3 Gallo Del Bar (Chi) Barkerville 10-1

Is by sire of late developers Barkerville (note the TGI section of his sire profile), and this horse is pretty typical. His very good effort two back was concealed by going five wide on the second turn, and he had excuses in his two recent bad ones--one was on dirt, the other in the bog on the inside of the grass course at Keeneland. Shipping from the colder north to Louisiana is tough, but this horse ran well doing it last year, and has been here long enough to have a published work. Live longshot.

4 Sampson's Son Lil's Lad 8-1

Developed quite a bit from two to three, and not at all since, which fits Lil's Lad's profile to a tee. This horse has lots of dirt figures that would make him a contender here, and his two recent grass figures are pretty good. This one can't be viewed as solid, but he does get weight worth about a point from several of these, and a very good rider (see profile). Contender, and value.

5 G P Fleet Northern Afleet 6-1

Ran some good figures over the summer, but his last couple were not great--a rail trip (1w1w) made the last look a lot better than it was. Horses have a tough time acclimating with the ship into Louisiana from cold weather, and this guy shows a work in Kentucky Jan. 10. Since he would need his best to have any shot, he's tough to like here, and an underlay, since he'll take money.

6 Fort Prado El Prado (Ire) 5-2

Has developed quite a bit with age, typical for sire El Prado, and has the best figures of anyone in the race. That advantage is offset quite a bit by the handicap weights--he'll be spotting weight worth about a point (give or take) to the whole field. He's very solid, and the strongest of the favorites in the race, but he would have to both run a top and get a good trip to have a big shot to win.

7 Ole Faunty Quiet American 8-1

Is the third live longshot in this one. After running some very big dirt figures as a five-year-old, he fell apart, but has been coming around recently when tried on grass by promising young trainer Shannon Ritter. His race two back was very good, and much concealed by the (3w3w) trip. If he runs back to that second off the layoff, he'll be tough at the weights.

8 Onthedeanslist Honor Grades 9-2

Is an example of the advantages of speed and saving ground in two turn races--look at all the one wide trips in his pp's. His grass figures are only modest, but those trips have showed his figures to best advantage and as lone speed again, he could get a piece of this again by running his race and saving ground.

<u>Overview</u> – The tote board will be upside-down for this one, with longshots having at least as good a shot as the favorites. Chinese Dragon and G P Fleet are clear bet-againsts, with Gallo Del Bar, Sampson's Son, and Ole Faunty offering value.



Any agent, and there are plenty, would be delighted to advise this and more for the standard five percent fee on purchase. To charge 20 percent up front on a \$300,000 to \$400,000 initial investment is ludicrous. No question, some agents are better than others, as are some doctors, stockbrokers, lawyers, accountants, etc., but as in any business, you check various sources and obtain references, interview and do your due diligence. Until last year, when a code of ethics was defined by the industry, you might have implied, "who can you trust?" Now there is a structure in place which allows someone new to the business to ask the questions and make your agent accountable. I can't agree that a 20-percent fee is acceptable because it is "transparent" and up front. It just doesn't make sense. If someone wants to do that, feel free, however I don't think you should endorse the idea by devoting three pages of explanation. It is very offensive to me and I am certain to many other agents like me.
