ECLIPSE FINALISTS ANNOUNCED The finalists for the 1999 Eclipse Awards were announced yesterday by the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, the National Turf Writers Association and the *Daily Racing Form*. In the hotly contested race for Horse of the Year, the three finalists are Breeders' Cup Sprint champion **Artax** (Marquetry), Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner **Charismatic** (Summer Squall) and Breeders' Cup Turf champion **Daylami (Ire)** (Doyoun {Ire}). The winners will be announced Jan. 3, but there is little suspense in the three-year-old filly category. **Silverbulletday** (Silver Deputy) dominated her division from the start of the year and dominated the voting, unanimously being chosen by the three voting blocks. The awards ceremony will take place at the Beverly Hilton in Beverly Hills, CA, Jan. 17.

DOCKSIDER TO AIRLIE Docksider (Diesis {GB}--Pump, by Forli), winner of the G2 Hong Kong Mile earlier in the month and third in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile last month, will stand at Airlie Stud in Ireland next year. Trainer John Hills, while disappointed that the four-year-old will not stay in training, said, "He's an outcross of Northern Dancer and has every chance of making it as a stallion. If they'd kept racing him, all sorts of things could have gone wrong. It's a shame that his career is over and there is always a bit of gap when a horse like him goes. He is still in quarantine in Hong Kong but when he comes back he will soon be off to Ireland."

PHILLY PARK TO LEAVE NTRA? Robert Green, president of Philadelphia Park, has sent a letter to National Thoroughbred Racing Association Commissioner Tim Smith indicating the Bensalem, PA track's intention to withdraw from the association effective the middle of January. In the body of the letter, Green delineates six issues of discontent, three of which involve the NTRA's relationship with the Television Games Network. Green is particularly critical of the agreement entered into between TVG and a number of racetracks which allows TVG to receive various tracks' signal on an exclusive basis. Philadelphia Park is a partner in The Racing Network and operator of its own telephone account wagering network. Green leaves open the chance of a return to the NTRA. "If these and some other matters of concern can be addressed democratically and resolved in a fair and responsible manner, Philadelphia Park would be prepared to continue its membership...and work assiduously in helping the NTRA achieve its primary goal of making Thoroughbred racing a major league sport in the U.S.," Green concludes. Chip Tuttle, vice president of communications for the NTRA, told the *Blood-Horse* that Philadelphia Park is "about 1-9 to drop out." The *Blood-Horse* also reported that M I Entertainment chairman Frank Stronach said the fate of his racetracks' membership in the NTRA hinges on the results of a meeting he hopes to have with Smith sometime before Jan. 15, the deadline for membership renewal.

KEENELAND 2000 STAKES WORTH \$6.6M

Keeneland announced a 2000 stakes schedule worth \$6,675,000 yesterday. The Kentucky track's richest race will be the \$750,000 GI Toyota Blue Grass S., run Apr. 15. Keeneland's other three Grade I races are the Apr. 8 \$500,000 Ashland, the Oct. 8 \$500,000 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup and the Oct. 14 \$500,000 Three Chimneys Spinster. Other highlights of Keeneland's Fall stakes program are the Oct. 7 \$400,000 GII Shadwell Keeneland Turf Mile; the Oct. 8 \$400,000 GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity and the Oct. 15 \$400,000 GII Walmac Int'l Alcibiades. Focal points of the spring meet will be the Apr. 22 \$325,000 GII Coolmore Lexington and the recently upgraded GII Maker's Mark Mile which will be worth \$150,000 when it is run on Apr. 14. In 2000, Stonerside Farm will sponsor the \$125,000 GII Beaumont on Apr 21. Keeneland's 15-day spring race meeting runs from Apr. 7 through Apr. 28. The 16-day fall race meeting begins on Oct. 7 and concludes Oct. 28.

Tampa Bay Settles Contract Dispute:

The local chapter of the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and the management of Tampa Bay Downs have reached a contract agreement and racing is expected to resume as normal on Sunday. "We're happy to have had a successful conclusion to the contract discussions," said John Grady, vice president and general manager of Tampa Bay Downs. "Now we are focusing on the 89 racing days remaining." Bob Van Worp, president of the horsemen's association added, "This has been unfortunate but we are very happy to be able to reach an agreement that will be helpful to both the horsemen and the track. I think that this settlement is a great avenue towards an early resolution to next year's contract. We are tickled to death to be back running our horses."

McPeek Officially Exonerated in New Jersey:

The New Jersey Racing Commission, by a vote of 6 to 1, has upheld the recommendation from an administrative law judge not to punish Kentucky-based trainer Ken McPeek for a 1993 breakdown of Mean Doris Jean at The Meadowlands, according to *Thoroughbred Times Online*. Stewards originally assessed McPeek a 30-day penalty, alleging that he knowingly ran his horse with a splint bone injury. McPeek denied the claims and appealed the stewards' ruling, but was suspended for one year by the commission. The conditioner was not at the commission meeting Tuesday, but told *Thoroughbred Times*, "I never had much doubt that I would be (vindicated)."

