WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

The victory of Strolling Belle in the GIII Ladies H. was a rather momentous one. Not only was this the first unrestricted stakes winner for the deceased Strolling Along, but also the first unrestricted stakes winner we can find with inbreeding to Danzig. These crosses appear 2x3 in Strolling Belle's pedigree, the first through Strolling Along, who is a son of Danzig, and the second through La Polonaise, a daughter of Danzig who is Strolling Belle's granddam.

We are beginning to gain the impression that this pattern of inbreeding at the top and the bottom of the pedigree is one which may have particular merit. Danzig's sire Northern Dancer has more than 30 unrestricted stakes winners bred on this pattern, and what is particularly interesting is that at least 12 of these are Group or Grade 1 winners, including English Derby winner Lammtarra (Nijinsky II); Belmont S. victor Touch Gold (Deputy Minister); Flying Spur (Aus) (Danehill), hero of the Golden Slipper in Australia; Preseli (Ire) (Caerleon), a leading candidate for the European filly classics in 2000; Willa On The Move (Assert {Ire}); and Hedonist (Alydeed).

All horses in the International *TDN* were bred in North America unless otherwise indicated.

Pedigree Perspectives cont.

Will Strolling Belle will mark the beginning of a trend of inbreeding to Danzig? The answer is probably that it depends through what sources and where in the pedigree. Danzig, for all his brilliance as a racehorse and sire, was not a sound horse, and physically lacks size and scope. Strolling Belle's sire Strolling Along was one of the most versatile sons of Danzig: he equalled a track record for 5 1/2 furlongs at Belmont Park at two, and ended up showing high-class form at a 1 1/2 miles. La Polonaise was a more one-dimensional runner, scoring four of her five wins in sprints, her stakes score coming in the six-furlong Schenectady H.

If we look at inbreeding to other sons of Northern Dancer we can see that it has enjoyed only limited success. We found 13 stakes winners inbred to Nijinsky II, of which three were inbred through the male line and female line, and five with Nijinsky II appearing as broodmare sire of the sire (another position which often seems a useful target for duplications). There are have been 10 unrestricted stakes winners inbred to Lyphard, three through the male line and female line and two with the broodmare sire as one of the strains. Salt Lake had a recent stakes winner, Salty Note, inbred 3x3 to Vice Regent at the top and bottom of the pedigree. Overall, however, we seem to be seeing much more class being generated by the combination of closely related strains of Northern Dancer, such as Storm Bird/Nijinsky II, Storm Bird/The Minstrel, Vice Regent/The Minstrel and Nureyev/Sadler's Wells, or through Nijinsky II and a range of other more typical sons. The balance may change as Northern Dancer's sons recede further back into pedigrees, but is does seem at least possible that some degree of diversity will work best, be it in physique, aptitude, genetic background (as with close genetic relatives) or sex.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

The GI Hollywood Futurity winner Captain Steve (c, 2, Fly So Free--Sparkling Delite, by Vice Regent) was covered in detail by Andrew Caulfield in Tuesday's TDN. It is worth noting, however, that both he and another of the weekend's major stakes winners, Strolling Belle, combine Northern Dancer and Damascus. Captain Steve's broodmare sire Vice Regent seems to particularly like the Damascus strain. Vice Regent is also broodmare sire of Time Limit, one of the best runners from the first crop of Fly So Free's fellow Damascus-line sire and juvenile champion Gilded Time. Vice Regent's son Deputy Minister is broodmare sire of No Curfew, the first stakes winner sired by 1999 freshman sire Unaccounted For, a grandson of Damascus. Dehere, a champion two-year-old by Deputy Minister, not only carries Damascus, but his highest earner Arrested Dreams is inbred to Damascus. There are some pedigree links between Vice Regent and Damascus. Vice Regent has the brothers Pharos and Fairway 4x4, and Damascus has the brothers Sickle and Pharamond II 4x3. Pharos, Fairway, Sickle and Pharamond II are all by Phalaris out of mares by Chaucer. In addition, Vice Regent's sire Northern Dancer has as double of Gainsborough, and Damascus has both Gainsborough's half sister Rosern and Teddy, whose dam is a close relative to Gainsborough.

