"He wasn't all out winning his last two, and I'm pretty confident he's still got some improvement left," trainer Buff Bradley told Daily Racing Form. Trainer Todd Pletcher sends out a pair of runners, West Virginia (Tomorrows Cat) and Magna Graduate (Honor Grades). The latter came into his own at the end of 2005, rattling off three straight graded-stakes victories, including a determined effort to hold off Suave (A.P. Indy) in the GII Clark H. at Churchill Nov. 25. "I'm not sure [Magna Graduate 's coming in 100 percent off the layoff, but running horses fresh tends to work for us, and he should be tight enough," Pletcher told DRF. "There's not a whole lot between us and Suave, and we're getting an unfavorable weight shift for the rematch." Magna Graduate will go postward as the 119-pound highweight. Donn cont. p2

Greeley's Galaxy Mr. Greeley

The primary concept behind "sheet" handicapping is that form is not a constant. Horses cycle in and out of form, hit peaks and bounce, which is why Thoro-Graph plots our figures on graphs for each horse. We did the first two legs of the Strub series as ROTWs, and both times we said Greeley's Galaxy would not be ready to run his best. Warren Stute lets his horses run themselves into shape (see trainer profile), and this colt did just that in his earlier campaign. In fact, he did run pretty well in his last: he spotted weight to the top two. Now he's within range of his best, and we expect him to run a big one this time or next. And with the rail and a more favorable weight situation, he probably won't need to get all the way back to his best to take this.

2 Top This And That Old Topper 20-1

Is heavily raced, but jumped to a big new top last time, one concealed by a very wide trip (4w5w). A repeat from the inside could get a check at a very big price, but a bounce is more likely.

3 Alexandersrun Sweetsouthernsaint 30-1 Has never run nearly fast enough to compete here.

4 Giacomo Holy Bull 6-1

Jumped forward to win a moderate Kentucky Derby, and paired that effort in the Preakness, before bouncing badly and getting time off. On the plus side, John Shirreffs is a decent layoff trainer, but this colt's best figures are good, not great. He spots roughly a point of weight (five pounds) to most of the field, and his late running style will cause traffic issues in this big field.

5 Dixie Meister Holzmeister 6-1

Was purchased on our recommendation as a two-year-old and sold for a nice profit following his last, where he took advantage of light weight and a rail trip to finish second in a weak running of the GII New Orleans H. But this is not the toughest group either, and while he's far from the fastest horse (best top) in here, he may have the most solid pattern of development, and might still have improvement left. He's not that likely to win, but definitely could get a check. **Cont. p6**

6 Hockey The General General Meeting 15-1

Isn't close to fast enough, and there is no reason to expect a big jump--except that Bob Baffert is on fire.

7 Ulistnintome Wild Rush 15-1

Hit a decent level as a juvenile, but obviously had some physical issues. His last was a nice forward move that put him in range here and he goes third off a layoff for Richard Mandella. Stretching out this one seems likely to run a new top, which gives him a good shot to get a piece of this at a price.

8 Ice Cole Jules 15-1

Jumped way forward in his first route try, and although a bounce is likely, a repeat would give him a shot to get a check at a big number.

9 Actxecutive Noactor 30-1

Is another that jumped forward off a long rest last time. But this colt has a history of running well fresh, then bouncing badly and the short rest won't help.

10 Canteen <u>Fusaichi Pegasus</u> 4-1

Will take a lot of money off his troubled second in the GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S., but note he saved every bit of ground while others raced outside. Even if you make his last a point faster because he was stopped (about two lengths), he's not one of the major contenders here, and his overall pattern is weak (see Thoro-Pattern).

11 High Limit Maria's Mon 7-2

Was very fast at two and early three, but hasn't developed at all since. He has run his best when fresh, and it's a concern that he ran just okay this time off the layoff for a major layoff trainer, as was failure to hold the rail path. At the second highest weight, with speed inside him, he's a contender, but an underlay.

12 Wilko Awesome Again 6-1

Has run tops twice in his life, and both set him back badly. In two starts in his current campaign, he hasn't even been able to come close to his top--and from way outside, his top probably wouldn't be enough to hit the board.

13 Distorted Distorted Humor 20-1

Improved quite a bit this fall, but has now leveled off at a point well short of competitive with these, especially from way out there.

<u>Overview</u> – Greeley's Galaxy is the most likely winner--if he runs his best, it's history. Canteen is a bet-against, and there are several longshots with a chance to fill out the exotics.

Live Racing at Tampa Cancelled Friday:

Heavy rain and lightning forced the cancellation of live racing at Tampa Bay Downs Friday. "The cancellation was in the best interests of the horsemen, jockeys, horses and employees," Vice President and General Manager Peter Berube said. "The frequent lightning strikes just made the decision to cancel very easy." Live racing continues today at 12:25 p.m. EST.

EHV-1 Update:

Laurel Park officials have taken 14 Pimlico-based entries for Wednesday's card in anticipation of the removal of a quarantine placed on the Baltimore track. The Maryland Jockey Club had placed Pimlico under quarantine Jan. 21 due to the outbreak of equine herpesvirus (EHV-1) at the track. "We have a bunch of happy trainers," said Georgianne Hale, MJC's director of racing/racing secretary. "They have been wanting to enter all week and were chomping at the bit." Trainers from Barns 5, 6 and A at Pimlico will not be allowed to run their horses until the Maryland Department of Agriculture lifts Hold Orders placed on those barns. State veterinarians took nasal swabs from all of the horses in Barn 5 and eight isolated horses in the Pimlico detention barn; results from those tests are expected Monday. "We are hopeful the situation at Pimlico is under control," said Lou Raffetto, chief operating officer for the MJC. "We took the extra measures to extend the quarantine until the state was able to further test Barns 5 and A to determine if the virus was present in their nasal secretions." Four horses have been euthanized to date at Maryland tracks, three at Pimlico and one at Laurel. Another horse was put down at a private farm in Maryland's Kent County. A Hold Order was placed on that farm Jan. 26 and will remain in effect for 21 days after the onset of the most recent confirmed case. The farm had received a horse from Pimlico Jan. 10.

NOTICE: CENTRAL KY HERPES VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

A number of Central Kentucky stallion stations and boarding farms have contacted the TDN in an attempt to inform breeders of a new requirement for mares coming to the breeding shed. Due to the recent outbreaks of Equine Herpes Virus infections at racetracks and training centers, veterinarians have advised precautionary measures be taken for the 2006 breeding season. The following language is expected to be a standard requirement on shed forms at stud farms: Our Veterinarian has requested that ALL MARES coming to the breeding shed must be vaccinated within 7 to 90 days before breeding for Equine Herpes Virus Type 1 (i.e. Rhinomune, Pneumabort-K, etc.). A statement to this effect should be furnished by the boarding farm and accompany the mare to the breeding shed (may be included on culture certificate).
