### MAKING MISCHIEF

Frank Stronach was quiet during the first two days of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington, but got into the mix on Day 3. Stronach, who was the high bidder on just two lots in Book 1,



bought five mares at Keeneland yesterday, including session topper **Northern Mischief** (Yankee Victor). Consigned by Lakland LLC, agent, the four-year-old broodmare prospect attracted a final bid of \$340,000. A half-sister to champion and MGISW Gourmet Girl (Cee's Tizzy), she was third in the GI Hollywood Starlet S. at two and has earned \$123,518 while under the tutelage of trainer Ron McAnally in Southern California. The dark bay was sold as a racing or

broodmare prospect, but will be retired

and head to the Adena Springs broodmare band. "I could possibly send her to Ghostzapper," Stronach said. "I am always looking for this kind of mare, but we don't need to buy mares to fill his book. He is pretty popular. He's going to have a full book." Bred by Sequel 2000, Northern Mischief was a \$145,000 KEESEP yearling and a \$160,000 BESMAR juvenile. Lewis Lakin bought her dam, GSP Rhondaling (GB) (Welsh Pageant {Fr}), for \$150,000 at the 2000 KEENOV sale and sent her first two foals through the ring as yearlings, but ended up buying Northern Mischief back at Barretts. "She was a good racehorse," Lakin commented. "Ron McAnally thought a lot of her and I wish the Adena people all the best with her. She probably has a lot of racing left in her, but either way, her bloodlines are great and you can't go wrong with something like that."

### Stronach Strikes Again...

Stronach also took home the second-highest priced mare at Keeneland Wednesday and the family of hip 891 is one that the Austrian businessman knows a little something about. Stronach went to \$220,000 for a weanling son of A.P. Indy from Santa Catalina (Cure the Blues) at the 1995 Keeneland November sale. Later named Golden Missile, the chestnut would go on to win the 2000 GI Pimlico Special, was third in the 1999 GI Breeders' Cup Classic and earned nearly \$2.2 million. Yesterday at Keeneland, Stronach paid \$235,000 for Catalindy, a daughter of A.P. Indy out of Santa Catalina's daughter Catalina Court (Forty Niner). "There were some sentimental reasons for buying her, but she was a pretty mare," Stronach commented. "She's nicely conformed and comes from a nice family," he added. Stronach indicated that Catalindy could also be bred to Ghostzapper at Adena Springs Kentucky this spring.

### Ryan's Hope...

The top-selling yearling at Day 3 of the Keeneland January Sale was hip 944, a son of Mr. Greeley out of Fellwaati (Alydar). Consigned by Bruce Kline, Agent II, he was purchased by Irishman Jim Ryan of Milltown Stud for \$200,000. A half-brother to GSP My Alibi (Sheikh Albadou {GB}), the chestnut is from the family of champion and successful sire Polish Precedent (GB). "He has quality, he's a lovely walker and he has a good pedigree," Ryan said of the May foal. "He's a real nice horse by a real good sire." The price came as no surprise to Ryan. "He's a colt that was always going to make money," he said. "You have to pay to get a colt like that." As for future plans, he added, "I might bring him back to Ireland, or I might leave him here." Should the chestnut colt head across the Atlantic, he will be trained by either Jeremy Noseda and Jim Bolger. If he stays in the States, he will go to fellow Irishman David Hanley. Hanley bred 2002 champion turf mare Golden Apples (Ire) and trained her at the start of her racing career. He is partners with Ben Walden Jr., Pat Madden and Brad Kelley in Hurricane Hall, and is the private trainer for the Georgetown, Kentucky, operation. Kline shared ownership of the colt with Diane Shashura, who acquired the mare for \$8,500 at the 2001 Keeneland November sale. Kline, who managed Mr. Greeley when he was standing at Spendthrift Farm, provided the season and the rest is history. "That was a great sale," he commented. "He just had a big, lovely walk to him and he had a lot of presence for a May foal and was very mature for his age. Right now people are most interested in how horses look more so than they do pedigree. If you have an outstanding-looking individual, they're going to bring good money." Though Mr. Greeley has changed addresses since, Kline still has a world of respect for him. "Mr. Greeley gets you a good racehorse and gets you a good sales horse," Kline added. Fellwaati is also the dam of a colt by High Yield which made \$40,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale.

