HONG KONG THE PERFECT TONIC FOR JIM

Jim and Tonic (Fr) (Double Bed (Fr)) continued his domination of Sha Tin Racecourse when he made the G1 Hong Kong Cup his third win in three starts at the Hong Kong oval. He hadn't won since April 18, when he took the Queen Elizabeth II Cup over course and distance, Favorite Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun (GB)) went to the front as expected, followed closely by Running Stag (Cozzene) to her outside. The filly set easy fractions and as they turned for home, jockey Greg Childs was expecting a victory. "I was happy with her the whole wav 'round," he said. "When she got into the straight, she just didn't kick." But kick is what Jim and Tonic did, shooting up the center of the track like a bullet, quickly opening up daylight and drawing off for a resounding win. "Jim And Tonic proved himself today," said winning trainer François Doumen. "He's been unlucky in his last two runs [ninth in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile and third in the GI Canadian International]." As for the future of the world traveller, Doumen said, "I am tempted to go to Singapore [early March], Dubai [late March] and the QEII here [mid-April]. Obviously I can't do the three, but will be choosing between the three."

BORGIA ENDS CAREER WITH WIN

Looking for her first win since Sept. 7, 1997, Borgia (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) gamely held on in a frantic stretch drive to win yesterday's G2 Hong Kong Vase at Sha Tin Racecourse in the final race of her career. Sea Wave (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Frankie Dettori went out and set extremely slow fractions, running the first 800 meters in 52.10 and taking 1:43.00 to go 1,600 meters. Turning for home, Sea Wave looked unbeatable, but Olivier Peslier had Borgia moving while Bimbola (Fr) (Bikala {GB}) was fanned seven wide for her run. Borgia caught Sea Wave at the eighth pole, but Thierry Gillet had Bimbola in gear, just missing in a dramatic finish. "I'm very happy because I won the German Derby on this filly two years ago," said Peslier. "It's been a long story for her." Favorite Rogan Josh (Aus) (Old Spice {Aus}) was in midpack throughout, and failed to kick in when asked.

General Challenge was an impressive winner of the GI Pacific Classic in August at Del Mar before running second in the Oct. 16 GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. and a disappointing 10th in the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The prohibitive favorite chased the early leaders before just wearing down 44-1 outsider Moore's Flat for a narrow victory. "It was a fight," winning rider Chris McCarron admitted to *Thorough-bred Times*. "I thought I was a sure winner coming for home, but I had to work hard to get by." General Challenge is expected to start next in the GI San Fernando S. on Jan. 15 at Santa Anita.

FASIG-TIPTON DECEMBER MIXED SALE SET FOR TODAY Fasig-Tipton's 1999 December Mixed Sale will be held today at Newtown Paddocks in Lexington, Kentucky. Bidding begins at 10 a.m. A total of 292 horses have been catalogued for the one-day event, with broodmares, broodmare prospects and one stallion prospect offered as hip numbers 1-178; and weanlings, yearlings and horses of racing age filling hip numbers 179-292. The covering sires represented include promising young stallions such as Alphabet Soup, Cherokee Run, Maria's Mon, Not For Love, Peaks and Valleys and West by West. There are weanlings by Alphabet Soup, Cryptoclearance, Lit de Justice and Sandpit (Brz); and yearlings by Lite The Fuse and Silver Deputy. The 1995 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Mixed Sale produced 1999 Horse of the Year candidate and likely Sprint Champion Artax (Marquetry). The four-year-old, who sold for \$82,000 as a weanling, won three Grade I races this year, including the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, and earned \$1,685,840.

