STRAVINSKY COLT TOPS DAY 2 AT KARAKA

David Ellis of Te Akau Stud was the last man standing after a furious bidding war at yesterday's second session of the New Zealand Premier Yearling Sale at

Karaka, walking away with a NZ\$2.2-million son of Stravinsky. It was the second-highest priced colt ever to sell at Karaka. The yearling, out of Group 1 winner Grand Echezeaux (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), was bred and consigned by Pencarrow Stud. He is a half brother to Darci Brahma (NZ) (Danehill), who went on to be

named New Zealand's champion juvenile last year after topping this sale when purchased by Ellis for NZ\$1.1 million in 2004. Ellis called the yearling "one of the most impeccable colts" he had ever seen. "He is by the sire of the leading fillies in both New Zealand and Australia from the blueblood family of Peter and Philip Vela through Grand Echezeaux and is a superb individual. We are very proud to have secured him for the New Zealand breeding industry for the years to come and hope that he will reward his owners with similar success to Darci Brahma." Darci Brahma's trainer Mark Walker will also train yesterday's sale topper, who was syndicated soon after purchase. Sam Kelt, of Keltern Stud in Hastings, was the determined underbidder on the prized yearling. The colt led the way on a day of strong bidding at Karaka, with a session record average of NZ\$149,772. "The sale started steadily this morning, but really stepped up a gear throughout the afternoon," said New Zealand Bloodstock's marketing and public relations manager Petrea Vela. "The last three hours of selling were as strong as we have ever seen it at Karaka with today's results exceeding all our expectations. Not only was it very exciting to see the Stravinsky colt sell for NZ\$2.2 million, but it is a huge boost to our industry to see two New Zealand buyers fighting it out at the end, with Japanese and Australian buyers also in the battle. Good-quality horses are certainly in high demand with buyers prepared to pay top dollars for lots that meet their scrutiny." The third and final session of the Premier Sale starts today at 11 a.m.

As the dam of Storm Cat, Terlingua's place in the history of the breed is secure. While Storm Cat has grabbed most of the headlines, Terlingua has two other stallion sons--Wheaton and Pioneering--who have quietly done a useful job. Wheaton, a son of Alydar, didn't run until he was four, when he took a second in a maiden from four starts. He won once in seven starts the following year, to retire with a record of one win in 11 outings. However, at stud in Florida (he has since moved to Pennsylvania), he has sired 10 stakes winners, including Santana Springs, winner last year of the GII Amsterdam S., and Radical Riley, successful in the GIII Holy Bull S. and GIII What a Pleasure S. Pioneering, by Mr. Prospector, started only at two, winning twice in seven starts. Retired to stand alongside Storm Cat at Overbrook, Pioneering has sired 18 stakes winners in his first six crops.

They include Give Praise, successful in the GII Sorrento S.; Pioneer Boy, who took the GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup H.; the GIII Golden Gate Derby victor, Danthebluegrassman; and Behaving Badly, successful in the GIII Rancho Bernardo H., and this weekend, the GI Santa Monica H. Incidentally, Pioneering had no fewer than eight individual stakes winners last year, and was a top 50 sire by earnings. So, overall, he has to be one of the best bargains going at his advertised fee of \$3,500 for 2006.

Behaving Badly, who took her record to five wins in seven starts with her Santa Monica tally, is one of three black-type horses for her dam, Timeleighness. She is preceded by the Citidancer gelding, Light Up the Town, who was three times stakes placed, and Lavish Numbers, a daughter of Polish Numbers, who captured the Maid of the Mist S., a New York-bred stakes. Timeleighness was an unraced daughter of the relatively obscure sire, Sir Raleigh. This extremely well-bred individual--he was a Sir Ivor half-brother to Green Dancer--raced in France where he captured a minor stakes. He had a distinctly limited impact at stud, siring only two stakes winners (one of which was Timeleighness's sister, Timelessleigh), and Behaving Badly is the only graded stakes winner in whose pedigree he appears. We can note, however, that Pioneering's half-brother, Storm Cat, did sire the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St. James's Palace S. victor, Back Minnaloushe, out of a mare by Green Dancer, so the dam of the sire (Terlingua), and the dam of the broodmare sire (Green Valley II) have appeared in identical positions in the pedigree of a previous winner at the highest level.

