Aidan O'Brien, however, feels that changes made to Hold that Tiger's training earlier this spring is to blame for his poor performances, and the trainer has noticed a difference in the \$1.1-million weanling since readjusting his training routine. "We just made a few little moves in the spring," O'Brien explained, "but it didn't really work, which was the case of a lot of our three-year-olds' disappointing springs." O'Brien also indicated that he'd given Hold that Tiger some additional schooling from the gate for his U.S. reappearance, a move prompted by the colt's poor start in the Juvenile. "We've done a little stall work, just to wake him up a little bit, and hopefully he'll be quicker out of there than he was last year."

There is an international flavour for this contest which sees the winning owner presented with a solid gold whip. The home defence is faced with challengers from Britain, Holland and Sweden with Fiepes Shuffle and the Dutch raider Lucky Strike likely to be the ones to set the standard. The former was promoted to third in the G3 Holsten Trophy at Hamburg July 5 and then finished fourth in the Listed Prix du Cercle at Deauville July 31. The sophomore showed his true worth when winning the G3 Grosser Preis von Berlin at Hoppegarten Aug. 10, with six of today's rivals behind, and will prove a formidable foe here. Lucky Strike was a hugely impressive seven-length winner of the Sport-Welt-Sprintpreis at Cologne May 4, on his last visit to Germany, and slipped the field when successful in the G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot at Longchamp June 22. He finished a highly respectable 2½-length fifth in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville Aug. 10 and holds a strong claim on that form alone. Back in 1998, Wagon Limit supplied one of the surprises of the year. Starting at odds of 34-1, he reveled in the sloppy conditions, splashing past Skip Away and Gentlemen--who at the time were generally reckoned to be the two best horses in training--on his way to a 5 1/2-length victory.

Fast forward nearly five years, and we find Wagon Limit's son, Silver Wagon, causing an upset by rolling past odds-on favorite Chapel Royal, who had been many people's idea of the current leader of the two-year-old division, to score a four-length victory in the GI Hopeful S.

The result was also something of an upset from the pedigree punditry point of view, as few, if any, would have tabbed Wagon Limit as a likely candidate to be the first of the freshman sire class of 2003 to sire a Grade I winner. In fact Wagon Limit's race record betokens almost anything rather than speed and precocity. He was unraced at two, and, after scoring a maiden victory at six furlongs, he never again won at less than a mile. His three-year-old season showed Wagon Limit to be a consistent and useful runner as he won four times, and earned three seconds and a third in 10 starts. He didn't capture a stakes that year, but he did finish third in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, which, 6 1/2-length victor Skip Away apart, was not one of the stronger renewals of this contest. At four, the Allen Jerkens trainee tackled tougher competition, and won just twice in 10 outings. The first of those wins also marked Wagon Limit's first stakes triumph, and came by way of a five-length tally in the one-mile GIII Westchester H. The second--his GI Jockey Club upset--marked his final start, although he did remain in training as a five-yearold, not retiring to stud until 2000.

That he reached the stallion barn more than a year after his most recent start, probably didn't help Wagon Limit's commercial appeal, and Silver Wagon is one of only 21 named foals in his first crop, and is his only winner from four starters to date. The fact that Wagon Limit was a son of Conquistador Cielo wouldn't have added to his market allure either. The only son of Mr. Prospector to achieve honors as Horse of the Year, Conquistador Cielo had long since faded from the forefront of fashion, although he remained a consistent sire of stakes winners throughout his career. Conquistador Cielo would not have been thought of as a hot sire of sires either, although his record in this department is better than one might expect. Wagon Limit follows Marquetry (sire of champion sprinters Artax and Squirtle Squirt), Mi Cielo and Australia's El Moxie, as the third Conquistador Cielo son to sire a Grade I winner, and another son, Norquestor did a very respectable job as a regional sire in Maryland.

A \$55,000 Ocala Breeders August Yearling and a \$120,000 Ocala February Two-Year-Old, Silver Wagon is the second foal of his dam So Ritzy, a daughter of Darn That Alarm. A winner of five of eight starts, So Ritzy is a half sister to four stakes winners. The best of these was Race Artist (by Wagon Limit's grandsire Mr. Prospector), winner of the GIII Virginia H., and herself dam of stakes winning and graded stakes placed Cherokee Girl. So Ritzy's granddam produced one minor stakes winner, but neither her third or fourth dams achieved that feat. Her fifth dam, the Man o' War mare Big Beauty, is a sister to the mare Galleon Gold, who appears in the pedigree of Wagon Limit, as third dam of his broodmare sire, Cox's Ridge. *Cont. p. 4*

Overall, Silver Wagon owns a very cleverly structured pedigree, with a number of potential sources for his ability. The strongest candidate for key influence is the combination of Raise a Native, who appears 3 x 4 in Wagon Limit, with Jig Time, who is responsible for Silver Wagon's broodmare sire, Darn That Alarm. Both Raise a Native and Jig Time are Native Dancer/Case Ace crosses and so are three-quarters genetic relatives, and Darn That Alarm has a particularly similar background to Mr. Prospector, as his dam is by a son of Count Fleet, sire of the second dam of Mr. Prospector. The pedigree of Silver Wagon has two other particularly notable reinforcements. Firstly, Wagon Limit is inbred 4 x 4 to Turn-to, and Silver Wagon is linebred to Ambiorix, a half brother to the dam of Turn-to. Secondly, Wagon Limit has a total of three strains of the Calumet sisters Two Lea (champion handicap mare and champion three-year-old filly) and Miz Clementine (ninetime stake winner, including over colts in the California Derby and Cinema H.) and So Ritzy's third dam is by Two Lea's son, Tim Tam.



