BAFFERT BRIGADE HEADS FUTURITY

Trainer Bob Baffert, who saddled Real Quiet to win the GI Hollywood Futurity two years ago, sends out three of the seven runners which will go postward in this year's edition of the 1 1/16-mile test. Captain Steve (Fly So Free) leads the trio after a front-running 5 3/4length tally in the Nov. 27 GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Downs. The chestnut colt also captured the Oct. 10 GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity, but in between the two wins sandwiched a less-than-impressive 11th-place showing after pressing the pace for a quarter in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. "He's still green and I think we might have messed him up a little in the Breeders' Cup," Baffert said. "The track was speed biased and we probably sent him too hard. I think it was a mistake. But his last race was the real deal." Baffert also has Purely Cozzene (Cozzene), who broke his maiden on the dirt in his debut over this track back in July. He was switched to the turf for his last three starts, winning the restricted Oct. 15 Pinjara S. after a short break and most recently running second, beaten a head after cutting out all the fractions, in the Nov. 27 GIII Generous S. Cameron Pass (Mr. Greeley), third in the Nov. 20 GIII Hollywood Prevue Breeders' Cup last time out, rounds out the team. The Baffert band will face its toughest competition from High Yield (Storm Cat), a \$1,050,000 Keeneland July yearling who won the GI Hopeful and was third in both the GI Champagne S. and the Breeders' Cup Juvenile before finishing sixth after a rough start in the Kentucky Jockey Club for trainer D. Wayne Lukas; and Malabar Gold (Unbridled), who steps up sharply after a 12-length maiden win Nov. 20. The 505 Farms colorbearer was purchased for \$1 million at the 1998 Keeneland September Sale.

Gritty Sandie made his stakes debut in the Sept. 26 GIII Lawrence Realization at the McKnight distance and finished like a rocket to win by 1 3/4 lengths. The threeyear-old stepped up for the GI Canadian International in his next outing and was sixth, but beaten only 5 1/2 lengths in that Oct. 17 test. Facing elders once again in his latest effort, the gelding closed for third with Lasix and front bandages added for the first time in the GII Red Smith H. at Aqueduct Nov. 20. Unite's Big Red captured the GII Pan American H. at Gulfstream in March, went to the sidelines, then returned to take the Sept. 5 Fabulous Frolic H. at Calder. But the five-yearold has been off the board in his four starts since, running 12th at 63-1 in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf two starts back before finishing eighth after a slow start in his most recent try, the Nov. 27 GIII Tropical Turf H.

The winner, a very late (Dec. 19) foal, was purchased for NZ\$70,000 (\$35,525) as a yearling in New Zealand.

In the ongoing furor over "milkshaking," Kentucky's Veterinary Medical Association has asked the Kentucky Racing Commission to impose a total race-day ban on milkshaking, and more significantly, "an immediate and complete restructuring of the entire pre-race medication policy" in the Bluegrass state, the Harness Tracks of America newsletter reported.

CTBA Juvenile Sales Merges with Barretts:

The California Thoroughbred Breeders Association announced that its 2000 Cal-bred select two-year-old sale has been merged with the Barretts March and May Sales. Consignors of horses nominated to the CTBA sale will be offered placement in either the select Cal-bred session of the Barretts March Sale or in the Barretts May Sale. The Cal-bred only April Sale was established by the CTBA to showcase select California-bred juveniles. To better serve the breeders and consignors of Cal-breds, the CTBA Sales Committe elected to merge the April sale with Barretts' March and May offerings. "We felt there was no reason to fragment the market for select California-breds," said CTBA General Manager Doug Burge. "The strong commitment from Barretts to offer a select venue for Cal-breds was the assurance we needed to enable us to join forces in the two-year-old market. We will work together to promote and support the California-breds offered in these sales for the betterment of the California breeder and owner."

More Stallions Heading to Turkey:

In addition to the purchase of GI Kentucky Derby winner Sea Hero (Polish Navy) at Keeneland's November sale, the Turkish Jockey Club has acquired the young stallions Eagle Eyed (Danzig), Mountain Cat (Storm Cat) and Ocean Crest (Storm Bird). Freshman sire Ocean Crest has sired stakes winners Silk Sails and Dawn of Forever from his first crop. Eagle Eyed, a full brother to leading sire Danehill, has sired the stakes-placed runners Leagleyeser, Where's Dave and Full Flow among from seven first-crop winners. Third-crop sire Mountain Cat has sired multiple graded-stakes winner Classic Cat, who also finished third in the GI Preakness S.

Jockey Club Adopts DNA Technology:

The Jockey Club is to replace blood-typing with DNAtyping to verify Thoroughbred parentage, beginning with the foal crop of 2001. The new DNA process will dramatically simplify sampling procedures for breeders by using mane hair root samples rather than blood. "Bloodtypes and DNA-types aren't interchangeable," said Jockey Club President Hans J. Stahl. "That means retyping all the stallions and mares. But it's a small price to pay for protection of the breed, let alone the longterm cost savings to be gained." No individual fees will be applied to the DNA-typing of stallions and mares, which will begin in the year 2000. A minimal acrossthe-board registration fee increase of \$25 will go towards the cost of DNA-typing the breeding stock. The increase will come into effect for foals from the crop of 2000.

TRA to Provide Job Bank Service:

The Thoroughbred Racing Associations has implemented an on-line racetrack job bank, a job listing and posting service for its member racetracks. TRA members can now use the Internet to post job listings and screen potential empolyees with the job bank, accessed at http://www.traofna.com. The job bank will allow the user to post to or select from six categories: general office, executive and management, patron services, P.R./marketing, racing department and properties/facilities. The general public will also have browsing capabilities. Those in search of employment opportunities in the industry can search by keyword or browse entire listings, and are required only to have e-mail capabilities.

Jockey Club Amends Final Registration Deadline:

The Stewards of the Jockey Club have approved changes to Rule 1, Section F of The Principal Rules and Requirements of The American Stud Book to amend the registration eligibility of foals which are not registered by Dec. 31 of their two-year-old year. The amended rule permits foal registration beyond a foal's two-year-old year, provided the applicant can demonstrate circumstances to warrant late registration and can meet all other requirements for registration. The late registration fee for registration beyond Dec. 31 of a foal's two-year-old will be \$2,000.
