WEEKEND PEDIGREE **PERSPECTIVES**

by Alan Porter

A LOOK AT THE ECLIPSE AWARDS

The Eclipse Awards were handed out Monday night, and a study of the nominees gives an interesting snapshot of some current pedigree trends. Looking at ballot nominees (ignoring write-ins) by sire line, Northern Dancer led the way with nine: Henny Hughes (Hennessy) and First Samurai (Giant's Causeway) by sons of Storm Cat; Summerly, by Summer Squall--like Storm Cat, a son of Storm Bird; Borrego and Artie Schiller, both by El Prado (Ire) (Sadler's Wells); Intercontinental (Danehill) and Lost in the Fog (Lost Soldier), both by sons of Danzig: Megahertz (GB), by Pivotal {GB}, a grandson of Nureyev; and Round Pond (Awesome Again), a granddaughter of Deputy Minister.

The Mr. Prospector line had five representatives: Afleet Alex (by Northern Afleet, by Afleet), Flower Alley (by Distorted Humor, by Forty Niner), the only horses to achieve votes in the Champion Three-Year-Old category; Smuggler (by Unbridled, by Fappiano); Adieu (by El Corredor, a grandson of Gone West); and Pleasant Home (by Seeking the Gold).

The only other male line with more than two representatives was that of Hail to Reason through Halo and Roberto, who had champions Saint Liam and Ashado, both by Halo's son, Saint Ballado; Cesario (Jpn), by Special Week (Jpn), by Halo's great son, Sunday Silence; and Rock Hard Ten (by Kris S., by Roberto). Male lines represented by two nominees were Seattle Slew, via the A.P. Indy grandsons, Stevie Wonderboy (Stephen Got Even) and Silver Train (Old Trieste). Icecapade (by Northern Dancer's son, Nearctic, and a three-parts relative to Northern Dancer) appeared through Wild Fit (by Wild Wonder, by Wild Again) and Stellar Jayne (by Wild Rush, by Wild Again). Both main branches of the In Reality line--Relaunch and Valid Appeal--made an appearance through champion two-year-old filly Folklore (by Tiznow, a grandson of Relaunch), and Saratoga County (by Valid Expectations, by Valid Appeal).

Sire lines with one representative were Blushing Groom (Fr), whose grandson Leroidesanimaux (Brz)

took champion turf male honors; Himyar/Domino, with Giacomo (by Holy Bull), being a nominee for champion three-year-old colt; and from a German male line which goes back to Bahram (GB), winner of the English Triple Crown in 1935, the GI Breeders' Cup Turf victor Shirocco (Ger).

Allowing for the particularly

strong influence of Northern Dancer via his European descendants, the breakdowns pretty much reflect what we find when we look at the sire lines in the leading U.S. yearling sales: somewhere approaching two-thirds are from the Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector lines, with Bold Ruler (which almost entirely rests on Seattle Slew these days) and Hail to Reason (mostly Halo) next, and most of the other lines represented by just a handful of horses.

As far as the long-term future of male lines other than Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector, there are some important indicators and connections from the Eclipse nominees. With the premature death of Saint Ballado, his son, Horse of the Year Saint Liam, is very likely going to shoulder the burden of continuing the Halo line in the U.S. A propensity for getting turf runners has seen the Roberto branch of Hail to Reason lose power on this side of the Atlantic, but in Rock Hard Ten it might have found its last best chance. For some time it has seemed that Bold Ruler is going to come down to Seattle Slew, and other than champion two-year-old colt Vindication (his last top son), Seattle Slew is relying on A.P. Indy and sons. The bright news is that two of those sons had Eclipse Award nominees (following last year's champion two-year-old Declan's Moon), and so far, five A.P Indy sons have Grade I winners in their first and second crops (with his best son, Mineshaft, waiting in the wings).

The Domino branch of Himyar has hung on by its finger tips for the better part of a century, and Giacomo, along with Macho Uno and the newly retired

Woke Up Dreamin--all by Holy Bull--will bid to extend the line another generation or two. Tiznow siring champion Folklore in his first crop is a promising sign for the In Reality line. Leroidesanimaux adds another string to the bow of Blushing Groom, who at the moment has Rahy, Cherokee Run (himself repre-

sented by several young sons) and Mt. Livermore's freshman son Orientate, a champion sprinter himself.

