February Storm to Live Oak:

February Storm (Storm Cat--Lilac Garden, by Roberto), a stakes-winning half brother to GI Kentucky Oaks winner Blushing K.D., will enter stud this season at Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Stud near Ocala, Florida. The six-year-old, who will stand as the property of K. David Schwartz and partners, will command a fee of \$3,500. Bred and raced by The Thoroughbred Corporation, February Storm performed best on the turf, winning Keeneland's Storm Cat S. on that surface and finishing third in the Woodlawn S. at Pimlico and the Exceller H. at Santa Anita. Also a half brother to 2002 Hong Kong Horse of the Year Electronic Unicorn, February Storm was purchased by Schwartz for \$55,000 at Keeneland January in 2004.

Handle Dips at Maryland Tracks:

The Maryland Jockey Club announced yesterday that the total 2004 handle declined four percent, partially due to the fact that there were 11 fewer racing days during the year. One of the reasons for the decline in racing days in 2004 was that Laurel Park had been closed since the summer, but is scheduled to reopen later this month. The daily average handle from all sources decreased two percent from \$3.48 million to \$3.41 million. However, the daily average handle on the export signal showed a four-percent increase, its fourth consecutive rise. Maryland's marquee event, the GI Preakness S., hosted a record crowd of 112,668 and set a new record for daily handle of \$87.9 million for the May 15 race.

Triple Crown Nominations Due Jan. 22:

Nomination forms for the 2005 Visa Triple Crown and its \$5-million bonus have been sent out to horsemen. The deadline for early nominations, at \$600 apiece, is Saturday, Jan. 22. Late nominations-priced at \$6,000-must be made by Mar. 26. The Visa Triple Crown will begin Saturday, May 7 at Churchill Downs with the 131st running of the Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs, which will carry a \$2-million purse this year.

WAVE 3, Premiere Radio Win Media Eclipse Awards:

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association has announced two additional Media Eclipse Award winners. The Louisville, Kentucky-based WAVE 3 TV won the award for Local Television for its pre- and post-race coverage surrounding last year's Kentucky Derby. The station devoted 9 1/2 hours to Derby Day coverage, including background news features and celebrity/ racing personality interviews as well as live racing. "We couldn't be more proud of winning an Eclipse Award in this city and what it means for us covering the Kentucky Derby," Dan Foos, the station's executive producer, said on behalf of the broadcast's personnel. "We have an all-star team of on-air talent and production. We all grew up with horse racing, and each year we try to make a better show than the last one for our daily viewers and for the people who follow the sport on a regular basis." The Eclipse Award in the Audio and Multi-Media Internet category was won by Premiere Radio Networks for its live national coverage of the 2004 Belmont S. "The Belmont Stakes was a wonderful story with Smarty Jones capturing the imagination of the country," said Shelby Whitfield, executive producer of the 90-minute broadcast. "My team of consummate professionals did the event justice. Racecaller Dave Johnson, anchor Don Chevrier, field reporter Fred Manfra and analyst Gregg McCarron share my love for Thoroughbred racing, and it shows in their work."

She continued on gamely in the stretch as Mazella and the favorite came after her, and got to the wire safely in front by a length. "I knew I wasn't going that fast and she was doing it very easily," Gomez said. "She went about her business in the stretch." Foaled in Kentucky with a California pedigree, Tizakitty was produced by a full sister to Horse of the Year Tiznow, multi-millionaire Budroyale and graded stakes winner Tizdubai.



BRITISH BOOKMAKERS RAISE NEARLY £100,000

According to figures released yesterday, British bookmakers and the Tote have combined to raise nearly £100,000 for the tsunami disaster relief effort, Racing Post reports. Ladbrokes shops, which number 1,900, have already collected £65,000, while Totesport customers have donated £12,000 and Coral has raised £21,000. "The hard work from our staff and the generosity of our customers has been outstanding," Ladbrokes PR Executive Mike Dillon told Racing Post. "There have been some wonderful examples of good will over the last five days. One Basingstoke punter donated £1,000 after backing Chelsea to beat Liverpool and a lady in Oldham donated £500 to name but two excellent contributions." Totesport has also pledged an additional £50,000 over what it collects from its customers. "The collection boxes will remain in our betting shops until further notice," added Totesport Chairman Peter Jones, while Simon Clare of Coral said, "We are doing another big push this weekend and we'll promote it for the rest of January, so we are hopeful of increasing that greatly." In addition, Betfair has announced that it will contribute £25,000 to the DEC Tsunami Earthquake Appeal and will donate its share of the revenues from a Jan. 10 cricket match to charity. Tote Direct, which accounts for more than 5,000 betting shops, has pledged its proceeds from this week's "totescoop 6" wager to the effort.

Bell will be handling a 2006 Epsom Derby-nominated colt by Montjeu (Ire) that sold for 520,000gns as the third-top lot at the Goffs September sale. "It's the first time Michael has had a horse with me," Bell told *Racing Post*. "It came through a friend of a friend who said he would buy a horse for us." He added, "[The colt] is bred along the same lines as [G1 Racing Post Trophy winner and 2005 Derby ante-post second favorite] Motivator (GB), by Montjeu out of a Gone West mare. He's an athletic, easy-moving sort and although it's very early days, he looks relatively precocious at this time--he's not a backwards sort."
