TIGER HILL TO HARAS DU VAL HENRY German champion Tiger Hill (Ire) (Danehill--The Filly {Ger}, by Appianai {Ity}), who was retired last week after injuring a tendon, will stand the 2000 breeding season at Haras du Val Henry in Livarot, France. The four-yearold will stand his first season for a fee of FF60,000.

SAFELY HOME DIES Safely Home (Winning Hit), the dam of 1989 Champion sprinter and 1990 Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Safely Kept (Horatius), as well as GSW Partner's Hero (Danzig), passed away last Friday at Dark Hollow Farm in Maryland due to the infirmities of old age. She was 26. Also the dam of MSP Safe At The Plate (Double Zeus) and 31-time winner Safe On Second (Double Zeus), her first foal in 1982, the mare was claimed in the early 1980s by David and JoAnn Hayden out of an \$11,500 claiming race at Bowie Race Course. She went on to a successful career in the breeding shed with her 10 foals to race earning \$3,270,398 on the racetrack. "Without question, she gave me and (wife) Joanne the life we have now," said Hayden, owner with his wife of Dark Hollow Farm. The couple has recently purchased additional nearby farm land, a parcel which will be named Safely Home. The mare, who had not been mated for the last three years, was buried on the farm.

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas has been named the winner of the 1999 Big Sport of Turfdom Award by the Turf Publicists of America. The award is presented annually to a person whose cooperation with the media, racetrack publicists and marketing executives enhances the sport of Thoroughbred racing. "No one is more deserving of the Big Sport of Turfdom award than Wayne Lukas," explained TPA President John Asher. "The media spotlight is always on him and he never fails to make himself available to the throngs of media who constantly visit his barn, especially during major racing events." Lukas will receive the award at the 34th Annual Big Sport of Turfdom Luncheon Monday, Jan. 17 at Jimmy's II Restaurant in Beverly Hills, California.

PELLEGRINI RUNNERS TO U.S. Three-year-old colt Asidero (Arg) (Fadeyev), winner of the G1 Gran Premio Internacional Carlos Pellegrini in Argentina last weekend and three-year-old filly Crystal House (Chi) (Golden Voyager), third in that event and recently purchased by Bob and Beverly Lewis, are on their way to trainer Ron McAnally's barn in California, according to the Daily Racing Form. McAnally, who has trained such tremendous South American athletes as Paseana (Arg) and Bayakoa (Arg), will start another South American import, undefeated Painter (Arg) (Robin des Bois), in the Dec. 26 Gl Malibu S. at Santa Anita.

TACTICAL CAT RETIRED Last year's GI Hollywood Futurity winner Tactical Cat (Storm Cat--Terre Haute, by Caro {Ire}) has been retired from racing after recurrent swelling in the area of the condylar fracture he suffered last year. The three-year-old will stand his first season at stud in 2000 at Overbrook Farm for a fee of \$10,000. In addition to last year's Futurity, Tactical Cat also won the Tremont S. and finished second in the GI Hopeful S. He started only three times this year, including a third-place finish in the GIII Ack Ack H. In 12 starts, Tactical Cat won four races and earned \$480,067.

Suffolk Dates Request Withdrawn:

Suffolk Downs has withdrawn a request to the Massachusetts Racing Commission to extend its current season by four dates and the meet will end as originally scheduled on Dec. 18. The track had made the request to give owners and trainers extra racing opportunities before the laws which govern Massachusetts racing expired on Dec. 31. But it now looks likely that eleventh-hour legislation will extend state racing and simulcast laws through 2000.

Maryland Million Deadline:

The deadline for nominating Maryland-sired foals for lifetime participation in Maryland Million racing events is Dec. 31. The fee to nominate weanlings is \$250. Nomination fee for yearlings not previously nominated as weanlings are \$600. Stallion nominations are also due for the 2000 breeding season. Stallions must be nominated before each breeding season in order for the foals conceived during that breeding season to be eligible for nomination. The stallion nomination fee due by Dec. 31 is equal to the advertised 2000 stud fee, with a \$500 minimum.

Buck's Boy Possible for McKnight:

According to *Thoroughbred Times Online*, trainer Noel Hickey has advised officials at Calder Race Course that 1998 turf champion **Buck's Boy** (Bucksplasher) is possible for this Saturday's GII W.L. McKnight H. at 12 furlongs. "I haven't made up my mind yet," Hickey told the Thoroughbred Times. "He's doing wonderfully. If he runs, he'll just ship right in from here (Hickey's Irish Acres Farm in Ocala)." The six-year-old was a good third after setting the pace in the Breeders' Cup Turf in his most recent effort.

