Maintaining his perfect record at Aqueduct, Congaree (Arazi) successfully defended his title in the GI Cigar Mile H. by dispatching the talented three-year-olds Midas Eyes (Touch Gold) and Toccet (Awesome Again) with this 5 1/4-length triumph. It was the third Grade I victory on the year for the five-year-old, who captured

the seven-furlong GI Carter H. over this surface in April and added the GI Hollywood Gold Cup over a mile and a quarter in July. Will he stay in training for 2004? Trainer Bob Baffert, for one, would like the handsome chestnut to be back in his shedrow. "Mr. and Mrs. McNair wanted to see how he ran today before making a decision on his future," Baffert said via telephone

from California. "What [Congaree] did today may have helped keep him around next year. The McNairs are in the business of racing horses, and when you have a racehorse like him, you hate to see him go the breeding shed." STRENGTH AND NUMBERS IN THE JAPAN CUP

How deep is the field of 18 which will assemble for this afternoon's \$4.4-million G1 Japan Cup in Tokyo? Ten of the starters have already compiled career earnings in excess of \$2 million, including likely race favorite Symboli Kris S. (Kris S.), who would approach the \$9-million mark if he is able find the line first in this internationally flavored field. The reigning JRA Horse of the Year, he finished third, beaten just a neck by

Falbrav (Ire) and Sarafan (Lear Fan) in the 2002 renewal of the Japan Cup. held at Nakayama while the Tokyo Racecourse underwent renovations. Winner of the G1 Arima Kinen in the final start of his sophomore campaign last December, the colt has raced just Islington Horsephotos twice this term, finishing fifth in the



G1 Takarazuka Kinen June 29 before registering an

unprecedented repeat victory in the G1 Tenno Sho at this track Nov. 2. The Thoroughbred Corporation's Johan (Gone West) will try to become the first U.S.based horse to win the Japan Cup since Golden Pheasant scored in 1991. Lightly raced and making just his fifth start of the season today, the son of Windsharp Johar Benoit Photo Seeks to become the first winner of the



Breeders' Cup Turf to follow up in this event. Singspiel (Ire), second in the 1996 Turf, did go on to Japan Cup success, while that year's Turf winner, Pilsudski (Ire), took the '97 Japan Cup. Cont. p2

CONGAREE KEEPS SMOKIN' Stonerside homebred Congaree (Arazi) triumphed by 5 1/2 lengths in last year's Cigar, stopping the clock in 1:33 and earning a 120 Beyer. He has been just as impressive this year. After coming up a head short when giving Milwaukee Brew five pounds in the GI Santa Anita H., he rebounded with his victory in the GI Carter H. as leading sprinter Aldebaran ran second. He was given some time off following a sixth at 4-5 in the GI Met Mile, returning to wire his foes in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup in mid-July, then didn't race again for another two months, finishing second to Perfect Drift in the GII Kentucky Cup Classic. Congaree got caught in a speed duel with Medaglia d'Oro in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Oct. 25, but was a game fourth, beaten a total of 2 1/2 lengths. He had been training smartly for his return and was bet down to 3-5. Breaking alertly under Jerry Bailey, Congaree tracked Midas Eyes (Touch Gold) through a half in :44.56, then moved up on even terms. He shrugged off the three-year-old in midstretch and strode home to give Bailey a record 70th stakes win for the year and his third on the day. "He feels better now than he did at three," said Bailey. "As good as he is, I told [the McNairs] I didn't see any reason to retire him."

Lord Weinstock's colors, carried to victory aboard Pilsudski six years ago, will be borne again this afternoon by jockey Kieren Fallon astride Islington. The talented filly was perfect in two tries this term versus her peers, winning the G1 Yorkshire Oaks for a second consecutive year Aug. 20 and the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf in her latest effort Oct. 25. She has yet to defeat males in her career, but turned in an outstanding performance when third, beaten about a half length by High Chaparral (Ire) and Falbrav, in the G1 Irish Champion S. Sept. 6. Neo Universe put himself on the brink of the Japanese Triple Crown with a narrow win in the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) June 1, but was denied the sweep when he could do no better than third in the G1 Japanese St Leger Oct. 26. Sarafan finished second in a controversial Cup renewal last year at Nakayama and comes into the repeat try off a Nov. 1 allowance victory at Hollywood Park. G1 Cox Plate winner Fields of Omagh was most recently third in the G1 Mackinnon S. Nov. 1 and is available at an eyepopping 99-1 on the morning line.

Heat Haze has displayed her patented kick in each of her seven U.S. starts, but that attribute has been blunted over a longer distances, and returning to a mile could be just what the doctor ordered for the homebred. Following a perfectly timed victory in the GI Beverly D. S. over 1 3/16 miles, the dark bay came up a length short when third in the GI Flower Bowl Sept. 27 and missed third by a nose in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf Oct. 25. She is perfect in three U.S. starts at a mile and under. Etoile Montante capped her French campaign by defeating older males in the G1 Prix de la Foret Oct. 12 at Longchamp, but meets a pair of fillies she had trouble handling earlier this year: Musical Chimes and Maiden Tower. They finished one-two in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches May 11, with Etoile Montante completing the trifecta. Musical Chimes, a fast-closing second to Tates Creek in the GI Yellow Ribbon, sheds her blinkers after a poor trip when 11th in the F/M Turf. Maiden Tower came up a nose short in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland Oct. 11. Another French invader is Acago, who was an unlucky sixth in the Pouliches. The chestnut rebounded to take the G3 Prix Chloe before running a close fourth, beaten 1 3/4 lengths by Bright Sky (Ire) and Six Perfections (Fr), in the G2 Prix d'Astarte. She gets Lasix and adds blinkers following her U.S. bow, a fifth in the GI Garden City Breeders' Cup H. at Belmont Sept. 7. The most well-travelled of this cosmopolitan field could be Dancal, an Irish-bred who was an excellent campaigner in South Africa before becoming a stakes winner in Dubai. The five-year-old ships in off a victory in the GIII Violet H. at the Meadowlands Oct. 17.

