SHEIKH MAKTOUM DIES

Racing was left in mourning yesterday with the news that the emir of Dubai, Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid Al Maktoum died Wednesday in Australia, aged 62. One of the sport's pre-eminent owner/breeders is believed to have suffered a heart attack while visiting Australia's Gold Coast. "The United Arab Emirates has lost a historical leader who devoted his life to establishing the

United Arab Emirates and enhancing its structure and the welfare of its people," read a statement issued by the Dubai government. Sheikh Maktoum, the eldest brother of the ruling family of Dubai, was quick to establish his presence on the European racing scene in the 1980s and set up the Gainsborough breeding operation based in Newbury in England, County Meath and Tipperary in Ireland and Versailles in Kentucky. Gainsborough was responsible for such luminaries as Fantastic Light, Lammtarra, Hatoof, Royal Applause (GB), Lailani (GB) and Sayyedati (GB). Sheikh Maktoum, who was the vice-president and prime minister of the United Arab Emirates, later enjoyed major success with the exploits

of the top-class sprinter and sire Green Desert, Cadeaux Genereux (GB) and Shamardal. Among his trainers were Ed Dunlop and Sir Michael Stoute, while in France he enjoyed a lucrative partnership with Criquette Head-Maarek and in the United States with Neil Drysdale. In 1992, the Maktoum family formed Godolphin, the international racing operation which has already won 124 Group 1 races in 11 countries. "Sheikh Maktoum's death is a huge loss to Dubai, but also to the world of horse racing," said Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford. "He was at the very center of everything Godolphin has achieved. It was Sheikh Maktoum who decided that horses should be trained in Dubai to run in the top international races. Along with Sheikh Mohammed, he set up Godolpin. He was the one who chose the blue silks our horses carry and he was involved in all key decisions affecting the stable. Our thoughts are with the Maktoum family at this very sad time." Joe Mercer, his British racing manager for 19 years, was among the first to pay tribute yesterday.





"It's absolutely awful," he told *PA Sport*. "We had hundreds of great horses--Cadeaux Genereux, Royal Applause, Fantastic Light, Hatoof, Shadeed, Shareef Dancer--dozens and dozens of them. He really enjoyed his racing. He knew what was going on and was a very good man to work for. He was a good loser and a good winner. He had over 200 horses in training and a lot of yearlings still to come in." Others to pay respects yes-

> terday included Dunlop, who trains from Sheikh Maktoum's Gainsborough Stables in Newmarket. "It's very sad news, primarily for Sheikh Maktoum's family and all of Dubai," he commented. "He was a wonderful man to work for and most importantly, he was the one who gave me a chance. He will be sorely missed." Expressing the sentiments of many around racing, Coolmore's John Magnier said, "It was with great regret that I learned of Sheikh Maktoum Al Maktoum's untimely death. He is a great loss, not only to his family and nation, but also to world racing. A great lover of the Thoroughbred racehorse, he enjoyed much success over the years both as an owner and breeder under the Gainsborough

Stud banner and also through his involvement in the hugely successful Godolphin operation. He made a lasting and important contribution to racing, not least in Ireland, and it is the poorer for his passing." Born in 1943, Sheikh Maktoum was highly instrumental in helping his father Sheikh Rashid bin Saeed Al Maktoum to develop the emirate and its infrastructure. He worked in concert with his brothers Sheikh Mohammed and Sheikh Hamdan to support Sheikh Rashid through illness in his latter years and became ruler upon his father's death in November 1990. The Maktoum brothers' continued revolution of Dubai has seen it become one of the world's major business and sports locations, with the Dubai World Cup having grown as an international focus in the horse racing community. He will be buried at Umm Hurira graveyard in Bur Dubai tomorrow, and an official mourning period of 40 days has been declared. Government offices will be closed for seven days. The Crown Prince of Dubai, Sheikh Mohammed, has immediately succeeded his brother as the emirate's ruler.

