FLANDERS FINALLY FINED Five years and three months after the fact, the New York State Racing and Wagering Board has fined trainer D. Wayne Lukas \$500 for the isoxsuprine positive on Flanders (Seeking the Gold) in the 1994 GI Matron S. at Belmont Park. Lawvers representing William T. Young's Overbrook Farm had tried to persuade the NYSRWB to fully overturn the positive and restore the victory to Flanders' otherwise perfect record. They failed on that account, but did get the NYSRWB to admit in the ruling that "it is improbable that (the isoxsuprine) had any effect on the performance of Flanders during the running of the Matron S. on Sept. 17, 1994." The Matron is the only official loss in Flanders' five-start career that ended in victory in the 1994 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. "Yes, I'm satisfied," Lukas said. "It had dragged on so long that we're running her baby (Surfside {Seattle Slew}) now. I'm glad to get it behind me. Mr. Young wanted to keep her record perfect. They did get them to state that this had no bearing on her performance and I think that's what got this resolved. It was never about money with Overbrook Farm. It was the principle." Lukas has never admitted any quilt, saying he had no idea how the prohibited medication got into the filly's system.

SCATMANDU RETIRED Scatmandu (Storm Cat--Princess Alydar, by Alydar) has been retired to Walmac International and will stand as the property of a syndicate for \$8,500 live foal, due Sept. 1. The four-year-old won six of 16 starts and earned \$330,789. He captured the 1999 GIII Sport Page H. and the 1998 Leonard Richards S. at Delaware Park. "Scatmandu not only drew attention on the racetrack, but at the sales as well, selling at Keeneland July for \$275,000," commented Kerry Cauthen, president of Walmac Bloodstock. "At Barretts he sold higher than any other juvenile in 1997, bringing \$1.1 million."

LONE STAR STAKES WORTH \$4M IN 2000 Lone Star Park will offer a record \$4 million stakes program for the 2000 Thoroughbred meeting, which opens Apr. 13. Highlighting the stakes schedule are a trio of \$300,000 stakes races--the Lone Star Derby and GIII Texas Mile on Apr. 22 and the May 29 GIII Lone Star Park H. The Lone Star Park H. will be the centerpiece of the second annual Lone Star Million Day. Eight stakes had their purses raised, triggering an 8.3-percent increase from last year's program. The largest increase went to the Dallas Turf Cup. Scheduled for June 17, the 1 1/8-mile turf test will be worth \$250,000 next year. Lone Star Park has added the \$100,000 Buick Turf Classic to its stakes line-up. The 1 1/16-mile contest for older horses will be run Apr. 16. The NTRA All-Star Jockey Championship will return to Lone Star on June 23. The track's fourth season concludes July 23.

OBS Wins Lawsuit Against Hialeah:

It took more than a decade, but the Florida Breeders' Sales Company, which later became Ocala Breeders' Sales, has won its lawsuit against Hialeah Race Course for breach of contract. Back in the early '80s, when the company held its annual February two-year-old sale at Hialeah (it has since been moved to Calder). OBS contracted Hialeah to fix up the track's sales pavilion. But the repairs were never made and, in 1985, OBS started a lawsuit. The suit was settled last week and at the same time, the track's account with the First Union Bank was frozen. Bill Hamilton, whose Tampa law firm of Holland & Knight represents OBS, said, "We estimate Hialeah owes our client around \$2 million including interest plus attorney fees. We are working with them on a payment schedule and hope to have it solved soon." Hialeah Vice President John Van Lindt said, "Our lawyers are negotiating a settlement."

Colonial Downs in Jeopardy:

Jeffrey Jacobs, owner of Colonial Downs, has threatened to close the Virginia track and develop the property if he cannot find a buyer by February, according to a report in *Times-Dispatch* of Richmond. Jacobs's threat came after the Virginia Racing Commission ordered Colonial Downs to host 32 days of Thoroughbred racing and 40 days of harness racing next year and to pay its delinquent bills by Feb. 29 or risk having its simulcast schedule pulled. "They are asking us to spend more money on live racing than what is coming in the door," Jacobs explained to the *Times-Dispatch*.

Tampa Bay Boycott:

Saturday's opening day card at Tampa Bay Downs is in jeopardy after horsemen boycotted the entry box Thursday. The horseman have been unable to come to terms on a contract with the track. Saturday's stakes race filled, but the other nine races had less than the number of horses expected, according to Leonard Alexander, president of the Tampa Bay Downs Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association. Alexander said the THBPA would block Tampa from sending their signal out if a contract wasn't reached by Saturday.

Baze Moves Up on Riding List:



GOVERNMENT TO EXAMINE INTERNET WAGERING BAN

The Australian government announced that it intends to examine the feasibility and consequences of banning Internet wagering, despite warnings from the online industry that any such law would be impossible to implement."It is not the desire of the Government to adopt a censorious or negatively prohibitive attitude towards the ordinary desire of Australians to indulge themselves in the pleasure and recreation of gambling," Prime Minister John Howard told the *Melbourne Age*. "But there must be recognition that excessive gambling blights the lives of tens of thousands of Australians and their families every year." Peter Coroneos, executive director of the Internet Industry Association, said that a ban would drive betting operations offshore.

RACECOURSE ASSOC. OKAYS BHB'S TOTE PROPOSAL

The British Horseracing Board's latest proposal for an industry-wide trust to run betting organization the Tote was given the seal of approval yesterday at an extraordinary general meeting of the Racecourse Association. The meeting also discussed plans for joint negotiation of television and other rights by the premier league grouping of British racecourses: Aintree, Ascot, Epsom, Cheltenham, Doncaster, Goodwood, Haydock, Kempton, Newmarket, Newbury, Sandown and York.