We long held that while inbreeding, linebreeding and outcross can all be effective, that none are a "silver bullet," and that what is more important is who are we inbreeding to, through, and where. Most of the nominees have duplications within five generations (as does most of the Thoroughbred population). Of the 27 horses on the ballots, seven (26 percent) were outcrosses, and eight (30 percent) had duplications

within four generations (or equivalent). The inbreds are Stevie Wonderboy (Weekend Surprise 3x3), Ashado (Cosmah 3x5), Folklore (In Reality 4x4), Rock Hard Ten (Hail to Reason 3x4, Nashua 4x4), Pleasant Home (Mr. Prospector 2x4), Flower Alley (Mr. Prospector 3x3, Northern Dancer 4x4x 5),

Cesario (Northern Dancer 5x3) and Round Pond (the brothers Viceregal/Vice Regent 3x4). Three crosses of Northern Dancer are becoming quite common in the pedigrees of good horses, and three of the nominees, Folklore, Flower Alley and Round Pond, have three crosses of Northern Dancer in five generations.

Horse of the Year and champion older male **Saint Liam** (Saint Ballado--Quiet Dance, by Quiet American) represents a Saint Ballado/ Mr. Prospector cross, which worked very well for Saint Ballado. He is a half-brother to graded stakes winner Congressionalhonor (Forestry). The dam, a stakes-winning daughter of the very promising broodmare sire Quiet American, goes back to the great mare Gallorette, and is from the same branch of that family as the very useful sire Silver Ghost, Champion Irish two-year-old filly Minstrella, and Grade I winner Misty Gallore. Saint Liam is linebred to Almahmoud through grandsons Halo and Northern Dancer, and has multiple strains of Almahmoud's sire, Mahmoud, along with Mahmoud's 3/4-brother, Mirza II.

Champion Older Mare **Ashado** (Saint Ballado--Goulash, by Mari's Book) is somewhat similar to Saint Ballado, as she is inbred to Halo's dam Cosmah and has three crosses of Cosmah's dam, Almahmoud. She's booked to Storm Cat for 2006, a mating which will give a horse with a somewhat similar genetic background to Giant's Causeway (dam by Rahy, who is by Blushing Groom--sire of Ashado's second dam-out of a sister to Saint Ballado).

Almahmoud is also doubled 5x5 in the pedigree of Champion Sprinter **Lost in the Fog** (Lost Soldier--Cloud Break, by Dr. Carter), this time through Northern Dancer and Halo's half-brother Maribeau (also sire of the dam of Mari's Book, the broodmare sire of Ashado). He's also doubled to Bold Ruler, once through Secretariat (by Bold Ruler out of a Princequillo mare) and once through Chieftain (by Bold Ruler out of a daughter of Princequillo mare).

Champion three-year-old colt Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet--Maggy Hawk, by Hawkster), like Saint Liam, will be at stud in 2006. He represents what has become a recent trend of Classic winners by sprinter/milers, usually out of mares with some stamina in their pedigree. His sire is by Mr. Prospector's son Afleet and started his career in Florida, but is now in Kentucky; he's another the legion of prominent sires bred on a Mr. Prospector/Northern Dancer cross (others including Kingmambo, Thunder Gulch, Elusive Quality, Distorted Humor and Grand Slam).

Afleet Alex and his stakes-winning brother Unforget-





table Max (also retiring to stud in Kentucky for 2006) are out of Maggy Hawk, a daughter of the Roberto-line sire, Hawkster. The pair represent the cross of a Mr. Prospector-line stallion over a Roberto-line mare. This combination brings together two important daughters of Nashua--Gold Digger, the dam of Mr. Prospector, and Bramalea, the dam of Roberto--a pair who have a very

similar genetic background.

Champion Three-Year-Old Filly **Smuggler** (Unbridled-Inside Information, by Private Account) is from the last crop of Unbridled, and underlined the magnitude of the loss suffered by the breeding industry when Smuggler's sire, Unbridled, died at the early age of 14 in 2001.