"I had the privilege to work as a pedigree advisor to Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Gainsborough Farm for nine years, between 1988-1996. We got lucky right off the bat, by sending a little Lyphard mare, Cadeaux d'Amie, to Irish River (Fr) for her first mating. The result was Hatoof, a real star who won the English 1000 Guineas at three, the Dubai Champion S. at four (defeating stablemate Ezzoud--I seem to remember cashing a big exacta bet that day) and the Beverly D. at five. We had some other big successes at Gainsborough, including Sayyedati, for his good friend, Mohammed Obaida; Lammtarra; and Fantastic Light.

It was a privilege, too, to work with people like Michael Goodbody, Joe Mercer and Allen Kershaw. I also had the good fortune to visit Dubai several times during that era, and to marvel how Sheikh Rashid's sons, led by Sheikh Maktoum, have translated his and their vision into a world-class city. As is their tradition, I always found Sheikh Maktoum and his family to be the most gracious hosts, and fantastic people to work for. In spite of his extremely busy schedule, Sheikh Maktoum took an active interest in the matings and other pedigree issues, and was always interested to hear one's views and reasons about the issues that were raised. They asked me out once to get an American view of the prospective racing program when Nad Al Sheba was just getting going. At the time, the Pick Six was really going strong in America, and we somehow figured out a way where the racegoer was given a chance to pick all the evening's winners, and all those that did went into a draw for a new Mercedes, or the like

Even after I had finished working for him, I would always get a friendly wave and handshake from Sheikh Maktoum when we would see each other at the races. He was a tremendous sportsman and gentleman, not at all standoffish, and quick to smile and laugh. I'm grateful for being able to know and work with him, and I'll miss seeing him at the races this year."



WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

MORE ON THE MODERN THOROUGHBRED

In Tuesday's column, Andrew Caulfield referred to Bill Finley's "What's Wrong With the Modern Thoroughbred" *Writer's Up* piece. For what it's worth, I'd like to offer my take on the modern phenomenon of top-class horses making fewer starts than their counterparts of earlier times. I must admit, I'm far from convinced that the modern Thoroughbred has undergone a radical change which has significantly decreased its soundness and durability compared to, say, 50 years ago.

What I would suggest has changed is the intensity of competition. The very best horses may not be running faster than ever before (although some would suggest that they are relative to track surfaces), but what is happening, is that many, many more horses are running very nearly as fast as the best horses.

To put it another way, the gaps between the best horse, 10th-best horse, 100th-best horse--and so on-are now significantly smaller than they were 50 years ago. As a result, competition is far fiercer, especially with regard to demanding early fractions.

So, to take one of Bill Finley's examples, a modern horse attempting to emulate Citation, who romped in

the Jersey Derby between the Preakness and the Belmont (when there was a month between the two Classics), is likely to encounter a draining effort, rather than an exercise breeze. Who wants a tune-up for a championship race like Ghostzapper's GI Woodward S., when he ran into Saint Liam (who was then yet to win a stakes), and narrowly prevailed after fractions of :45 3/5,

1:08 3/5, and 1:33 1/5? Such efforts are only achieved with great physical cost, and while that race is an extreme example, the level of performance needed to win a major race is likely to be far higher now than in Citation's day. It makes sense for the modern trainer to carefully space a horse's races, aiming for, say, six really high level efforts in a year. In fact, we'd venture to say that, although they may not pay their way on that type of program, most claimers would also run better with similar handling.

A good analogy for the current state of events might be found in the world of middle-distance (and upwards) running. While the club runner will often turn out almost every weekend, the stars of the sport carefully ration their efforts, and assiduously avoid each other until the major championships.

Unfortunately, while the fans would like to see the best horses in action more frequently, and against each other, given the intensity of current competition, the wisest course for the trainer of a good horse is likely to be to follow the current trend, and carefully ration his charge's efforts.
