#### AIR JIHAD, "LOVE" KO'ED IN HONG KONG

Air Jihad (Jpn) (Sakura Yutaka O {Jpn}), winner of the G1-Jpn Yasuda Kinen and G1-Jpn Mile Championship in his home country this year, was scratched from today's G1 Hong Kong Cup after he strained a tendon in his right front leg. The G2 Hong Kong Vase also lost a participant as an ultrasound of the left front leg of Fruits Of Love (Hansel) revealed a strained suspensory. Mark Johnston, trainer of Fruits Of Love, told Sporting Life, "It is unfortunate, but there's nothing we can do and there's no point risking a horse as valuable as this. We want to keep him for next season, when he will be going for the Dubai World Cup." The four-year-old captured the Dubai Turf Classic at Nad al Sheba earlier this year, and went on to win the G2 Hardwicke S. and run second in the GI Canadian International. Air Jihad's defection leaves a field of 12 for the Cup. The dozen are headed by the champion New Zealand mare Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}), who has won six 1999 stakes, including the G1 Doncaster H. and G1 BMW Cox Plate; and two-time Hong Kong hero Jim and Tonic (Fr) (Double Bed (Fr)), winner of the '98 G2 Hong Kong International Bowl at seven furlongs and the '99 G2 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at the Cup distance of 1 1/4 miles. The five-year-old comes off a ninth-place finish, beaten four lengths, in the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Mile. Another experienced traveller is Cup contender Running Stag (Cozzene), a graded-stakes winner in France and the U.S. The five-year-old pocketed the GII Brookyn H. and GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. in America this season. Fourth in the GI Woodward S. in September, he was most recently second, beaten a neck at short odds, in an allowance race over Lingfield's all-weather surface Nov. 16. Jockey Shane Sellers flies in for the mount. "I think he will adapt well to the course at Sha Tin," Sellers told Sporting Life. "Both his major stakes wins were achieved on the dirt, but I feel he can run on any surface. We've drawn an outside post, but I don't see that as affecting us greatly. I think Sunline will set the pace-we'll be looking to catch her." Hong Kong International fields, p2

#### HOMECOURT ADVANTAGE

Welcome home! It has been something of an up-anddown season for Manistique (Unbridled). She began her 1999 campaign with a trio of graded stakes victories, including her first Grade I in the Santa Margarita H., but was brought immediately back down to Earth when dealt a decisive loss in the GI Apple Blossom H. A 4 1/2-length victory in the GI Vanity H. was tempered by a loss in the GII Chula Vista H., a neck score in the GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H. was soured by a disappointing performance when last of eight in the Breeders' Cup Distaff in her last. The four-year-old came into this event with a perfect five-for-five record over the Hollypark main and would not disappoint. With owner Marshall Naify making a rare racetrack appearance, the 17-hands bay broke well and secured a stalking position while close to the pace four wide. She began to get serious with a menacing move three deep at the halfmile marker, took over at the top of the lane and had plenty in reserve to hold Snowberg safe to become the first repeat winner of the Bayakoa. Winning trainer John Shirreffs was happy to see his filly get back on track. "I'm just thrilled, to tell you the truth," he said. "She rated kindly and responded when asked to run. She was just back on her game." As for the future, Shirreffs added, "It's possible this could have been her last race, but that will be Mr. Naify's call. I'd hate to look down the shedrow and not see her big head sticking out of the stall."

Field Of Hope, with six wins, three seconds and three thirds from her 14 career starts, has won three of her last four outings, taking the G3 Prix du Chemin de Ferd du Nord at Chantilly in June, the G2 Prix d'Astarte at Deauville in August and the G1 Prix de la Foret in her latest appearance at Longchamp Oct. 17. Docksider, a two-time group winner in Germany this year, was the runner-up in the G1 Sussex S. in July, then shipped to the U.S. where he ran sixth in the 1 1/4-mile GI Oak Tree Turf Championship and third, missing by only a neck, in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. South African champion Resfa has two wins from his six Hong Kong starts, including the Hong Kong Classic Trial. Midnight Bet has just one win from six starts in Japan this season, taking the G1 Kinko Sho, but the five-year-old captured the G2 Hong Kong International Cup last year.

Five-for-nine on the year, **Big Jag** was the winner in a pair of graded stakes at Santa Anita earlier this season and added two more stakes victories at Bay Meadows in the fall before running third in the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. He makes his turf debut. **Sainte Marine**, the champion three-year-old sprinter in France last year, earned a win in the '99 G2 Prix de Gros-Chene and was the runner-up for the second straight year in the G1 Nunthorpe S. The four-year-old filly was sixth, beaten about four lengths, in the G1 Prix de L'Abbaye de Longchamp last out Oct. 3.

