BUCKRAM OAK'S FUSTOK DIES IN CRASH

The head of Buckram Oak Farm, Mahmoud Fustok,

was killed Wednesday afternoon in Pompano Beach, Florida, after he and an unidentified man were struck by an automobile. Details were still unclear as of yesterday, but local newspapers reported that 55-year-old Albert Brooks lost control of his sport utility vehicle, possibly due to a medical emergency, and hit Fustok and another man near the 200 block of Pompano Beach Boulevard. The two men were not in a vehicle. All three were transported to North Broward Medical Center, where Fustok died. There was no word on the

condition of the other two men. Born in what is now Lebanon in 1936, Fustok was a prominent owner and breeder who recently enjoyed one of his biggest wins as an owner when Silver Train upset the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint in October. Eurosilver, Najran, Last Song, and Mint are other recent U.S. graded winners campaigned by Buckram Oak. A successful businessman in Saudi Arabia who owned an auto dealership, real estate, construction and oil-related businesses, Fustok first made waves as an horse owner in Europe in the 1980s. In France and England, he raced, in partnership or in whole, two-time champion Green Forest, 1982 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner In Fijar, and 1986 G1

Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud winner Noble Fighter. He also campaigned Silver Hawk, who ran third in the 1982 G1 Epsom Derby before going on to a successful stallion career at Airdrie Stud in Kentucky. Fustok, who first came to the U.S. in the 1950s to attend the University of for Buckram Oak in 2005 Oklahoma, where he graduated with a degree in petrol-chemical engineering, purchased a 500-acre tract

near Lexington and named it Buckram Oak Farm in 1978. He sold the farm to Jess Jackson last year, but retained a 200-acre farm near Ocala, where he kept horses. Fustok is survived by his brother Mustapha, a part owner of Buckram Oak.

GUIDRY RECEIVES GEORGE WOOLF AWARD

Mark Guidry has been honored as the 2006 recipient of the George Woolf Memorial Jockey Award. The Woolf Award, which honors riders whose careers and character reflect positively on themselves and the sport, will be presented to Guidry at Santa Anita Mar. 12. "This is the icing on the cake," said the 46-year-old reinsman. "It ranks way over any other accomplishments that I've had in my career." Jockeys nationwide participate in the balloting. The Louisiana-born Guidry follows Eddie Delahoussaye (1981), Kent Desormeaux (1993), Craig Perret (1998), Robby Albarado (2004) and Ray Sibille (2005) as that state's natives to win the Woolf, "I think a lot of it has to do with the way we were raised," Guidry added. "We were taught to respect others, to treat others like you want to be treated." Guidry had a career-best year in 2005, with his mounts earning over \$7.6 million. He piloted graded stakes winners Buzzards Bay, Indy Groove, Purim, Real Dandy and Sorcerer's Stone over the course of the year.

BRASS HAT TO DUBAI Last Saturday's GI Donn H. winner Brass Hat (Prized) will follow in the hoofsteps of 2005 Donn runner-up Roses in May and will ship to Dubai to contest the \$6-million G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 25. "I just talked to the guy who does the shipping [in Dubai], and we're planning to leave Florida, I think, on the 15th of March," said William 'Buff' Bradley, who trains Brass Hat for his father Fred Bradley, who also bred the five-year-old. "So we'll be there about 10 days before to get settled in." Brass Hat will ride a three-race winning streak into the world's richest race. Before the Donn, he aired by open lengths in both the Prairie Bayou S. at Turfway Dec. 17 and the GII New Orleans H. at Louisiana Jan. 7. Asked whether Brass Hat would get a breather after the Dubai World Cup, Bradley said, "We'll play it by ear. He'll definitely get a little break. I know everyone says they're cooked when they get back from Dubai, but I don't necessarily think that's true. I've seen horses come back and do very well. He's such a good shipper; he just takes everything so well. But we'll take it one race at a time; that's the way we've always done it."

and we'll keep her in races of a mile or less, at least for the first half of the season." Oxley and Ward, who teamed to win the Kentucky Derby in 2001 with Monarchos, also have a pair of highly regarded three-

year-old colts. Dr. Pleasure (Thunder Gulch), a son of Oxley's champion Beautiful Pleasure, was stakes-placed at two before finishing seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Strong Contender (Maria's Mon), the \$800,000 topper at Keeneland April, made an impressive debut at Arlington Aug. 12 (<u>video</u>), but **Dr. Pleasure** Horsephotos hasn't faced the starter since.

Hold Order Lifted on Pimlico Barn 6:

The Maryland Department of Agriculture has lifted the "General Animal Hold Order" on Barn 6 at Pimlico Race Course after 33 of the barn's 35 horses tested negative for equine herpesvirus in two separate tests. The two remaining horses did not clear the testing process and have been isolated in Barn 8, the detention barn. The cleared Barn 6 horses will be allowed to resume training with the rest of the horse population this morning and will be allowed to race at Laurel Park beginning Feb. 15.

Rice Gets Additional Suspension:

Stewards at Tampa Bay Downs have ruled that trainer Don Rice be suspended for an additional six months and have denied privileges of the grounds during that period. Three horses trained by Rice have tested positive for "milkshaking" in the past week. The combined sentence will be seven months; Rice will be re-eligible to race Sept. 5. "The additional six months may seem harsh, but that's the penalty for three violations," explained Peter Berube, the track's vice president and general manager. "Everyone knew we were testing and what the penalties were for violations. Two independent labs confirmed the three positives, which happened on Jan. 27, Jan. 29 and Jan. 31, and the stewards issued their final ruling today, Feb. 9." The "milkshake" threshold used in this testing is more than 37 millimoles of alkaline agents per liter of plasma. Rice is the only trainer to have a horse test positive since the practice was instituted by Tampa Bay in January. The track sends the pre-race samples taken from a randomly selected race each day to Bay Care Lab in Clearwater, Florida, with split samples sent to the On-Track Lab in Pompano Beach and/or the University of California Testing Lab in Davis, California. The local trainers' organization agreed to authorize the milkshake testing, but the track cannot fine or redistribute purse monies other than to order barn surveillance and/or deny access to the grounds with license suspension.

Third in Delaware's Go for Wand S. in May, it was off to the sidelines for the bay after a disappointing fourth in the Foxy J.G. S. for Penn-breds at Philly Park in June. Making her first foray on the grass in her return, she set the pace before tiring to fourth late at Louisiana Downs Dec. 31, and was back on the dirt here.
