#### **ROBERT LEWIS DEAD AT 81**

Robert B. Lewis, who raced Eclipse Award and Kentucky Derby winners Silver Charm and Charismatic, as well as champions Orientate, Serena's Song, Timber

Country and last year's top two-year-old filly Folklore, died yesterday at his Newport Beach, California home following a long illness. He was 81. "We lost a giant," said trainer Bob Baffert, who gave Lewis his first Derby victory with Silver Charm in 1997. "He was just the nicest man. He's the only guy I know who won every big race and people still rooted for him. That's tells it all right there.

Believe me, he will be missed by many. This is just the saddest day." D.G. Van Clief Jr., president of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association and the Breeders' Cup, had known Lewis since the owner became involved in racing in 1990. "I had the pleasure of working with him both on the NTRA board in the early days and thereafter as a member of the Breeders' Cup Sport and Executive Committee," he said. "I was fortunate to have a close working relationship with Bob in those capacities and, beyond being a hugely influential owner and important force in the Thoroughbred market place, Bob was a terrific human being." Echoing those sentiments, Fasig-Tipton Director of Marketing Terrence Collier said, "The industry has suffered a great loss--it will be impossible to replace a man of his stature. He was competitive and gracious; he enjoyed great success, but at the same time he treated defeat very philosophically. My deepest sympathies go to his constant companion, his wife, because you never thought of Bob alone, you always thought of Bob and Beverly. My heart goes out to her." Lewis is survived by his wife of 58 years, Beverly, and their three children, Jeff, Jim and Nancy Lewis Francois. A service will be held Thursday, Feb. 23, at 11 a.m., at St. James Anglican Church in Newport Beach. #### Mourning Our Loss...

Tributes to Lewis have come from every corner of the sport. Keeneland President Nick Nicholson said, "The industry has lost a real stalwart, Keeneland has lost a real supporter and [Nicholson's wife] Susan and I have lost a very dear friend. He and Beverly were role models for every married couple. Susan and I truly cherished the time we were able to spend with them and we will miss him very much. I'm sure you've heard the word ambassador a lot today, and that's the way he represented the sport in public--he was a great sportsman and handled victory and defeat with equal style and class. But I also had the privilege of seeing the leadership he gave to our industry in private, when the cameras were not on, in meeting after meeting with organizations all over the country, and we will also miss that, in ways that people don't know. His public persona was unparalleled, but his private persona was as well. He was a great leader. There was a real man." John Moynihan, who served as Lewis's bloodstock agent, said, "He was a one-of-a kind person; an exemplary human being. He was like a father to me. I feel absolutely blessed to have been associated with him and am so, so happy he included me in his life. He was a super, super person to work with and was more than a client, but a best friend." ## Early Years...

Born May 12, 1924 in Minneapolis, Minnesota, Lewis was raised in nearby Glendale, but would head out West following high school to attend the University of Oregon. There he was a cheerleader for the school's hockey team, the Fighting Ducks, and also met his future wife. The Lewises would borrow the university's colors for their racing silks. Lewis served in the Army during World War II, and returned to Oregon to complete his studies at the conclusion of the war. After graduating, Lewis followed in his father's footsteps and went into the brewing industry, eventually moving to Los Angeles to work as a sales representative. On Apr. 16, 1956, Lewis started the Foothill Beverage Company, an Anheuser-Busch distributor, and over the next five decades, the company expanded, becoming the second-largest beer distributer in California. Up until his death, Lewis served as chairman while his son, Jeff, took over the reins as president and general manager.

## Rising Empire...

Lewis had been bitten by the racing bug after attending Santa Anita's opening day in 1934. He wed Beverly in 1947 and the couple spent part of their honeymoon at Del Mar and Agua Caliente. After dabbling in the



business for years with friend and business associate Arthur "Bud" Straub, the couple jumped into the game with both feet in 1990, and it didn't take long for their operation to achieve success. Sunshine Machine became the first winner for the Lewises; Serena's Song Horsephotos Blue Eyed Davy recorded their first stakes win at Santa Anita

Park's Oak Tree meeting in 1990. Overall, alone and in partnership, they campaigned 50 stakes winners, and bred seven. The couple enjoyed their first Grade I victory with Twice the Vice in the 1994 Del Mar Oaks, trained by Ray Bell Jr, who was also winning his first race at that level. From then on the stream would become a tidal wave. The Lewises' most most accomplished runner, Serena's Song, was also their first sales purchase. Bought for \$150,000 at the 1993 Keeneland July sale, the filly won 17 graded stakes, including 11 Grade I races, before retiring as the leading earning female of all time with \$3,283,388 in the coffers. As a broodmare, the bay proved even more lucrative for her owners, with her offspring, including Group 1 winner Sophisticat, grossing \$10,960,000 at public auction.

