#### TOP NAMES MEET IN GULFSTREAM FEATURE

Today's ninth race at Gulfstream, a one-mile allowance on the main track, will feature the three-year-old debuts of the highly regarded pair **High Cotton** (Dixie

Union) and Strong Contender (Maria's Mon). Peachtree Stable's High Cotton was the runner-up in a pair of graded stakes at Churchill in the fall, coming up second-best to Private Vow in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Nov. 26 in his last start. The bay has been training smartly at Palm Meadows for his return. "It's an awfully tough race for a first-level allowance," trainer Todd Pletcher told Daily Racing Form, "but that's the nature of the beast down here this time of year." One of his prime opponents is

Strong Contender, who was sidelined after an eyecatching debut win at Arlington in August (video). The chestnut, an \$800,000 purchase by John Oxley at Keeneland April, has trainer John Ward thinking that he can follow in the footsteps of another Oxley/Ward son of Maria's Mon, Monarchos. "We have hig hopes for [Strong Contender]," Ward told *DRF*. "The game plan is to ultimately make either the Wood [Apr. 8] or the Blue Grass [Apr. 15], and then get to the Derby if he can dance all the dances." **Click here for brisnet.com pps**.

#### HINES, OWNER OF LAWYER RON, DIES

James T. Hines Jr., whose homebred Lawyer Ron is among the top contenders for the Triple Crown, was found dead at his home yesterday, according to published reports. The 69-year-old Hines was discovered in

the indoor swimming pool of his home near Owensboro, Kentucky. Foul play is not suspected; an autopsy was scheduled for today. Funeral plans have not yet been announced. Hines, a Kentucky native, had many business interests, including Owensboro Manufacturing and MidAmerica Jet. Lawyer Ron, coming off an impressive win in the GIII Risen Star S., was scheduled to contest the \$250,000 Southwest S. That race was to be held Monday, but was scrapped by Oaklawn Park officials and rescheduled for Saturday, Feb. 25. If Lawyer

One of the more interesting recent developments in European breeding has been the arrival of domestic Mr. Prospector-line stallions as a force to be reckoned with. The first wave of Mr. Prospector stallions in Europe came in the early and mid 80s with his sons Hello Gorgeous and Damister, both of whom proved disappointing. Hello Gorgeous and Damister were both middle-distance horses, Hello Gorgeous best at around 10 furlongs, and Damister effective at a mile and a half, and it may be significant that the two stallions which have made a significant inroad for Mr. Prospector in Europe were speedier types.

The first of these was Machiavellian, who was the European champion two-year-old of 1989 and the runner-up in the G1 2000 Guineas the following year. At a time when Northern Dancer had already become a dominant influence in European pedigrees, Machiavellian had the ideal background, as he was not only free from Northern Dancer, but had Northern Dancer's half-sister, Raise the Standard, as his second dam. A horse in the right place at the right time, Machiavellian (who died in June, 2004) has sired 58 stakes winners, 33 of them group or graded winners, and 11 Group/Grade 1.

Three years after Machiavellian came Zafonic, by Mr. Prospector's son Gone West. He captured three Group 1 events at two and the G1 2000 Guineas at three, and was a champion in both years. Zafonic died in 2002, as a result of an accident during a shuttle season in Australia, but he has sired at least 47 stakes winners, 21 group or graded, and four Group/Grade 1. Incidentally, Zafonic's brother, Zamindar, stood in England, then Florida, and returned to England after getting the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches victress Zenda in his first crop.

Despite their early deaths, both Zafonic and Machiavellian have a chance to extend their male lines. Zafonic has three sons--Trade Fair, Xaar and Zafeen--slated to stand in Europe in 2006, and Xaar has already sired two group winners in his first crop (three-year-olds of 2005). Meanwhile, Machiavellian, who has at least eight sons at stud in Europe, as well as Street Cry (first runners in 2006) in the U.S., is showing signs of becoming a sire of sires. His first son with runners, Vettori, has five group or graded winners from his European crops, as well as three Australian Group 1 winners from his shuttle crops, while Machiavellian's son Medicean was among the leading European freshman sires of last year, with G1SW Nannina and GSW Abigail Pett. Another Machiavellian son, Almutawakel, has two major stakes winners, one Group 1 from his first crop in New Zealand, and two group winners in his first European crop. That first crop is headed by Silver Cup, winner last year of the G2 Premio Regina Elena (Italian 1000 Guineas), and successful this year in the GII San Gorgonio H. and Monday's GII Buena Vista H.

