesterday afternoon as the Fall Meet came to a close. The 24-day meeting saw increases in both on-track attendance and total handle. (Figures from 1998 were adjusted, replacing the handle and attendance numbers from last year's Breeders' Cup week with the totals from the same week in 1997, to provide a more accurate comparison). Ontrack attendance was 205,583, up 1.41 percent, while handle from all sources was \$157,778,085, up 3.1 percent over the adjusted 1998 figure. On-track handle dropped 1.18 percent, totaling \$31,435,289 for the '99 season. With one less \$100,000 stakes on the program, daily purses for the fall meeting averaged \$366,354, down 3.1 percent from a year ago. "Our 125th anniversary year has been spectacular from start to finish--from a record Kentucky Derby and Oaks weekend through the continued growth of our Fall Meet," Churchill Downs President Alex Waldrop said. "We have faced significant new competition in our market over the past year, but our loyal patrons and growing numbers of new fans have strongly supported Churchill Downs racing this year and we thank them for it." Bobby Barnett, who tied for the top spot last year, led all trainers with 13 wins, including the GII Falls City H., GII Clark H. and GIII Ack Ack H. Those stakes wins were for Barnett's number-one client, John Franks, who picked up his fifth consecutive Churchill Fall owners' title, and his seventh overall, with a total of eight victories. Calvin Borel led the jockey standings at the meet for the first time with 42 winners, ending Pat Day's reign after five straight winning seasons.

NEW WINTER PLACE TO RACE IN SPAIN

A new racecourse at Mijas in southern Spain is being established and hopes to open within months, staging weekly fixtures. Trainers from the rest of Europe are interested in establishing year-round or winter operations at the course, such as Britain's David Nicholls. Irish trainer Eddie Creighton, formerly traveling head lad with Michael Kauntze, brought out five horses from Ireland just over two weeks ago. Apart from riding horses, his five are the only racehorses currently in the 92 boxes which have been completed, with another 200 or so currently being constructed. The two dirt tracks, a main course of 1 1/16 miles and a one-mile training track, are in place, as are the 23 floodlights and the main racecourse buildings. The grandstand is currently in preparation, but will take 18 months to complete. However, racing will start without it. The stables, a tunnel going under the track into the infield and car parking are the most obvious projects to be finished before racing can start. The financing has been provided by a municipal company backed by the nearby town of Mijas, with £8 million spent so far.