The dam of Timeleighness and Timelessleigh was another unraced mare, Pleasure Moment. One of only three foals produced by her dam, Pleasure Lady, Pleasure Moment was by Timeless Moment out of a What a Pleasure mare. This is an identical cross to the one which produced champion two-year-old Gilded Time, which suggests that his daughters could be worth trying with Pioneering.

Another generation back, one arrives at the classiest individual in the recent generations of the female family, prior to the arrival of Behaving Badly, this being Money to Burn, the fourth dam of the Santa Monica heroine, and a winner of three stakes events, and runner-up in the Frizette Stakes.

The upgrading in performance over her immediate famly which Behaving Badly represents, probably stems from the fact that her dam offers quite a strong reinforcement of Pioneering's background. In fact, of the eight stallions in the fourth generation of Pioneering's pedigree, six are present in Behaving Badly's dam. The arrangement of these names is rather clever too. To start with, Pioneering is by Mr. Prospector, where Behaving Badly's second dam, Pleasure Moment, is by Timeless Moment, a horse whosed dam has quite a similar background to Mr. Prospector. Then, Pleasure Moment is out of Pleasure Lady, who is a product of a Nasrullah/Count Fleet cross, as is Mr. Prospector's dam, Gold Digger.

The fact that Behaving Badly's broodmare sire, Sir Raleigh is by Sir Ivor, gives Behaving Badly a double of Somethingroyal. She appears through Pioneering's broodmare sire, Secretariat, and Secretariat's half-brother, Sir Gaylord (sire of Sir Ivor). In both cases the Somethingroyal is combined with Spy Song, and where Terlingua has Menow, Sir Raleigh has Menow's three-parts-sister Athenia. Thus, the mating of Pioneering with Timeleighness duplicates several high-quality ancestors and in very similar combinations.



YOUNG SIRES: COUNT THOSE ABC'S

As everyone, both north and south of the border, who knows about North American earnings figures has known for years, Canadian sires have benefited from an institutionalized, official inflation of their earnings figures which has resulted in Canadian sires being overrated in international terms. This is simply because when the Canadian dollar began to float downwards against the U.S. dollar near the end of 1976, the U.S. Jockey Club never compensated for it. Though the Canadian dollar was at one point worth less than 70 cents U.S. (it's currently quoted around 87 cents), Canadian earnings were always counted the same as U.S. earnings; only at the beginning of 2005 did The Jockey Club begin to calculate them the same as any other foreign country.

Because it's an official miscalculation, it is not really feasible to try and figure out how to compensate for this error in analyzing Canadian stallions, or stallions, such as Smart Strike, who had a lot of runners in Canada up to the end of 2004. Fortunately, in his case, he's such a good sire it hardly matters. The marketplace is evidently compensating for his Canadian form, because one key APEX calculation (ABC Runner index) makes him and Distorted Humor clearly the world 4th and 5th best sires, behind only the towering top three: Storm Cat, A.P. Indy, and Danzig. Yet Distorted Humor stands for \$150,000--and is probably cheap at that-while Smart Strike has only this year stood for as much as \$50,000 for the first time. In my view, at least in this respect the market is overcompensating for his Canadian form: if he's just 87 percent of the sire the numbers say he is, he's the bargain of the century (so far) at \$50,000. This is relevant also because two of the highest-rated sires whose first foals were born in 2001, and were four-year-olds in 2005, stand or stood in Canada: Porto Foricos and Archers Bay.

Never heard of 'em? I'm not surprised: Porto Foricos, a beautifully-bred son of Mr. Prospector who won a good 10-furlong handicap at York when trained by Henry Cecil, has only had 34 year-starters, but they include 2003 Canadian champion two-year-old filly My Vintage Port, from his first crop. His 5.88 A Runner index tops this group of sires whose first foals arrived in 2001. Second is another Canadian, Archers Bay. He was a son of Silver Deputy who won the 1998 Queen's Plate. He died before he had his first runners in 2003, but what a sensational sire he would have been--Canadian earnings bias or no. He had 45 winners in 2005, and no fewer than 24 of them were A, B, or C runners. Even if the Canadian dollar was inflated, this was going to be some kind of sire.

