### DANEHILL COLT TOPS TATTERSALLS MONDAY

French trainer François Doumen, agent for owner John D. Martin, went to 105,000gns to get the topselling yearling at yesterday's opening session of the Tattersalls December Sales at Park Paddocks in Newmarket, England. Consigned by Genesis Green Stud, agent, the Danehill colt is out of Shamisen (GB) (Diesis {GB}), a group-placed mare who is herself a full sister to MGSW Enharmonic and a half sister to MSW Soprano (GB) (Kris {GB}). Those who were interested but dropped out included agent Charlie Gordon-Watson and underbidder Clive Brittain, who saddled the colt's dam to run second in the G2 Lowther S. and trained her first two foals, the good handicapper Lone Piper (GB) and two-year-old Wind Chime (Ire). Doumen said, "He seemed a lovely colt and we hope he does well." A daughter of Royal Academy brought 100,000gns Monday, the third highest-ever price for a filly at the Tattersalls December yearling section. Consigned by John Troy, agent, the bay was purchased by Irish agent Peter Doyle, acting for trainer Richard Hannon. A February foal, she missed the October auction because of a slight setback, but was one of the standouts of the December catalogue. She is a full sister to stakes-winner Gold Academy (Ire), a course-record holder at York who was third in both the G1 St James's Palace S, and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. and who is also trained by Hannon. "It would be great if she could do as well as Gold Academy, and she seemed a really nice filly," the conditioner said. The only two December yearling fillies to make more were a daughter of Sir Ivor, who sold for 165,000gns 10 years ago, and a daughter of Sadler's Wells who went for 125,000gns in 1994. The December Sales resume Wednesday with four days of foals.

Agnes World ventured to France for his last start, winning the five-furlong G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp Oct. 3, one of Europe's premier sprints. The 6-5 favorite was sent to the lead here by jockey Yutaka Take and he never looked back, widening his margin in the stretch. "We had a good break," said Take, "so I let him go as he wanted." Masa Lucky, who defeated Agnes World in the May 23 Takamatsunomiya Kinen, closed well but fell a half-length short. After winning three of his first 10 starts, Agnes World has now taken four straight races.

A French mare called Ginger Candy has twice reminded me over the last 10 days of a phrase penned by an American schoolboy over 200 years ago--that "Tall oaks from little acorns grow." Those of you without a horticultural bent need to know that the botanical name for the oak family is Quercus, which forms part of the name of several of Ginger Candy's sons. Her two-year-old son is Theos Quercus (Fr), a Johann Quatz (Fr) colt who was successful on Nov. 20 in the Prix Delahante, a listed race won a year earlier by Ginger Candy's Hero's Honor colt, Super Quercus. Super Quercus has since switched continents, but he has lost none of his ability, as he showed with his Grade I victory in Sunday's Early Times Hollywood Derby.

As Super Quercus is apparently now considered a potential winner of next year's Breeders' Cup Mile, he can fairly be described as a tall oak grown from a little acorn. He is the result of a season which cost FF40,000, or roughly \$7,500, and his price as a yearling was equivalent to little more than \$20,000.

Although he couldn't be described as fashionably bred, don't get the idea that his bloodlines aren't worthy of a Grade I winner. His sire Hero's Honor began his stallion career at Lane's End Farm in 1985 at a fee of \$50,000, his sizeable fee reflecting the fact that he was an extremely well-bred Grade I winner.

Hero's Honor's sire was the incomparable Northern Dancer and his dam is Glowing Tribute, a blue hen who now has no fewer than six graded-stakes winners to her credit, including the Kentucky Derby winner Sea Hero. Whereas Sea Hero was successfully switched from turf to the main track, Hero's Honor was very much a turf specialist, winner of the Gl Bowling Green H. and Gl United Nations H. in 1984, when he ranked third behind John Henry and Majesty's Prince among the older turf males.

Maybe Hero's Honor's turf background went against him in Kentucky, where he attracted only 34 mares in his final season in 1990, and he was transferred to France. The French soon had good cause to congratulate themselves, because the graded winners Hero's Love, Home Of The Free and Honor The Hero eventually emerged from his 1988 crop and his 1989 crop contained Poolesta (Ire), a smart English juvenile who later enjoyed Grade III success in the States. Hero's Honor's handful of runners in France prior to his arrival had done well enough to ensure him a warm welcome and he continued to make his mark until his death in June. 1998. Incongruously, several of his French progeny have distinguished themselves after being sent to the States, good examples this year being Khumba Mela (Ire), Bouccaneer (Fr) and now Super Quercus.

Super Quercus' dam, Ginger Candy, is one of the few notable offspring by Hilal, a high-class French miler. A tough individual, Ginger Candy was placed in several listed races over sprint distances. The next dam, Ginger Lass, was even better, twice finishing third in Group 3 events over a mile in France, but the most distinguished name in Super Quercus' female line is that of his fourth dam, My Bupers. Although her \$10,200,000 son Snaafi Dancer was a total disaster, My Bupers also produced the champion sprinter My Juliet and the very good English colt Lyphard's Special. Her other descendants include Stella Madrid, Tis Juliet, the 1998 Irish Oaks winner Winona (Ire) and this year's Group III winner Isle de France.

"Mr. Fabre has told me that I will not be riding for him next year," said Jarnet. "We have parted on excellent terms and that is how life goes on. I've had my highs and lows, but it has been great working for him over the years. As far as my future is concerned, I will have to see if Mr. Wafic Said will renew my retainer for next year. I will more or less be riding as a freelance jockey and be more available for anyone who would like to have me on their horse." It had been announced earlier that top apprentice Christophe Soumillon will ride as number two jockey for the Fabre stable next season. Officially employed by Cedric Boutin until June of next year, Soumillon only needs one more winner to ride out his claim following his success aboard Supreme Alliance (Fr) (Kendor (Fr)) in the last race on vesterday's Maisons-Laffitte card. The 18-year-old Soumillon has been something of a revelation in France this season, and currently has ridden 69 winners.