Never worse than second in five starts, Legend Hunter, a National Association of Racing horse, captured his first graded stakes in the Oct. 23 G2-Jpn Daily Hai Sansai S. at Kyoto. Jockey Katsumi Ando said, "It is my dream to win the Japan Racing Association's Grade 1 race with an NAR horse. I hope this race prepares (Legend Hunter) for the Classic season--he has a bright future ahead of him." Added trainer Katsuyoshi Takada, "He is getting more powerful with every race. All I have to do is keep him in good condition." Meiner Condor, two-for-three lifetime, broke his maiden at Hakodate in June and came back to take the Sept. 25 G3-Jpn Sapporo Sansai S. His regular rider, Naoto Ito, has been out of action since he was injured in a training mishap Oct. 13. (Preview cont. p5)

Second in his first attempt at a route over the local dirt Oct. 2, Tahkodha Hills graduated in his next start, getting up to win by a head as the even-money favorite going a mile Oct. 17. Stretching out an extra sixteenth for his next and most recent start Nov. 22, the homebred was kept within three lengths of the lead through the opening six furlongs and gained steadily late to cross the wire second, beaten 1 1/4 lengths. The dark bay broke alertly under jockey Eibar Coa and settled nicely in sixth as Fight For Ally (Fit to Fight) set moderate fractions. Still seventh with five sixteenths to run, there was a question of whether Tahkodha Hills could thread the needle, but Coa guided him through a seam, took over from Wayward Ways 100 yards from the line and prevailed. Winning trainer Ralph Ziadie was looking toward the future after the race. "The longer he goes the better. I'll be pointing him towards the Florida Derby," Ziadie said. Winning jockey Coa had his choice between the winner and End Leader (End Sweep, fourth). "We think he's going to be a really good horse next year as a three-year-old," he said. "He's still green, plays around and does wrong things...he's not focused, but he has a lot of talent."

Early Warning, given time away from the races after a seventh in the W.D. Schaefer H. on Preakness Day May 15, returned to the racetrack with a sharp, front-running victory in the Saratoga mud Aug. 15 and returned 15 days later to finish fourth in the GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. Third in the GIII Fayette Breeders' Cup at Keeneland Oct. 10, the bay was most recently a closing third in the Broad Brush S. at The Meadowlands Oct. 29, beaten just a length. Yankee Victor made the early running, but Jorge Chavez kept Early Warning in close attendance through six furlongs in a moderate 1:11 1/5. The latter responded when roused to poke a head in front at the eighth pole and gradually increased his margin to the wire. Doc Martin rallied late to be up for the place spot. "I knew (Yankee Victor) had speed and I didn't want him to get away from us because I knew he would be tough," Chavez said. "That horse hung in until midstretch, but my horse was simply much the best." Winning conditioner Todd Pletcher indicated that original plans called for Early Warning to get some time off "but I would like to think about the (GIII) Gallant Fox H. (Dec. 26)," he said.

**GOLDNEYEV MARE TOPS DEAUVILLE** OPENER Gold's Dance (Fr) (Goldnevev), in foal to Bering (GB), attracted a bid of FF2,600,000 from B.B.A. England to top yesterday's opening session of the Deauville December Breeding Stock Sale at the Agence Française sales grounds in Deauville, France. The eightyear-old mare is already a Group 1 producer with just one foal to race; her undefeated two-year-old filly Goldamix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) captured this year's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. Consigned by Elevage du Pays d'Ouches, Gold's Dance is herself a winning half sister to GSW Solveig (Fr) (Gay Mecene). Amenixa (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}), from the Haras du Val Henry consignment, was the only other seven-figure mare on opening day, bringing FF1,800,000 from Curragh Bloodstock Agency. In foal to Zieten, the five-year-old is a full sister to Amilynx (Fr), winner of this year's G1 Prix Royal Oak. The day's top-selling weanling was a colt from the first crop by Singspiel (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}) out of Lattaquie (Fr) (Fast Topaze). Consigned by Haras de Fresnay Le Buffard, the March foal was purchased by Margaret O'Toole. The first session showed significant gains over the 1998 opener, with the aggregate up nearly 61 percent and the average gaining 36 percent. The three-day sale continues today at 10 a.m.

### WRITERS UP

## THE VANDERBILT FACTOR By Ed Bowen

Alfred Vanderbilt's self-deprecating sense of humor prompted him often to comment that he had devoted a great deal of thought to the mating which produced Native Dancer, as he purposely downplayed the fact that he had devoted a similar degree of thought to the matings that produced all his other horses.

As the owner of champions such as Native Dancer and Discovery, and as the racing executive who engineered the match race between War Admiral and Seabiscuit, his place in the annals of racing is guaranteed. But Vanderbilt, who passed away recently at the age of 87, should be remembered for his influence on the Thoroughbred breed as well.

From the standpoint of international Thoroughbred racing and breeding, a couple of decisions along the way have guaranteed Vanderbilt a place in history beside such names as Lord Derby, Federico Tesio, and the Phippses and the Whitneys.

At any given moment in the history of Thoroughbred breeding and racing there are horses that are perceived as stars and even superstars. But even at this glorified echelon, there is a high futility rate in so far as projecting an ongoing influence. As the breeder of Native Dancer and of Miss Disco, the dam of Bold Ruler, Vanderbilt adroitly side-stepped this truism, for the imprint of those animals has lingered over many equine generations.

