Trainer Gai Waterhouse opened the bidding at A\$1 million, but Wadham's Dale Sutton answered her A\$1.2-million salvo with the final bid. "He

is by Sadler's Wells out of a Group 1-winning mare and he is well put together--hopefully he can go to stud later on," Sutton said of the colt, who will be syndicated. "He will eventually go to Wadham in Victoria, but we won't be rushing him. We liked him, had our vet check him thoroughly and decided to go for him." Sold as Lot 177, the bay is the first foal from G1 Golden Slipper S. winner Ha Ha, who went on to win the G1 Flight S. at three. The yearling was consigned by Strawberry Hill Stud. "He was a lovely colt and he deserved his price, in my opinion," Strawberry Hill's John Singleton said.

STONEWALL STILL AT IT

Richard and Audrey Haisfield's Stonewall Farm continued their shopping spree at the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale yesterday, going to a sessiontopping \$440,000 to acquire hip 1303, the six-year-old Expect An Angel (Valid Expectations). Consigned to the sale by Jim FitzGerald's Knockgriffin Farm Inc., agent, the bay, offered as a broodmare prospect, won the 2004 running of the GIII Chaposa Springs H. at Calder. Central Kentucky bloodstock agent Peter Bradley purchased the mare privately last spring on behalf of a partnership and transferred her to Woodbine, where she added a victory and an additional \$60,000 in earnings. She was retired with nine wins from 24 career starts and a bankroll of \$236,799. "As this sale has shown, if you have a young and pretty mare with quality, you'll get all the money that she'll bring," said Bradley, who managed the partnership. "She was as pretty as any mare in the sale." Apparently, the Stonewall operation concurred. "I just thought she was an awesome physical to go along with her race record," commented Stonewall's Bert Welker. "That's basically what we're looking for." Welker indicated that the mare should prove easy to breed in house. "That kind of pedigree can go with almost all of our stallions," Welker continued, adding that Expect An Angel is likely to visit either Medaglia d'Oro or Value Plus. In addition to this week's purchases, the Stonewall broodmare band includes GISW Nonsuch Bay (Mr. Greeley), Italian Group 3 winner Miss Nashwan (Ire) (Nashwan), and GSP Cat Alert (Tabasco Cat) and Hermione's Magic (Forest Wildcat). Cups King Strikes Early...

Ten-time Melbourne Cup winning trainer Bart Cummings struck early when he secured a colt by Redoute's Choice (Aus) for A\$900,000, outstaying

underbidders which included Darley. Selling as Lot 41, the bay is out of the Luskin Star (Aus) mare Click (Aus), a half sister to Epsom H. winner Nick's Joy (Aus). He was consigned by Newhaven Park Stud. "We valued him between A\$800,000 and A\$1,000,000, so we were quite happy," Cummings said.

"We liked his pedigree and conformation, and his X-rays were perfect so we gave it a shot and all the boys--Wilf Mula, Michael O'Keefe and Len Smith--will join a syndicate." Long-time owner and Malaysian businessman Dato Tan Chin Nam will also have a share in the colt. Newhaven Park Stud's John Kelly pointed out that the colt was bred on the same cross as 2005 G1 Golden Slipper winner Stratum (Aus). "We were hoping he would sell well and, from the day he was born, he has always been a very nice colt," Kelly commented. "We were pleasantly surprised. I said to Bart, 'he looks like the sort of horse you will be back here with next year' [for the Magic Millions two-year-old race]."

Perry Secures Rock of Gibraltar Colt...

Paul Perry was prominent among a noticeably trainer-driven buying contingent, going to A\$400,000 to secure Lot 107, a Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) colt from the Sir Tristram mare Emulate (NZ) offered by Coolmore Stud. The colt is a half-brother to G1 New Zealand Oaks winner Tapildo (NZ). "We think Paul Perry is the best judge in the country and for him to buy the colt enhances what we think of the stallion and his progeny," said Coolmore's Peter O'Brien. "Rock of Gibraltar is a seven-time Group 1-winning son of Danehill and, being by Danehill, he raced like an Australian horse. He backed up every couple of weeks, he was tough, he had legs of iron and he retired sound. He is a great cross with Australian mares and they are lovely quality animals, particularly good movers, like Danehill himself." Perry added that he was very impressed with the first crop of Rock of Gilbraltar. "I really like them, he was a freakish racehorse himself and his yearlings have a lot of presence," Perry said. "I really reckon he will make it as a stallion."

Domestic Buyers Lead the Way...