DERBY DRAWS 601 A total of 601 yearlings have been entered in the 2001 G1 Vodafone Derby at the first entry stage, an identical number to last year. The Maktoums dominate the entry, with Sheikh Mohammed accounting for 73, Godolphin nominating 56 and Sheikh Hamdan entering 43; Sheikh Ahmed and Maktoum al Maktoum have 24 and 11 yearlings engaged, respectively. Sue Magnier has 30 entries, including the salestopping 1.7 million-guineas Tattersalls Houghton colt by Fairy King (USA) which was sold by Ballygallon Stud. He is in training with Aidan O'Brien, as are the 27 entered in the ownership of Michael Tabor. The 1999 Vodafone Derby-winning team of owner The Thoroughbred Corporation and trainer Henry Cecil number two expensive Houghton-bought Sadler's Wells (USA) colts among their representatives--the 1.2 million-guineas youngster out of Marseillaise and the son of Shilka (GB) who cost 775,000gns. The Queen has just one entry. Sue Ellen, managing director of United Racecourses (parent company of Epsom), said: "Once again the yearling closing has proved an extremely popular option for entering the most-valuable three-year-old race in Europe, and underlines the continued prestige of the race. The 2001 Vodafone Derby is guaranteed at £1 million and yearling entries will ultimately pay £6,300 to run. Their connections clearly continue to see the value in entering early and we are delighted and grateful for their support."

WAY OF LIGHT TO AUSTRALIA Way Of Light (USA) (Woodman {USA}--Salchow {USA}, by Nijinsky II {Can}}, the champion juvenile in France after winning the 1998 G1 Grand Criterium, has been bought by Roselands Stud in Australia and will stand Down Under in 2000. The three-year-old, bred and raced by the Niarchos family and trained in France by Pascal Bary, is a three-quarter brother to European champion juvenile and successful stallion Machiavellian (USA). The runner-up in this year's G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange, he goes to stud with two wins and two seconds from 10 starts and earnings of FF1,587,085. Roselands' Managing Director Lynden Burns said: "Way Of Light is an outstanding stallion prospect. He comes from the immediate family of Northern Dancer and Danehill, both of whom have experienced extraordinary success at stud. We believe Way Of Light will be a real winner in Australia. Several European and Japanese studs have also expressed an interest in securing his services for the Northern Hemisphere season in 2001."

SPRAKE UPDATE

Jockey Tim Sprake, badly injured in a car accident Monday morning, continued to be listed in "critical but stable" condition in North Hampshire Hospital, Basingstoke, yesterday. The rider suffered head injuries in the accident. His agent, Guy Jewell, said: "They have taken him off the medication this morning, but he has not come round yet. He's still on the ventilator, but has not regained consciousness. Nothing has changed since last night--the situation is still the same. It's a case of when he wakes up."

MORE ACCOLADES FOR DAYLAMI

Daylami (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}) has been voted Horse of the Year by the Racehorse Owners' Association. The Breeders' Cup Turf winner also was named the Outstanding Older Horse of 1999. The award for three-year-old colt went to G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. winner Dubai Millennium (GB) (Seeking The Gold {USA}) rather than the G1 Epsom Derby winner Oath (Ire) (Fairy King {USA}). The award for new Flat owners went to the Primo Donnas, the syndicate that owns Primo Valentino (Ire) (Primo Dominie {GB}), winner of the G1 Middle Park S., while J. P. McManus was voted Owner of the Year. The awards were presented in front of some 700 guests last night at the ROA Awards dinner and dance at the Hilton Hotel in London.

THE NATIONAL STUD PLANS SHUTTLE SHOW

For the second year running, The National Stud at Newmarket is planning a special show for a number of stallions returning from the Southern Hemisphere in time for the 2000 European covering season. Scheduled for the morning of Thursday, Feb. 3, the stallion show is expected to take place in the Tattersalls sales arena prior to the opening of Tattersalls' new two-day February sale of breeding stock, horses in and out of training and yearlings. Aside from The National Stud's shuttle stallions Air Express (Ire) and Bahamian Bounty (GB) and New England Stud's highly successful young sire Vettori (Ire), the show is expected to feature the first public appearances in Europe of the multiple Group 1 winners Danzero (Aus) and Dracula (Aus), who will be based at Cheveley Park Stud and Plantation Stud at Newmarket respectively, and also Egerton Stud's new inmate, the 1991 Breeders' Cup Mile winner Opening Verse (USA).

EPSOM TRAINING CENTER GETS GRANT

The training centre at Epsom yesterday received a major boost with the news that the Levy Board has awarded a grant of £111,474 to restore the horse walks, tracks and access points to the gallops.