KRC Bans Milkshakes:

Calling upon their "legal authority and moral obligation", the Kentucky Racing Commission yesterday imposed a permanent ban against the practice of milkshaking. The action follows similar measures taken by the Louisiana Racing Commission, which outlawed milkshakes in their jurisdiction effective Dec. 17. Dr. Tom Tobin of the University of Kentucky testified to the committee that although evidence on the effectiveness of milkshakes as a performance-enhancing substance was inconclusive, there is evidence that the mixture can cause inaccurate pH levels in post-race urine testing, thus effectively masking the presence of other drugs. "We felt that if we could get some evidence before the commission that milkshaking had the potential to cloud other tests, we would have the authority to order a cessation of milkshakes," said KRC Chairman Richard Taylor. Taylor also pledged the support of the KRC to Kentucky's Equine Drug Council, which is funded by a percentage of wagering the state of Kentucky receives from its tracks.

WRITERS UP

Beulah Babes

Racetrack managements, usually with less than impressive results, have tried, tried and tried again to get more people to bet more money on their races. It's hard for any track, harder still for the Beulah Parks of the world.

With modest racing at a low-profile track, Beulah General Manager Mike Weiss knew he was up against it, particularly in the crowded simulcast market where the Beulah signal competes daily with such powerhouses as Aqueduct, Gulfstream, Fair Grounds, Hollywood Park and Santa Anita. But Weiss remained a believer in Beulah's product, which features a steady diet of cheap yet competitive races that have the type of large fields horseplayers prefer. The problem was getting them to take notice. But how?

The answer: a double helping of cheesecake. Little Beulah Park's simulcast signal has become the talk of the industry and its off-track business has never been better. It must be the Beulah Twins.

Everyone at the track knew who they were. How could you not? Young, attractive, blonde and, yes, buxom, identical twins Jenna and Katie Felty were working as mutuel clerks when Weiss had his brainstorm. He would take the two and make them the hosts of the track's simulcasting programming. Never mind that they knew little about handicapping. Everyone loves a pretty face, especially older males, the majority of simulcast customers.

It had to be better than the usual array of bland talking heads that most tracks feature on their simulcast shows.

"I was walking around the track trying to figure out what I could do to make people notice Beulah Park," Weiss said. "Our races are really competitive and we have a lot of full fields, which is our strength. If people would just take notice of us, I thought we had a product they'd like to bet on. And there, sitting behind the mutuel machines, were Katie and Jena. It's one thing to have a nice-looking female. It's even better to have bookends. If people would look up and say, 'Wow, what's that?,' I thought they might see that we had a 12-horse field and they'd bet on us."

There were a few blips at first. Though both of the twins' parents work in racing, Katie and Jenna, who are 22, struggled with some of the handicapping parlance. Some fans would not take them seriously, refusing to get past the dumb blonde stereotype.

"A lot of people didn't think we knew what we were doing," Jenna said. "There'd be a lot of criticism from some of the bettors. We still get it. You can't let it bother you."

But they learned quickly and can now discuss the nuances of a track bias with the best of them. That they're attractive is important, but so is their ability to give out winners.

It's gone better than Weiss ever could have expected. When the twins started in the fall of 1997, Beulah handled about \$14 million a year in off-track business. It's now \$23 million and growing.

There are the Beulah Twins fan club, the Beulah Twins souvenirs, the Beulah Twins Tour (coming next to Sunland Park in New Mexico). There's the Beulah Twins Playboy spread. The Feltys took part in Playboy's Playmate 2000 search and, so far, have appeared on the Playboy website. They did not pose nude, but wear provocative bikinis that do not leave much to the imagination.

"There's no doubt they are noticed," Weiss said, "and our off-track numbers have gone up significantly. I can't say it's 100 percent because of them, but they have made people look at our races."

Both are astonished by the success they have had and hope that it only continues to grow. Weiss is looking to expand the tour and expects that even more tracks will begin taking the Beulah signal. The twins were contacted the other day by World Wrestling Federation officials, who expressed some interest in fitting the Beulah babes into their anything-goes programming. Only Katie still works at the mutuel machines, which she does twice a week, fitting that in with her TV role and her duties as a wife and the mother of four-month-old daughter Macey. She gets flowers from customers and good tips when she gives out a winner. Both girls get a considerable amount of fan mail.

Jenna's the older of the two, by eight minutes, and the more outgoing. No longer a mutuel clerk, she is a full-time staffer with the track's publicity department. She's single, but doesn't want to be. Katie admits that Jenna's a little more knowledgeable and the better handicapper.

They may be a gimmick, but a gimmick that, apparently, works. Sure beats a totebag giveaway.
