Purchased privately after a 19 1/2-length romp at Thistledown in July, Too Much Bling acquitted himself quite well when taking a steep step up in class in the Aug. 27 GI Hopeful S., running third to First Samurai and Henny Hughes. He was less impressive finishing up the track in the GI Champagne S. in early October, and, after a well-beaten sixth in the GIII Nashua S. at Belmont Oct. 28, it was time for some regrouping. Given a two-month freshening, he returned with vigor, taking Santa Anita's San Miguel S. by four lengths Jan. 8, and was returning to graded company as the crowd's odds-on pick. Hustled out of the gate by Garrett Gomez, Too Much Bling carved out :21 3/5 and :43 4/5 fractions with Totally Gone (Gone West) contesting from the two path. "She got a little rank on the inside there and he [Garrett Gomez] said at the half-mile pole he was totally out of horse. She didn't show up today. I guess I got to take the blame for that one." 

Of the session topper, Peisah added, "She was outstanding and created a lot of interest, which I guess is vindication of all the work you put in, but I don't necessarily think it's a measure-it's nice for them to go on and win a race." Lee Freedman purchased the second-highest lot of the day from the consignment of Broadwater Farm. Freedman paid A\$170,000 for a son of Danehill Dancer (Ire) out of the unraced mare Portrait (Aus) (Octagonal {NZ}). The yearling is a three-guarter brother in blood to multiple group-winning sprinter Jet Spur (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}). "I've been trying to buy a couple of the nicer colts today and have missed out, so I'm really pleased to get him," said Freedman. "He's a perfect specimen, just like Choisir (Aus), by the same sire and being from a very fast family, he's a good buy." Gai Waterhouse was underbidder on the international phenom Choisir at the 2001 Classic Sale, but the trainer didn't miss out on a son of the champion yesterday, going to A\$135,000 to secure a colt from his first crop. "I think Choisir was the best sprinter Australia has seen for quite some time," Waterhouse said yesterday. "He was a champion two-year-old and three-year-old, then went to Europe and won there, too. I think he is perhaps the most attractive first-season sire standing in Australia."
