Before the Steelers and Seahawks square up in Detroit Sunday for the Vince Lombardi trophy, things just

might get 'super' in a day earlier in Florida. Super Frolic (Pine Bluff), who ran a big fourth in the Oct. 29 Gl Breeders' Cup Classic as a 69-1 bomb, returns from a three-month breather to face eight in Saturday's Gl Donn H. at Gulfstream Park. Since joining trainer Vladimir Cerin's barn at Santa Anita

last summer, Super Frolic has emerged as a legitimate graded-level horse. He followed a fifth in August's GI Pacific Classic with a win in the 1 1/4-mile GII Hawthorne Gold Cup in September, beating Lord of the Game and Perfect Drift. In the Classic, he stumbled badly, but got on track and ran well to be 2 3/4 lengths back of Saint Liam at the finish. Shipped back to California after that, he had a few maintenance moves in November and early December and resumed training in earnest about six weeks ago. He worked six panels at Santa Anita in 1:13 1/5 Jan. 26, then, after returning to the East Coast, seemed to show an affinity for the Gulfstream surface by drilling a bullet four furlongs in :46 Jan. 31. Super Frolic leaves from post five under Cornelio Velasquez, marking the first time the two have been partnered.

Sidelined after undergoing surgery to remove a chip from his left front ankle following the Belmont, last year's GI Kentucky Derby upsetter faces a solid dozen in the final leg of the Strub Series, which is restricted to four-year-olds of 2006. John Shirreffs, Giacomo's trainer, said the race's age restriction and its timing were major factors in running. "The Strub is his last chance to run in the four-year-old series,

and we wanted to start sooner," said Shirreffs. "He's a little more aggressive than he was as a three-year-old and probably gained 150 pounds. I remember him as being kind of thin as a 3-year-old; now he's filled out. He's a bigger, stronger horse." While a big effort could mean a shot at the Mar. 4 GI Santa Anita H., Shirreffs said he was thinking more long-term for Giacomo. "I don't put a lot of pressure on a race," he said. "It's the big picture that counts. I feel the best is yet to come from this horse."

RECORD NUMBER NOMINATED TO BC A record 16,183 foals were nominated to the Breeders' Cup program in 2005, Breeders' Cup Limited announced yesterday. The foals, by Breeders' Cup, European Breeders' Fund (EBF) and Common Fund nominated stallions tops the old mark of 15,947 nominated foals, set in 2004. Nominations have increased 15.5 percent since 2002. The 2005 results do not include Southern Hemisphere foals, which have an Apr. 15 nomination deadline. The 16,183 represents a record high of 49 percent of the eligible foal crop for North America. Total foal nomination revenue generated by the 2005 foal crop was \$8,214,000, the highest revenue total since the Breeders' Cup nomination program began in 1982. "We are delighted with this year's record-breaking nomination totals and our steady growth over the past three years," said D.G. Van Clief, Jr. president of Breeders' Cup Limited. "We salute our nominators, whose support of our programs is critical to the growth of the Breeders' Cup and our industry."

Funny Cide to Gulfstream Park H .:

Following his good runner-up effort to Sir Greeley in yesterday's ninth race, a one-mile allowance on the main track, 2003 GI Kentucky Derby hero Funny Cide (Distorted Humor) will return to graded-stakes action in the 9 1/2-furlong, GII Gulfstream Park H. on Mar. 4. Thursday's game try likely went a long way in determining the gelding's 2006 plans. The chestnut was well beaten in all three of his starts last year and did little to redeem himself with a seventh-place effort his 2006 bow, the Jan. 7 GIII Mr. Prospector H. With a talented foe in Sun King back in third yesterday, trainer Barclay Tagg was encouraged by Funny Cide's performance. "I'm glad he ran a good race," said Tagg. "Edgar [jockey Prado] had to get into him a little bit, which was good, because I think he needed a wake-up call. It wasn't his ideal distance, and this was a really salty race. I'm just pleased he showed some life. I'd have been perfectly happy with him finishing third or fourth, as long as he showed that he could still go long and finish strong. We had to find out if he could do it again. We'll point him to the Gulfstream Park H."

India Returns in Today's Eighth:

India (Hennessy) made such a favorable impression romping by 12 lengths in her second start at Saratoga last July that her breeders, Frank and Jane Lyon of Summer Wind Farm, repurchased her for a reported \$2.05 million. The couple had previously sent her through the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale, where she was knocked down to Peachtree Stable for \$400,000. India faltered badly in her first start for the Lyons, though, finishing an up-the-track seventh in the GI Matron S., before an improved third in the GIII Valley Stream S. at Aqueduct Nov. 20. Todd Pletcher, who retained training duties after the transfer in ownership, opted to shelve the then-juvenile for the rest of the year. She's been in steady training, however, and returns to action in today's eighth race at Gulfstream, a 6 1/2-furlong entrylevel allowance over the main track. The chestnut filly has been installed as the 9-5 favorite and breaks from post nine. John Velazquez rides.

NOTICE: CENTRAL KY HERPES VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

A number of Central Kentucky stallion stations and boarding farms have contacted the TDN in an attempt to inform breeders of a new requirement for mares coming to the breeding shed. Due to the recent outbreaks of Equine Herpes Virus infections at racetracks and training centers, veterinarians have advised precautionary measures be taken for the 2006 breeding season. The following language is expected to be a standard requirement on shed forms at stud farms: Our Veterinarian has requested that ALL MARES coming to the breeding shed must be vaccinated within 7 to 90 days before breeding for Equine Herpes Virus Type 1 (i.e. Rhinomune, Pneumabort-K, etc.). A statement to this effect should be furnished by the boarding farm and accompany the mare to the breeding shed (may be included on culture certificate).

