ACTION PICKS UP AT TATTERSALLS

Raffin Stud did well at vesterday's second session of the Tattersalls December Sales, offering four of the top six lots. The first crop of Spinning World (Nureyev), based at Ashford in Kentucky, were well received in America last month and the first of the Breeders' Cup Mile winner's weanlings to appear at a British auction fetched the top price of the day, 70,000 guineas. The colt is the first produce of Roses In The Snow (Ire) (Be My Guest), a winner on both sides of the Atlantic, and was purchased by agent Peter Doyle, acting for a pinhooking client. "The Spinning Worlds have been doing very well in America and I thought this one was a reasonable price," said Doyle. Another first-crop sire, Coolmore's Entrepreneur (GB) (Sadler's Wells), had a 68,000 guineas colt, out of Mariakova (The Minstrel). The British Bloodstock Agency (Ireland)'s John McCormack captured this one. Another Raffin colt, by Danehill out of Sabaah Elfull (GB) (Kris {GB}) was taken by David Brown of Furnace Mill Stud for 60,000 guineas from Doyle. Brown said, "I thought he was a lovely horse, particularly being such a late foal [May 10], by a good stallion from a family that everybody knows. I don't normally stick my neck out so far, so I hope that I am proved right next year." The top filly of the day went for 50,000 guineas. By Night Shift out of Nunatak (Bering {GB}), she went to the BBA (Ireland)'s Adrian Nicoll. Ennistown Stud's Grand Lodge colt went for 62,000 guineas to Ashtown House Stud's Paul Shanahan. Trade was much better on the second day of foals and the sale resumes at 9:30 a.m. today. Top 5 Lots p2.

THORNFIELD IS SUPREME, WINS SOVEREIGN

Five-year-old Thornfield (Sky Classic), winner of the \$1.5 million Gl Canadian International Oct. 17 and more than \$1.1 million in earnings this year, was named Canada's Horse of the Year last night at the annual Sovereign Awards in Toronto. Trained by Phil England, campaigned by Ontario owner/breeder Knob Hill Stable and ridden by Richard Dos Ramos, he was the longest odds in the Canadian International field at 18.85-1. Thornfield held off 9-5 favorite Fruits of Love to take Canada's biggest race and set himself up as favorite for the Sovereign. Frank Stronach was honored as top owner as well as top breeder.

A very even field lined up for the first Group 1 staying handicap of the season in New Zealand. Gold Cloud (Truly Vain {Aus}) quickly took command in a race that was full of pace. As she tired upon entering the straight, Trounced shot through on the rail and made the lead about a furlong from home. In a blanket finish, Trounced just held off Windsor Phew by a head with In My Time a nose back in third and favorite Magic Winner (Ubetido {Aus}) another nose back in fourth. The second and third placings were reversed following a protest by In My Time's rider Linda Ballantyne. Trounced is likely to head to Waikato next for the G2 Waikato Times Gold Cup in 10 days and then possibly the G1 Auckland Cup Jan. 1.

SIXTEEN RACES UPGRADED FOR 2000 The

American Graded Stakes Committee has released its list of graded stakes races for 2000, awarding graded status to 473 stakes events, one more than in 1999. Whereas nine races were awarded Grade I credentials for this year, the Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile at Hollywood Park will be the only new Grade I for the upcoming season. An additional 15 races were upgraded, including six new Grade II events and nine Grade III races. Arlington International, which is scheduled to race in 2000, was awarded the same 17 graded stakes it was scheduled to run in 1998 and 1999, although three of its races have been downgraded.

COUNTESS DIANA TO JANUARY SALE Countess Diana (Deerhound--T.V. Countess, by T.V. Commercial), the champion two-year-old filly of 1997, will sell at the Keeneland January Sale, with Eaton Sales acting as agent for owner/breeder Richard Kaster. The January Sale is set for Jan. 10-13 in Lexington. Winless in four starts at three, Countess Diana was two-for-four this year, taking an allowance race at Saratoga after an 11month layoff and most recently posting a three-length allowance score in her turf debut at Keeneland Oct. 21. The winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Fillies, GI Spinaway S., GII Walmac Int'l Alcibiades S. and GII Schuylerville S. during her Eclipse campaign, and second to Jersey Girl in the '98 GIII Nassau County S., she has notched seven victories and two seconds from 14 career starts with earnings of \$1,117,186.

