#### A BUZZ ABOUT THE CLASSIC

The last time **Buzzards Bay** (Marco Bay) paid an afternoon visit to the main track at the foot of the San Gabriel mountains, the striking chestnut colt turned in an ultra-game performance, taking the GI Santa Anita Derby last March. Winless in four starts since then, the

Florida-bred will try to snap that streak in this afternoon's \$1-million Sunshine Millions Classic in Arcadia. A respectable fifth to Giacomo in the GI Kentucky Derby, Buzzards Bay was a disappointing fourth in the GIII Affirmed H. in June before being sold for \$725,000 as a horse of rac-

ing age to dissolve the Fog City Partnership at the Fasig-Tipton July sale. He returned from a four-month absence to finish third to Magna Graduate in the GIII Discovery H. Oct. 29, but was a flat seventh in the grassy Sir Beaufort S. Dec. 26. Trainer Ron Ellis thinks a return to his preferred surface could be the right tonic. "He's worked awesome since his last race," the conditioner commented. "It was a disappointing race, but I figure he's going to bounce back on the dirt." The four-year-old breezed six furlongs in a bullet 1:11 at Hollywood Park Jan. 21. Lava Man (Slew City Slew) is another looking to regain his best form. Winner of the GI Hollywood Gold Cup last summer, the Cal-bred had a miserable fall, finishing seventh in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and 11th in the Japan Cup Dirt. The dark bay will attempt to halt his seconditis at Santa Anita, where he has a trio of runner-up finishes from three starts, including the GI Malibu S. in 2004. Those shopping for a longshot could do worse than Whos Crying Now (Concerto), who seems to be getting better with age. Second to subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Classic third Super Frolic last May, the dark bay was up late to beat Supervisor (Skip Trial) by a head in the Carl G. Rose Classic at Calder Nov. 12. The confirmed closer was unsuited by a slow pace when third in the GIII Fred W. Hooper H. in South Florida Dec. 17, but an abundance of front-runners in here could set things up nicely for the six-year-old.

House of Fortune, a multiple graded-stakes winner at three, didn't find the winner's circle last year until her final outing, when she swept through the Cat's Cradle H. at Hollywood Dec. 4. Sweet Lips captured this contest last year at Santa Anita, but, following a second in the GII La Canada S. Feb. 12, was sidelined after her sixth in the GI Santa Margarita Invitational Mar. 12. Though she was a rusty sixth in Calder's Stage Door Betty H. on New Year's Eve, the chestnut has been training smartly over this surface since that outing.



The Florida-bred returned with a vengeance in the Arizona Juvenily Filly S. Dec. 31 at Turf Paradise, winning by 10 1/2 lengths while covering 6 1/2 furlongs in 1:14 3/5. Knights Templar earned a Sovereign Award on the strength of her 13 1/4-length triumph in the GIII Mazarine Breeders' Cup S. Oct. 1, but faded to sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Oct. 29. Peach Flambe handled state-breds by seven lengths in Calder's Joe O'Farrell S. Nov. 12. Fifth Avenue defeated Folklore in her career bow last May and ran the eventual champ to 3/4 of a length in the GII Adirondack S. July 27, but things went awry afterwards. The Floridabred was well beaten in both the GII Spinaway S. Aug. 26 and the GI Matron S. Sept. 17, and will be hoping to turn that form around here.

1 Texcess In Excess (Ire) 15-1

Is a typical In Excess (see profile) in that he was precocious, but hasn't developed at all from two to three. This race features good examples of early and late developers, and this gelding is not fast enough at this point to compete with those that have gone on.

# 2 Lava Man <u>Slew City Slew</u> 3-1

Ran two huge figures over the summer back when his trainer could do no wrong, but has tailed off since. A return to his best or even near it would do it here, but Doug O'Neill hasn't been getting the same results recently (see "last 90 days").

#### 3 B. B. Best Yes It's True 12-1

Was an excellent two-year-old, but hasn't developed much more than Texcess. Doesn't fit with graded level horses at this point.

# 4 Supervisor Skip Trial 5-1

Wouldn't have been mentioned in the same breath as horses like Texcess and B. B. Best based on juvenile form, but has steadily developed, and at this point is a better horse. All his dirt tries this year have been good, with his last effort concealed by a wide trip. This one is a little short of competitive for the win spot, but could hit the board at a price.

## 5 Wild Buddy Line in the Sand 15-1

Has been racing on grass recently, but hasn't run fast enough on any surface to threaten here.

# 6 Whos Crying Now Concerto 5-1

Has raced often against Supervisor, and like that one, has lots of good tries on dirt this year. On his best this one is a little better, and had some trouble in his last. He is a contender, and usable at a price.