# Classic Glory...

Juvenile champion Timber Country, owned in partnership with Overbrook and Gainesway, was the first to give the Lewises a Classic victory when he collected the 1995 Preakness S. But the best was still to come. From 1997 through 1999, the Lewises won four of nine Triple Crown events. Silver Charm won the Derby and Preakness in 1997, but failed to deliver the Triple Crown following a 3/4-length defeat to Touch Gold in the Belmont. The gray recorded his biggest payday, however, the following year when he scored in the \$4million G1 Dubai World Cup. "That's when our family got really close to him and to Beverly," said Bob Baffert. "Going through the Triple Crown and Dubai was a defining moment. But he was a very smart businessman, and he kept me in line." Charismatic stood at the edge of immortality two years later, but an injury sustained in the final jewel of the Triple Crown caused him to falter and finish third and forced him into early retirement. The Lewises looked to have little chance with Commendable in the 2000 Belmont, but the 18-1 shot came through to give them yet another Classic

## Eclipsing the Competition...

In addition to the Eclipse Awards garnered by Serena's Song, Timber Country, Charismatic and Silver Charm, the Lewises were also honored with an Eclipse Award of Merit in 1997. Active at sales across the country, the owners purchased Orientate for \$250,000 at the 1999 Keeneland September sale and were rewarded when he was named champion sprinter of 2002. Homebred Folklore was the last to carry the green and gold silks to Grade I victory, taking the 2005 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, and earned her owners a seventh Eclipse. Unfortunately, Lewis was too ill to attend the ceremonies, and he passed away early Friday morning. "He went very peacefully," his son, Jeff, told The Blood-Horse. "We brought him home [from the hospital] last Saturday. He wanted to come home; he didn't want to spend his final days in the hospital. He was resting comfortably and peacefully. He just ran out of gas. He just couldn't go on any longer." He added, "He had his family around him when he passed away. He had a wonderful life, and we'll miss him tremendously." It has not yet been decided what will happen with the Lewis horses. "I talked with Bob about a week ago and I talked with Beverly this morning, but we didn't discuss any plans about the stable's future," Bob Baffert said.

Continuing his tribute, D.G. Van Clief Jr. said, "Bob was loyal to his friends, his family and colleagues. He was in every respect and every situation a gentleman. He was always positive and encouraging, a mentor to many of us in many ways and a positive example to all of us. We will miss him a great deal. He was a beloved ambassador for the sport. Our hearts go out to Beverly

and his entire family." Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who handled Classic hero Charismatic, superstar Serena's Song and the two most recent champions, Orientate and Folklore, has always been vocal in his praise of Lewis. Upon hearing the news of his passing, A Coglianese Lukas remarked, "Bob was such

a special person. Our relationship

went way beyond client/trainer a long time ago. He was a very good friend, a special friend who was there for you no matter what." Consignor Craig Bandoroff of Denali Stud, who handled many of the Lewises' sales horses, remarked, "If you meet one person like him in life, you consider yourself fortunate. I always said that even if I had never done any business with him, my life would be better just for having known him. He was generous, caring and gracious." Santa Anita President Ron Charles added his comments on the loss of Lewis. "Bob was one of the most cordial, genuinely nice people that I've ever met," he said. "For the last 15 years, he has been Thoroughbred racing's ambassador. I was very fortunate to serve with Bob for five years on the [Thoroughbred Owners of California] and during that time, he showed his passion for racing by working tirelessly to improve the industry. What was really impressive was that he worked to try to create good will in an industry that sometimes can be very contentious. Obviously, we send our condolences to Beverly, who was such an instrumental part of racing's best team." Horse Racing TV will produce a video tribute honoring Lewis, which will be shown at Santa Anita this Monday, Feb. 20, during the Presidents' Day card.

ROY CHAPMAN PASSES AWAY Roy "Chappy" Chapman, owner and breeder of Kentucky Derby and Preakness champ Smarty Jones, died yesterday at his Pennsylvania home. Slowed by chronic illness, Chapman was semi-retired, but owned Chapman Auto Group, a string of car dealerships in Pennsylvania. The 79-year-old, who suffered from emphysema, was wheelchair-bound and had an oxygen tank when he attended the 2004 Kentucky Derby, but made his way to the winner's circle after watching the homebred colt's victory. Chapman and his wife, Patricia, got their start in racing in the late 1980s and enjoyed success with steeplechase horses before turning their attention to flat racing. They operated Someday Farm, where Smarty Jones was raised, before selling the Pennsylvania farm three years ago. The Eclipse winner was by far the best horse bred at Someday, capturing eight of nine starts and suffering his only loss when second in the GI Belmont S. He was retired after that race with earnings of \$7,613,155, including a \$5 million bonus for winning the Rebel S., GII Arkansas Derby and Kentucky Derby. The chestnut stood his first season at Three Chimneys in 2005; his first foals arrive this year.

