Reddam paid 300,000 guineas for Vague at last year's Tattersalls December sale and had nominated her to the GI Kentucky Oaks.

Music School Will Start in Southwest...

Oaklawn's Southwest S., which was rescheduled to this Saturday after cold weather forced the cancellation of racing at Hot Springs Monday, attracted a new face yesterday when trainer Neil Howard committed the unbeaten Music School (A.P. Indy) to the one-mile event. Howard opted against the Southwest when it fell 15 days after Music School's Feb. 5 allowance win at Oaklawn--which improved the colt's record to twofor-two--but things changed following the Southwest's postponement. "The extra week makes all the difference," Howard said yesterday after watching the 3/4brother to Mineshaft breeze a half in :49 3/5 over a muddy Oaklawn strip. "We were running out of options to get to the GIII Rebel [S., at Oaklawn Mar. 18], and the week's delay makes a big difference. His work this morning was perfect." Robby Albarado, originally slated to ride Steppenwolfer (Aptitude), switches to Music School. Corey Lanerie will ride Steppenwolfer.

CAN 'LATINO' WORK HIS MAGIC?

When they met three weeks ago, **Linngari (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) outfinished a game **Latino Magic (Ire)** (Lion Cavern) to win the 1777-meter G3 Dubal Al Rashidiya at Nad al Sheba, stretching his winning streak to three

in the process. Latino Magic wound up third behind Greys Inn, 1 1/2 lengths off the winner, but put forward a good effort in what was his seasonal debut. He'll try to turn the tables on Linngari when the two meet up again in today's G2 Al Fahidi Fort S. in Dubai, a 1600-meter grass event. Frankie Dettori retains the mount on the six-year-

old, who is winless in four starts since annexing a valuable Galway handicap last July. Third in the G2 Royal Whip S. after that, the Robbie Osborne trainee then traveled to America, where he went unplaced in a pair of graded events at Belmont in October. While the well-traveled veteran has every right to improve today, he'll have his hands full again with Linngari. An improving four-year-old, Linngari concluded his sophomore year with a win in the Listed Superior Mile at Haydock in September--his first stakes tally--and he showed little rust taking his second in his 2006 bow last out. "He broke so well, and put himself in perfect position," said winning rider Edgar Prado. "I felt comfortable every step of the way. Other horses would come to him, and he would just take off again...a really nice ride, and he did it easy, and that's the scary part. Turning for home, I hit him to get his mind on business, but he was just waiting for me to tell him what to do. There is plenty left in that tank." Trainer John Ward has been high on the colt all along. "We've really never gotten to the bottom of this horse," he explained. "We've never really wanted to, but we were anxious to see what our hole card was, and it turned out it was an 'Ace.' We have three to four weeks to decide what's next." Storm Treasure (Storm Boot) rallied for second, while Big Lover picked up a check for third. High Cotton stumbled at the start and went after the leaders, but began to back out of it on the turn and was eased. Strong Contender was sold to John Oxley by Murray Smith, who previously sold a rather nice Maria's Mon colt named Monarchos to him back in 2000. Video, sponsored by Taylor Made.

An impressive maiden winner at Belmont in September, the bay was unplaced in the Nov. 5 GIII Iroquois S. and the Dec. 3 What a Pleasure S. and was sidelined. "He's just such a big horse," said his trainer, Dallas Stewart. "When they get that big, they tend to have shin problems, and we needed to back off him after his last race because of those problems. We're taking the approach that if he's ready, we'll be ready. If he can make it for a spring campaign we'll go for it, but if he's not, we'll just get him started when the time is right." Flanders Fields worked in company Monday at Gulfstream with another Stewart runner preparing for a comeback--the veteran sprinter Clock Stopper (Gilded Time). 

Lawyer Ron Expected in Southwest:

GIII Risen Star S. winner Lawyer Ron (Langfuhr) is expected to race in Saturday's Southwest S. at Oaklawn, despite the death Tuesday of owner James T. Hines, Jr. "The tragic death of Mr. Hines should have no impact on Lawyer Ron," trainer Bob Holthus said yesterday. "The paperwork is underway, and, from what I understand, Lawyer Ron will race in the Southwest for The Estate of James T. Hines, Jr." Holthus had a long association with Hines. "I've had horses for Mr. Hines for 21 years," the trainer said. "And we've been pretty lucky. He had Ruby Surprise, and she won the [GII] Humana Distaff at Churchill Downs, and earned almost \$800,000. And he had Dorothy Ann, a stakes winner of nearly \$300,000. Of course, Lawyer Ron is the best horse I've trained for him." Hines bred Lawyer Ron and named him for his friend Ron Bamberger, an Owensboro attorney. "Mr. Hines was a good man and a good owner. He will be missed," added Holthus. Holthus will also saddle Kings Challenge (Elusive Quality) and James C Ellis Juvenile S. winner Red Raymond (Deputy Commander) in the Southwest.

Pancho Villa Dead:

The 24-year-old stallion Pancho Villa (Secretariat--Crimson Saint, by Crimson Satan), a good sprinter in the mid-1980s and close kin to leading sire Storm Cat, died Feb. 20 of a heart attack as he prepared to cover his first mare of the season at Cedarcrest Farm in Texas, according to published reports. A full brother to the speedy Terlingua, the dam of Storm Cat, Pancho Villa was a \$1.8-million purchase by D. Wayne Lukas at Keeneland July. His best season came as a three-yearold in 1985, when he won seven of his 17 starts, including the GII Silver Screen H., GII Bay Shore S., King's Bishop S., and the GIII National Sprint Championship S., in which he equaled a track record winning the six-furlong race at Hollywood Park in 1:08 4/5. At stud, Pancho Villa is represented by the Grade I winner Do It With Style and no fewer than 18 other stakes winners. His progeny have earned in excess of \$14.7 million.

Outta Here landed the Delta Jackpot S., finished second in the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S. and third in both the GIII Best Pal S. and GIII Generous S. Currin opted to take an unorthodox route to the GI Kentucky Derby with his charge, sending him to Dubai to run fourth in the G3 UAE Derby before finishing seventh in the Run for the Roses. He added a third in the GII Swaps S. later that season. After a lackluster four-year-old campaign, Outta Here kicked off 2005 with a win in a Santa Anita optional claimer ahead of his runner-up finish in the GIII Tokyo City H. He missed by a nose in a Hollywood allowance Dec. 1 in what would be the final start of his career. In all, the six-yearold bankrolled \$657,167 while compiling a record of 28-3-5-6.

"The idea is to go for the Stan James 1000 Guineas, and it's just a question of whether or not we give her a run beforehand," he added. "We'll see how she is, what the weather is like and how the ground is shaping up--I wouldn't be averse to going straight to the Guineas with her, although a prep run wouldn't do her any harm." Never out of the top two in any of her four runs to date, Wake Up Maggie defeated 25 other rivals to win the valuable Tattersalls Ireland Sales S. last August prior to her Cheveley Park effort.