FROM THE DESK OF... Bill Oppenheim



FIN DU SIECLE ... END OF THE CENTURY

I'm not as much an historian as perhaps I should be, so I can't comment on The Greatest or The Best of the whole 20th century...nor, given the technological and scientific advances of the last 100 years, can I imagine what the landscape will look like a hundred years from now--or even where the landscape will be, for that matter. But the end of a whole century must be a time for reflection, so I wanted to take this opportunity to select a few Greats of the last 30 years or so, what I've seen. Being American, you know what my bias is...

The Greatest Horse: Secretariat. He was a freak of nature, which is maybe one reason why he wasn't as great a sire as he was a racehorse (any population tends to breed back to the median). I never saw him race in person, but I did see him train at Saratoga, and of course saw most of his races on television. His Preakness win, for me, was the greatest of all: he went from last in a field of six to 2 1/2 lengths first in a furlong on the backstretch. He had the most electrifying turn of foot I've ever seen. Other nominations?

Defining Moment: The first time I ever went to Lexington, Kentucky, was for the July sale in 1978, age 28, nearly 29. I had begun my career as a racing journalist in New Zealand and Louisiana, so I was very much a kid from Kansas coming to the Big Time. I sat in the seats around the outside of the pavilion, and when Nureyev became the second millon-dollar yearling, I swear my heart was in my mouth. I had never before seen a horse who just oozed class like he did. I can remember like it was yesterday watching Joss Collins being almost carried out of the pavilion, straight to the bar, afterwards. Joss, buyer of a few thousand horses, told me once he doesn't remember much about it at all.

Greatest Moment at a Horse Sale: Hands down, the night Seattle Dancer sold for \$13.1-million at the 1985 July sale. Warner Jones, breeder and consignor of the colt, was bidding for a syndicate trying to buy him too; I don't remember who else was involved, but I do remember, when the bidding got to about \$8 million and Warner was already past his limit, Warner easing up out

of his seat (the Magnier seats now, about the third row down, right on the aisle), throwing his catalogue in the air, and walking down the aisle and out the other side, shaking his head in disbelief. It was 10 minutes of the excesses of Rome, and it was astoundingly great theatre, as this sport/business can be.

Greatest Influence on the Breed: Without any question, Northern Dancer, Winner of the 1964 Kentucky Derby in then-record time (Secretariat broke it in 1973), failed to stay when third to Quadrangle in the Belmont (thus proving for all time you don't need to win the Triple Crown to be a great sire), but doubtless the greatest sire of the second half of the 20th century. His great-grandsire Phalaris (1913), tail-male ancestor also of Native Dancer, Nearco, Nasrullah, and Hail to Reason, was the greatest influnce of the first half of the century. Northern Dancer's influence is huge, including, of course, Nijinsky, Lyphard, Danzig, Nureyev, Sadler's Wells, Vice Regent (Deputy Minister), and now Storm Bird (Storm Cat). He and his great-grandsire are truly the only candidates for the title Horse of the Century, from my (admittedly breeding-oriented) perspective.

Greatest Influence Now Virtually Forgotten: The 'Iron Horse', Discovery (1931), by Display, by Fair Play (also sire of Man o' War). Discovery was the damsire of Native Dancer AND Bold Ruler.

Greatest Trend: The rise of what we now call the 'commercial market,' and the decline of owner-breeders. The injection of money and value into the business in the last 30 years has been phenomenal, as the \$317-million gross for last month's Keeneland November sale demonstrates. But it hasn't been all positive, because it has coincided with the decline of the owner-breeders, and the consequent disappearance of what used to be great female families. There are just a few large-scale owner-breeders of the old school left-mostly based in France, for some reason--and while the professionalism, if you will, of the breed and the business has been enhanced, we have lost some great virtues as well, which are to be lamented. At least, I think so.

So there you are--a view from this soapbox, and a highly personal one. These are just my views and opinions, and it would be quite interesting, and fun, to hear from others whose experiences are no doubt quite different from mine. What do you think? We'd love to hear from you on these subjects.