When you look at this group of sires--there were 133 of them who qualified for APEX ratings in 2005--there are four, really, who are prominent on all the leaders' lists. To be more precise, they are 'prominent' (top 10 F01 sires) on the index lists, but in fact they are clustered in the top four spots on the two lists which count, respectively, the number of A Runners, and the number of ABC Runners. It makes me wonder whether, in this big-crop era, the number of a sire's successes is becoming just as good, if not better, a barometer of sire success, than even the index figures are.

Whether you turn him upside down or backwards, Archers Bay has definitely been one of those top four F01 sires; not only was he second to Porto Foricos by A Runner Index, he is the F01 number one by ABC Runner Index, with a massive 3.40--that means 27.2 percent of his runners (since 8.00 percent = 1.00 for ABC Runners, you multiply 8.00 x 3.40) have qualified as A, B, or C Runners--and Canadian bias or no, that's a huge performance. Forestry and Cape Cross are this group's most expensive sires, and they are tied for the lead with 18 A Runners each since they had their first runners in 2003. Cape Cross (3.37) is ranked 12th among the world's Top 40 by A Runner Index, but is eligible for the list only by virtue of having had over 200 year-starters (in his case, 267). cont. p5

Forestry is just a few starters short (he's had 188 year-starters) of having enough runners to qualify for the overall leaders' lists, which is a shame--because, so far, he has been siring A Runners at a 4.79 rate -- good enough for the world Top Five, nevermind the top 40. Of course, by the end of this year he will have far more than 200 year-starters, so we'll see then if he can sustain such a high index figure. Statistically speaking, for a young stallion that's about the best problem you can have: can he stay in the 4's? There are only six stallions with 200 + year-starters who do rate in the 4's; two of them (Danzig and his son, Danehill) are dead, and two more (Storm Cat and Sadler's Wells) are in their twenties.

Cape Cross has the distinction of not only being tied for the lead in number of A Runners (18), he is also tied for the lead--this time with Victory Gallop--in number of ABC Runners, with 42 each. Archer's Bay has 40, Forestry 39 (remember, in this particular count the same horse can be an ABC runner each year it runs, if it reaches the requisite earnings threshold). In terns of A Runners, after Forestry and Cape Cross's dead-heat on 18, their closest pursuers are Archers Bay again (16) and Victory Gallop again (15). I know I've said it before, but his consistent presence among this group's top four makes his \$10,000 stud fee for 2006 look a giveaway price. One of this Gang of Four, Archers Bay, is dead, but the other two stand for \$100,000 (Forestry) and €50,000 (Cape Cross) respectively, so why does WinStar (relatively speaking) practically have to give seasons away to Victory Gallop, at \$10,000?

I've always argued that, regardless of market demands, sires really shouldn't be rated until the end of the year when their first four-year-olds have raced. That's exactly where this group is at, and, besides the four who I reckon have established themselves as the group's leaders, there are plenty of other impressive numbers registered by this group of sires. In particular, Europeans Tiger Hill and Verglas, and Americans Military and Menifee rank among the group's top 10 in both A Runner Index and ABC Runner Index. A.P. Indy sons Malibu Moon and Old Trieste have also posted very respectable numbers, as have four-figure stud fee sires Wagon Limit, Intikhab, and Gold Away; and Silver Charm, an early exile to Japan, now has quite respectable figures.

GIANT'S CAUSEWAY: WINS ON NUMBERS

Because he has already had what must be a record (for this stage of proceedings) 243 year-starters, there is almost no way Giant's Causeway's index figures could look as good as other sires whose first foals were three-year-olds of 2005. Sure enough, he ranks only 17th among his sire group by A Runner Index (2.26), while he doesn't even make the group's top 20 by ABC Runner Index (1.44). It's when you look at his number of A Runners, and ABC Runners, that we get any indication that he could be one of the world's most expensive sires: he leads this sire group in both categories, with 11 A Runners, and 28 ABC Runners. Interestingly, stablemate Fusaichi Pegasus is tied for second in number of A's (10), and is outright second in number of ABC's (26). We're all used to these amazing Florida sires doing well, but there can't be many more amazing than Yes It's True. Number two on the 2004 Freshman Sire List, he just marched right on when they became three-year-olds, finishing last year tied with Fusaichi Pegasus for second by number of A Runners (10), and was outright third by number of ABC Runners (24). With A Runner and ABC Runner indices of 3.79 and 2.27, respectively, he's looking like the best sire descendant ever of his grandsire, Raja Baba.