CHAMPION A NINE-BALL AFFAIR A maximum of nine will go to post for Saturday's G1 Ireland The Food Island Champion S. at Leopardstown after yesterday's forfeit stage. In what promises to be one of the races of the season, four Classic winners, a G1 Dubai World Cup winner, a multiple Group 1 winner, a dual G1 Yorkshire Oaks winner and a Classic runner-up are among the entries for Ireland's autumn showpiece. Dual Derby winner High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), this year's G1 Irish Derby winner Alamshar (Ire) (Key Of Luck), G1 2000 Guineas winner Refuse to Bend (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and G1 Irish Oaks winner Vintage Tipple (Ire) (Entrepreneur {GB}) are joined by Moon Ballad (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}), Falbrav (Ire) (Fairy King), Islington (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and France (GB) (Desert Prince {Ire}). G3 Coventry S. winner Statue of Liberty (Storm Cat) completes the remaining possibles for the €1-million event. Leopardstown manager Tom Burke aims to provide good-to-firm going and explained to Irish Times, "Our ground is good to firm at the moment and the forecast is for dry conditions Wednesday and Thursday. There is some rain getting into the west of Ireland on Friday, but the present indications are that it may not even reach the east coast, but if it does, it will produce very little in the way of rain." In that event, Burke intends to water the track in order to maintain the present track condition. High Chaparral's participation is ground-dependent and Aidan O'Brien told Racing Post, "Good, safe ground is all we want. High Chaparral will be left in at the forfeit stage, but we will have to make a decision on Wednesday or early Thursday, as we will have to change his work pattern should we keep him for the Prix Foy the following weekend instead." Alamshar's conditioner John Oxx would be content if the going remained unchanged, but less so if Johnny Murtagh, recovering from a back injury, is unable to ride. "Alamshar worked this morning and is in good order," Oxx told *Irish Times*. "Johnny rode him on the Peat gallop and we're happy with him. As for the Champion S. and Johnny riding, we are still taking it one day at a time. We'll see how he goes on at Limerick on Wednesday."

CANDY RIDE EARLY CLASSIC FAVORITE Candy Ride (Arg) (Ride the Rails), recent winner of the GI Pacific Classic, was made the 7-2 Classic favorite when wagering on the second Breeders' Cup future bet closed Monday. Candy Ride edged out GI Suburban H. winner Mineshaft (A.P. Indy), who closed at 9-2. The field closed at 25-1. A total of \$104,303 was wagered on the Classic. Last year's Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Azeri (Jade Hunter) was the 9-5 favorite in the Distaff future wager. Sightseek (Distant View) was next at 5-1, with the field closing at 18-1. Azeri was favored at 3-1 in the first future wager, while Empire Maker (Unbridled) was the Classic favorite after period one and closed Monday at 8-1. In the Breeders' Cup Sprint, Aldebaran (Mr. Prospector), winner of Sunday's GI Forego, was made the lukewarm 5-1 favorite, with Beau's Town (Beau Genius) at 6-1. The field, favored after Period One, closed at 10-1. In Turf wagering, 2002 champion High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Storming Home (GB) (Machiavellian) were made cofavorites at 6-1, with Period One favorite Alamshar (Ire) (Key of Luck) at 8-1. The field closed at 11-1. The combined total handle of \$222,056 on the four Breeders' Cup races available during Period Two represents a 38 percent increase over the Period One handle of \$160,759. "We are pleased with the 38-percent increase in total handle from the first period," said Ken Kirchner, senior vice president of product development for the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. "Most importantly, there are very solid value plays in each of the four pools. We'll continue to work hard to promote the next round of pools available Sept. 19-21." The third pool features wagering on the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, Juvenile Fillies, Filly and Mare Turf and Mile.

Forego, who died in 1997 at the age of 27, retired in 1978 with a career record of 34 wins from 57 starts. "I think it's very fitting that Forego's name has been attached to what is a vital fund-raising drive for the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation," said TRF Executive Director Diana Pikulski. "This is a horse who shouldered tremendous burdens in so many races with the weight he carried and he came through so many times. In a way, the TRF has also accepted a burdensome task, the responsibility for caring for so many horses. And we do our very best to come through for them."

Cancel Delay Policy Implemented in Many Facilities:

Most North American pari-mutuel facilities have met the request of the Thoroughbred Racing Association's 2020 Committee to eliminate closed betting cancel delays from their tote operations by yesterday's deadline. All Canadian racetracks have eliminated the cancel delay, as mandated by the Canadian Pari-Mutuel Agency. The majority of those who could not meet the deadline have regulatory or union contract restrictions requiring delays ranging from 3 to 12 seconds to cancel mutuel tickets after the close of betting. Cancel delays permit mutuel tellers, who are responsible for the cost of all tickets they have produced, to cancel an erroneous ticket even after the system has been closed for wagering at the start of the race. Until the cancel time has expired, pari-mutuel wagering outlets cannot begin transmitting their pools to the host track's tote system, thus increasing the amount of time it takes to report final odds and prices. Racetracks and pari-mutuel facilities with no cancel delays include: Aqueduct, Arlington Park, Belmont Park, Calder Race Course, Ellis Park, Evangeline Downs, Fair Grounds, Keeneland, Laurel Park, Lone Star Park, Pimlico, Prairie Meadows, Remington Park, Retama, Ruidoso Downs, Sam Houston Race park, Saratoga Race Course, Suffolk OTB, Sunland Park, Thistledown, Timonium, Turf Paradise and Turfway Park. Cancel delays still exist at Colonial Downs, Del Mar, Fairplex Park, Fonner Park, Gulfstream Park, Louisiana Downs, Oaklawn Park, Meadowlands, Monmouth Park, Oak Tree, Philadelphia Park and Santa Anita. ð -
