BULLISH ON THE MARKET

The forecast for the 2006 Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale that starts today is decidedly sunny.

Almost universally, consignors are predicting that the strong trade of 2005 will continue in the new year. "I think it is going to be a great year," said Reiley McDonald of Eaton Sales. "I think the strength of the two-year-old sales will surprise a lot of people, and I think January will be exactly like November, but without the top-end horses. You might not see the fireworks, but the horses will sell very well. I think we are in the middle of a really strong horse market. A lot of people had a

really great year in 2005, and there will be plenty of breeders out looking to buy a good broodmare. It's all about supply and demand...the demand is high and the supply of good horses is limited." Eaton, which sold 51 lots at the 2005 Keeneland January Sale, has cata-

loqued 140 this year. "I don't know the reason, but we are stronger this January than we have been for some time," Mc-Donald said. Craig Bandoroff of Denali Stud had a busy November Sale, turning over more than \$10 million in horseflesh. He is looking forward to the new season. "There is every reason to be optimistic," he said. "Nothing has really changed since last year.

JUST ENOUGH IN THE CUP

Silver Cup (Ire) (Almutawakel {GB}) charged down the stretch to just nip Ticker Tape (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}) at the wire to earn her first U.S. win in yesterday's GII San Gorgonio H. at Santa Anita. The dark bay filly culminated a four-race win streak with a victory in the G2 Italian 1000 Guineas in May, but stateside success had been elusive. Seventh in the July 3 GI American Oaks, Silver Cup was runner-up in an Oct. 21 Keeneland allowance in her first start for trainer Patrick Biancone and was third in the Nov. 12 GII Mrs. Revere S. before a troubled fourth-place effort in a Dec. 29 Santa Anita allowance. A lightly regarded 16-1 shot in the San Gorgonio, the four-year-old settled just off the pace, swept to the outside for the drive and finished with a powerful kick. "For a minute, [Kent Desormeaux] opened up and I thought I wouldn't catch [Ticker Tapel," admitted winning rider Victor Espinoza. The Mulholland Drive...

John and Martha Jane Mulholland are single-minded in their approach to selling horses, and that sense of purpose has been paying dividends. Mulholland Springs brought seven yearlings to the 2005 Keeneland September Sale and saw all seven find new homes. The

septet was headed by a daughter of Forestry that sold for \$975,000; overall, they grossed \$2,580,000 for an average of \$368,571, making the Mulhollands the leading consignors by average at the sale (with at least two sold). "We set very low reserves--our reserves are often less than 50 percent of what the horses sell for," Martha Jane Mulholland explained. "If buyers ask, we tell them what the reserve is, we'll show them the ticket. We

are not here to get the horses appraised. We are commercial breeders and we have to make a living. We bring them here to sell and price them reasonably and we hope that the market likes what we have to offer." The Mulholland Springs horses have been very well received to date. The six yearlings they sent through the ring at the 2003 Keeneland September Sale brought a total of \$3,790,000, an average of \$631,666. They included a Saint Ballado filly that was purchased for \$1.4 million and another by Forestry, who won a Gulstream allowance yesterday, that attracted a final bid of \$1 million. The Mulhollands had just one consigned to Keeneland November 2005, a Deputy Minister mare in foal to Speightstown, but she made their trip worthwhile, bringing \$700,000. They have two at January, and both were rated worthy of Book 1. "The first, She's a Rich Girl (Affirmed), is a well-made, attractive mare," Martha Jane Mulholland remarked.

"She is a full sister to The Tin Man, and you don't have too many opportunities to purchase full sisters to Grade I winners. It's a nice family. The second, Confiding Winner (Confide), is very beautiful and impressive--she is really kind of overpowering physically. I like that she won stakes as a two-year-old and as a three-year-old, and her two-year-old half-sister (Summer Girlfriend, by Forest Camp) won two out of three last year. We are hoping for big things from her. She also has a sister that produced Flamenco (Dance Master), who was a stakes winner at two and finished second in the GII Sanford S. and third in the GI Hopeful S. It's obviously a family that gets very precocious horses." The Mulhollands have been in the horse business since the 1970s, switching from Quarter Horses to Thoroughbreds in the mid-'80s. They purchased their 83-acre Lexington farm in 2001, and now maintain a broodmare band that numbers about 15. If their string of success continues, that number will be down to 13 by Tuesday. Martha Jane Mulholland sees no reason to be pessimistic. "I think it will be a great January sale," she said. "A lot of breeders couldn't fill their orders in November. January mares may not have as exciting pedigrees or race records, but there are some awfully good buys that come out of the sale."

