CAN LUKAS DISCOVER ANOTHER STARLET?

Surfside (Seattle Slew), winner of the GI Frizette S. in October and third after a wide trip in the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies last time out, bids to give trainer D. Wayne Lukas a record seventh victory in the GI Hollywood Starlet at Hollywood Park this afternoon. Lukas won the Starlet for the first time with champion Althea in 1983; he has taken five more this decade. including four straight from 1994-97, with such top distaffers as Serena's Song and Sharp Cat. "We've been very fortunate to have had some very nice fillies to run in the race, and I think we're bringing another exceptional one over there on Sunday," Lukas said. Surfside, the 5-2 second choice in the Juvenile Fillies, lost ground every step, but still got up to finish just 1 3/4 lengths behind stablemate Cash Run and favored Chilukki. While Lukas wouldn't take anything away from his Juvenile Fillies winner, he did say, "I think (Surfside) had the worst trip of any horse in the race. She had a trip that compromised her chances." The daughter of champion Flanders has been training impressively at Santa Anita since the Breeders' Cup. The likely pacesetter in the Starlet, Classic Olympio (Olympio) will try to harness her speed while going two turns for the first time. The dark bay has knitted a three-race win skein coming into today's 1 1/16-mile test, including a front-running score in the seven-furlong Moccasin S. at Hollywood Nov. 14. The pace will have to be fast for the late-running Humble Clerk (Humble Eleven) to be at her best. The Arkansas-bred miss closed from the back of the pack to win the Nov. 27 GIII Golden Rod S. in her most recent outing. The homebred bay has been first or second in her last four starts. "She likes what she's doing and she's getting better all the time," owner/breeder/trainer Jim Danaher said.

COMMANDING PERFORMANCE FOR "CAPTAIN"

Captain Steve (Fly So Free) pulled rank on his five rivals in yesterday's GI Hollywood Futurity. The 13-10 favorite, he came from just off the pace to storm past 7-2 High Yield (Storm Cat) and, despite zig-zagging his way down the stretch, drew off for a commanding fourlength victory "He's very green still, but very talented," trainer Bob Baffert explained. "I've still got to get him straightened out--he's got to learn how to run in the last part of the race." Added winning jockey Robbie Albarado, "He gets lonely out there, he doesn't like to be by himself." The colt, a disappointing 11th in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, jumped marks left behind after the track was floated for the Oct. 10 GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity and swerved his way to a 5 3/4length score in the Nov. 27 GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. He will need to run a straight course if he is to follow in the hoofsteps of Baffert's other Hollywood Futurity winner, 1998 Kentucky Derby and Preakness hero Real Quiet, but the trainer said yesterday, "He reminds me a lot of Real Quiet. As soon as he went two turns, he was a different horse." The highly regarded Malabar Gold (Unbridled), the 2-1 second choice, was off a step slowly, sprinted up to take the lead, dragged Eddie Delahoussaye through a half in :46 and tired to be last.

Just Listen, third behind the 15-10 McKnight favorite Gritty Sandie (Manila) in the Sept. 26 GIII Lawrence Realization H. at Belmont, took a couple of months off after the effort, returning to be a lackluster seventh in the Nov. 27 GIII Tropical Turf H. Let go at nearly 13-1 in his second start back, the three-year-old rated in the middle of the pack through moderate fractions, changed to an outside lane at the top of the stretch and was rallying when he drifted in on Musical Ghost (Silver Ghost), causing that one to check sharply. Just Listen kept on going, drawing off to win by three lengths, while Musical Ghost stopped to be ninth. The stewards took a look at a tape of the race and disqualified Just Listen, placing him ninth. That gave the victory to Wicapi, who had won the Oct. 23 Flying Pidgeon H. at 1 3/8 miles on the Calder turf and was second in the Nov. 25 Thanksgiving Day H. on the main track. The dark bay was himself checked on the first turn, but saved ground down the backstretch, swinging to the outside for the drive to get up for second. Gritty Sandie hesitated at the break and trailed for the first mile, but made some progress in the run to the wire to be fifth.

Lady At Peace, first or second in five of her seven previous turf starts, had stepped into the graded ranks just once before, finishing sixth after setting the early pace in the GII San Clemente H. at Del Mar July 31. Despite tiring to be eighth in her latest, the one-mile H. C. Ramser Sr. H. at Santa Anita Oct. 24, she was sent off the slight choice after morning-line favorite Sapphire Ring (Marju (Ire)) was scratched. The bay zipped right to the lead, opened up on the field through undemanding fractions and was kept to the task to hold Cyrillic at bay to the wire. "She was doing terrific, had been training very well," said Julio Canani, who took over the filly's training after her last race. "I'm telling you, I think she can improve because we have been working in the mornings on taking her off the pace...I've been impressed by how she finishes. But the way the race came up today, we figured we'd wait until another day before we take her back." Canani saddled Tuzla (Fr) to win last year's Dahlia.