The last two runnings of the Hollywood Derby were won by Johar (2002) and Denon (2001). Can one of these three-year-olds follow in their footsteps? Kicken Kris has been nearly perfect at distances of 10 furlongs or more, running second to Silver Tree in the Virginia Derby July 12 before annexing the GI Secretariat S. a month later. He couldn't handle MGSW Stroll after wide trip when second in the nine-furlong GII Jamaica H. Sept. 21, but bounced back to winning form in the GIII Lawrence Realization, run over 1 1/2 miles at Belmont Oct. 11. Silver Tree, who hasn't raced since his Colonial Downs triumph, has inspired confidence in his connections. "[Trainer] Bill Mott is the king of bringing them off layoffs," said assistant trainer Kenny McCarthy. "If anybody can do it, he can." Unbeaten in two starts over this course, Stanley Park earned his first graded-stakes win by defeating Bis Repetitas in the GIII Bay Meadows Derby Nov. 1. Senor Swinger came up just a half-length short when third to his elders in the GIII Carleton F. Burke H. at Santa Anita Oct. 24 and should appreciate this 10-furlong distance. Winner of the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud last year, Alberto Giacometti has yet to visit the winner's circle in four 2003 starts. The bay was a good third to European Horse of the Year Dalakhani (Ire) in the G1 Prix Lupin, but has not been out since finishing sixth in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris and makes his first start for trainer Laura de Seroux.

The handsome colt had a rough start in the GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity, running sixth to Eurosilver in that Oct. 4 race, but turned things around with an impressive 7 3/4-length triumph in the GIII Iroquois S. Nov. 2. After getting off to a slow start from post seven, the dark bay quickly reached contention with a four-wide move on the backstretch and put a head in front as they turned for home. He opened up a bit on the field and had enough left to hold on. "I thought it was a tremendous effort because I had to put him to the test," jockey Shane Sellers said. "I had to get after him early going into the turn because the leaders were going in :24 and :48 and just walking...he could have got tired on me, and he probably did a little bit because I made a middle move with him. RECORDS FALL AT TATTERSALLS FOALS The largest ever Tattersalls December Foal Sale proved a record-breaker, concluding in Newmarket last night with an all-time high turnover of 21,157,000gns, up 23 percent on the amount yielded 12 months ago. Last year's figure included a lot that sold for 1.8 million guineas, accounting for over 10 percent of the sale total, so while this year's 28,688gns average actually fell by 3 percent, the 21-percent rise in median to 17,000gns was a more accurate reflection of the market. The 2003 clearance rate was 78.1 percent, compared to 71.7 percent in 2002. Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony commented, "All four of our yearling sales, starting with the Houghton and culminating with the December Yearling Sale on Monday, have broken new ground and they have had a major impact on the success of this week's foal sale. The turnover has broken the 20-million guineas barrier for the first time, which in itself is a massive rise, but the real indicators have been the surge in the median and the higher clearance rate from the largest foal catalogue ever put together in Europe. The median shows the extraordinary depth to the market." He added, "Equally indicative has been the record number of lots breaking 50,000gns, 100,000gns and 200,000gns. The Irish pinhookers, as ever, have led the charge, but all week they have been up against strong domestic competition as well as

Watership Down Up on Top... Watership Down Stud was the week's top vendor, selling eight lots for 842,000gns, while Sheikh Mohammed's agent John Ferguson headed the buyers' table after making an unprecedented nine foal purchases for 1.68 million guineas. Among those was yesterday's top lot, a colt by Green Desert out of Solosole (Gulch). Consigned by Marc de Chambure, Eric Puerari and Michel Zerolo's European Sales Management, the French-bred brought 300,000gns. BBA's Ireland's Adrian Nicoll was underbidder for the colt. "If you see an outstanding foal, it makes sense to buy it then as it might be more expensive as a yearling. We can also then take them back to Ireland and they don't have to go through the stress of going to a yearling sale," said Ferguson, adding, "The more stallions we stand, the more income we get and the more opportunity we get to support the industry by putting money back into the pool." Danehill's penultimate foal crop included a daughter of Grail (Quest For Fame {GB}), a half-sister to top two-year-old Three Valleys (Diesis {GB}). The filly was consigned by New England Stud for the Countess de le Warr, who bred the filly in a foal share, and purchased for 260,000gns by Barronstown Stud, which is likely to reconsign the filly to next year's Houghton Sale. The four-day breeding stock sale begins tomorrow at 9:30 a.m. "We have a strong catalogue of mares and fillies to come, and we can very definitely take encouragement from this week's proceedings," Mahony said.