Turfway Quarantine Rescinded:

State veterinarian Robert Stout yesterday rescinded the quarantine order on Barn 27 at Turfway Park, signaling the end of the quarantine restrictions that had been implemented at the Florence, Kentucky oval after an outbreak of equine herpesvirus (EHV-1). The barn had been under quarantine since Jan. 6, when some horses stable there tested positive for exposure to the virus. The 52 horses stabled at Barn 27 will be allowed to train with the general population beginning this morning. "On behalf of all of us at Turfway," said Turfway Park President Robert N. Elliston, "I want to express my appreciation for the outstanding cooperation we received from the Kentucky Department of Agriculture, KHRA state veterinarian Nancy Davis, and the diagnostic lab at the University of Kentucky. We also appreciate the patience and understanding our horsemen have shown as we worked to ensure the safety and well-being of all the horses at Turfway."

WRITERS UP

MORE TO COME FROM ALEO & GILCHRIST

By Steve Sherack

Owner Harry Aleo and trainer Greg Gilchrist became household names in 2005, campaigning Lost in the Fog (Lost Soldier) to champion sprinter honors, and may have more stars on the horizon this year with unbeaten sophomores Frisco Star (More Than Ready) and Victorina (Delaware Township).

Frisco Star, who broke a 23-year-old track record as a juvenile in his Santa Rosa debut last summer, returned to take a six-furlong Bay Meadows optional claimer by a head in his three-year-old debut Jan. 26. After earning

a 102 Beyer Speed Figure in his sparkling unveiling, the \$175,000 OBSAPR juvenile was awarded a 90 Beyer last time. "It was a pretty demanding race," Gilchrist said of Frisco Star's Bay Meadows tally. "The racetrack was very loose and he struggled all the way around. He was pretty tired afterwards. At first, I

was a little let down, but now that I've reflected on the race, it made me like the horse more. I think he'll even be able to handle more ground." Up next for Frisco Star will be a six-furlong overnight stakes at Golden Gate Feb. 19. "After the race on the 19th, we'll possibly stretch him out to seven-eighths or a one-turn mile. It depends how things go next time though." Frisco Star's return to the races was delayed due to a minor shin problem and a virus. He has bounced back from his most recent start no worse for the wear. "Physically, he's fine," the 57-year-old trainer added. "We fired his shins [during the layoff] and his mechanics are fine now."

Victorina also appears to have a bright future. The bay debuted with a 1 1/4-length maiden tally going five furlongs at Santa Rosa last August, then added a Golden Gate allowance by five lengths Oct. 20. After breaking on top in her second career start, the \$160,000 OBSAPR two-year-old ducked in sharply, nearly tossing jockey Russell Baze, but remarkably recovered to win under wraps. She earned an 81 Beyer for that performance. "I was holding my breath like everyone else," Gilchrist said of her eventful beginning last time.

"But to do that, drop back and come around to win...how far would've she won by without all that happening?" Victorina has been in steady training since December, posting a string of bullets, including a best-of-45 five-furlong move in :59 2/5 at Golden Gate

Jan. 6. "I had a race for her last week at Bay Meadows, but there weren't enough horses, so it didn't go," Gilchrist continued. "I also had her nominated for this weekend's [GIII] Old Hat S. at Gulfstream [Feb. 4], but she hadn't run in so long, so

we decided it was best to stay home. We're just going to wait for an overnight stakes at Golden Gate going three quarters of a mile on the [Feb.] 16th. She's a very nice horse and she's also very rateable. We'll see how she does on the 16th, then maybe try more distance."

Being based in Northern California, Gilchrist realizes that he has to ship his horses to get national recognition. In 2005, Lost in the Fog racked up plenty of frequent flyer miles, notching prestigious races like Gulfstream's GII Swale S., Belmont's GII Riva Ridge Breeders' Cup S. and Saratoga's GI King's Bishop S. "Both are two-for-two and have run some impressive races," Gilchrist said of Frisco Star and Victorina. "I think both have good futures in front of them. You got to be able to travel to answer those questions [about being Oaks & Derby contenders] later."

Stable star Lost in the Fog remains on target to make his seasonal bow in the Apr. 22 Golden Gate Fields

Sprint. He is yet to have a listed workout since his seventh-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Belmont Oct. 29. "He's doing fine," Gilchrist commented. "We haven't started jacking him up yet. I'm trying to have him peak at the end of March or begining of April." According to Gilchrist, the blazed-faced colt may see more distance this year and possibly try the GI Met Mile

at Belmont May 29. "I'll let the horse tell me," he said of stretching Lost in the Fog out. "We certainly know he can go six and seven furlongs and I have no doubts about him going one mile. If he returns like he left, there's nothing wrong with sprinting though. There are plenty of good races out there. If he does try more ground, I'll consider the Met Mile."

Gilchrist began training horses for Aleo in 1979 and currently has nine horses in training for the 85-year-old San Francisco native. Gilchrist has been his only trainer. "As far as owners go, they don't make 'em any better than that," Gilchrist said of Aleo.