Solvig Heads Smith Dispersal...

Owner and breeder Bentley Smith has known a good horse or two during his long and profitable career in the business. The Minnesota native, who operated King Koin, a company which sold laundry equipment, was at the head of affairs for the successful racing stable of the late Frances Genter for about 30 years and rejoiced in Unbridled's Kentucky Derby and Breeders' Cup Classic victories and Smile win in the 1986 Breeders' Cup Sprint. Smith purchased Unbridled for just \$70,000 as a weanling from the Tartan Farm dispersal in 1987. He has also maintained a small racing and broodmare operation of his own over the years and it wasn't uncommon to see a Smith-consigned weanling or yearling in a Keeneland catalogue. In fact, at the 1998 July sale, Smith, who was once married to one of Mrs. Genter's daughters, consigned a weanling daughter of Caerleon, but he ultimately bought the filly back for \$135,000. The "no-sale" sign turned out to be a blessing in disguise as the mare, which he named Solvig, proved a resilient and durable multiple graded stakes winner of seven races and \$800,000. But Smith has made the decision to gradually disperse his Thoroughbred holdings and the crown jewel of the draft is sure to be the daughter of Incha (GB) (Nashwan), who is being consigned by Gainesway as hip 400. "She was foaled and raised at Gainesway," said the farm's Director of Sales Michael Hernon. "She's a very special mare by one of the world's leading broodmare sires. She's from a strong and deep family and she's the kind of mare who will get someone off to a good start. She'll be an excellent addition to any broodmare band." Hernon has a world of respect for Smith. "He's been a long and loyal client of the farm and he's a real gentleman," he commented. "But he's reached the point where he's decided to reduce his numbers so this is the breeding stock portion of that." Hernon added that Smith still has a handful of horses in training, including Solvig's half sister Ambling (Chester House), third in a Gulfstream turf maiden this past Saturday. With a 2004 colt by War Chant now training in Florida, and, according to Hernon, a "lovely, leggy" filly by Giant's Causeway last year, Solvig sells on a Mar. 23 cover to Smarty Jones.

High Hopes for Fulton Fillies...

Stan Fulton has left his mark in Central Kentucky auction houses over the past several years, spending freely on well-bred yearlings and has built a formidable racing operation which spans from coast-to-coast. His bright green silks have been carried by such horses as St. Averil, Fire Slam, Roll Hennessy Roll, Saint Buddy, A.P. Warrior and Fleet Indian, the last of which is part of a Fulton consignment being handled by Bruce Gibbs' Greenfield Farm at Keeneland today and tomorrow. Consigned as hip 198, the daughter of Indian Charlie is the recipient of a pair of timely catalogue updates, as she took the Nov. 27 Montauk H. to earn her first black-type and tacked on a Philadelphia Park allowance victory Dec. 30. The New York-bred sells as a racing or broodmare prospect and Gibbs believes either role suits the five-year-old. "She's obviously still got some talent seeing she won just eight days ago," he offered. "But she's a stakes winner now and her value as a broodmare is high right now, too." To date, Fleet Indian has seven wins from her 12 starts and earnings of \$230,793. Also part of the draft is hip 64, Unbridled Danz (Unbridled's Song). Campaigned exclusively on the turf, the dark bay won her first three starts, including the Aug. 6 Audubon Oaks, but was third in the Hatoof S. at Arlington Aug. 27 and sells as a broodmare prospect. "She had an injury which would be long-term and it would be questionable whether she could return, so he decided to sell her as well," Gibbs added. "She's a very special physical. She's very well balanced and a very smooth filly. I think she's pretty correct--one of the best Unbridled's Songs I've seen in a long time." Gibbs has been associated with Fulton for about four years, laying up the yearlings acquired by Fulton at auction in addition helping to sell the broodmare prospects off the track.


From Rags, to Riches, to More Riches?...