NUMBERS UP AT HOLLYWOOD The Autumn meet at Hollywood Park concluded Monday with figures up for both handle and on-track attendance. The total ontrack attendance reached 235,689. The average attendance for the 31-day meet was 7,603--up 2.1 percent from the 1998 figure of 7,443. The average attendance at satellite locations declined 1.8 percent to 10,425, causing total attendance to decrease .2 percent, from 559,945 to 558,864. Total handle for the season increased 3.9 percent, from \$305,676,174 to \$317,682,260. On-track, the handle increased 11.3 percent, from last year's \$52,858,964 to 1999's \$58,840,043. The leading rider at the meet was Laffit Pincay, Jr., who became the winningest jockey in racing history at Hollywood on Dec. 10. With his 32 victories, Pincay became the first jockey over 50 to win a major riding title in the United States. The meet's leading trainer was Bob Baffert. "We had great weather, frequent carryovers and we had Laffit's quest for immortality," said track president Rick Baedeker. "This was a meeting where the stars aligned. Everything came together, we caught every good break. We may one day match the good weather and the good betting cards, but obviously, we will never match what Laffit Pincay did here." The Autumn meet was the first Hollywood meet run under the management of Churchill Downs Inc. Hollywood opens for its Spring/Summer Meeting on Apr. 28.

CANDY STRIPES TO FLORIDA Candy Stripes (Blushing Groom {Fr}--Bubble Company {Fr}, by Lyphard) will stand the 2000 breeding season at Stoneriggs Farm in Ocala, Florida. The 16-year-old stallion began his breeding career in South America where he sired multiple grade I winner Different (Arg), as well as Group I winners Seaborg (Arg) and Victory Stripes (Arg). He was purchased by North American interests and stood at Taylor Made Farm in Kentucky. His first North American crop will be two-year-olds in 2000. "We expect great things of Candy Stripes's first crop when they hit the track this year, however, we are still going to stand him for \$6,000 to make him affordable to the breeders in Florida," explained Stoneriggs owner Robert Slack. "He fits right into our plan of having a full complement of world-class proven stallions right here in Florida."

SPORTSMAN'S RELEASES 2000 SCHEDULE

Sportsman's Park has unveiled a powerful \$2.1 million stakes schedule for its 2000 meeting. The highlight of the season is the "Million Dollar Triple," which includes the Apr. 29 \$200,000 GIII National Jockey Club H., the May 7 \$300,000 GIII Sixty Sails H. and the May 13 \$500,000 GII Illinois Derby. New to the stakes schedule is the \$100,000 Illinois Derby Prep, a 1 1/16-mile event for three-year-olds on Mar. 25. Rounding out the seven six-figure stakes on tap this year are the \$100,000 Lady Hallie on Apr. 8, the \$100,000 Sportsman's Park Breeders' Cup on Apr. 1 and the \$150,000 National Jockey Club Oaks on Apr. 22. "The stakes program along with our daily purse structure will create a great deal of interest among horsemen to race with us and I look forward to serving them and their needs in every way I possibly can," said Sportsman's newly appointed racing secretary Alan Plever The 54-day meeting runs from Mar. 3 through May 13.

OBS CATALOGS ON NET Catalogs for the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Winter Mixed Sale will be mailed out next week and are already available on the internet at www.obssales.com. A total of 1115 lots are catalogued for the four-day sale, which begins with two consignor-preferred sessions on Jan. 17 and Jan. 18 and continues with two open sessions on Jan. 19 and Jan. 20. Of the 626 horses catalogued in the consignor-preferred sessions, 318 are yearlings and 290 broodmares. In the open sessions, there are 166 yearlings and 222 broodmares.



LEVY BOARD TO REIMBURSE FIXTURE FEES...

The Levy Board has approved the reimbursement of the fixtures fees charged by the British Horseracing Board to Britain's 59 racecourses in 2000. This will be the second year running that the Levy Board has met the full cost of the daily fixture fees, which cover the cost of the Jockey Club's licensed officials, the security and veterinary field forces and the BHB handicappers. The total cost of the grant to cover fixtures fees in 2000 is budgeted at £5,850,000, an eight percent increase compared to this year's £5,419,000. This follows a slight increase in the number of people due to be employed in 2000 because of more Sunday racing and additional responsibilities.

...AND SUPPORT DIVIDED RACES FUND

The Levy Board has decided to give a grant of £100,000 to the British Horseracing Board's Divided Races Fund. This is in addition to the facility fee which will be paid by the Levy Board to racecourses for each divided race--£550 (flat) and £650 (National Hunt)--in 2000. It is estimated that these facility fees, approved in March this year, will cost the Levy Board an estimated £120,000 next year. The Board decided to authorize both grants because of the costs faced by owners and racecourses in staging divided races and the extra levy income generated by them. Following a request from the BHB, the future funding of divided races will be looked at by the Levy Board at its annual strategy review meeting which takes place in March.