Three-year-old Smuggler is a member of the last crop of foals sired by Unbridled, and so far is the only one of from that crop to win a stakes event. That, in a way, is something of a microcosm of Unbridled's stud career. He was never the most proflic sire of stakes winners-although his score of 43 black-type winners for 582 foals (7 percent) is more than respectable by current standards--but what made him a standout was the quality of his best performers, as no less 12 of those 43 (27 percent) were Grade I winners. Smuggler's dam Inside Information was an outstanding mare who captured six Grade I events, but her daughter has edged her out on one account: Smuggler has already taken an Eclipse Award at three, where her dam didn't get hers until she was voted champion older female at four. Smuggler goes back to the great tap-root mare, Grey Flight, but it is another 'Blue Hen,' La Troienne, who is particularly important here. Smuggler has five crosses of La Troienne: two through Buckpasser's dam Busanda; one through Busher, a 3/4-sister to Busanda; and two through Better Self, who is by La Troienne's son Bimelech, and is a genetic relative to Busanda and Striking. The champions two-year-olds, **Stevie Wonderboy** (Stephen Got Even--Heat Lightning, by Summer Squall) and **Folklore** (Tiznow--Contrive, by Storm Cat) are both

examples of interesting inbreeding. Stevie Wonderboy, from the second crop of Stephen Got Even, is out of a mare by A.P. Indy's half-brother, Summer Squall. As a result, Stevie Wonderboy has Weekend Surprise 3x3 in his pedigree. In fact, Stevie Wonderboy is an unusual example of close inbreeding to a mare who herself is closely inbred, as Weekend Surprise is by Secretariat, and her second dam is by Secretariat's half-brother, Sir Gaylord, giving her

Somethingroyal 2x4. We should also note that Stevie Wonderboy has Bold Ruler 6x5x6, and that his fourth dam is by Loser Weeper, a brother to Bold Ruler's dam, Miss Disco.

Folklore, from the first crop of three-time Eclipse champion Tiznow, has In Reality 4x4 through her tailmale line and Basie, her third dam. Since her granddam, Jeano, is by Fappiano (dam by Dr. Fager, a son of In Reality's broodmare sire, Rough'n Tumble) there are also three crosses of Rough'n Tumble. It's probably no coincidence that In Reality and Rough'n Tumble are themselves closely inbred horses: In Reality has War Relic (another closely inbred horse) 3x3 at the top and bottom of his pedigree, and Rough'n Tumble had Spearmint and Whisk Broom 4x4. Folklore also has Northern Dancer 5x5x4, with two of the strains having an interesting connection. Both Tiznow's granddam, Lonely Dancer, and Storm Cat are by sons of Northern Dancer, and the pair have some similar strains on the distaff side.

The final two champions are the turf stars Leroidesanimaux (Candy Stripes--Dissemble {GB} by Ahonoora {GB}) and Intercontinental (Danehill--Hasili {Ire} by Kahyasi {Ire}) are particularly closely related, as their dams are half-sisters (have half-sisters ever previously been represented by U.S. Champions in the same year, one wonders?). Actually the relationship is even closer than that as Leroidesanimaux's sire, Candy Stripes is by Blushing Groom out of a Northern Dancer mare, a cross which is reversed in Kahyasi, the broodmare sire of Intercontinental. Leroidesanimaux is going to be at stud in 2006, and it will be interesting to see if he can get runners which can be effective on dirt as well as turf.

His grandsire Blushing Groom has been represented by two U.S. branches which are predominantly dirt--Cherokee Run (by Runaway Groom), and Mt. Livermore--while another son, Rahy, has had his share of dirt stars. Oddly enough, Leroidesanimaux has a pedigree connection to Giant's Causeway, who proved very effective on dirt as well as turf, and has First Samurai and Grade II winner Diamond Omi on dirt in his first U.S. crop. Giant's Causeway's dam, Mariah's Storm, is a granddaughter of Blushing Groom. Giant's Causeway's granddam, Immense, is by Roberto out of a granddaughter of the mare Itsabet. Leroidesanimaux's third dam is also by Roberto out of a granddaughter of the mare Itsabet. As for Intercontinental, she is the third champion by Danehill out of her dam, and she was preceded to the champion turf female crown by her sister Banks Hill (GB), who took the same honor in 2001. 
LEADING LIGHTS


A total of 1,184 sires qualified for APEX (Annual Progeny Earnings indeX) ratings at the end of 2005. That means they passed a few simple numerical tests, most notably: they had 10 or more three-year-olds in 2005 (so last year's freshman sires don't have APEX ratings); they had at least two crops to race; and they had at least 20 'year-starters'--meaning the horse (by this sire) has run at least once in the calendar year (a horse is therefore one 'year-starter' each year it starts).

