



After making it this far, hopefully I continue to be healthy and the trainers and owners keep having confidence in me to give me better horses in the future. I'm going to continue to do the best I can to get to the winner's circle. It's definitely more special to do this in New York." Santos' other career highlights include his dual Classic wins aboard Funny Cide and Volponi's upset in the 2002 GI Breeders' Cup Classic. 

Bowie Horse Negative for EVH-1:

Blood samples and nasal samples taken from a horse sent to isolation at the Bowie Training Center by trainer Chris Grove have come back negative for equine herpesvirus. Despite the negative test result, the Maryland Department of Agriculture has not officially lifted the "investigational hold order" it placed on Barn 1 at the facility. Grove's horses are still restricted from training or racing until the hold is lifted. "Obviously we are delighted to hear that the suspicious case at Bowie was not the equine herpesvirus, but apparently a case of EPM as we thought it may have been after learning of the horses background," said Maryland Jockey Club Chief Operating Officer Lou Raffetto. "We look at this as one of the first breaks we've gotten since the outbreaks." Should there be no more outbreaks of EHV-1 at Pimlico, Raffetto indicated that the guarantine at that track would be lifted this coming Wednesday, Feb. 8. In anticipation of that, the Maryland Jockey Club has taken a total of 14 entries from horses based at Pimlico for that afternoon's live racing program.



HOGAN SPEAKS OUT

In the wake of the New Zealand Premier Sale at Karaka last week, the country's most prominent breeder, Sir Patrick Hogan, has called on the industry to upgrade its mares to keep its businesses commercial. "The sale went well for me, but those who didn't go so well need to ask themselves some serious questions," Hogan told New Zealand Herald. "In particular, they need to look at their bloodlines. A number of broodmare owners are still relying on older families that were fashionable 15 to 20 years ago, but which are not in fashion now...if a mare's family is not performing, breeders should be prepared to cull, and cull heavily." Hogan's Cambridge Stud accounted for four of the top 10-priced horses at the three-day Premier sale. He was leading vendor (by aggregate) for the 25th year, with 39 sold at an average of NZ\$214,449 and gross of NZ\$8,363,500. The sale average was NZ\$127,072, down 7.5 percent on the previous year. "From what I could see, the top end was strong at Karaka, the middle was not too bad, though I wouldn't say over-exciting, and the bottom end was terrible," Hogan asserted. His comments were echoed by New Zealand Bloodstock marketing manager Petrea Vela, who said in a statement, "Many buyers have impressed upon us the importance of the New Zealand industry providing the strongest catalogue possible, and this is something that New Zealand Bloodstock will endeavour to address over the coming months. Leading into the sale, we knew that the absence of Danehill, and the reduced number of yearlings by Zabeel that we had to sell, would likely prevent the final statistics from reaching the record-breaking heights of last year which saw the sale average up 23 percent on the previous year. The catalogue wasn't as strong this year overall, so what we hoped for was to see an increase from 2004."

NOTICE: CENTRAL KY HERPES VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

A number of Central Kentucky stallion stations and boarding farms have contacted the TDN in an attempt to inform breeders of a new requirement for mares coming to the breeding shed. Due to the recent outbreaks of Equine Herpes Virus infections at racetracks and training centers, veterinarians have advised precautionary measures be taken for the 2006 breeding season. The following language is expected to be a standard requirement on shed forms at stud farms: Our Veterinarian has requested that ALL MARES coming to the breeding shed must be vaccinated within 7 to 90 days before breeding for Equine Herpes Virus Type 1 (i.e. Rhinomune, Pneumabort-K, etc.). A statement to this effect should be furnished by the boarding farm and accompany the mare to the breeding shed (may be included on culture certificate).