PAIR OF SEVEN-FIGURE HORSES AT

DEAUVILLE The highlight of the second day of Agence Française's December breeding stock sale in Deauville was the two mares who fetched more than a million francs. The session's top price was the FF1,500,000 Brian Grassick gave for Wakria (Ire), a nine vear old Sadler's Wells mare offered in foal to Desert King (Ire) by the Haras du Mezeray. Wakria was a Listed winner at Longchamp herself and this year she has been represented by a winner and an Indian Ridge yearling which made FF1,500,000 at Deauville in August. Grassick was acting for Joseph Higgins of Gerardstown House Stud near Navan in Ireland, Gerardstown House has made a substantial investment in mares and fillies over the last few years in both Europe and the United States. The aim is to keep about 15 mares and to sell the majority of the their offspring as yearlings. Next year, Gerardstown House will have 11 two-year-old fillies in training including a Gulch filly bought at Keeneland in July. The day's next best price was the FF1,200,000 Patricia Boutin of Suprina gave for Heavenly Star (Ire), a six year old Alzao (USA) mare carrying to Rainbow Quest (USA) offered by the Haras d'Etreham. Boutin was acting for Chryss O'Reilly who bred Heavenly Star herself and kept her half sister Heaven's Command, a Grade III winner in the United States. Other mares to sell well included Rabea (USA), a five year old daughter of Devil's Bag (USA) in foal to Green Tune (USA) who was bought by Jean Pierre Deroubaix of the French Bloodstock Agency for FF520,000 and Magical Dust (Ire), a stakes placed mare carrying to Bering (GB) who was bought by the same agency for FF340,000. Xavier Bozo of Intercontinental Bloodstock gave FF360,000 for Innocentines (Fr), a Linamix (Fr) filly from the family of Fappiano carrying to the leading French first season sire Johann Quatz (Fr).

The top priced foal on Sunday was a filly by Celtic Swing (GB) out of the Grade II winner Smart'n Noble who was bought by Hubert Barbe for FF300,000 from the Haras d'Etreham. One of the first Northern Hemisphere foals by Octagonal, a colt out of Faensa, had earlier been bought by trainer Jean Lesbordes for FF180,000. Throughout the first two days of the three-day sale, the demand was regular and very international with successful purchasers from France, England, Ireland, Germany, Italy, Scandinavia, Turkey, the United States, Australia, Japan and South America.

Amilynx's five-yearold full sister Amenixa (Fr) was bought by the Curragh Bloodstock Agency for FF1,800,000 in foal to Zieten. Amenixa was bought for an American client of Johnny Mckeever of the CBA's and is likely to go to Kentucky. "I adore Linamix," McKeever said, "and she is just a very pretty mare, from the moment I saw her coming out of her box I thought she was something special, the nicest mare I have seen at this month's sales. It is also not every day you get to buy a sister to a Classic winner."

PROVINCIAL RACING IN FRANCE by Claude Beniada

Following President Jean-Luc Lagardere's recommendations, PMU racing in the provinces has been persistently developed over the last four years. In 2000, there will be PMU meetings held at Cagnes-sur-Mer (14), Amiens, Bordeaux, Craon, La Teste, Le Croise-Laroche (3), Le Lion d'Angers, Lyon (4), Marseille Borely and Marseille Vivaux, Nancy, Nantes (3), Pau, Strasbourg, Toulouse and Vichy (8), in addition, of course, to the Deauville and Clairefontaine meetings in July and August which have been taking place for years. The Quinte races, run mostly in big handicaps and providing French racing with most of its income, will also be run in the provinces; six at Cagnes-sur-Mer, two in Compiegne, and one each at Pau, Vichy, Craon, Lyon, Marseille, Nancy, Nantes, Toulouse and Strasbourg. The policy has certainly helped to increase the interest of local populations for racing and also increased the overall income, but has generated some problems, mostly for trainers based around Paris. Travelling expenses for the stable help are rising as are working hours, which make it difficult for trainers to send people away from their base for too long. Also, the recent affair involving leading trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre has revealed security problems for horses travelling to race in the provinces. On Sept. 4 at Craon, two-year-old Lord Flasheart (Blush Rambler), trained by Alain de Royer-Dupre, won the onemile Listed Criterium de L'Ouest, but two weeks later the trainer was informed that the horse has tested positive to Heptaminol, a substance which acts on the cardio-vascular system. It can be injected or swallowed. The horse had been stabled the night before in a box, on the racecourse and fed normally by the travelling head lad. In order to find out where the product came from, as the trainer denied giving it, tests have been run in three different boxes on the course and samples taken from feed-tubs in these boxes all showed traces of heptaminol. The reason for this has yet to be determined and as the trainer, Alain de Royer Dupre is considered responsible. The horse has been disqualified, but the trainer's good reputation is not in doubt. He reacted to the affair by saying, "I am very disappointed by what happened. As a trainer who first started out in the provinces, I love racing there whenever I can. But if the security is not total, there is no point sending horses. I will not run horses in the provinces now until France Galop can guarantee the security. There is too much at stake to play it by ear. "