The form of a 1 3/16-mile money allowance at Aqueduct Dec. 2 certainly held up, with the top three finishers returning to sweep the GIII Ladies H. Strolling Belle defeated her elders in that event, but was slightly overlooked in the wagering this time despite a second to champion-elect Silverbulletday in the Aug. 21 GI Alabama S. at this distance. The bay sophomore, well placed early from her rail post, stalked Sazarac Jazz along the inside through six furlongs in 1:13 1/5. Angled out three wide by Herbie Castillo, she reached the front in midstretch and edged away late for her first added-money score. "Herbie did an excellent job with her," said Loretta Lusteg, trainer John Kimmel's assistant. "He rated her a little bit, let the speed go to the front. He got her to relax well and she finished great." Maiden Fair rallied from the back of the pack to get up for second, while 3-5 chalk Belle Cherie (Belong to Me) weakened to fourth in the final furlong. "She just didn't have it at the end," said jockey John Velazquez.

Agnes World, winner of the Oct. 3 G1 Prix de I'Abbaye de Longchamp at five furlongs, has pocketed four in a row, most recently taking the G2-Jpn CBC Sho Nov. 27. The morning-line favorite has jockey Yutaka Take in the saddle. Black Hawk, third in the G1-Jpn Mile Championship Nov. 21, cuts back in distance. Jockey Norihiro Yokoyama chose the five-year-old over several potential mounts, and feels that six furlongs is the ideal distance for the British-bred bay. Masa Lucky defeated Agnes World in the G1-Jpn Takamatsunomiya Kinen May 23, but was second behind that rival in the CBC Sho, his first start after a six-month layoff.

POLAR EXPEDITION RETURNS TODAY Eight-year-old Polar Expedition (Kodiack), winner of 20 races and \$1,488,635, returns from a 19-month layoff in today's sixth race at Hawthorne Park, a 1 1/16-mile allowance test against 11 rivals. The dark bay gelding, sidelined by what was described as a "myriad of minor problems" by the Hawthorne press department, won his only two starts last year, including the GIII National Jockey Club H. in his last racetrack appearance. Overall, the three-time Illinois Horse of the Year has won 14 stakes, including the GII Breeders' Futurity and GII Arlington-Washington Futurity in 1993 and the GII Jim Beam S. in '94.

Tampa Bay Boycott Continues:

The first race on yesterday's opening-day card at Tampa Bay Downs had a field of two horses and there were two races with just three horses as horsemen, who have yet to sign a contract, continue their protest of lowered purses at the track. The total purse value for the seven Thoroughbred races run yesterday was \$40,560, an average of \$5,794 a race. The local Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association President Leonard Alexander said, "We met with (Tampa Bay Downs General Manager) John Grady at 10:30 (Saturday morning) to see if we could make some progress on this contract. He turned us down flat." He added, "They are taking entries for Tuesday, and they're not going to well." Grady and Tampa owner Stella Thayer are taking a hard line and refusing to negotiate. Sunday's card closed with eight races, including one for Arabians. The seven Thoroughbred races averaged five entries each, and the average purse per race is \$5,617, for a total of \$39,320. Originally, the condition book called for 10 races and a total purse distribution of \$107,000. When the track is dark on Monday, Alexander said his group would try to step up the pressure, attempting to block the incoming simulcast signals. "We aren't allowing Tampa's signal to go outside the state and we think we can stop anyone's signal from coming in on dark days," he said.

REDOUTE'S CHOICE TO ARROWFIELD

Triple Group 1-winning colt Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill {USA}) will stand at Australia's Arrowfield Stud with a syndicate led by Arrowfield chief John Messara securing a 50 percent interest for an undisclosed sum. Trainer Rick Hore-Lacy has indicated that the aristocratic colt will likely retire following an autumn campaign, culminating with a tilt at the A\$2.5 million Doncaster H. at Randwick April 22. He will join Australia's hottest young stallion Danzero (Aus) and highly regarded Flying Spur (Aus) as the third son of Danehill on the Hunter Valley stud's roster, at a fee yet to be announced. "He has everything we look for in a sire," Messara said of the colt who is from Shantha's Choice (Aus) (Canny Lad {Aus}), the daughter of late broodmare queen Dancing Show (USA) (Nijinsky II {Can}), who died at Coolmore Australia Stud in late October. Her Danehill filly has a foster mother. Dancing Show was among Australasia's most significant broodmares as the dam of G1 winners Umatilla (NZ) (Miswaki {USA}) and Hurricane Sky (Aus) (Star Watch {Aus}). Dancing Show was also the dam of the Inglis Easter sale-topper, a A\$1.2 million Thunder Gulch filly purchased by Eduardo Cojuangco's Gooree Stud. She also has a Woodman yearling filly and both her surving progeny are likely to be retained by Cambridge Stud. "[Redoute's Choice] was an undefeated Group 1 winner at two, a weight-for-age and Classic winner at three and is an absolutely smashing type," Messara added. "He has the female pedigree with his broodmare sire being Golden Slipper winner Canny Lad and his female family being responsible for the likes of El Gran Senor, Xaar, Umatilla and Hurricane Sky. I also think he will make a great shuttle stallion given his international family lines." Messara said Redoute's Choice would likely be kept under a mile. The colt, last seen when fifth to Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) in the G1 Cox Plate, has been back in work for three weeks with Hore-Lacy considering five Group 1 races for him this autumn. Redoute's Choice won his only two starts as a two-year-old, including Victoria's premier juvenile race, the G1 Blue Diamond S. at Caulfield, but was forced out of the Golden Slipper after suffering from a virus on race eve. He defeated older sprinters winning the Group 1 Manikato S. before placing in the Group 1 Vic Health Cup and beating arch rival Testa Rossa (Aus) (Perugino {USA}) in the Caulfield Guineas.