Another Florida emigre, last year's leading North American Freshman Sire, Successful Appeal, has had considerably smaller crops, yet had a Kentucky Derby second and is ranked number two among this sire group by both A Runner (4.29) and ABC Runner (2.86) indexes. Fractionally ahead of Successful Appeal by A Runner index is a horse who would have been 1000-1 to top this sire group. He has only 46 year-starters, compared to Giant's Causeway's 243, and even Successful Appeal's 70, but he has an A Runner Index of 4.35, and is the sire of three Group winners. I refer, of course, to Muhtathir, bred by Shadwell and raced by Sheikh Hamdan at three, and Godolphin at four and five, and standing at the Haras du Mezeray in France. He's by Elmaamul, an obscure enough son of Diesis who was himself repatriated to England from Italy a year or so ago. In fairness, Muhtathir turned out to be quite a consistent and very high-class miler. He had been second to Victory Note (Desert Prince third) in the 1998 French 2000 Guineas, then came back to win the GII Celebration Mile at Goodwood. He won a Group 1 in Italy at four, another Group 2 there at five, but ran his best race ever the same year, when subbing for injured stablemate Dubai Millennium to win the G1 Jacques le Marois. He was rated 123, 120, and 126 by Timeform in those three years, so it's not like he had no credentials. He's still listed as standing for only €7,500, so considering the company he's keeping on the sire front, he deserves to cover a full book this year.

Once again, there are plenty of other sires whose first crops were three-year-olds last year who deserve a mention. Foremost among them is Montjeu, who would rocket to the top of the charts if we could measure 12-furlong-plus Classic-winning three-year-olds to foals. He had three Classic winners in his first crop: Irish Derby and Arc winner Hurricane Run, Epsom Derby winner Motivator, and English St. Leger winner Scorpion. He doesn't rank higher in these tables through a combination of the usual Coolmore-sponsored huge foal crops, plus the fact that most of his A Runners happen to be Classic winners rather than £50,000 earners (approximate minimum A Runner threshold in Britain/Ireland 2005). cont. p7

Another interesting horse in Europe is Sinndar, who won the Arc, and English and Irish Derbies in 2000. His foals have done zero as two-year-olds, but he had a trio of stakes-winning three-year-old fillies last year, including Irish Oaks and Vermeille winner Shawanda, plus classic-placed Pictavia. He nominally does represent the Danzig sire line, being by Grand Lodge, but has started out, as a sire, much more like his dam's Mill Reef side. No bad thing, either. Incidentally, Dubai Millennium was not rated, because one of the conditions is that a sire must have had two crops; however, had he been eligible, my estimate (from manual compilation) is that he would have an A Runner index around 4.00 and an ABC index around 2.55--both very high rankings.

Seven other American sires from this group who have promising numbers so far, one way or another, include Precise End, who stood in New York, and was actually this group's leading sire by ABC Index (3.30). Being a son of End Sweep, he was captured by Japan before he even had runners. More Than Ready, Dixie Union, Cape Canaveral, and Bernstein are four Kentucky sires who have all scored very good numbers, as has Old Topper in California, and Tiger Ridge, a placed (at four) halfbrother to A.P. Indy and three-quarter brother to Summer Squall, by Storm Cat, who stands in Florida. He also doesn't rank higher in these tables through a combination of the usual huge Coolmore-sponsored crops, plus the fact that most of his A Runners happen to be Classic winners rather than £50,000 earners (approximate min. A Runner threshold in Britain/Ireland 2005).