## Arbitrate a Highlight of Wednesday Session...

He was forced to spend \$10,000 more than he had budgeted, but Dr. Oscar Benavides, bidding on behalf of Oak Stable (Mexico), went to \$260,000 for Arbitrate (Deputy Minister). Consigned by Taylor Made on behalf of Bob and Beverly Lewis, the six-year-old is the son of champion Serena's Song, who won no fewer than 11 Grade I races and beat the boys in the GI Haskell Invitational H. and GII Jim Beam S. The 14-year-old mare has produced Group 1 winner Sophisticat (Storm Cat), who sold for \$3.4 million as a KEEJUL yearling; Grade II winner Grand Reward (Storm Cat); and stakes winner Serena's Tune (Mr. Prospector), a \$1 million KEEJUL yearling. Her four-year-old Harlington (Unbridled) brought \$2.8 million as a KEESEP yearling, and a twoyear-old full brother to Sophisticat and Grand Reward sold for \$3.5 million at the 2005 KEESEP sale. "He has an obviously strong pedigree," Benavides commented. "His bloodlines are very popular and he's a very nicelooking horse." Catalogued as a racing or stallion prospect and reserved at \$124,000, Arbitrate will first be sent to Benavides' Montesacro Farm before a decision is made on his immediate future. He will ultimately be sent overseas. Bred and raced by the Lewises and trained by D. Wayne Lukas, Arbitrate has won five of his 33 career starts and earned \$195,390. He was also the runner-up in the Dr. Fager S. at Arlington in 2004. The eye-catching chestnut posted a five-length victory in his latest appearance, an optional claimer at Churchill Downs Nov. 24.

### Gross Out of the Park...

With just three sessions in the book, the Keeneland January Sale has already eclipsed the total gross of last year's six-day sale. The 2005 renewal saw 1361 lots make \$53,418,000 and average \$39,249. Thus far in 2006, 743 horses have sold for \$56,283,300, an average of \$75,751.

## The Sky's the Limit...

Sky Mesa (Pulpit--Caress, by Storm Cat) is off to a quick start in the sales ring. The Three Chimneys stallion, whose first crop hit the ground in 2005, had eight weanlings sell for an average of \$163,750 and a median of \$122,500 last year. He was a success during the first book of Keeneland January as well, with three yearlings all selling for more than \$100,000. Leading the group was hip 523, a colt consigned by Knockgriffin Farm, Agent VI, that was purchased for \$180,000 by Massy/Jones. "People are really loving him," Dan Rosenberg, president of Three Chimneys, said of the six-year-old. "They love the stallion physically. He's really stamping his foals. They look fantastic with tons of substance and tons of class. We're very excited about him." Raced by John Oxley, Sky Mesa was undefeated in three starts at two, winning the GI Hopeful S. and GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity, but was injured on the eve of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, for which he would have been favored. He went on to be second in the GI Haskell Invitational H. and third in the GII Dwyer S. at three and retired to Three Chimneys in 2004 with earnings of \$633,076. He is booked full for 2006 and stands for a fee of \$30,000.

### Graded-Stakes Fillies Featured on Day Four...

There are but two offerings in today's fourth day of trade at Keeneland that achieved black-type in graded events and they could lead the day's proceedings. Consigned by Kitty Taylor's Warrendale Sales, hip 1288, Didycheatamandhowe (Stephen Got Even) was one of the first stakes performers from her sire's first crop, following a debut victory with a narrow defeat when second in the GII Mazarine Breeders' Cup S. at Woodbine. Offered as a broodmare prospect, the four-yearold posted a record of 9-2-1-1 and banked \$123,703. Jim FitzGerald's Knockgriffin Farm consigns hip 1303, Expect An Angel (Valid Expectations), to today's session. A nine-time winner of \$236,799, the six-year-old posted the most important victory of her career in the GIII Chaposa Springs H. at Calder in December 2004. The Florida-bred filly is also catalogued as a broodmare prospect.