After capturing the GIII Gotham S. by 7 1/2 lengths in March, he finished a good fourth in the GII Wood Memorial three weeks later. Skipping the Derby in favor of the GI Preakness May 15, the chestnut colt rallied through traffic to finish third to Charismatic and Menifee, but went to the sidelines with a chipped knee. The crowd's choice rated just off the pace, rallied four wide in the stretch and edged clear late. "I didn't ask him until the 3/16 pole and he responded really well," said winning jockey Mike Luzzi. "He galloped out great and felt awesome. They did a good job with him, considering he had all that time off. He showed that his Preakness was no fluke."

PINCAY CLOSING IN ON HISTORY By Bill Finley

Laffit Pincay Jr. took another step closer to history yesterday, riding two winners at Hollywood Park to draw to within four of Bill Shoemaker's mark for most victories ever by a rider, 8,833. It shouldn't be long now for the jockey who says he has never felt better and has never ridden better. "This has been the best time in my career as a jockey," Pincay said yesterday. "I have a great wife, beautiful kids and I have a new grandchild. I'm happy to be riding every day. I'm close to the record, but I'm getting there without any pressure. I'm really enjoying this. What else can I ask for."

Pincay's sudden resurgence has been, he said, the result of a combination of factors. He says a new diet has helped him finally win the fight against weight, which has put him in better spirits and has allowed him to ride better. That, in turn, has caught the attention of trainers, who are now lining up to give him good mounts after ignoring him for years.

"Everything is working together," he said. "When I started to feel good, people noticed," Pincay said. "I noticed it myself, that I was riding better. Shoemaker came to the jockey's room the other day and said, 'I don't know what you're doing, but you're riding a lot better.' I'm stronger and I look better. Trainers see that and they start putting you on better horses."

Pincay had originally hoped to break Shoemaker's record at Santa Anita, which opens Dec. 26, or maybe even on his 53rd birthday, Dec. 29. But he'll be just as happy to have his victory party at Hollywood Park.

"I'm riding so many good horses now there's no way I'd stop for a while," Pincay said. "I've talked about it with my agent. I think there was some bad communication with the people at Hollywood Park. If I keep winning, I'll be glad to do it here."

With the countdown now narrowed down to single digits, the usually unflappable Pincay is beginning to get excited. He knows he's about to do something special.

"It will mean a lot to me because I think Shoemaker is the greatest rider I ever rode against," Pincay said. "It's a record I never thought anybody would come close to. I'm very proud of that. When I won my 8,000th race, I thought I had a chance, but it would be iffy. When I hit 8,500, I thought I had a good chance to do it. I knew I couldn't stop and I had to go for it."

Pincay has four mounts on today's card at Hollywood.



TREMPOLINO TO RETURN TO FRANCE

The return of Trempolino (USA) (Sharpen Up {GB}) to Haras du Mezeray, where he was bred (he was born in the United States and returned to France as a weanling), is excellent news, considering his results to date. He is so far responsible for 55 blacktype winners and several Group 1 winners, notably Dernier Empereur (USA) (Champion S.) and Juvenia (USA) (Prix Marcel Boussac). He has also produced U.S. graded winners Talloires (USA), Trampoli (USA), Hidden Trick (USA) and Cox Orange (USA), French group winners Neuilly (USA) and For Valour (USA), English group winners Arkadian Hero (USA) and Triarius (USA) and German group winner Saugerties (USA). The winner of the 1987 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in record time, the Paul de Moussac-bred Trempolino almost added the Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita the same year, just missing out to Theatrical (Ire). Earlier in the season he was runner-up to Natroun (Fr) in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club, to Groom Dancer (USA) in the G1 Prix Lupin and was third to Risk Me (Fr) in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris. He prepared for his Arc success with a brilliant win in the G2 Prix Niel, where he employed a notable turn of foot. The scenario was the same in the Arc itself, where Pat Eddery held him up for a long time at the back before getting his mount to change gears with impressive speed to pass Tony Bin (Ire) (who won the following year), Triptych (USA), Mtoto (GB) et al. Trempolino's class and temperament allowed him to maintain his form throughout his three-year-old campaign, with three wins and five places from eight outings from April to November. His ability was already evident as a two-year-old, as he beat Le Glorieux (GB) (a future triple-Group 1 winner) as both made their debut over a mile at Deauville. He was also twice-placed in group races as a juvenile. In total, he ran 11 times with four wins and seven places.

