She broke from the far outside in the 11-horse field, but Silver Cup (Ire) (Almutawakel {GB}) overcame the

draw to earn her second straight graded-stakes victory, getting up for a 3/4-length victory over Elusive Diva (Elusive Quality) in the GII Buena Vista H. at Santa Anita yesterday. The G2 Italian 1000 Guineas winner picked up her first U.S. tally in the Jan. 8 GII San Gorgonio H., rallying to best

Ticker Tape (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}) by a half-length as a 16-1 shot. Let go at 7-1 this time, the dark bay was just off the lead as Elusive Diva cut out the fractions. The pacesetter was still in front as they hit the eighth pole, but Silver Cup came with a late surge to get on top in the final strides. "I had to start riding her a little bit earlier today [than in the San Gorgonio]," jockey Victor Espinoza explained. "She's the kind of filly that, when you turn for home, you don't think you have too much horse, but you can't give up. The last few yards, she was really kicking it in." The pacesetter held on to best 7-2 favorite Mirabilis (Lear Fan) by a nose for second, with Ticker Tape another half-length back in fourth. Buena Vista chart, p2

LAUREL CANCELS SPRINT STAKES

The GII General George Breeders' Cup H. and GII Barbara Fritchie Breeders' Cup H. will be canceled for 2006 because of the ongoing restrictions on shipping horses into and out of the state. The two sprint stakes were originally postponed, with the Fritchie scheduled for Mar. 4 and the General George set for Mar. 18, but Maryland Jockey Club Racing Secretary Georganne Hale learned over the weekend that New York will not lift its quarantine until sometime next month. The ban was put into place because of the problem with equine herpesvirus at Maryland's tracks. "No one wants to cancel two of its premier races, but in light of the situation...we have no choice but to take a one-year hiatus," said MJC President Lou Raffetto. "To preserve the integrity, quality and grading of the race, we thought this was the best move to make."

CAN'T CATCH A "BUZZ"

Buzzards Bay (Marco Bay) hadn't visited the winner's circle since posting a 30-1 upset in the GI Santa Anita Derby last April, but proved much the best in yesterday's GIII All American H. at Golden Gate Fields. The chestnut had been off the board in four of his five starts since his surprising performance at Santa Anita. He did manage a third in the GIII Discovery H. at Belmont in October, but was seventh when trying the turf in the Dec. 26 Sir Beaufort S. and fourth when returned to the main track for the Jan. 28 Sunshine Millions Classic, both in Arcadia. Sent off the 2-1 second choice in the All American, Buzzards Bay prompted 3-2 Trickey Trevor (Demaloot Demashoot) for six furlongs, took control as the pacesetter faded down the lane and drew clear for a handy score. Although the words "Storm Cat" and "unfashionable"

don't ordinarily appear together in the same sentence, breeders hardly put out the welcome mat when one of Storm Cat's Grade I-winning sons took up stallion duties.

That son--Harlan--spent four full seasons at Stone Farm before succumbing to a ruptured aorta at the start of his fifth season in

1999. Even though he was priced at only \$5,000, Harlan never attracted more than 48 mares in a single season, with a low of 26 mares in his second year.

So what was the problem? Harlan probably wasn't helped by the fact that his victory over American Chance and Cherokee Run in the GI Vosburgh S. represented the only stakes success of his 28-race career. Other possible negatives were his failure to race at two and his lack of stakes performance before the age of four (although slow progress to stakes level has hardly been held against the likes of Forest Wildcat and Stormy Atlantic). Perhaps he also wasn't helped by having a third dam bred in Chile.

On the plus side, Harlan's dam was a Canadian Grade II winner by the influential Halo. In addition to siring the sensational Japanese stallion Sunday Silence and the champion sire Saint Ballado, Stone Farm's son of Hail to Reason also sired the dams of such high-profile stallions as Singspiel, Machiavellian and Rahy. Hail to Reason, of course, appears twice in the pedigree of the dam of Storm Cat's highest-priced son, Giant's Causeway, but breeders weren't to know that at the time Harlan was struggling.

Harlan's legacy amounted to only 98 named foals, yet two of them--Menifee and Harlan's Holiday--developed into major performers, with each winning the Blue Grass S. during a distinguished career.

Menifee was bred by Arthur B. Hancock III at Stone Farm before being offered for sale as a yearling in 1997. The bidding stopped at a modest \$35,000, even though his dam Anne Campbell (who was to be named Broodmare of the Year for 1999) had already produced Desert Wine, a three-time Grade I winner who was second in both the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. Perhaps the stumbling block, in the eyes of potential buyers, was Anne Campbell's age: she was 23 when Menifee was foaled.

As Roses In May recently reminded us, 23-year-old mares can occasionally produce top-class performers and Menifee wasn't hindered by his dam's advancing years. Racing for the partnership of Hancock and James H. Stone III, Menifee matched his half-brother Desert Wine by filling the runner-up spot behind Charismatic in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness. He also put up an excellent effort when he narrowly defeated Cat Thief and Forestry under top weight in the Haskell Invitational, but he missed another chance of glory when stiffness ruled him out of the Breeders' Cup Classic, which fell to Cat Thief.

It had been his owners' intention to keep Menifee in training as a four-year-old, and there appeared to be every possibility of further improvement. After all, he was a sizeable individual (16.2 hands) with a May birthday, and both his sire and broodmare sire had improved with age. Sadly, some swelling in an ankle early in 2000 persuaded his connections that it was wiser to retire him to Stone Farm.

Hancock--clearly no admirer of the mega-book concept--announced that "we plan to breed him to 45 mares, maybe two or three more if he can handle it."

Handle it he apparently could, as he covered 61 mares in 2000, followed by 70 in 2001, 76 in 2002 and 88 in 2003. But, with the start of his career coinciding with MRLS, Menifee had only 125 named foals in his first three crops. This type of total makes it hard for any stallion to compete in today's industry, and Menifee's 125 foals was the second-lowest total among the top 15 stallions on last year's third-crop sires' table.

Menifee has had enough foals, though, to show that he has definite potential. He was represented by his third graded-stakes winner when Taittinger Rose recorded a well-deserved victory in the GIII Sabin H. Menifee's earlier graded winners were two other fillies, namely Letgomyecho (GII Forward Gal S.) and Burnish (GIII Miss Preakness S.).

We should get a more precise idea of Menifee's capabilities over the next two years, when his fourth crop races. With 74 live foals, this crop is comfortably larger than its predecessors and it is followed by a 63-strong fifth crop, foaled in 2005.

Menifee's original appeal as a stallion may have suffered from the failure of his half-brother Desert Wine, who sired only two graded winners from an output of 423 foals. Menifee is clearly faring better than Desert Wine, and so is another half-brother, Bold Badgett, who was retired to the Old English Rancho in California as an unraced four-year-old. Although Bold Badgett wasn't widely used, he managed to make his mark by siring Disturbingthepeace, a multiple Grade II winner, and Leave Me Alone, winner of last year's GI Test S.

Another stallion from this family is Anne Campbell's Irish-based grandson Fasliyev, whose first Group 1 win came on the same day that Menifee took the Haskell Invitational. Fasliyev made a spectacular start as a stallion, with five group winners in his first crop, but he has failed to maintain that momentum. The chances are that he will bounce back in 2007, when he will be represented by a batch of two-year-olds sired at €75,000.

Menifee received a bit of help in siring a mare as good as Taittinger Rose. Her dam, La Rosa, is a Grade II-winning daughter of Twilight Ridge, who triumphed in the 1985 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, and she comes from a female line which served Fred Hooper well.