Graeme Rogerson, who was the leading buyer in Australia in 2005 when he spent A\$15.7 million on 105 yearlings, outdid an active international bench to top the standings at the Magic Millions opener. Rogerson spent A\$1,362,500 on nine lots, going to A\$320,000 to secure Lot 97, a colt from the first Australian crop by Elusive Quality. Trainer Gai Waterhouse gave A\$1,100,000 for five horses, including Lot 55, a Dehere filly from the immediate family of Golden Slipper winner and producer Bint Marscay (Aus) that brought A\$320,000. The international buyers were led by Adrian Nicoll of BBA Ireland, whose previous MM purchases include G1 Australian Oaks winner Serenade Rose (NZ) (Stravinsky). He went away with Lot 84, yet another Stravinsky filly, for A\$475,000. "Hopefully we have bought another Serenade Rose," he said.



Storm Cat Filly Also Joins the Ranks...

The buyer of the session topper, Stonewall also went to \$185,000 for hip 1152, the five-year-old Stormy Season (Storm Cat). Consigned by Eaton Sales, acting as agent for Overbrook Farm, the dark bay was produced by Grade III winner Timely Broad (Broad Brush) and was sold carrying her first foal by Overbrook stallion Cape Canaveral. Overbrook purchased Timely Broad for \$450,000 at the 1999 Keeneland November Sale following a racing career that saw her earn \$342,351 and put her in foal to Storm Cat the following year. After dropping Stormy Season in 2001, she produced another Storm Cat filly the next year followed by a pair of Seeking the Gold fillies. Overbrook returned Timely Broad to Keeneland November in 2004 and, consigned by Eaton Sales, the mare was sold for \$170,000 in foal to champion sprinter Aldebaran. She subsequently gave birth to a filly by the Darby Dan stallion and is likely to be bred in 2006 to Medaglia d'Oro.

All That Glitters...

Gold Regent (Mr. Prospector--Regent's Walk, by Vice Regent), a three-parts younger brother to Marquetry, always looked the part of a good horse. But, purchased by Bob and Beverly Lewis for \$500,000 at the 1997 Keeneland July Sale, he was unplaced in five starts on the West Coast. He broke his maiden at Turfway Park, but was retired after making just one more start. Owned now by Clarence Scharbauer Jr. and standing at Valor Farm in Pilot Point, Texas, for a stud fee of \$2,500, the 10-year-old is the sire of hip 1306, the topselling yearling during yesterday's session. Consigned by Four Star Sales on behalf of Burnett Ranches and Johnny T.L. Jones Jr., the Texas-bred daughter of Expressive Dance (Riva Ridge) was knocked down for \$80,000 to the bid of Mark Glyer. "The people were definitely more interested in the damside," Four Star Sales' Kerry Cauthen said. "They were certainly buying her as more of a long-term broodmare prospect." The gray, a mature-looking May foal, is a half-sister to GISW Chief Honcho and to the dams of GSW American Chance and MSW Queen's Park. Cauthen believed the winning bidder has bought himself a runner. "She's a very typey filly that looks very fast," he said. "Out of that mare, she should be very fast. Whatever she does, it just looks like she wants to get there fast."

The Daddy's Dam to WinStar...

With A Princess (With Approval), the dam of last year's GII Super Derby S. winner The Daddy (Valid Expectations), was hammered down for a final bid of \$100,000 to Grant Troutt, agent for WinStar Farm, yesterday afternoon. Catalogued as hip 1204, the 14year-old mare, also the dam of the stakes-placed With a City (City Zip), was sold in foal to Lightnin N Thunder on a Mar. 6 cover. WinStar bred and raced the stallion, a son of GI Spinaway S. winner Things Change (Stalwart), who stands at Bridlewood Farm in Florida as the shared property of that stud and WinStar. The fiveyear-old stallion's racing career was cut short by an injury suffered in the 2003 Cradle S. A full seven lengths clear of the field with a furlong to race, he was caught late and finished second. "He had a tremendous amount of talent and he was a very good-looking horse," WinStar President Doug Cauthen commented. "We are supporting him very hard and well and so is Bridlewood. We feel that he's a horse that deserves that level of support." Among the mares bred to Lightnin N Thunder in his first year at stud in 2004 include GI Spinaway S. winner Oath; Sugar's Image (Valid Appeal), the dam of Halo's Image; and Grade III winner Millie's Quest (Quest For Fame {GB}). With A Princess was consigned by Eaton Sales as agent for Carl Bowling's Straightaway Farm, who purchased the mare for \$13,500 at the 2003 Keeneland January Sale.

Sale on Record Pace...

With three days of trade remaining, the January sale has already become the second-highest grossing in its history. The existing record gross of \$66,694,900 was achieved in 1988, but the Nelson Bunker Hunt dispersal accounted for nearly \$47 million of that amount. "The sale continues to roll on very successfully," Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell said. "There remains a tremendous hunger for a horse right now. There is a lot of discretionary income out there and people are willing to spend." Russell stressed that the participation of fledgling stallion stations as well as owners buying mares for their newly retired stallions has contributed to the strength of the market.


