## APPLAUSE, APPLAUSE AT TATTERSALLS

The highest-priced foal on a slow first day of the 1999 Tattersalls December Foal Sale in Newmarket, England yesterday made 30,000 guineas. The bay, a colt by first-crop sire Royal Applause (GB), was purchased by agent Amanda Skiffington for an Irish client as a pinhooking prospect. He was consigned by breeder Mark Collins' Low Ground Stud near York. His dam Thevetia (GB) has had four winners from six runners, including In Like Flynn (GB) (Handsome Sailor), winner of seven races in Britain and the U.S. Skiffington said, "He was the nicest I have seen today, although they have not been a great bunch. He was bought for a stud in Ireland to be resold next year." A filly by In The Wings (GB), from Hilborough Stud, made 26,000gns to the Andrew Sime agency. The purchaser was one of her part-breeders, Dubai-based lawyer Ziad Galadani, who has horses in training with John Hills and Mark Johnston. Her dam Ninia (Affirmed) is a half-sister to Gold Land (Gone West), who finished second in the Coventry S. for trainer Paul Cole in Britain before going to California-based Neil Drysdale, where she won three Grade III events. A colt by successful first-season sire Vettori (Ire) made 23,000gns to the bid of Margaret O'Toole, another pinhooking prospect for Gay O'Callaghan's Yeomanstown Stud. The day's figures were down significantly on last year's--the median fell by 20 percent and the average by 29 percent. Trade is expected to pick up when the sale resumes at 9:30 a.m.

### Magic Millions Macau Sale Results

The (Australian) Gold Coast-based company Magic Millions sold 27 two and three-year-olds in Macau Nov. 28, grossing \$HK4,025,000 (\$518,685) and averaging \$HK175,000 (\$22,551). Magic Millions managing director Don Hancock said while three-year-olds were particularly sought after at the sale, it was important to retain a balance in the catalogue. "From our point of view, if we switch to a catalogue of predominantly three-year-olds we could invite suspicion as to why they are here unraced," he said. Among the top sellers were a Mighty Avalanche (Aus)--Plush Lady (Aus) three-year-old which brought \$HK400,000 (\$51,546) and a half-brother to prolific Hong Kong winner Smashing Pumpkin (Aus) (Bold Citadel) by Danzig sire Muhayaa which sold for \$HK280,000 (\$36,082).

### Yachtie To Shuttle?

The 10-year-old stallion Yachtie (Aus) (Broad Reach {NZ}--Glide By {GB}, by Remainder Man {GB}), sire of GI Matriarch winner Happyannuoit (NZ), could shuttle to Kentucky next year, The Oaks Stud manager Rick Williams told the New Zealand Press Association. He currently stands for a fee of \$NZ6,000 (\$3,141). Happyannuoit, the champion two-year-old filly in New Zealand last year, is from the stallion's second crop and is now four-for-eight since shipping to the U.S. this season. "We've had an approach and we are seriously considering it," said Williams. The stallion, a G1-placed two-year-old on the track, relocated from Grangewilliam Stud to The Oaks last season. "His first big book are now two-year-olds and the quality of mares going to him has improved since he's been here," said Williams.

After a successful run in 1999, the Kentucky Derby Future Wager will again be available during three periods in the coming year, Feb. 17-20, March 9-12 and April 13-16. Wagering will commence at 12:00 p.m. Thursday and will close at 4:30 p.m. the following Sunday. The field of horses consists of 23 individual horses as determined by a committee, and a 24th betting interest comprised of all other three year olds. The mutuel field was a popular choice during the first season and proved the correct choice when Charismatic scored his upset Derby victory. "The first Kentucky Derby Future Wager was one of the brightest successes of a very good year at Churchill Downs," said Churchill Downs president Alex Waldrop. "We look forward to presenting this wager to an even larger audience as we focus on Kentucky Derby 2000."

### Tiebreaker to be Used in Horse Of Year Balloting:

It was announced yesterday that a tie-break rule could be implemented, if necessary, in voting for 1999 Horse of the Year. Under the current system, representatives of the three voting bodies, the NTRA, the National Turf Writers Association and the *Daily Racing Form* each cast individual votes which are tallied to create a voting bloc. The majority choice of each voting entity for Horse of the Year receives one point for a maximum of three points. In the event of a tie, three way or two way, in the event of a split vote, the popular vote will be used to break the tie. "This precedent was established in 1984 when John Henry and Slew o' Gold were in a two-way tie," said Chip Tuttle, NTRA vice president of communications. John Henry was ultimately declared Horse of the Year based on the popular vote.

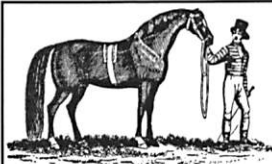

**SEA-BIRD'S TRAINER DEAD** Etienne Pollet, the trainer of the great \*Sea-Bird, died last Saturday. He was 88. The revered horseman was best known for his handling of the winner of the 1965 Epsom Derby and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, and he was regarded as one of France's greatest trainers. In 1953, he saddled La **Sorellina (Fr)** and \***Silnet**, both owned by Paul Dubosq, to be first and second in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. He was also responsible for the 1968 Arc winner, champion \***Vaguely Noble**; three-time champion **Hula Dancer (USA)** and Great Britain's 1961 Horse of the Year **Right Royal (Fr)**. In 1964, Pollet saddled both \***Grey Dawn II** and \***Sea-Bird** to be first and second in the Grand Criterium, \***Sea-Bird's** only career defeat. Pollet was renowned for refusing to train more than 50 horses at a time and retired in 1970 after training **Gyr (USA)**, a son of \***Sea-Bird**, to win the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and finish second to **Nijinsky II (USA)** in the Epsom Derby. Pollet will also be remembered as a great tutor and it was no coincidence that the late François Boutin, his long-time assistant, went on to launch his own career with great success.

Enjoying a more consistent year than last season, Milford Track redeemed his defeat when favorite in this race last year and recorded his first stakes success since winning the Listed Grand Prix de Marseille in 1997 with an authoritative front-running display. The six-year-old has recorded at least one win per campaign in each of his five seasons of racing. Drama preceded the race when **Magic Whisper (Fr)** (**Subotica {Fr}**) fell backwards in the stalls, momentarily trapping **Sylvain Guillot** against the back of the gate; he walked away clutching his left arm, and **Magic Whisper** was announced a non-starter. Milford Track went straight to the lead and took the field into the straight. **Aurelian Malenfant** kicked the leader three lengths clear approaching the two-furlong pole in a move that was to prove decisive. Milford Track was kept up to his work throughout the final furlong and maintained his comfortable lead to the wire. **Mawasko** was a safe second; **Fragrant Mix** looked threatening at the quarter-mile marker but didn't follow through. Favored **Whiplash (Ger)** (**Executive Pride {Ire}**) finished strongly, despite traffic problems in the straight.