#### 7 Desert Boom Boomerang 20-1

Is a classic late developer, and has become a very good horse this year, as trainer Art Sherman has run wild (see "last 90 days"). His last two were much better than they looked--he spotted weight and lost lengths racing outside the winner both times. On almost every dirt effort over the last year, he's a strong contender here, and the horse to beat.

# 8 Super Strut Lil Tyler 12-1

Has an unsound pattern, and isn't fast enough to compete with these.

#### 9 Proud Tower Too Proud Irish 20-1

Showed a perfect history of cycling and bouncing until recently, when he finally put two tops together. It's likely the cumulative effect of those two efforts will cause a bounce now, and it's questionable whether he can run that well going long, since both sides of his pedigree are sprinty. (See sire profile and dam-side data.)

# 10 Buzzards Bay Marco Bay 4-1

Was a solid but unspectacular three-year-old that managed to win a weak edition of the Santa Anita Derby without running that fast. He improved quite a bit when he returned this fall, an effort that was concealed by a wide trip. He's a contender on his best, but almost always gives up lengths racing wide, and he starts outside here.

#### 11 Trickey Trevor Demaloot Demashoot 15-1

Responded well when stretched out by Jerry Hollendorfer recently, and his recent figures put him right in this. But there's a lot of speed inside him, so he probably won't be able to clear and save ground this time and the recent big efforts may have taken something out of him.

## 12 McCann's Mojave Memo (Chi) 15-1

Tailed off after a couple of big ones over the summer, although he was able to win a state-bred stakes because of a rail trip. But he hasn't run a figure that would be competitive here in six months, and the post could cause the same wide trip (4w4w) he got last time.

<u>Overview</u> – This race has a big field with lots of early speed, and there will be some rough trips. Desert Boom is solid and should be a square price, with Whos Crying Now and possibly Supervisor usable as longshots.

### PIMLICO QUARANTINE COULD END FEB. 4

Officials at the Maryland Jockey Club are hopeful that it will be able to lift the guarantine on Pimlico Race Course as early as next Saturday, Feb. 4. The Baltimore oval was placed on quarantine Jan. 21 because of an outbreak of equine herpesvirus. Since the beginning of this month, a total of 11 horses have tested positive for the disease; three horses have been euthanized while an additional eight horses remain under isolation in the detention barn. Barns 5, 6 and A are under isolation from the general horse population after horses in those barns displayed symptoms of the virus. "We are hopeful, based on the evidence to date, barring any other incidents at Pimlico that we may be able to remove that quarantine effective Saturday the 4th," said Lou Raffetto, chief operating officer of the Maryland Jockey Club. "Barn 5 will be out of isolation on the 30th. The hold order would remain in place until it is lifted from Barn 6 and Barn A and we would go back to the plan that was in place initially with other horses at Pimlico being allowed to run at Laurel, with the holds on the other barns until they are released. There is some good news here. We are moving in the right direction. We're hopeful that we have this under control." In a related issue, Raffetto indicated that there is a "90-percent chance" that the GII Barbara Fritchie H. and GII General George H., scheduled for mid-February, would be pushed back to March. "We think it's in the best interest of the racing program," he explained. "While it's a difficult situation, in that you hate to lose the events, again it's what is best for the program. It's a very strong likelihood that those two races, each \$300,000 events, would be moved to some time in March when we feel comfortable that the guarantines will be lifted and with the other states around us."

**GROOVY EUTHANIZED Groovy** (Norcliffe--Tinnitus, by Restless Wind), the champion sprinter of 1987, was euthanized Thursday at WinStar Farm due to progressively worsening neurological problems. The Texas-bred stallion was pensioned in 2001 after displaying early signs of the problems which ultimately led to his demise. Despite finishing second (placed fifth) in the GIII Gotham S. and a close third in the GI Wood Memorial, Groovy was well-beaten in the 1986 Kentucky Derby and Preakness and never made another start beyond one mile. He would go on to win 10 of his final 15 starts, including his first six appearances of 1987. Purchased for a reported \$4 million by Prestonwood Farm following his victory in the GII Forego H., the chestnut annexed the GI Vosburgh S., but was upset by Very Subtle at odds of 4-5 in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. The Prestons stood Groovy for the first 11 years of his stud career before selling the farm to Bill Casner and Kenny Troutt. Groovy stood two years for WinStar before being pensioned. "He was a tremendous racehorse, and a really neat personality," said WinStar President Doug Cauthen. "He was really people friendly." Groovy will be buried at WinStar.