Of those 1,184 sires, 698 of them had at least 200 year-starters in the seven-year period 1999-2005, in North America (U.S. and Canada), 'Europe' (for these purposes, Great Britain, Ireland, France, and Germany), and Japan. APEX ratings always cover a seven-year period, with eight years ago dropping off each time a new one is added (this prevents us from thinking once-great sires are still right at the top when they might not be). From this group of 698 sires (with 200+ year-starters), today I would like to identify the 159 sires with APEX 'A Runner' indices of 1.50 and higher. To make a long story as short as possible, horses who figure in the top two percent of earners in the countries mentioned each year qualify as 'A Runners' (the next two percent are called 'B Runners', the next four percent 'C Runners,' and the top eight percent, combined, are called 'ABC Runners').

An index of 1.00 means the sire in question is average, in that he sires two percent 'A Runners' (top two-percent earners) from year-starters. The sires covered today, who have all now had enough year-starters (200 since 1999) to be proven one way or the other, all have A Runner indexes of 1.50 or higher, meaning they sire three-percent A Runners to year-starters, or higher. Next week I shall cover the younger sires rated, including the likes of Forestry (4.79, actually top-rated among major 2001 sires, but just missing the 200-runner threshold, with 188) and Unusual Heat (first foals 1999, 5.52 from 172 year-starters, mostly in California).

The accompanying tables show the distribution of these 159 sires with 200 + year-starters and 1.50 + A Indexes--22.7 percent of the 698 sires rated--into three categories. Almost exactly half (79) of the 159 sires have A Indexes of 2.00+, and, of these, 43 have ratings of 2.50 or higher, and 36 have ratings of 2.00-2.49. Another half (80) have A Indexes between 1.50-1.99. Of the 698 sires with 200+ year-starters, 261 of them (37 percent) had their first foals in 1993 or earlier --about the youngest of these is 18 years old by now-yet they include just over half (22) of the 43 sires rated 2.50 and higher. That's why we still respect the elders in this aspect of the game: the good ones are still getting the good mares, or, at least, still producing the good results. Unfortunately for mare owners, dead sires are still rated through the last year they have 10 or more three-year-olds: of those 22 top older sires, 14 are dead or retired. Bill Oppenheim cont. p6

On the other hand, 65 percent (75) of the 116 sires rated between 1.50-2.49 had their first crops foaled in 1994 and later, which suggests there are plenty of very useful sires still at stud, many of whom, if not exactly young, are at least not yet 20-somethings. But there is quite a bit of evidence of compression of stallion ratings, which looks like yet more statistical evidence of the effects of what used to be considered double-size crops. To the extent that there is greater concentration of A Runner indexes ratings in the 1.50- 2.49 range, this suggests the best are not as far in front of the rest as they once were. The two line graphs illustrate this point. One illustrates how the highest A Index for a sire with 200 + 'runners' has declined; in 1997, Danzig topped the charts with a 6.85 rating; this year, Storm Cat is the leader, at 5.28. That's still great, but nonetheless 23-percent lower than the top-rated horse nine years ago. Similarly, the number of sires with 200+ 'runners' who have A Indexes of 4.00 or higher has also fallen; this has dropped 60 percent, from 15 in 1997 to just six last year.