SPRAKE CRITICAL BUT STABLE

Tim Sprake was still in critical but stable condition yesterday in intensive care at North Hampshire Hospital, Basingstoke, as the result of head injuries sustained in a car crash Monday morning. The jockey's agent, Guy Jewell, said, "They sedated him yesterday for another 48 hours and they hope the swelling around the brain will have gone down during that time. They will reassess the situation [Friday]."

HAMMOND SURPRISED AT MONTJEU'S "RETIREMENT"

Trainer John Hammond expressed surprise yesterday at a newspaper report suggesting that Montjeu (Fr) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) had run his last race and would be joining his sire at part-owner John Magnier's Coolmore Stud. The G1 French Derby, Irish Derby and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner was expected to stay in training next season, and Hammond said, "This is all news to me, and as far as I am concerned the horse will be back again next season. He's fine and I'm looking forward to him racing again." Looking back to the Japan Cup, in which Montjeu finished fourth on fast ground, Hammond said, "The ground wasn't an issue with him. The only thing that worried me was the traveling for a three-year-old. The journey to Japan did take a lot out of him, but he's in good shape now. In the race itself, a few things didn't go for us and we weren't able to get the work into him beforehand that we would have liked. Montjeu is fine and is enjoying a much-deserved break. I wouldn't expect him to make an early return to action next season. It wouldn't take a genius to work out his program next season. We'll be looking at all the major races between 1 1/4 and 1 1/2 miles." The G1 Prix Ganay in early May was mooted as a possible starting point.

RACING SEMINAR JAN. 18 IN LONDON

The annual racing industry seminar organized by the British Betting Office Association will take place Tuesday, Jan. 18, at Claridges Hotel in London. Speakers include the Racecourse Association chairman Angus Crichton-Miller, talking about 2002 and beyond, Rob Hughes, who chairs the Levy Board, and John Brown, the managing director of William Hill bookmakers. Mike O'Brien MP, the parliamentary under-secretary of state at the Home Office, will talk about the government's view on the future legislation of betting while Professor Neville Topham of Salford University will offer his views on gambling and the effects of social and technological change.

HE'S ALL THE BUZZ IN NEW ZEALAND

While the megabucks keep rolling in at the box office for Disney's Toy Story 2, a three-year-old colt named after one of the principal characters, Buzz Lightyear (NZ) (Gold Brose {Aus}), goes into the G1 New Zealand Derby Dec. 26 as the strong favorite. There were many who had doubts about the middle-distance, and therefore Derby, pretensions of the colt after he had won the G1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas at one mile at Riccarton early last month. A 1 3/4-length win seemed convincing enough, but the way in which he won did not suggest that he would relish a longer trip. His trainer, Robert Priscott, then sent him to Otaki two weeks later, where he beat Domero (NZ) (Lord Ballina {Aus}) by 1 1/4 lengths in the G1 Bayer Classic, also at a mile. Ridden again by star apprentice Opie Bosson, Buzz Lightyear had to work hard for the lead, but then he had the race to himself all the way to the line, although Domero did close fast for second.

However, the Otaki race told us little more about the colt's stamina. Priscott was adamant, however, that his pride and joy would have no difficulty in stepping up to longer trips and immediately indicated that the colt would prove his point in the Listed New Zealand Derby Trial over slightly longer than 1 1/4 miles at Ellerslie in Auckland, run last weekend. The trainer's confidence was totally justified as the NZ\$19,000 National Yearling Sale purchase simply cruised home to win effortlessly. After racing effortlessly alongside leader Idol (NZ) (Masterclass {USA}), Buzz Lightyear quickened three lengths clear early in the stretch and coasted home, much to the astonishment of Idol's rider, champion jockey Lance O'Sullivan, who said, "Buzz Lightyear drew out from us in a flash, after which it was all over. Anyone who says a horse with that turn of speed can't win the Derby has got to be nuts."

So, it all points to a question of stamina. Bred by the Golden Horseshoe syndicate in Waikato, "Buzz" is a son of the multiple G2 winner Gold Brose (Aus) (Huntingdale {Ire}), who was joint third on the 1992-93 Australasian Two-Year-Old Classifications. Buzz's dam, Excitable Kid (USA), is by Youth (USA), an outstanding middle-distance runner. In 1976 the Nelson Bunker Hunt-owned galloper won both the G1 Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby), G1 Prix Lupin and was third in the G1 Prix de L'Arc de Triomphe. The same year, he traveled to North America to win both the GI Canadian International and the GI Washington International. Priscott, who does not court publicity and rarely speaks to the media, selected the colt at the Karaka sales. "He was one of five yearlings we bought at the sale for our syndicate [himself, his wife Karen, long-time friend Dave Smith, vice-chairman of the Waikato Racing Club, and long-time Priscott family patron Graham Allen]. He impressed me as a very athletic type of yearling, although there was still plenty of room for development." After the colt had won two trials in impressive style, Priscott was made a very tempting offer from Hong Kong, but turned it down and sold the colt to Terry Jarvis, the former New Zealand test cricketer and co-founder of Sky Television in New Zealand. "It was a very big offer from Hong Kong," said Priscott, "but at the same time Terry Jarvis also expressed an interest in buying him and the advantage of doing the deal with him was that it was agreed that the horse would remain in my stable." The Disney character always wins through in the end, now we wait to see if his equine namesake can do the same.