# FROM THE DESK OF... Bill Oppenheim



### YOUTH WORSHIPPERS

It's been a rule of thumb for years that the yearling sales were better indicators of the market than the mixed sales, because the composition of the catalogues was more consistent over the yearling sales, and it used to make a big difference what was catalogued in the mixed sales. Perhaps not so much anymore, if my 'best available' hypothesis proves accurate. The money is there, and buyers are going to spend it on the 'best available.' The results of the 12 major 2005 sales which we covered on Dec. 7 (p. 5) bore this out: 7,287 yearlings in nine sales were up 14 percent in gross and 11 percent in average from corresponding 2004 sales; 4,862 horses sold in the three mixed sales were up 15 percent in gross and 11 percent in average. Not much difference.

It's also possibly true that there's very little difference anymore between top pedigrees available in the market, and not-so-top pedigrees; so performance and conformation become Crown Prince and King in the selection process. You can guarantee that a good-looking filly or mare who could run will bring top dollar these days, just about irrespective of pedigree. There have been some pretty big trend lines changing in this business since 1995. Above all, the rise of three-figure stallion books now appears to have had a huge impact on the market, in at least two ways: successful sires now have six percent stakes winners, and 10 percent stakes horses, instead of 10 percent and 18 percent, respectively; and it is definitely fueling the current demand for broodmares. As the number of mares bred to commercial stallions has increased, the class level of stallions' books drops, but the demand for anything remotely credible to fill the book grows.

The imperative to fill the books, as well as the intention to demonstrate commitment to their stallions, was no doubt a factor in the decision of Stonewall Farm principals, in various partnerships and entities, to buy an estimated 22 mares in Book 1, for a total outlay of just under \$3.6 million. There were also at least three mares bought for Rock Hard Ten by part-owners, and three for Afleet Alex. Good on them, too: the competition for mares--especially credible mares--is intense, and it does make a difference to breeders to see that the people behind the stallion are supporting him.

The fact that six of the 12 fillies or mares to bring \$500,000-plus in Book 1 were, in fact, broodmare prospects tells us something, too: no history yet, therefore no failures--a clean slate. There were a couple of striking things about the six that were in foal: three of the six were by Gone West or two of his first-year male line descendants: Speightstown (son) and Smarty Jones (grandson). Other than Gone West, the nextoldest sire a \$500,000-plus mare sold in foal to was Distorted Humor, whose first foals have just turned six, and who was North America's number two sire in 2005. Like Speightstown (and 2005 Leading Freshman Sire Tiznow), Distorted Humor stands at WinStar; they've got to be pretty pleased with the way their resident sires are performing. The other two covering sires of Book 1 mares who brought \$500,000-plus were Giant's Causeway (world's leading second-crop sire) and Songandaprayer, fourth-ranked Freshman Sire in North America in 2005). Youth is definitely being served, both on the sire and broodmare sides of the pedigree.

Sales results last year--the 12 'majors' grossed a record \$1.177-billion--suggested the Thoroughbred breeding (as opposed to racing) sector has stepped up a notch as an investment opportunity. Prices have been driven upward by record demand, and one of the reasons is that you really can make money selling (as opposed to racing) Thoroughbreds. Why else are there so many rich new players in the breeding sector, and so few in racing? It's great for the breeding sector--one wag suggested that 'as of now, all broodmares ever bought before the beginning of the 2005 breeding season are good value'--but breeders maybe need to be reinvesting more in racing themselves.

If fewer and fewer people race horses, the strength of the breeders' market is at risk. Now that we have a new, streamlined Breeders' Cup board, perhaps this is an item they should take a look at. Yes, the big-day purses need to be increased; but equally vital is to do something to help increase purses nationwide, to make owning horses more financially attractive. John Gaines saw, more than 20 years ago, that breeders need to be prepared to support their ultimate market. Now, more than ever, I think the fabulous results of these breeding stock sales show that breeders would be well advised, right now, to redouble their efforts to make racing more attractive. Racehorse owners ultimately only get half their money back; it's not good enough, and the fact that this market is so successful focuses the light on that problem. Hopefully, the new board will be prepared to be bold and creative. Maybe it's time to look at a \$1,000 foal nomination fee (I totally agree with the new stallion fee idea), and enhancing the funding of a nationwide racing program leading up to the Breeders' Cup. Time to stop squabbling among ourselves, too, and just get it done.