RUSSIAN REVIVAL RETIRED

In a deal brokered by the Curragh Bloodstock Agency, this year's G3 Prix du Palais-Royal winner Russian Revival (USA) (Nureyev {USA}--Memories {USA}, by Hail the Pirates {USA}) has been retired to Killarkin Stud in Co. Meath. His fee has been set at Ir£3,000, Oct. 1 terms. The six-year-old was a consistent performer over the course of his five-year racing career, with seven victories and nine placings from 25 starts. A multiple Listed stakes winner in England, Russian Revival was second in the 1997 G2 Hong Kong International Bowl. His dam was the winner of the GII Miss Grillo S. at Belmont Park as a two-year-old and is a half-sister to the outstanding American turf mare and MGISW Memories of Silver (USA) (Silver Hawk {USA}).

PRIZE MONEY TO INCREASE IN 2000

The Irish Horseracing Authority yesterday announced a big increase in prize money for next year, contributing 30 percent more. Prize money will rise to a total of Ir£25 million next year, up almost Ir£4.5 million, with the IHA putting in Ir£12.2 million. Minimum prizes will rise to Ir£5,000 from Ir£3,500.

COLLINS SELLS MOST OF CORBALLY STUD

Much of Corbally Stud near Celbridge, County Kildare, was sold to an unnamed Dublin-based businessman, Racing Post reports. Owner Sean Collins did not reveal the purchase price for the farm, but did say that 145 of the nearly 170 acres were sold. "It was well in excess of the figure it reached at auction," Collins said. Corbally was home to Priolo and Desert Style, who earlier this year were relocated and sold, respectively. Collins said he will remain on the unsold portion of land to "have my own private stud."

★ BRITAIN ★

HUGHES ASKS SAVILL TO RECONSIDER

Levy Board chairman Rob Hughes yesterday asked the British Horseracing Board chairman Peter Savill to reconsider his decision to resign from the Levy Board. Savill was very critical of Hughes' role in the recent Levy negotiations, which produced a settlement of £61 million. Hughes said he was proud of the settlement, but admitted it could have been higher. According to the Racing Post, Savill is still serving on the marketing subcommittee, which has one more meeting.

BALDING AND QUEEN SEVER TIES

The Queen has decided against giving trainer lan Balding any yearlings next year, effectively ending their 35-year relationship, according to the *Racing Post*. Balding said that a lack of success, as well as fewer yearlings, were the main culprits for the split. "We've really had no luck at all for The Queen in recent years," he told *Racing Post*, "so it's not a total surprise. It's been a great privilege to train for Her Majesty and she has been a wonderful owner." The Queen's horses will be split among Roger Charlton, Richard Hannon and Sir Michael Stoute.

RACING NEEDS £30 MILLION, HAS £1.9 MILLION

A marketing report commissioned by the British Horseracing board called for a £30 million investment over three years to transform and widen the audience for British racing. But the only available money next year is the £1.9 million earmarked by the Levy Board. Peter Savill, the BHB chairman, said, "The study shows the enormous potential there is for racing to generate significant income through increased investment in marketing. Sadly, in the light of the levy settlement imposed on racing in October, the funds will not be available in the short term for an investment on the scale proposed in this report." The report concluded that an additional £160 million would be generated for racing from the investment of £30 million. Its theme was that racing needs to reform and spend to "create an audience profile that will attract substantial TV and sponsorship income."


