LINNGARI TAKES AL FAHIDI FORT

Linngari (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) doubled his group tally at Nad al Sheba yesterday with a 2 1/4-length victory in the G2 Al Fahidi Fort S. The four-year-old, coming off a win in the Feb. 2 G3 Al Rashidiya, overtook pacesetter **Holiday Camp** (Chester House) half way down the straight over the rain-soaked turf course and powered clear. Previously trained by Sir Michael Stoute, Linngari was making his second start for Herman Brown. "Linngari has been working exceptionally well, although the rain made me a little nervous," Brown admitted. "We decided to sit behind the pace today, which I think suited him as he has such acceleration. The plan now is to head straight for the [Mar. 25 G1] Dubai Duty Free on Dubai World Cup day, if we are invited." **Latino Magic** (Ire) (Lion Cavern) was always near the rear and trailed home last in a disappointing effort. Prepping for the Mar. 4 GII Santa Catalina S., **Brother Derek** (Benchmark) worked six furlongs in a bullet 1:12.20 at Santa Anita yesterday. Jockey Alex Solis was in the irons. "He was just breezing, not as aggressive as last time," said trainer Dan Hendricks. "We took a little edge off him and everything looks good. He doesn't require a lot of works. I don't need to work him every five or six days and really pound him. He stays fit on his own. He'll do a little something next Wednesday or Thursday and that should be it." Hendricks, 47, has been training on his own since 1987. Brother Derek is his first serious Triple Crown candidate. "I just hope we can sustain it, keep it going and stay healthy."

SALE COMPANY OFFICIALS COMPLAIN ABOUT HANDLING OF MEDICATION GUIDELINES' DEVELOPMENT

Several sale company officials have written a letter to Dr. Larry Bramlage complaining about how an American Association of Equine Practitioners task force handled the development and release to the public of its guidelines for medications in sale horses. Chaired by Bramlage, a prominent equine surgeon, AEEP Task Force on Medication Issues at Public Auction issued its recommendations last December. The recommendations included a ban on anabolic steroids while horses are on a sale company's grounds. The letter, dated Feb. 10, is typed on Society of International Thoroughbred Auctioneers (SITA) stationery and is signed by Nick Nicholson, the president and chief executive officer of Keeneland; Walt Robertson, the president of the Fasig-Tipton Co.; and Tom Chiota, the president of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. The letter's writers noted that SITA and the AAEP had worked together in the past on various veterinary issues and reached a consensus--something the sale company officials said did not happen with the medication guidelines. According to the letter, "during discussion at Sales Integrity Task Force meetings, the AAEP was asked for its input and analysis on medication and other veterinary issues. Therefore, consultation would have been entirely appropriate for any recommendations germane to auction sales as it has been on other important issues."

ClassicStar's office in Utah, where the Plummers are based, was closed that that time.

Purse for 2005 Palomar BC H. in Dispute:

Owner Jim Ford has petitioned the California Horse Racing Board to redistribute the purse for the 2005 \$180,000 GII Palomar Breeders' Cup H., the *Thoroughbred Times* reports. Ford's Katdogawn (GB) finished fourth behind Intercontinental (GB) in the Sept. 3 contest at Del Mar, but it was later determined that Intercontinental received a Lasix shot at 12:10 p.m. the day of the race, just three hours and 25 minutes before post time. California racing law requires that Lasix shots be administered at least four hours before post time. According to the report, Dr. Amy Lee Nevens was videotaped by a security guard as she gave the shot, and the time stamp on the recorder established that the injection was given after the deadline. Intercontinental would normally have been scratched, but Nevens had falsified the medication record and the stewards were not informed of the infraction until after the race. She was fined \$750 during a hearing with the stewards Oct. 15.