All successes are built upon existing raw material. For Vanderbilt, one key to his lasting success was the purchase from Mereworth Farm of the two-year-old Discovery in 1933. Vanderbilt had reached adult status that year, inheriting Sagamore Farm in Maryland and a goodly portion of the grist which makes such mills operate happily, i.e., financial wherewithal.

Dealing with the older Walter Salmon Sr., the stripling Vanderbilt played things coolly. When negotiations seemed to be complicated, he announced that he was sailing for a trip to Africa and that he had made his last offer for the colt. It was aboard the good ship Aquitania that the young traveler received a telegram that Discovery would, indeed, carry his cerise and white diamond silks. (If the spirit of the Aquitania was attuned to racing history, this was a welcomed addition to its lore, for 10 years earlier, the same vessel had carried Epsom Derby winner Papyrus toward his embarrassing defeat by Zev in an early international match race in New York.)

Discovery developed into a storied, weight-carrying handicapper in an age when weight-carrying handicappers were revered in American racing. He was sent to stud at Vanderbilt's Sagamore Farm in Maryland and, while his number of stakes winners, 25, was not overwhelming, his genes showed a phenomenal stamina.

Mated frequently to the Pompey mare Outdone, Discovery sired three stakes winners. The second of that trio was Miss Disco, a 1944 foal that won the Test and three other stakes at three and four. Miss Disco was bred by Vanderbilt, but did not race for him.

World Wars are such bloody nuisances. Being involved in the first one prompted August Belmont II to sell a yearling named Man o' War, and being involved as a decorated naval office in the second prompted Vanderbilt to sell some yearlings in 1945. At the Meadow Brook sale, Miss Disco was purchased for \$2,100 by Sydney S. Schupper, who enjoyed her racing career and then sold her on to Mrs. Henry Carnegie Phipps of Wheatley Stable.

From Miss Disco, Mrs. Phipps bred Bold Ruler, Preakness winner and Horse of the Year at three in 1957 and a fierce handicapper in 1958. Bold Ruler proceeded to set a 20th Century North American record at Claiborne Farm by leading the sire list eight times. The non-pareil Secretariat topped the legion of Bold Ruler's best sons. While many of them failed to duplicate their prowess as stallions, the branch that went through Boldnesian to Bold Reasoning to Triple Crown winner Seattle Slew and thence to A.P. Indy and his sons Pulpit, Old Trieste, etc., is among the lines which seem destined to preserve and prolong the influence of Bold Ruler into the next century.

#### Vanderbilt cont.

Vanderbilt had no pressing matters which prompted him to sell yearlings in 1950 and thus he kept to race one of the great homebred crops of history. The Sagamore youngsters of that age included Native Dancer and the accomplished geldings Find and Social Outcast. Native Dancer was by Preakness winner Polynesian and out of Geisha, another homebred Discovery mare.

A champion who lost only one race--which was, unfortunately, the Kentucky Derby--Native Dancer of Sagamore never appeared to be as great a stallion as such contemporaries as Bull Lea, Nasrullah, and Princequillo. Nevertheless, as the sire of Raise a Native and the broodmare sire of Northern Dancer, his name became a virtual ubiquity in the pedigrees of top-class horses the world over.

Raise a Native, of course, begot Mr. Prospector, Alydar, etc., and Northern Dancer sired an array including Nijinsky II, Sadler's Wells, Lyphard, Nureyev, Danzig, Storm Bird, and so forth.

Moreover, Native Dancer's other sons included Dancer's Image, plus Dan Cupid (sire of \*Sea-Bird), and Atan (author of a male line branch leading in the current framework to Sharpen Up {GB}).

Two great horses were sufficient to implant the name of Alfred G. Vanderbilt alongside those of the best breeders, but they were far from his only lasting contributions.

The last conversation the writer had with Mr. Vanderbilt was on Belmont Day, when the old gentleman thanked us for a note pointing out that 1999 Kentucky Derby-Preakness winner Charismatic sprang from a long-ago Vanderbilt-bred. Good Example, the fourth dam of Charismatic, and Grass Shack, the third dam, were both bred by Vanderbilt. Good Example was out of Parade Girl, another Mereworth-bred which Vanderbilt mined early in his career. Grass Shack continues today in many other pedigrees as the third dam of leading sire Deputy Minister.

Good Example also foaled Exclusive, a Vanderbilt-bred which produced five stakes winners including Exclusive Native. Also a leading sire, Exclusive Native sired Triple Crown winner Affirmed and filly Derby winner Genuine Risk.

Both Exclusive Native and Deputy Minister were sires with more than one Vanderbilt element, for in addition to being out of the Good Example-Grass Shack female dynasty, they also traced on the top half of their pedicrees to Native Dancer.

Thus, decades later, and for decades to come, these good examples and many others provide testimony to the effective considerations by which Alfred G. Vanderbilt bred his foals.