# Thoro-Graph Race of the Week

Saturday, Tampa Bay Downs, post time: 4:40 p.m. EST SAM F. DAVIS S., \$125,000, 3yo, 1 1/16m

Horse Sire Odds
Seaside Retreat King Cugat 6-1
Didn't develop much at two, and is too slow to compete with these.

Blazing Rate Exchange Rate 20-1 Had a very strong and brief campaign as a juvenile, packing three big efforts into a two-month period. He threw a stinker in his return on a sloppy track over which lots of horses failed to fire, and is back on two weeks' rest with a mile work in between--indications that he is healthy. Note that he has had nothing but wide trips, but draws inside here. Strong contender, even without improvement with age.

Pegasusbystorm Fusaichi Pegasus 20-1
Marched down to a good one in his third start, but bounced badly in the Remsen, indicating the top took a lot out of him. Note that Matz is on fire and does well at Tampa, but if the two-year-old top was a big effort, it's unlikely he has improved enough to compete here.

R Loyal Man More Than Ready 5-1
Got good late last year, and ran a big one last time. But he's now developed nine points since October, which means that top will probably cause a bounce, and the distance is a question.

Hesanoldsalt Broad Brush 4-1 Is full to a good one, and jumped to a big one when stretched out second out. He's basically held that level since, and the timing is right for a new top. Getting weight from many here (five pounds is worth one Thoro-Graph point), with a decent post, he's a contender.

Ran a big one to win the Nashua, and not nearly as well to win the Remsen. He clearly is a good horse, but we think he's a little overrated--top three-year-olds usually don't bounce that much late in their juvenile year. He'll definitely be over bet here; he would need to get back to his top to have any shot at all, and even that might not be good enough. Contender, but an underlay.

Broodmare Produce Report - \$14 Value #200 - All Registered Foals with Tabulated Race Records Sweet Grass Creek Saint Ballado 20-1 Isn't fast enough to compete with these.

Laptop Computer Notebook 8-1
Jumped to a big one second out, and didn't bounce
much when shipped south and stretched out. With five
weeks' rest into this there's a very good chance he'll at
least get back to his top, and he gets significant weight
from most of the other contenders.

Deputy Glitters Deputy Commander 20-1
Ran big first out, but hasn't gone on. His pattern is shaky, and the distance is a question.

Electrify Delaware Township 10-1
Jumped forward with the addition of Lasix, bounced, then returned to his top last time when given eight weeks. He gets much less rest this time, so a forward move is unlikely, and a bounce is probable. The post doesn't help.

Little Cliff Gulch

Jumped forward at Keeneland, but his Florida effort was terrible. He's worked well since and should run much better now, but the post and weight work against him even if he returns to his best.

Right Flanker Outflanker 20-1 Is slowest here by quite a bit.

<u>Overview</u> – Bluegrass Cat is a contender, but he'll be wildly overbet, so the right play is to take a shot against him. Blazing Rate, Hesanoldsalt and Laptop Computer look like the right ones.





#### Hold Order Lifted at Pimlico:

The Maryland Department of Agriculture has lifted the "General Animal Hold Order" on Barn A at Pimlico Race Course after 21 of 25 horses tested negative for equine herpesvirus (EHV-1). Said State Veterinarian Guy Hohenhaus, "We will continue working with all parties involved to monitor the situation and bring it to a conclusion. We thank the owners, trainers and staff for their diligence in practicing prudent bio-security measures and their patience as we work through this science-based process that will make sure the remaining horses test negative before they will be released from the Detention Barn." The four horses from Barn A and an additional two from Barn 6 which did not clear last week remain isolated from the general horse population and are stabled in the detention barn. Those animals are expected to be re-tested Tuesday. Beginning this morning, Pimlico will re-open for regular training hours between 6 a.m. and 10 a.m. and all horses based at the track, with the exception of those still being detained, will be allowed to race at Laurel. Barn 9 remains under a Hold Order at Laurel through next Friday, pending negative test results. There have been no outbreaks of EHV-1 at the Bowie, where 600 horses are stabled.