Things have sort of come full circle for 12-year-old Elbaaha (GB) (Arazi), who will sell Tuesday afternoon at Keeneland as hip 571. On the board seven times in a mostly undistinguished career at the races, the chestnut mare was bred in 2000 to Red Ransom and was entered carrying that foal for the 2001 January Sale, where she was knocked down for a modest \$60,000 to the bid of BBA (Italia). The resulting foal, who would come to be known as Electrocutionist, was sent to Italy and blossomed as a three-year-old, winning three of his four starts, his only defeat coming at the hands of Shirocco (Ger) in the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club. The chestnut, raced by Earle Mack, was sent overseas in 2005 and, proving his Italian form was no fluke, went on to defeat the world-class Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn) in a thrilling renewal of the G1 Juddmonte International S. at York in August. Sent to North America late last season, he was sent off the 5-2 favorite in the GI Canadian International S. at Woodbine, but could not guite get the job done, finishing fourth before being placed third. Electrocutionist has since been purchased privately by Sheikh Mohammed and will race in the Godolphin blue in 2006. With that notoriety in hand, it would be no surprise should Elbaaha light up the Keeneland tote board tomorrow, but there's added appeal. The daughter of French Group 3 winner Gesedeh (Ire) (Ela-Mana-Mou (Ire)), consigned to the sale by David C. Parrish's Indian Creek agency, is the lone offering in the sale carrying a foal by Montjeu (Ire), already the sire of such stars as G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Hurricane Run (Ire) and Motivator (GB), to name but a few. Indian Creek's Shack Parrish is high on the chances of the mare. "She's very nice, walks very well and is a big, scopey mare," he explained. "She got better looking when Electrocutionist started winning Group 1s, but she's awfully nice on her own. She's in foal to Montjeu and we're just really lucky to have her. On paper, she's certainly one of the better mares and she's young enough still." Elbaaha is a half sister to the dams of champion Royal Du-Bai and Group 1 winner Robertico. Her second dam is responsible for champions Ardross and Larrocha (Ire), as well as the granddam of Scorpion (Ire), a French Group 1 winner also by Montjeu.

Hunter Valley an Outfit on the Rise...

Adrian Regan and Fergus Galvin's Hunter Valley Farm may be one of the newer kids on the block, but don't let that fool you. The team, which met in the early 1990s at the National Stud program, have been in Central Kentucky for many years, and founded the farm last July with the assistance of John Wade and Tony Hegarty, two Chicago-based investors in the operation. After a solid September yearling consignment, which saw Hunter Valley sell a half-dozen six-figure youngsters, things got even better during the November Breeding Stock sale, when no fewer than 16 of their consignees made in excess of \$100,000. "We've been very happy with our sales results so far," said Galvin, whose previous experience includes five years as a farm manager at Ashford Stud and four years prior to that as the manager of Prince Fahd Salman's Newgate Stud. "We had a fantastic November and hope to do the same here." Based on 200 acres of land in Versailles, Regan says that Hunter Valley is here to stay. "We'll be at all the major sales," he stated. "We've got a very good clientele--they've been very supportive of us. They gave us a good start. Most of the people who sold with us in November have something with us in January and February. Our long-term goal is to build up a good sales consignment and that people get to know us. That is our aim--to produce good horses--and it's started off well." Cont. p5

Added Galvin, "We like to think we do a good job for our clients, be it at the high end or the low end. We treat all our customers the same and we like to think we do an equal job for everyone." Despite not having a presence at last year's January sale, both Regan and Galvin had a hand in one of the stars of the show. Stephen Hillen, a longtime friend of Galvin, had privately purchased Native Roots (Ire), the dam of reigning Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Wilko, earlier in the summer. Galvin pointed Hillen in the direction of Regan, who at the time was working for Crescent Hill Farm. The rest, as they say, is history. At the drop of the hammer, the \$1.1-million price tag represented a profitable transaction for all. Hunter Valley has 32 horses consigned to the January sale.

"She is carrying a foal by Mr. Greeley, who is by Gone West, and Flamenco's sire, Dance Master is by Gone West, so we think the cross will be very well-received," said Martha Jane Mulholland. The chestnut mare was purchased for \$100,000 at the 2004 KEEJAN sale.

Hip 214, Givememore (Brz), 5, Special Nash (Ire)-Super Mensity (Brz), by Stouci (GB)

Consigned by Denali Stud (Craig & Holly Bandoroff), Agent X

The champion two-year-old filly in her native Brazil with a pair of group wins to her credit, she also won a stakes at Calder in her U.S. bow and was fourth, beaten just a half-length, in the De La Rose S. at Saratoga this August. The five-year-old sells as a racing or broodmare prospect. "If you are a champion anywhere, you have to be able to run," Craig Bandoroff said. "She is a big pretty mare and, lots of times, the South American breeders want to take those mares back home. Someone might be looking to get her started in her broodmare career."

She is in foal to Smarty Jones, who was the top freshman covering sire by median at the 2005 sales; the 16 mares sold in foal to the champion brought a median price of \$365,000.