Finally, an intriguing pair who, for slightly different reasons, both have the profiles of sires who are going to have big years with their first four-year-olds in 2006 -- and both happen to be sons of Kingmambo, namely King's Best and Lemon Drop Kid. King's Best has a dramatic pointer to this effect: so far, his two-year-old ABC index is 0.43, while his first three-year-olds scored 2.14. That is a massive improvement, and nine times out of 10 a horse with that profile so far goes on to have a huge year the next year (now). King's Best's overall numbers aren't that hot yet, but he is tied for second (with Dansili) behind only Giant's Causeway by number of year-starters so far (175); anyway, I predict a big year for him. Also intriguing is Lemon Drop Kid, whose stud fee has just been chopped again, to \$20,000. His 1.47 A Runner index is disappointing, considering the shot he got, but on the other hand, all his other numbers are very good: B Runners (1.96), C Runners (2.21), ABC Runners overall (1.96), two-yearolds (ABC 2.16), three-year-olds (2.51). A lot of people seem to be writing him off, but these numbers say that's too hasty.

BRAVE RAJ DIES Brave Raj (Rajab--Bravest Yet, by Bravo), the champion juvenile filly of 1986, died Saturday, Jan. 28, a week after aborting a premature filly by Gulch. She was 22 years old. Bred in Florida by Dr. Wallace S. Karutz, Brave Raj was purchased for \$24,000 at the OBS February Sale, but went on to win six of her nine starts, capped by her 5 1/2-length victory in the third edition of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies for trainer Mel Stute and owner Dolly Green. "Obviously her race record speaks for itself. She was a champion and she was a tough mare," said Barry Ezrine, farm manager of Warren Rosenthal's Patchen Wilkes Farm. "She made her pedigree, from a pedigree that was nothing. She was a champion racemare and an excellent producer. She was a real kind mare, a great mother." After aborting her foal Jan. 21, Brave Raj was returned to Patchen Wilkes and appeared to be on the improve, Ezrine explained. But on the evening of Jan. 27, she laid down and was unable to return to her feet. She was transferred by ambulance to Hagyard-Davidson-McGee Jan. 28, but she was still unable to bear any weight and the decision was made to euthanize her. Retired with earnings of \$933,650, the dark bay was purchased on behalf of Rosenthal for \$500,000 at the 1987 Keeneland November Sale. She has since gone on to produce 10 individual winners from 11 to race, including stakes winners Bravo Bull (Holy Bull) and Russian Tango (Nijinsky II), the dam of MGSW Eurosilver.

Laurel Horse Tests Positive for EHV:

The Maryland Department of Agriculture confirmed that Laurel-based Hey Ralphy, from the barn of Rodney Jenkins, was infected by equine herpesvirus (EHV). The filly was euthanized Jan. 26 with a suspected pelvic injury. A Hold Order has been placed on Barn 9 at the central Maryland track. "The news is disappointing, but we still think we see the light at the end of the tunnel," said Lou Raffetto, Chief Operating Officer for the Maryland Jockey Club. We had hoped we would have this situation under control by Feb. 9, which essentially would have been one month since the first case at Pimlico. We are now going to have to wait and monitor the situation here at Laurel. We have already put the proper precautions into place to control the situation." Three horses have already been euthanized at Pimlico Race Course, Laurel's sister track, and eight horses remain in isolation at that track's detention barn. There have been no new cases of EHV-1 at Pimlico since Jan. 19. "We urge everyone's patience and diligence in continuing strong preventative measures such as keeping horses separate from others for a period of time, disinfecting and keeping vaccinations up to date," explained Maryland State Veterinarian, Dr. Guy Hohenhaus. It is a matter of time and continued proper management to bring this outbreak to conclusion." Due to the herpes outbreak, Laurel announced it will reschedule a pair of graded events, though exact dates haven't been decided on. Both the GII Barbara Fritchie Breeders' Cup H., originally slated for Feb. 18, and the GII General George Breeders' Cup H., slated for Feb. 20, will be rescheduled.

HRTV to Provide Herpes Update:

HorseRacing TV (HRTV) will provide viewers with an update this afternoon of the equine herpesvirus (EHV-1) at Laurel Park in Maryland. The segment will air in the 3-4 p.m. hour (EST) and will include interviews with Lou Raffetto, the Maryland Jockey Club's chief operating officer, along with several veterinarians.