One very interesting thing which the graph showing the top rating also highlights: during this entire nine-year period, while a lot of sires' ratings were declining, Storm Cat's have remained relatively level: in any seven-year period ending between 1997--2005, he always had an A Index between 5.22-5.63--in other words, just about since he began having runners, he has sired between 10.44 percent--11.26 percent A Runners to starters. One amazing fact about A Indexes is that three stallions, Danzig, A.P. Indy, and Storm Cat, have been the top three sires, in some order, for each of the last seven years. In the last nine years, each of the three has been the top-rated sire for three years each. But one of the reasons Storm Cat has been top-rated for the last three years is that he has remained where he always was, while the A Indexes for Danzig (no doubt because of his then great-age, worse mares, and smaller crops) and A.P. Indy (because of his refusal to work in Europe, where Kingmambo's halfbrother Mingun is his only A Runner) have dropped, Storm Cat's has remained just about where it's always been. Also bringing six figures Monday, Storm Wolf (Stormin Fever) (39A) sold for \$155,000 to Narvick International, Inc. From the consignment of River Edge Farm, agent, the four-year-old colt won last year's GII Lazero Barrera Memorial. Monday's highest-priced two-year-old was hip 113, a daughter of Bertrando out of Negative Pledge (Alleged). Also consigned by River Edge Farm, Inc., agent, the half sister to graded stakes winner Collect Call (Meadowlake) was purchased for \$80,000 by Woodside Farm. The sale ended with its second session last night and complete results will appear in tomorrow's TDN.



Full to Songandaprayer to Stand in Florida at Sequel:

Rationalexuberance (Unbridled's Song--Alizea, by Premiership), a four-year-old brother to leading sophomore stallion Songandaprayer, will stand the upcoming breeding season at Sequel Stallions in Orange Lake, Florida. His fee will be \$3,500, live foal, with discounts available to qualified mares. A winner of three races from 10 starts, Rationalexuberance earned \$41,058 at the track. His older brother Songandaprayer also began his breeding career in Florida before being moved (for the 2006 season) to Walmac Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, where he stands for \$35,000.

Calder Forced to Suspend Simulcast Operations:

Calder Race Course announced yesterday that it is suspending its simulcast operations while the State of Florida appeals a court ruling on the constitutionality of an intrastate simulcast wagering law. Calder and Gulfstream Park entered into an agreement on Dec. 9, 2005 to exchange simulcast signals of their live horse races as well as interstate racing signals. The agreement was reached after Florida's First District Court of Appeals upheld a lower court ruling that a state law prohibiting the exchange of live and simulcast racing signals between South Florida Thoroughbred tracks was unconstitutional. The Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation has appealed the district court decision to Florida's Supreme Court. "The agreement reached by Calder and Gulfstream last year to conduct year-round simulcasting at both tracks was a positive step forward for Florida racing," Calder president Ken Dunn said in a statement. "We want to work with our pari-mutuel partners, horsemen and state regulators to increase state tax revenue, track revenue, purses and breeders' awards and to promote customer loyalty. We hope to move ahead with those objectives once the Supreme Court hears this case."

Monmouth '06 Stakes Worth \$4.75 Million:

Anchored by the \$1-million GI Haskell Invitational H. on Aug. 6, the 2006 Monmouth Park stakes schedule features 21 races worth \$4,750,000. The season also includes the \$750,000 GI United Nations H. on July 8 and the GII Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup S. on Aug. 27. "The major stakes that we're announcing today are just the beginning of what is sure to be a very successful 2006 racing year in New Jersey," said Dennis Dowd, senior vice president of racing for the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority. "When the overnight stakes schedule is added in, total stakes purses will top \$8 million and overnight purses will start at \$330,000 per day." Monmouth's new turf course will be unveiled in late June. Stall applications for the 2006 season are due by Mar. 13 and the backstretch is set to open on Apr. 10. The meet runs from May 13 through Sept. 24.

Longshots Trigger Whopping Trifecta:

A trio of longshots crossed the finish line one-two-three in yesterday's second race at Philadelphia Park, triggering a \$38,378.80 trifecta. Cozy Fannie, a 43-1 outsider, paid \$89.40 to win the race, while 10-1 shot Queen's Folly rallied from next-to-last to get second and 67-1 shot Justaspringfling held on to be third. A \$2 ticket purchased at an off-track site in upstate New York won the entire trifecta pool, but officials were unable to confirm if it was one, single \$2 ticket or two \$1 boxed trifectas. The all-time Philly Park trifecta record is \$55,608.90, set in 1976.