Out of the Green Desert mare Elfaslah, Almutawakel was one of Machiavellian's best runners. Successful in the G1 Prix Jean Prat and beaten a neck in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at three, Almutawakel upset U.S. champions Victory Gallop and Silver Charm, G1 English Derby winner High Rise and international star Daylami to win the G1 Dubai World Cup in record time at four. Almutawakel campaigned most of the remainder of that season, and all of the next in the U.S.

Almutawakel didn't capture a stakes in this country, but did miss by just a nose in the GI Woodward S. He also took second in the GI Oaklawn H. and third in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup.

Silver Cup is the first foal of her dam, Ribblesdale, a maiden winner in England. Ribblesdale was sired by Northern Park, a son of Northern Dancer and the G1 Prix de Diane (French Oaks) heroine, Mrs. Penny. A \$2.8-million yearling, Northern Park did win a blacktype race in France, but was an ineffective sire, and Silver Cup is the only group/graded stakes winner in whose pedigree Northern Park appears. Silver Cup's granddam, Tarib, was also a disappointing producer with just two minor winners from four starters. She was, however, a performer of some distinction over sprint trips, capturing the G2 Premio Umbria in Italy, and the G3 Ostermann Pokal and Scherping-Rennen in Germany.

By the outstanding sire Habitat, Tarib was out of Red Coral, a mare with a remarkably cosmopolitan career. By Blushing Groom's sire Red God, out the the American-bred On-and-On mare Meme Chose, Red Coral was conceived in Ireland, but was imported to Australia in utero.

Red Coral proved to be a talented performer Down Under, winning the Leilani S., a race which now has Group 3 status, and finishing fourth against colts in the G1 Craven 'A' S. and G1 Newmarket H. She subsequently returned to Europe for her stud career. Incidentally, Red Coral's dam, Meme Chose, was a pretty well-bred mare, and was in fact closely related to Sweet Tooth, the dam of Alydar (both were by On-and-On, and Sweet Tooth's granddam, Real Delight, is sister to Bubbley, the granddam of Meme Chose).

Silver Cup is bred on a pattern which is becoming an extremely common one in high-class winners: that of a sire bred on a Mr. Prospector/Northern Dancer cross, bred back over a Northern Dancer-line mare. When Machiavellian is involved this has an extra factor, as he brings in the half-sister to Northern Dancer. We can note this working with the two other Machiavellian sons out of Northern Dancer-line mares who have runners, Medicean and Titus Livius. Medicean's Group 1 winner is out of a Northern Dancer-line mare, and his other group winner is inbred to Northern Dancer, while the only European black-type winner by Titus Livius is also out of a Northern Dancer-line mare. Machiellian's son. Vettori, is not out of a Northern Dancer-line mare. but his second dam is by Northern Dancer's son Nijinsky II, and eight of his stakes winners--including two of his Group 1 winners--are out of Northern Dancer-line mares.

Silver Cup has a couple of other twists too. Her broodmare sire Northern Park has Great Nephew as his broodmare sire. Great Nephew is out of Sybil's Niece, a 3/4-sister to Northern Dancer's sire, Nearctic. Almutawakel's broodmare sire, Green Desert, is by a son of Northern Dancer out of a mare by a son of Sir Gaylord, and the same formula is found in Silver Cup's dam.

#### SAM RUBIN, OWNER OF JOHN HENRY, DIES

Sam Rubin, who raced rags-to-riches champion John Henry, died Feb. 13 in Palm Beach, Florida, according to The Blood-Horse. He was 91. A New York City native who became a bicycle importer, Rubin acquired John Henry privately for \$25,000 as a three-year-old in 1978, when the gelding was competing in claiming races. Racing for Rubin and wife Dorothy's Dotsam Stable, the bay was eventually transferred to Ron McAnally, who saddled him to Horse of the Year titles in 1981 and 1984 and five other Eclipse Awards. By the time of his retirement at age nine, John Henry had captured 39 of 83 career starts and a record \$6,591,860. The 31-year-old retiree currently resides at Kentucky Horse Park. Rubin is survived by Dorothy, son Tom and daughter Phyllis.