WILD WONDER DIES Wild Wonder (Wild Again--Carol's Wonder, by Pass the Tab), sire of GI Del Mar Debutante winner Wild Fit and her GII San Vicente S .winning full brother Fusaichi Rock Star, died Wednesday afternoon of an apparent ruptured aorta at Doug Arnold's Buck Pond Farm, where he was to take up stud duties this season. The winner of nine of his 20 career starts, Wild Wonder took a trio of graded stakes, including a track-record setting performance in the GIII Longacres Mile H. in 1998. His two aforementioned runners also starred in the sales ring. Wild Fit sold for \$3 million at last year's Fasig-Tipton November Mixed Sale following her runner-up finish to Folklore in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Fusaichi Rock Star made headlines when he was knocked down to owner Fusao Sekiguchi for \$825,000 at the 2004 Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale.

At yesterday's meeting, the PAC Board authorized disbursement of up to \$50,000 from the Horse PAC fund to federal political candidates in first-quarter 2006; received a report on the NTRA's legislative activities in Washington D.C., including the status of the Equine Equity Act, which is expected to deliver \$444 million in tax relief to horse owners and breeders over 10 years; and reviewed fundraising strategies for 2006. #### MERCER TO BOW OUT

I've travelled the world with Gainsborough and there have been such a lot of good horses. In the last nine years alone I've calculated that Gainsborough had 1,208 winners, including 30 at Group 1 level, 39 at Group 2, 56 at Group 3, and many more in Listed company." Bruce Raymond, another former jockey, will move up from assistant racing manager to take Mercer's place and said, "I am delighted to have been appointed racing manager to the Gainsborough operation. I have had a long and happy association with the late Sheikh Maktoum, firstly as a jockey and then as his assistant racing manager for the last 10 years. Sheikh Maktoum will of course be sadly missed, but I feel that with the continuing help of the great teams already in place I can keep the name of Gainsborough to the fore."

The former comes into this off a 1 1/2length victory over Met hopeful Ilha da Vitoria (Brz) in the G1 Paddock S. at Kenilworth Jan. 7 while Jamaica nearly defeated would-be Met favorite Winter Solstice (SAf) in the G1 Queen's Plate Jan. 1. Team Valor is represented in the Majorca by Alexandra Rose (SAf) (Caesour), who was beaten a nose by Bad Girl Runs in the G1 Cape Fillies Guineas Dec. 3.

#### **DUBAI'S CHOICE TAKES DEBUT Dubai's Choice**

(Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), purchased for A\$1.8 million, the second-highest priced offering at the 2005 Australian Easter Yearling Sale, was the narrow winner of his much-anticipated racecourse Saturday (Friday night U.S. time) at Rosehill Gardens. Drawn in stall two, the attractive bay colt was a bit slow into stride, but was coaxed to the front shortly thereafter. He quickened up nicely into the stretch and was fully extended to hold off Strat's Flyer (Aus) (Strategic {Aus}) by about a head. Dubai's Choice is the first foal out of Saucy Nell (Aus) (Marauding {NZ}), herself an unraced half sister to Encounter (Aus), a six-time Group 1 winner and champion at two and three in Australia. He is trained by Tim Martin for owner Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum and others and came into his bow off a single 900-meter barrier trial, finishing fourth over holding ground at Rosehill Jan. 17.

#### **KEENINSKY RETIRED**

Dual Group 1 winner Keeninsky (NZ) (Stravinksy--So Keen (NZ), by Jade Hunter) will retire immediately to the Oaks Stud at Cambridge in New Zealand. He concludes his career with seven wins and two placings from 14 appearances. The Graeme Rogerson-trained four-year-old won the G1 Manawatu Sires' Produce S., which helped him toward champion New Zealand twoyear-old honors, and the G1 Telegraph H. After winning the Telegraph H. over six furlongs at Trentham, Keeninsky's career was troubled by injury. He finished a lackluster sixth behind Sedecrem in the G1 Waikato Sprint and bone chips were discovered after he was last in the G1 Newmarket H. at Flemington, won by Alinghi (Aus). He returned from an 11-month spell to finish almost 10 lengths behind Gee I Jane (NZ) in the G1 Telegraph H. Jan. 21, beating just three home. The Oaks Stud purchased a half share in Keeninsky in 2004. The remaining half was retained by owners John and Dorothy Carter and Brian Hall and Isabel Harris. "We discussed retiring him with the other owners because his joints were tickling him up and he was sore," said The Oaks general manager Rick Williams. "He had surgery to remove bone chips on his nearside fetlock after the Nemarket H. last year. He was an early-maturing speed horse, very quick and he will inject a lot of speed into NZ mares, and he will be priced so that breeders will be able to access him."