All these things combine to explain why it may or may not be that significant whether this January Sale breaks all known records for Keeneland January sales. In 1988, including the huge Nelson Bunker Hunt dispersal, the January Sale grossed \$66,592,000, and averaged \$50,182. But the Bunker Hunt dispersal grossed \$46,912,800, while the rest of the sale grossed just under \$20 million. Mixed sales these days don't include many dispersals, and represent a much broader market. The contemporary top was in 2000, when Keeneland January grossed \$60,937,500, and averaged \$49,183; those will be more relevant figures to compare this year's to. The market was peaking then, just as the dot-com crash was happening, and the breeding sector's 2005 returns suggest that the world's disposable income has now at least returned to precrash levels. The U.S. Treasury Secretary just predicted 3.5-percent growth in the American economy this year. Horse sale results also suggest the world economy is strong right now. 

WHIFFLING DIES Whiffling (Wavering Monarch--Queen's Gambit, by Bold Ruler), the dam of ill-fated champion Prairie Bayou (Little Missouri), was euthanized due to the infirmities of old age in December, according to The Blood-Horse. The 20-year-old, in foal to Dixie Union at the time, had resided at the de Kwiatkowski family's Calumet Farm near Lexington, Kentucky. A \$120,000 purchase at Keeneland September by Loblolly Stables, the bay won once in those yellow and brown colors before being bred to Little Missouri in her first breeding season. The resulting foal was Prairie Bayou, who won the GII Jim Beam S. and the GII Blue Grass S. before finishing second as the favorite in the 1993 GI Kentucky Derby. He rebounded to take the GI Preakness S., but broke down badly during the GI Belmont S. and was euthanized. The chestnut gelding was posthumously honored with an Eclipse Award as champion three-year-old male. In 1992, Whiffling produced the Demons Begone colt Flitch, who became a multiple graded stakes winner on the grass and bankrolled \$628,796. She was part of Loblolly's dispersal at Keeneland November in 1994 and was sold for \$1.05 million to Calumet while in foal to Danzig. She became a successful commercial producer for Calumet, with her 1996 colt by Seeking the Gold, Crunk, selling for \$725,000 at Keeneland July; Daring Bid, an Unbridled colt, reaching \$1.45 million at the same sale in 1999; and her A.P. Indy filly Walkes Spring attaining \$1.4 million at Keeneland July in 2000. Whiffling produced a filly by Orientate in 2004 and foaled a Vindication colt last spring.



### BOMBER BILL KEEPS GOING AND GOING...

Was it Tesio who said, "If there is an exception to the rule, there is no rule"?

In the midst of a debate about the soundness or otherwise of the modern Thoroughbred there is an Australian tale of remarkable longevity.

Charismatic 10-year-old Bomber Bill keeps turning up to the track, winning his 17th graded race on Saturday in the A\$100,000 G3 Rubiton S. at Sandown in Melbourne at his 87th start.

"From the time he jumped it was like I was on a four-year-old that was flying," remarked jockey Vlad Duric. "At the 300m I thought I was going to win the race, but he was going to get beaten five times up the straight. He just sticks his head out and tries so hard. He has so much character."

Bomber Bill has won a stakes race every year since 1998, when he won the Perth S. as a two-year-old. Without fanfare, he has amassed three Group 1 trophies, two Group 2 trophies, seven Group 3 trophies and five Listed races. Bomber Bill has 23 wins and earnings of A\$1,869,83--a grand return on his A\$31,000 yearling purchase price.

Former trainer Robert Smerdon was considering retirement for Bomber Bill when stable foreman Pat Cannon recommended that Maureen Harry, who is his aunt, could keep the grand old athlete in sprightly shape by training him on the beach at Warrnambool on Victoria's south coast.

Bomber Bill took to the beach life with aplomb, spending much of his time roaming in a paddock with a black Shetland called Radish, and Harry works him in the sand along the beach before taking him on leisurely wading and swimming expeditions.

It suited him so well, in fact, that Bomber Bill gave Harry her first city win when he captured the Listed Kevin Heffernan S. on Nov. 12.

"I just let him stride along the beach and wade up to his chest in water," said Harry. "He has just thrived down there."

Harry will now target the G2 Norman Carlyon S. (1200 meters) at Moonee Valley on Jan. 25 with the evergreen sprinter.

"He's a champion in my book," Harry said.
