STEVENS MULLS HIS OPTIONS

Faced with the choice of not walking again, jockey Gary Stevens hung up his tack for the final time Sunday because of a degenerative arthritis condition in his right knee. "It hadn't been a sudden decision," Stevens, 37, said during a teleconference yesterday. "The last sixteen to eighteen months I've been riding with pain and the level of pain has been increasing to where I can't tolerate it anymore." "I've only got five percent cartilage in the knee and the outside is bone on bone," continued Stevens. "There's nothing I could do and will require knee replacement in the future." Riding since he was 16 when he rode his first winner aboard his first mount, Little Star, Stevens now will take his time to decide his future. "Right now I'm going to spend time with my immediate family before going back home to Idaho and spend time there," said the 1998 Eclipse-winning jockey. "I have several options out there but I'm going to take 4 to 6 weeks to decide." Stevens wasn't specific but he mentioned there was talk of television work or continuing to work with Prince Ahmed Salman's Thoroughbred Corporation, for whom he was the contract rider. Elected to the Hall-of-Fame in 1997, Stevens rode Winning Colors (1988), Thunder Gulch (1995) and Silver Charm (1997) to victory in the Kentucky Derby and in November, rode Anees to victory in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, who is consider one of the top prospects for the 2000 Derby. "The reason I attempted this comeback was winning my fourth Derby," said Stevens, who retired with 4,512 victories. "This colt (Anees) is very exciting." But now that mount will go to someone else and Stevens will get to enjoy a few more meals than he has before.

CAVONNIER CALLS IT A CAREER The 1996

Kentucky Derby runner up Cavonnier (Batonnier) was retired this past Monday after his fourth-place finish in the Ack Ack S. at Santa Anita. A homebred gelding for Robert and Barbara Walter, the six-year-old will take up residence at the Walters' farm in Northern California. Cavonnier won the 1996 GI Santa Anita Derby before being nosed by Grindstone in that year's Run for the Roses. The dark bay was sidelined after pulling up lame with a bowed tendon in the 1996 Belmont S. and did not race again for nearly 30 months. His comeback started with a one-length victory in the 1998 edition of the Ack Ack, but he was off the board in four starts this year. "He's sound and all, but he just doesn't want it anymore," trainer Bob Baffert told the Daily Racing Form. "The tendon's not bothering him, but he just doesn't have that competitive spirit. We had decided that if he is not going to be competitive at that level, he should be retired." Cavonnier bids farewell with seven wins from 21 career starts and earnings of \$1,201,664.

DETTORI'S AGENT CALLS IT QUITS:

Matty Cowing, the agent for jockey Frankie Dettori for the last 10 years, announced Wednesday that he is retiring due to ill health, Sporting Life reports. Cowing, 62, has undergone triple bypass surgery and suffers from high blood pressure. "Frankie and I have had a talk and the danger of what the pressure (of being his agent) could do to my health is too big a risk to run, so I'm packing it up," Cowing told Sporting Life. Added Dettori, "Matty took me on as an apprentice and in our 10 years together I've been champion apprentice, champion jockey twice and ridden over 1,500 winners including many Classic and Group 1s. He's been a great agent and a great friend to me, but for the last two or three years his health hasn't been good and at his age, his health has to come first." Andrew Stringer, the assistant trainer for Barney Curley for five years, will take over as Dettori's agent when the flat season opens in the spring. The 37-year-old, who started in racing as a jump jockey, makes his first foray into the agent business. "I've never been an agent, but I've done virtually everything else in racing and I'm looking forward to an exciting challenge," Stringer told Sporting Life.

BREATHALYZER TESTS FOR HONG KONG JOCKS?

Jockeys riding at Hong Kong's Millennium Cup fixture Friday night may be breath-tested if they opt to leave the jockeys' room between races to join in New Year's Eve celebrations. Normally riders are restricted to the changing and weighing rooms until they have completed their rides on the program. But jockeys Basil Marcus and Eric Legrix asked the Hong Kong Jockey Club for permission to leave the track between races on the Dec. 31 fixture to be with their families. The Hong Kong Jockey Club is making an exception for the new millennium and jockeys will be allowed to leave the track, but may have to undergo a breath-test on their return. A Hong Kong Jockey Club spokesman said: "Our chief stipendiary steward has told the jockeys that we reserve the right to breath test them when they return. It is an exceptional case because it is a unique occasion." The final race of Friday's meeting will be run at 12.45 a.m. local time on Saturday, Jan. 1.
